THE MATCH-UP... The Providence College women's basketball team will face Pittsburgh in BIG EAST Conference action on Saturday, January 14. The game will be played at the Petersen Event Center in Pittsburgh, Pa. Tip-off is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. Saturday's game will mark the only meeting between the two programs on the 2005-06 regular-season schedule.

LOOKING FOR SOME GOOD KARMA... The Friars will try to capture their first BIG EAST regular-season road victory since January 11, 2003 when they defeated Pittsburgh, 80-77, in Pittsburgh, Pa. The Friars are 0-1 on the road this season in BIG EAST Conference play.

ALL GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END... In the Friars' most recent game on January 11, the Friars fell to Georgetown in BIG EAST Conference action, 79-67. The loss snapped Providence's five-game win streak. PC's string of five victories marked the longest win streak since the 1991-92 season.

THE MONKEY IS OFF OUR BACK... On January 7, the Friars snapped a 39-game winless streak in BIG EAST Conference regular-season play with a 58-57 victory over Cincinnati in Providence, R.I. Prior to the Friars' win over the Bearcats, PC had not won a regular-season league game since February 8, 2003 when it defeated Pittsburgh, 57-54, in Providence, R.I.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME VS. PITTSBURGH... Providence College and Pittsburgh have met 41 times in the history of the two women's basketball programs. Providence leads the all-time series, 26-15. However, the Panthers have won each of the last three meetings between the two squads.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST SEASON... The Friars and Panthers met twice last season. Pittsburgh swept the season series over Providence, 2-0. On February 19, Pittsburgh defeated Providence, 63-47, at the Petersen Event Center in Pittsburgh, Pa. On February 28, the Panthers earned an 80-43 win over the Friars at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I.

THE LAST TIME PROVIDENCE DEFEATED PITT... The last time Providence College defeated Pittsburgh in women's basketball was on February 8, 2003 in Providence, R.I. The Friars earned a 57-54 victory on that day.

THE LAST TIME PC WON ON PITTSBURGH'S HOME COURT... The Friars have lost each of the last two meetings against Pitt on the Panthers' home court. The

PROVIDENCE COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL • GAME NOTES

last time PC defeated the Panthers in Pittsburgh, Pa. was on January 11, 2002. The Friars earned an 80-77 victory over Pitt on that day.

SCOUTING PROVIDENCE... The Providence College women's basketball team enters Saturday's game against Pittsburgh with a 6-8 overall record and a 1-2 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. PC was enjoying a five-game win streak before falling to Georgetown, 79-67, in it's most recent game on January 11. Three Friars are averaging double figures in scoring, led by junior Shauna Snyder (Albuquerque, N.M.) at 14.0 points per game. Fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.) is second among her teammates in scoring (13.0 ppg), followed by freshman Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) who is averaging 12.9 points per contest. Nwafili leads the team in rebounding (9.0 rpg), followed by freshman Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) who is hauling in 8.6 boards per game. Marandola leads Providence with 41 assists and 27 steals. As a team, PC is averaging 62.5 points and 38.9 rebounds per contest. The Friars' opponents have averaged 62.5 points and 34.9 boards per game.

FRIARS' SIX WINS EXCEED WIN TOTAL OF PREVIOUS TWO SEASONS... On January 7, Providence captured it's sixth victory of the season, with a 58-57 defeat of Cincinnati in Providence, R.I. PC's six wins on the year exceeds the Friars' combined win total from each of the previous two seasons. In 2004-05, the Friars finished the year with a 1-27 mark. In 2003-04, PC completed the schedule with a 4-23 record.

ALL-TIME RECORD IN BIG EAST REGULAR-SEASON PLAY VS. CURRENT LEAGUE MEMBERSHIP... PC is 144-163 all-time against current BIG EAST Conference members during regular season league action. In league games vs. the five new members of the conference, Providence is 1-0. The Friars defeated Cincinnati in their first-ever BIG EAST meeting on January 7 (58-57).

WINNING AFTER TRAILING AT THE HALF... The Providence College women's basketball team earned it's first victory of the season after trailing at the half on January 7 vs. Cincinnati. PC trailed, 28-22, at the half vs. the Bearcats and rallied to win the game, 58-57. Providence is 1-4 this season when it trails at half-time. The last time Providence won a game after trailing at half-time was during the 2003-04 season when it trailed Stony Brook, 33-32, at halftime and went on to win the game, 59-57. That game was played on December 11, 2003.

HALFWAY THERE... The Friars have led nine of their 14 opponents at halftime this season. On November 21, Providence led Yale, 43-14, at halftime. The Friars went on to win that game, 74-53. On November 26, the Friars led Saint Peter's, 24-21, at the break. PC eventually lost the game, 54-46. On November 29, the Friars held a 38-32 halftime lead against Quinnipiac, but lost the game, 83-80, in overtime. On December 4, the Friars held a 27-23 lead against Fordham at the half, but fell to the Rams, 64-60. On December 6 against No. 6/7 Rutgers, Providence led, 31-25, at the half, but fell to the Scarlet Knights 58-45. On December 10, the Friars led, 38-32, at the half against URI and went on to win the game, 69-66. PC led 34-30 at the half against Harvard and went on to win, 70-59, on December 21. The Friars held a 45-23 halftime lead over Wagner on December 28 and won, 79-55. On December 31, PC held a 27-20 lead at halftime against Saint Francis (N.Y.) and won the game, 66-44. Providence is 5-4 this season when leading an opponent at the half. The Friars are 1-4 when trailing at the half.

ROAD WARRIORS... Prior to the start of the 2005-06 season, Providence had not earned a victory in a road game since December 30, 2003. Through 14 games on the 2005-06 season, Providence is 6-8 overall, including a 3-4 mark in games played on the road. On December 10, Providence claimed it's first road victory against Rhode Island by a score of 69-66. On December 21, PC recorded it's first set of back-to-back victories since December 2003, with a 70-59 road win against Harvard in Cambridge, Mass. On December 31, Providence defeated Saint Francis (N.Y.), 66-44. The Friars' three road wins this season have all been by double-digits. PC lost it's last road game to Georgetown on January 11 in Washington, D.C. (79-67).

PROVIDENCE CLAIMS LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY SINCE 2000-01 SEASON... On Wednesday, December 28, the Friars defeated Wagner, 70-55, for a 24-point margin of victory. It marks PC's largest margin of victory since the 2000-01 season, when it defeated Princeton by 27 points (69-42) on December 31, 2000.

CRASHING THE BOARDS... On December 28, 2005, Providence pulled down a season-high 49 rebounds in a 79-55 victory over Wagner in Providence, R.I. It is the most rebounds for the Friars in a single game since grabbing 50 boards against Pittsburgh on January 11, 2003. As a team the Friars are averaging 38.9 rebounds per game through 14 games. Four Friars are averaging better than 5.0 rebounds per contest, led by fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.), who averages 9.0 boards per game. Last season, the Friars averaged 29.3 rebounds through 28 games - in 2005-06, PC has improved its rebounding average by 9.6 rebounds. The Friars have pulled down 43-or-more rebounds in six games this season, including four of the last six.

LARGEST REBOUNDING MARGIN OF THE SEASON... On November 21, the Friars defeated Yale, 74-53, in Providence, R.I. PC out-rebounded the Bulldogs, 45-18, in the game. The Friars' 27-rebound advantage vs. Yale is the largest rebounding margin of the season.

POINT PRODUCTION... Providence has scored 70-or-more points in four of its 14 games this season. Last year, Providence did not reach 70 points in any of its 28 games. During the 2003-04 season, PC hit for 70 or more in a game twice (27 games). In 2002-03, the Friars hit for 70-or-more points in six games. This season, PC scored a season-high 80 points vs. Quinnipiac on November 29 in an 83-80 overtime loss. It marks the most points in a single game for the Friars since, January 11, 2003, when the Friars defeated Pittsburgh, 80-77. With regard to scoring in a regulation length game, Providence hit for 79 points this season against Wagner on December 28, in a 79-55 victory.

MORE POINTS... A year ago, the Friars finished the season with a scoring average of 44.2 points per game. Through 14 games on the 2005-06 schedule, Providence is scoring 62.5 points per contest - 18.3 points better than the previous season.

A FRESH LOOK... The Friars have four freshmen on the 2005-06 roster (Chelsea Marandola, Catherine Bove, Ashley Etheridge and Shantee Darrian). Through 14 games this season, a freshmen has led the Friars in scoring nine times. They have combined to record 17 double-digit games, and have scored 328 of the teams' 875 total points (37.5-percent of the Friars' total offense).

NWAFILI POSTS FIFTH DOUBLE-DOUBLE OF THE SEASON... Fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.) leads the Friars in double-doubles this season with five, and owns a total of 12 in her career. She registered her first double-double on November 18 vs. Sacred Heart on 10 points and 11 rebounds. On November 29, Nwafili scored 20 points and added 12 rebounds vs. Quinnipiac. On December 2, Nwafili netted a season-high 21 points and grabbed 12 boards vs. Navy. On December 4 at Fordham, she hit for 17 points and grabbed 15 rebounds. Most recently, Nwafili registered 17 points and 10 rebounds at Georgetown on January 11.

DOUBLE-THE-TROUBLE... Two Friars have joined fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.) on the list of Friar players who have recorded double-doubles. On November 21, freshman Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) recorded her first collegiate double-double in a 74-53 victory over Yale. In the game, Marandola hit for 19 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. Sophomore Kristen Brown (River Vale, N.J.) tallied her first double-double of the season (third of her career) against Quinnipiac on November 29 with career highs in points (16) and rebounds (13).

PROVIDENCE IS 5-1 WHEN THEY SHOOT OVER 40-PERCENT FROM THE FIELD IN A GAME... The 2005-06 Providence women's basketball team has a 5-1 record when it shoots 40-percent or better from the floor in a game. In PC's five victories this season, the team shot 49.1-percent (27-55) in a 74-53 win over Yale (11/21/05), 48.2-percent (27-56) in a 69-66 victory against Rhode Island (12/10/05), 48.9-percent (23-47) in a 70-59 victory over Harvard (12/21/05), 41.9-percent (26-62) in a 79-55 win vs. Wagner (12/28/05) and 45.9-percent (28-61) in a 66-44 win at Saint Francis (12/31/05). In the team's only loss of the season after shooting 40-percent or better from the field, the Friars fell to Quinnipiac 83-80 in overtime. During that game, PC shot 42.3-percent (30-71). Providence has claimed just one victory this season when it shot below 40-percent. On January 7, the Friars defeated Cincinnati, 58-57, after shooting just 33.3-percent (21-63) from the field. PC is 1-6 when it shoots below 40-percent from the field.

20-SOMETHING... Two Friars have eclipsed the 20-point plateau this season in a single-game. Fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.) scored 20 points vs. Quinnipiac on November 29. She followed that up with a season-high 21 points in the Friars' against Navy on December 2. Freshman Ashley Etheridge (Portland, Conn.) is the only other Friar to record 20-or-more points in a single game this season. On December 10, Etheridge hit for 21 points against Rhode Island.

TIGHT DEFENSE... On November 21, Providence College held Yale to 14 points in the first half of play. The last time PC held an opponent under 20 points in the first half was on December 28, 2002, when the Friars led St. Bonaventure, 33-19, at halftime.

BLOCK PARTY... The Friars are averaging 3.3 blocks per game through 14 games. Fifth-year senior Gayle Nwafili (Maplewood, N.J.) has recorded 16 of the teams' 46 blocked shots on the year. Sophomore Danielle Howard (Willingboro, N.J.) owns 10 rejections on the season. Nwafili is averaging a team-high 1.14 blocked shots per game this season and has recorded 43 blocks in her career. As a team, PC posted a season-high seven blocks vs. Quinnipiac on (11/29/05). They have recorded five blocked shots in four games, including their most recent outing vs. Georgetown on January 11.

CHARITY WORK... The Providence women's basketball team is getting to the free-throw line more often this season. Through 14 games, the Friars are attempting 18.5 free throws per game (.660, 171-259). Providence has attempted 20-plus free-throws in six games. Last season the Friars played 28 games and averaged 10.5 free-throws per game (179-294, .609) and attempted a season-high 19 free throws against Stony Brook (12/7/04).

NEW LEADERSHIP... PC is under the direction of first-year Head Coach Phil Seymore, who was hired in April. He spent the last five seasons as an assistant coach with the Providence College men's basketball team and helped guide the Friars to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one showing in the post-season NIT. Through 14 games as the women's head coach at Providence, he has posted a 6-8 record (1-2 BIG EAST). He earned his first collegiate victory as a head coach on November 21 vs. Yale (74-53). With the win, he helped the Friars snap an 18-game winless streak. On January 7, Seymore recorded his first BIG EAST win as head coach of the Friars with a 58-57 win over Cincinnati. Prior to the win over the Bearcats, PC had lost 39-consecutive BIG EAST regular-season games.

HOME GROWN... Providence College welcomes Johnston, Rhode Island native Chelsea Marandola to the women's basketball program. Marandola, a freshman on the 2005-06 roster, is a two-time Rhode Island Gatorade Player of the Year. She finished her career at Johnston High School with 2,631 points and is the all-time leading scorer in the State of Rhode Island. Marandola also is a four-time First-Team All-State honoree. In Marandola's collegiate debut vs. Sacred Heart (11/18/05), she recorded three rebounds, three assists and three steals in 18 minutes. On November 21, Marandola led the Friars to their first victory since

December 30, 2004, with a 74-53 win over Yale. She tallied her first collegiate double-double in the game with 19 points and 12 rebounds. Marandola has reached 19 points in three other games this season - most recently on January 7 vs. Cincinnati. Through 14 games, Marandola has reached double figures 11 times, including nine of the last 10 games. She is averaging 12.9 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.9 steals per game. Marandola has earned BIG EAST Conference Freshman of the Week honors twice this season (December 12 and December 27). Marandola is the first Providence freshman since Jessica Simmonds, during the 2001-02 season, to earn the weekly honor. HEAD COACH • First Season PHIL SEYMORE

Providence College Associate Vice President for Athletics Bob Driscoll announced the appointment of Phil Seymore as head coach of the women's basketball team at the College on April 7, 2005. Seymore, is the eighth women's basketball coach all-time at Providence, and looks to rebuild a program with a storied tradition.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Seymore served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's basketball team, helping the squad earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2001 and 2004.

"Phil Seymore brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our women's basketball program," Driscoll said. "He has enjoyed success as a student-athlete, a professional athlete and as a coach. He understands the mission of the College and is dedicated to rebuilding our program while providing a positive experience for our student-athletes."

"Phil has an outstanding basketball mind," Providence College Men's Basketball Head Coach Tim Welsh said. "He has been a valuable part our program over the last five years. We will miss him on our staff. I believe he will be a tremendous head coach and that this is a great hire for the College."

Seymore came to Providence in 2000 after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons under Head Coach John Beilein. While at Richmond he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wingmen. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

"Phil was one of my first full-time assistant coaches," West Virginia Men's Basketball Head Coach John Beilein stated. "I knew in a short time that I wanted him to be my assistant forever. His attention to detail is impressive, but what is equally impressive is how he looks at the big picture -- life, basketball and recruiting. This is a great selection for Providence and the BIG EAST."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius. Five of those seven years were under Beilein.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. He played one season for Albany of the Continental Basketball Association where he earned 1983 All-Star honors. Seymore is a member of Canisius' Athletic Hall of Fame.

"I feel very blessed to have the opportunity to be the head coach of the women's basketball program at Providence College," Seymore said. "I am familiar with the team and have a great respect for basketball in the BIG EAST. I, along with my staff, am looking forward to empowering the women's basketball team for a positive change on and off the court. Also, I am excited for the opportunity to create a competitive atmosphere so we may build on the great tradition of Friar women's basketball."

Seymore resides in Rumford, R.I., with his wife, Alicia, and his daughter, Amani.

Navy outscored Providence, 35-34, in the half. Joining Nwafili in double digits was freshman Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) who hit for 16 points and grabbed seven rebounds. All 16 of her points came in the second half. Brown finished the night with eight points and eight rebounds. The Friars committed a season-low 12 turnovers in the game. The Mids led by as many as 12 points (52-40) in the second half with 6:56 remaining in the game. The Friars cut the deficit to four points (62-58) with 1:10 left on the clock, as they went on an 18-10 scoring run. Navy hit five-of-six free-throw attempts in the final minute to keep control of the lead and gain the six-point win (67-61).
