**FRIARS HOST NO. 12/11 WEST VIRGINIA ON FEBRUARY 9...** The Providence College women's basketball team will host No. 12/11 West Virginia in BIG EAST action on Saturday, February 9 at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. Tip-off is scheduled for 2:00 p.m.

**THINK PINK...** Saturday, February 9 at the Providence College vs. West Virginia women's basketball game, the Friar community has chosen to participate in the annual "Think Pink" campaign designed to create awareness in the fight against breast cancer. At the game, pink Friar t-shirts will be sold and donations toward the cause will be accepted. All proceeds will be donated to the Gloria Gemma Breast Cancer Research Foundation during halftime.

**PROVIDENCE VS. WEST VIRGINIA ALL-TIME...** The Friars and Mountaineers have met 16 times in the history of the two women's basketball programs. West Virginia holds a 12-4 record vs. Providence all-time. The first meeting was played on February 10, 1996 in Morgantown, W. Va. and the Mountaineers earned an 87-81 victory.

**THE LAST TIME THE TWO TEAMS MET...** Providence and West Virginia last met on January 13, 2007 in Morgantown, W. Va. The Mountaineers earned a 69-57 victory on that day.

**THE LAST TIME PROVIDENCE DEFEATED WEST VIRGINIA...** The last time Providence defeated West Virginia was on February 7, 2006 in Providence, R.I. The Friars earned a 57-55 victory on that day.

**THREE OF THE FRIARS' FOUR VICTORIES IN THE ALL-TIME SERIES HAVE COME AT HOME IN ALUMNI HALL...** The Friars have defeated the Mountaineers four times since the all-time series began on February 10, 1996. Three of their four victories have come at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. PC is 3-5 vs. WVU all-time in games played at Alumni Hall.

**FRIARS TO FACE SIXTH NATIONALLY RANKED TEAM OF THE YEAR ON SATURDAY WHEN IT FACES WEST VIRGINIA...** The Friars will face its sixth nationally ranked opponent of the season when they No. 12/11 West Virginia on Saturday, February 9 at 2:00 p.m. Providence is 0-5 this season vs. teams ranked in the national polls. Providence has two games remaining vs. opponents who are currently ranked nationally (Syracuse and Rutgers).

## LAST TIME PROVIDENCE DEFEATED A RANKED OPPONENT...

The last time Providence defeated a ranked opponent dates back to January 3, 2007, when it knocked off 13th-ranked Louisville, 106-94, in double overtime in Providence, R.I.

**AT A DEFICIT...** In five games vs. Nationally ranked opponents, the Friars have posted an 0-5 record. In those five losses, the Friars have been out-scored by an average of 25.2 points per game. PC's largest margin of defeat vs. a ranked opponent this season came on December 20 against then-ranked #23/24 Michigan State - who has since dropped out of the polls. MSU defeated Providence by 38 points (73-35). It also marks PC's largest margin of defeat this season. The Friars fell to #24/21 DePaul by just 11 points (66-55) in the smallest margin of defeat at the hands of a ranked foe on January 12.

**HOME SWEET HOME...** The Friars have posted an all-time mark of 263-144 (.646) at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. This season the Friars are 5-5 at home. On November 20, the Friars played their 400th game all-time at Alumni Hall when they hosted Manhattan. Providence is currently in the midst of a three-game home losing streak. PC's last victory at Alumni Hall was against UMass (59-56) on December 31.

**SCORING TROUBLES...** The Friars have been held below 60 points in six of its eight BIG EAST Conference games this season. The Friars are 0-6 in those games. Providence scored 61 points in two BIG EAST games this season, and is 1-1 in those games, with its only win coming against USF (61-49). Prior to opening league play, the Friars had eclipsed the 60-point plateau nine times. PC hit for 70+ points six times during non-conference play.

**FRIARS ARE 5-1 WHEN THEY TOP THEIR OPPONENT ON THE BOARDS...** The Friars have posted a 5-1 record this season when they out-rebound their opponent. The only loss when holding an advantage on the boards came against No. 24/21 DePaul (66-55) on January 12. The Friars out-rebounded the Blue Demons, 35-31, in that game.

**DARRIAN NEARS 400 CAREER REBOUNDS...** Junior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has recorded 387 rebounds in her career after competing in just 43 career games, for an average of 9.0 rebounds per game. Darrian's rebounding average is the program's second-highest all-time for a career. Britt King '86, who holds every rebounding record at Providence College, finished her career with 1,205 rebounds for a program-best career average of 10.6 boards per game. Additionally, 147 of her 387 rebounds have come off of the offensive glass, which is good for 3.4 offensive rebounds per game (43 career games). This season, Darrian is averaging 8.1 rebounds per game through 21 contests.

**DARRIAN LEADS FRIARS ON BOARDS...** Junior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has hauled in a team-best 171 rebounds this season through 21 games for an average of 8.1 rebounds per game. She has led the Friars on the boards in 17 of 21 games. On November 28, she matched her career high in rebounding with 16 boards against Fordham. Darrian has 16 double-digit rebounding games in her career, and is the only Friar to reach double figures on the glass this season (five times). She has pulled down eight-or-more rebounds in a game 14 times this year.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE...** Junior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) leads the Friars in double-doubles this season with three. On November 28, she recorded 26 points and 16 rebounds against Fordham. On December 8 against Central Connecticut, Darrian recorded her second double-double of the season with 20 points and 14 rebounds. Her most recent double-double came on January 15 in a 61-49 victory over BIG EAST foe USF in Tampa, Fla. She posted 13 points and 11 rebounds against the Bulls. Darrian owns five double-doubles in her career.

**HOLMES CONTINUES TO DISH IT OUT...** Sophomore Kendria Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) led the team in assists a year ago as a freshman with 103 handouts for an average of 3.7 assists per game. Through 21 games on the 2007-08 schedule, Holmes leads the team once again in assists with 72 (3.4 apg). She posted a season-high six assists three times this season in games against New Hampshire (12/28), #20/20 Notre Dame (1/30) and #1/1 Connecticut (2/2/08). Additionally, she has handed out five assists in four other games this year vs. Hartford (11/13/07), Iona (11/17/07), Fordham (11/28/07) and #22/24 Pittsburgh

(1/19/08). She has handed out at least four assists in 11 of PC's 21 games. In her career, Holmes has dished five or more assists in a game 17 times (49 career games).

**BLOCK PARTY...** The Friars registered a season-high 11 blocked shots against Fordham on November 28. It marks the second most blocked shots by a BIG EAST Conference team this season, through all games played on February 6. It also marks the most blocked shots in a single game by the Friars since December 20, 2000 when the team swatted 11 shots against Holy Cross. On January 15, the Friars posted 10 blocked shots in BIG EAST play against USF. It marks the second most blocked shots in a league contest this season through league games played on February 6. Sophomore Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) led the Friars with a career-high six blocked shots against the Bulls. Her block total in that game marks the most blocks by a single player in a BIG EAST regular-season game this season.

**GET OUT OF HERE...** Sophomore Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) and senior Aga Lorenc (Lubycza, Poland) lead the way in blocked shots this season through 21 games. Cournoyer owns 28 blocked shots, and recorded a career-high six blocks

against USF on January 15. Cournoyer has surpassed her block total from a year ago and now owns 54 rejections in her career. She has recorded two-or-more blocks in a single game six times this year. During the 2006-7 season as a rookie, Cournoyer's 26 blocks marked the third-highest block total for a freshman in program history. Lorenc has 19 blocks this year. She posted a season-high three rejections against Iona on November 17 and has recorded two-or-more blocks in seven games. Last year, she led the Friars in blocked shots with 33. Three other Friars have reached double-digits in blocks this year. Sophomore Jessica Clark (Bronx, N.Y.) has recorded 15 blocks overall and posted a career high of three blocks in games vs. Fordham (11/28/07) and Seton Hall (1/26/08). Freshman Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) and junior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) have recorded 12 blocked shots each.

**HANKINS LEADS FRIARS IN 20-POINT GAMES...** On January 12, freshman Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) matched her career of 20 points against No. 24/21 DePaul. Hankins is one of four Friars to eclipse the 20-point plateau in a single game this season, and has done so a team-best three times.

**MAKING STRIDES...** Third-year Head Coach Phil Seymore has helped the program increase its win total in each of the last two seasons since taking over the program in 2005. Seymore inherited a team that posted a 1-27 record prior to his hire. In his first season with the team in 2005-06, the Friars made a 7.5 game improvement in the win column with an 8-19 record. Last season, the improvements continued as the team completed the year with a 13-16 record. This year, Providence has an overall record of 11-10. It marks the first time Providence has posted double-digit wins in back-to-back seasons since the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons.

**HULL HITS FOR CAREER-BEST 25 POINTS IN BIG EAST OPENER...** Sophomore Trinity Hull (Cranston, R.I.) has reached double figures in eight games this season. In PC's BIG EAST Conference opener vs. Marquette on January 5, Hull netted a career-best 25 points on 9-16 shooting, including a 3-5 performance from three point territory. She also connected on all four of her free-throw attempts.

**20-SOMETHING...** Four Friars have reached the 20-point plateau in a single game this season a total of seven times, and each of the four players hit the single-game milestone for the first time in their careers during the 2007-08 campaign. Freshman Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) leads the team with three, 20+ point games. Hankins netted a season-best 20 points against Central Connecticut on December 8 and hit for 20, once again, on December 31 against UMass. Most recently, Hankins hit for 20 points against No. 24/21 DePaul on January 12. Junior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) is second on the squad with two 20+ point scoring games. Darrian recorded a career-high 26 points against Fordham on November 28 and chipped in 20 points against Central Connecticut on December 8.

**LIFE WITHOUT CHELSEA MARANDOLA...** The Friars are without the services of 2007 All-BIG EAST Second-Team selection Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.). The junior guard averaged 14.9 points, 6.2 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.9 steals per game during the course of her first two seasons with the Friars. She is shelved for the 2007-08 season with an injury. Marandola currently holds the fifth-highest career scoring average all-time at Providence (14.9 ppg) through 55 games as a Friar.

**BOVE TOO?...** Junior guard Catherine Bove (Cincinnati, Ohio) played in PC's first three games of the season before sustaining an injury. Bove started each of those games and averaged 7.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game. Bove entered the 2007-08 season as the second-leading returning scorer behind Chelsea Marandola (also lost to injury). In 2006-07, Bove averaged 11.7 points, 5.1 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.7 steals per game. Bove scored a career-best 31 points in a 106-94, double-overtime, victory over #13 Louisville last year and added career-best six assists in that game (1/3/07).

**COURNOYER DISHES SIX ASSISTS VS. CENTRAL CONNECTICUT...** Sophomore forward Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) dished out a career-high six assists in PC's 76-64 victory over Central Connecticut on December 8. Her six assists are tied for the most assists recorded by a PC player this season through 21 games. Kendria Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) has handed out six assists in three games this season as the team's point guard. Prior to the Central Connecticut game, Cournoyer's previous career-high in assists stood at three (vs. Notre Dame on February 17, 2007). Through seven BIG EAST Conference games, Cournoyer ranks second among her teammates in assists (11).

**PROVIDENCE IS 7-0 WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF...** The Friars are 7-0 this season when leading at halftime. Each of the team's victories when leading at the half have been decided by a double-digit margin, with the exception of the Friars' game against Massachusetts (59-56) on December 31. PC defeated Brown by a season-high 34 points on November 9 after leading 39-23 at the half. On November 28, the Friars led Fordham 26-20 and went on to win by 18 (63-45). On December 5, the Friars led Harvard, 37-30, at halftime and won the game, 78-64 (+14). On December 8 against Central Connecticut, the Friars led by 11

points at halftime and went on to win the game, 76-64 (+12). Providence led New Hampshire, 31-25, at the half on December 28 and earned a 73-41 win. On January 15, the Friars led 39-24 against USF at the half and went on to win by 12 (61-49).

**A WORLD OF DIFFERENCE WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF...** Providence has led at halftime in seven games this season and have won those games by an average margin of 17.9 points per game. In Providence's four victories when either trailing or tied at halftime, the Friars have won by an average margin of 8.25 points per game.

**FRIARS ARE 6-0 WHEN SCORING 70+ POINTS...** The Providence women's basketball team is 6-0 this season when it scores 70+ points in a game. The Friars opened the season with a 79-45 victory over Brown on November 9. PC's second win of the year, when scoring 70+ points, came against Iona on November 17. The Friars defeated the Gaels, 73-64, in that game. On November 23, the Friars earned a 71-60 victory over Florida International. The Friars beat Harvard, 78-64, on December 5, and followed with a 76-64 victory over Central Connecticut on December 8. On December 28, Providence posted a 73-41 victory over New Hampshire.

**WHEN THE FRIARS SCORE 60+ POINTS IN A GAME...** The Friars have scored 60+ points in 11 games this season and have posted a 9-2 record in those games. The only losses Providence has endured when scoring 60-or-more points in a game came at the hands of Hartford (77-60) on November 13 and #22/24 Pittsburgh (81-61) on January 19.

**FRIARS REACH DOUBLE-DIGITS WINS FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT SEASON UNDER HEAD COACH PHIL SEYMORE...** With their 59-56 victory over UMass on December 31, the Friars reached double-digits in the win column for the second-straight season under third-year Head Coach Phil Seymore. It marks the first time PC has recorded back-to-back double-digit win seasons since doing so during the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons.

**FRIARS CLOSE NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE WITH 10-3 RECORD...** For the second-straight season, Providence has posted a 10-3 record in non-conference play. Prior to last season, Providence had not recorded 10-or-more non-conference victories in a season since 1990-91 (10-1).

**HOME GROWN...** The Friars feature two players from Rhode Island on their roster this season. Junior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) returns for her third season with the program, while Trinity Hull (Cranston, R.I.) joins the club as a rookie. Hull played scholastically for Cranston High School East.

**NEW HEIGHTS...** Senior center Aga Lorenc (Lubycza, Poland) is the tallest player to ever play women's basketball at Providence College. She is flanked by five other players on the roster, who are over 6-feet tall, marking the most players over six feet on the roster in a single-season all-time.

**HELPING HANDS...** The Friars have recorded a season-best 16 assists in two games this year against Harvard (December 5) and Central Connecticut (December 8). Providence has registered double-digit assists in 13 of its 21 games this year. On January 22, the Friars handed out just three assists in a 70-50 loss in Providence, R.I. On January 26, PC dished out just two assists in a 58-43 loss to Seton Hall in Providence, R.I. Those two outings marked back-to-back season lows in assists, but Providence has bounced back with 10 assists and 13 assists, respectively, in its last two games.

**DORSEY SHINES IN PROVIDENCE'S VICTORY AT HARVARD...** Sophomore Brittany Dorsey (Detroit, Mich.) scored a career-high 22 points in PC's victory over Harvard on December 5. Dorsey was 7-15 from the floor, including 6-10 from beyond the three-point arc. Her six three-point field goals was two shy of the Friars' single-game record of eight set by Jennifer Davis against Rutgers (11/28/93) and Julie Wheeler vs. West Virginia (2/22/97). Dorsey also connected on two-of-two free throws and recorded three assists and one steal in 33 minutes of action.

**STEALING THE SHOW...** Freshman guard Trinity Hull (Cranston, R.I.) recorded eight steals against Iona on November 17 in Providence, R.I. Her theft total was one shy of the all-time single-game steal record set by Helen Jessie-Mency on February 5, 1991 against Pittsburgh. Hull is tied for second on the team in steals (32, 1.5 spg).

**PROVIDENCE'S WIN OVER BROWN ON NOVEMBER 9 MARKS LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY SINCE 1997...** The Friars 34-point victory over Brown on November 9, marks the largest margin of victory for the Friars since defeating Puerto Rico, 88-45, on November 28, 1997 at the San Juan Shootout in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

**FRIARS OWN FOUR VICTORIES THIS SEASON WHEN TRAILING OR TIED AT HALFTIME...** On November 17, the Friars overcame a seven-point halftime deficit (33-26) to defeat Iona, 73-64. It marked the largest halftime deficit overcome by the Friars en route to a victory since November 22, 2002. On that day, the Friars trailed Navy by nine points (37-28) at halftime and rallied to defeat the Mids, 70-62, in Burlington, Vt. On November 23, the Friars rallied to defeat Florida International, 71-60, after trailing by nine points at halftime (33-24) in Miami, Fla. It equaled the Friars' largest halftime deficit overcome to gain a victory since beating Navy on November 22, 2002. Providence has earned victories in four games this season when either trailing or tied at halftime.

**FRIARS PICKED TO FINISH 15th IN THE BIG EAST PRESEASON COACHES' POLL...** The Friars were picked to finish 15th in the BIG EAST Conference Preseason Coaches' Poll, released on October 25 at ESPN Zone in New York City, N.Y. The Friars recorded 36 points in the poll. Connecticut topped the poll with 225 points and 15 first-place votes. Rutgers received the remaining first-place vote and registered 211 points. Georgetown sits below Providence with 20 points.

## HEAD COACH • Third Season PHIL SEYMORE

Phil Seymore embarks on his third season as head coach of the Friar women's basketball team. Seymore was hired as the eighth coach in the program's 33-year history on April 7, 2005.

The program has made tremendous strides during Seymore's two-year tenure on the sidelines. Prior to his arrival, the Friars won just five games during a two-year period from 2003 through 2005, including an 0-32 record versus BIG EAST Conference opponents.

During Seymore's first season with the Friars, the team posted an 8-19 overall record and a 3-13 mark in the BIG EAST. It marked a 7.5 game improvement in the win column. Last season in 2006-07, the Friars showed even greater signs of progress with a final record of 13-16 (3-13 BIG EAST). On January 3, 2007, Seymore led Providence to an impressive 106-94, double-overtime, victory over 13th-ranked Louisville during BIG EAST regular-season play. At the time, the Cardinals were one of five NCAA Division I women's

basketball programs who were undefeated.

The Friars' 13 victories on the year marked the most in a single season since the 2001-02 campaign, when PC finished the year at 13-15. Providence started the year with a 7-1 record, including victories in each of its first six games. It stands at PC's best start since 1990-91 when the team began the year with seven-straight victories.

Furthermore, Providence completed the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 10-3 record. It marked the first time since the 2002-03 season that PC had posted a winning record in non-conference play. It also marked the most non-conference victories in a single season since 1990-91.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Seymore served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's basketball team, helping the squad earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2001 and 2004.

"Phil Seymore brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our women's basketball program," Driscoll said. "He has enjoyed success as a student-athlete, a professional athlete and as a coach. He understands the mission of the College and is dedicated to rebuilding our program while providing a positive experience for our student-athletes."

"Phil has an outstanding basketball mind," Providence College Men's Basketball Head Coach Tim Welsh said. "He has been a valuable part of our program over the last five years. We will miss him on our staff. I believe he will be a tremendous head coach and that this is a great hire for the College."

Seymore came to Providence in 2000 after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons under Head Coach John Beilein. While at Richmond, he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wingmen. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

"Phil was one of my first full-time assistant coaches," West Virginia Men's Basketball Head Coach John Beilein stated. "I knew in a short time that I wanted him to be my assistant forever. His attention to detail is impressive, but what is equally impressive is how he looks at the big picture -- life, basketball and recruiting. This is a great selection for Providence and the BIG EAST."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius. Five of those seven years were under Beilein.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. He played one season for Albany of the Continental Basketball Association where he earned 1983 All-Star honors. Seymore is a member of Canisius' Athletic Hall of Fame.

Seymore resides in Rumford, R.I., with his wife, Alicia, and his daughter, Amani.
