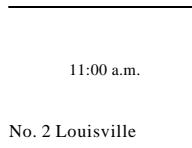

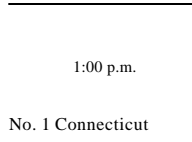

PROVIDENCE VS. LOUISVILLE IN 2007... Providence and Louisville met earlier this season at the Friar Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex in Providence, R.I. on September 30. The Cardinals earned a 2-1 victory in an evenly played match. Louisville outshot Providence, 9-8, overall. The Friars held the advantage in shots on goal, 7-6. Each team recorded three penalty corners. Providence took an early 1-0 lead as Nellie Poulin tallied a goal off a feed from Jessica Lane. Louisville tied the game, 1-1, 10 minutes before halftime on an unassisted goal from Janelle Avila. Casey Diener connected on the game-winning goal 1:55 into the second half as she received a pass from Nicole Youman in front of the cage and knocked it across the goal line. PC's Rachel Chamberlain recorded four saves in the game, while Louisville's Marie-Claire Heller made six saves.

FRIARS MAKE RETURN TRIP TO BIG EAST CONFERENCE FIELD HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP... The Providence field hockey team is making its second-straight trip to the BIG EAST Field Hockey Championship. It marks the first set of back-to-back appearances for the Friars at the tournament since making consecutive trips in 1997 and 1998.

FRIARS AT THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT IN 2006... The Friars appearance at the BIG EAST Tournament in 2006 marked the first trip to conference post-season play since the 2000 season, and the first under the direction of Head Coach Diane Madl. Providence earned a share of the BIG EAST Regular-Season Championship in 2006 and entered the tournament as the No. 2 seed behind Louisville. The Friars defeated No. 3 seed Villanova in the semifinals, 4-2, and advanced to the championship game against UConn. The Huskies earned a 4-3 victory over Providence and claimed the title.

FRIARS VS. THE TOURNAMENT FIELD... The Providence field hockey team holds a 1-2 record this season vs. teams participating in the BIG EAST Tournament. The Friars' only victory against the field came on October 12 against 18th-ranked Syracuse. PC defeated the Orange, 3-2, in Providence, R.I. The losses against the tournament field came against 16th-ranked Louisville (2-1) in Providence, R.I. and sixth-ranked Connecticut (3-1) in Storrs, Conn.

PROVIDENCE AND LOUISVILLE WILL MEET IN THE SEMIFINALS OF THE BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP ... The Providence College field hockey team enters the BIG EAST Championship as the No. 3 seed. The Friars will take on No. 2 seed Louisville at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, November 3 at J.S. Coyne Field in Syracuse, N.Y. The Cardinals earned a 2-1 victory over the Friars earlier this season in Providence, R.I.

PROVIDENCE VS. LOUISVILLE ALL-TIME... Providence College and Louisville have met four times in the 32-year history of the Friar field hockey program. Louisville owns a 4-0 record all-time vs. Providence, including a 3-0 mark vs. the Friars during BIG EAST Conference regular-season play.

PROVIDENCE AND LOUISVILLE TO MEET FOR FIRST TIME IN A POST-SEASON SETTING... Providence College and Louisville have met four times in the history of the two field hockey programs. Saturday's meeting in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Championship will mark the first match-up between the two schools in a post-season game.

THE FRIARS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS... Providence enters the BIG EAST Tournament with a 2-4 record vs. opponents who are ranked in the NFHCA Division I National Coaches' Poll. The Friar victories came against No. 10 Boston College (3-0) on October 3 and No. 18 Syracuse (3-2) on October 12. The losses vs. ranked opponents came against No. 20 Boston University (2-1) on August 28, No. 16 Louisville (2-1) on September 30, No. 5 Iowa (3-1) on October 6 and No. 6 Connecticut (3-1) on October 27. Two of the four losses vs. ranked opponents were decided by one goal.

FIVE OF PC'S SEVEN LOSSES ON THE YEAR HAVE BEEN DECIDED BY ONE GOAL... Five of Providence's seven losses on the year were decided by one goal. The only opponents who managed to outscore the Friars by more than a goal were No. 5 Iowa (3-1) on October 6 and No. 6 Connecticut (3-1) on October 27. Two goals is the largest margin of defeat that the Friars have faced all year.

FOUR FRIARS ECLIPSE 20-POINT MARK IN 2007... Four members of the Providence field hockey team have eclipsed the 20-point plateau this season. Senior defender Michalagh Stoddard (Norwood, Mass.) leads the way with 23 points on eight goals and seven assists. Junior Meghan Holden (Worcester, Mass.) is second on the team in scoring with 22 points on six goals and 10 assists. Sophomore Nellie Poulin (Oakland, Maine) and junior Jessica Lane (South Windsor, Conn.) check in with 21 and 20 points, respectively. Poulin is tied for the team lead in goals with nine and adds three assists. Lane leads the team with 18 assists and has one goal.

HELPING HAND... Junior Jessica Lane (South Windsor, Conn.) leads the Friars with 18 assists through 20 games this season. Lane's 18 assists mark a single-season career high and also bring her within one assist of tying the program's single-season record of 19. The current record (19 assists) was set by two-time All-American Paula Wagoner in 1997.

BALANCED ATTACK... Twelve players on the Providence field hockey roster have scored at least one goal this season. The team has combined for a total of 49 goals through 20 games, marking the 10th highest total for goals in the program's 32-year history. The most goals scored in a single-season by the Friars came during the 1989 campaign, when PC tallied 67.

STRONG STARTS... The Providence field hockey team has scored 30 of their 49 goals this season in the opening half of play. PC's goal output drops off in the second half with 18. In one overtime game this year, Providence scored one goal.

POULIN AND RUGGIERI TIED FOR TEAM LEAD IN GOALS... Sophomore Nellie Poulin (Oakland, Maine) and freshman Julie Ruggieri (Barrington, R.I.) are tied for the team lead in goals through 20 games with nine apiece. Poulin has tallied goals in eight different games this season and has two multiple-goal games. In PC's most recent game against Brown on October 30, Poulin registered a season-high five points on two goals and one assist. Ruggieri has tallied goals in seven different games and owns three multiple-goal games.

EVOLUTION OF THE FRIARS UNDER HEAD COACH DIANE MADL... Head Coach Diane Madl has coached 120 games on the Providence College sidelines. In those games she has compiled a 63-57 record. During her first three seasons with the program, the Friars played on a grass surface (Hendricken Field). In those first three years, the Friars posted a record of 26-33. In 2005, the program began playing on an astroturf surface with the opening of the Friar Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex. Since that time, Madl and the Friars have turned the program around and have posted a 37-24 mark, including a 31-11 record since 2006.

TWO CURRENT PLAYERS RANK AMONG THE TOP-25 ALL-TIME IN SCORING AT PC... Senior Abby Maguire (Southbury, Conn.) and sophomore Nellie Poulin (Oakland, Maine) rank among the top-25 all-time in scoring at Providence. Maguire checks in at 12th all-time on the list with 70 points on 30 goals and 10 assists. Poulin ranks 24th all-time with 46 points on 19 goals and eight assists. Maguire also ranks ninth in career goals at PC (30), while Poulin is tied for 20th (19).

GETTING OFFENSIVE... Senior defender Michalagh Stoddard (Norwood, Mass.) enters the 2007 BIG EAST Championship with a team-leading 23 points on eight goals and seven assists. Prior to the 2007 season, Stoddard appeared in 59 games at center back and made 55 career starts. In those 59 games, she recorded just four points on one goal and two assists.

SOPHOMORE RACHEL CHAMBERLAIN HAVING ANOTHER SOLID SEASON IN GOAL... Sophomore All-American goalkeeper Rachel Chamberlain (Branford, Conn.) has played 1,320 minutes in the cage this season and owns a 1.33 goals against average and a 0.777 save percentage. She has allowed 25 goals and has registered 87 saves. Four of her 13 victories on the season are shutouts, while she has teamed with fellow goalkeeper Kim Vesling (Pittsford, N.Y.) for two more shut-out wins. In her two seasons with the team, Chamberlain has a 29-11 record, including 11 shut-out victories. Additionally, she has registered a 1.29 goals against average and a 0.789 save percentage in 2,720 career minutes of action.

PROVIDENCE'S 13 WINS TIED FOR FIFTH MOST ALL-TIME IN A SINGLE-SEASON... The Friars own a 13-7 record through 20 games this season. Their 13 victories are tied for fifth most all-time in a single-season in the program's 32-year history. Providence recorded a single-season record of 21 victories in 1989. In 1987, 1990 and 2006, the Friars recorded 18 wins, in 1988, PC posted 17 victories. The program has earned 13 victories in three different seasons (1979, 1992 and 2007).

FRIARS RANKED IN NATIONAL POLL FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT WEEK... The Providence field hockey team is ranked in the NFHCA Division I National Coaches' Poll at No. 20. The Friars have been ranked in the poll during each of the last two weeks. PC started the season ranked 17th in the Preseason Poll, but dropped out after suffering back-to-back losses to open the 2007 schedule.

HEAD COACH • Sixth Season

Diane Madl embarks on her sixth season as head coach of the Providence College field hockey program in 2007. She was introduced to the Friar community as the sixth head coach in program history on February 4, 2002. In just five years, Madl and her staff proved that they had the perfect blueprint to rebuild a program - and the Friars reaped the benefits in 2006 with a BIG EAST Conference Regular-Season Championship and an overall record of 18-4. Providence's 18 wins in 2006 are tied for the second most in program history, while the Friars' five wins in the BIG EAST mark the most all-time for PC in a single season (5-1). Providence made its debut in the STX/NFHCA Division I National Coaches' Poll on September 12th with a ranking of No. 16 and remained in the national poll for nine-consecutive weeks, including seven-straight weeks in the top-15. PC was ranked 11th in the last two weeks of the season, including the final poll which was released on November 7. The Friars posted an impressive 5-3 record in 2006 versus nationally ranked teams.

With the team's great success in 2006, countless individual accolades rolled in for the Friars. Madl was named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year, Dita/NFHCA Division I Northeast Region Coach of the Year and Woods Unlimited Coach of the Year. She helped to develop five All-BIG EAST selections, including three First-Team honorees. The three First-Team selections mark the most in program history in a single-season, while the five selections in all are tied for the most in program history. The Friars also had five team members named to the All-Northeast Region Squad, including three First-Team selections. Senior captain Lauren Sickel (Plaistow, N.H.) and freshman goalkeeper Rachel Chamberlain (Branford, Conn.) became the first All-America selections for Providence in the sport of field hockey since 1997 as members of the NFHCA Division I All-America Third Team. The duo became just the seventh and eighth All-America selections in program history, and Chamberlain was one of just two freshmen in the nation to earn All-America honors. She also was named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Year, marking the first time a Providence goalie has won the post-season award.

Madl has coached nine players who have earned All-BIG EAST honors a total of 13 times, eight players who have earned STX/NFHCA Division I All-Northeast Region recognition a total of 13 times and two NFHCA Division I All-America selections. The Friars' success also has been rewarded in the classroom. Madl has coached 13 athletes who have earned NFHCA Division I National Academic Squad honors a total of 26 times, including three student-athletes who earned the recognition during each of their four years at Providence. Additionally, Madl has coached 28 student-athletes who have earned BIG EAST Academic All-Star accolades a total of 52 times.

In five years at the helm, Madl has coached 100 games and has posted a record of 50-50. She enters the 2007 campaign ranked third all-time in wins behind Jackie Barto (163-93-22) and Kate Denning (56-46-4). Denning roamed the sidelines from 1979-84, while Barto coached the team from 1985-97. On December 7, 2006, Providence College Athletic Director Robert G. Driscoll announced that he extended Madl's contract through the the fall of 2010.

Madl came to PC after spending eight seasons as the assistant coach at the Maine (1993-2001). In 1995, Madl took a year off from coaching to play for the 1996 United States Olympic Field Hockey Team in Atlanta, Georgia. She is a 1989 graduate of the University of Connecticut. While at UConn, the Huskies captured the 1985 Division I NCAA National Championship. During her career she earned All-America and Academic All-America honors for field hockey. She also played basketball for the Huskies from 1986-88. As a senior at UConn in 1989, Madl earned the prestigious Honda Broderick Award, as the top collegiate field hockey player in the nation, and also was named New England Female Athlete of the Year. Madl graduated from Connecticut magna cum laude, with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

As a member of the U.S. National Team, Madl played in the Olympic Games (Atlanta, Georgia - 1996), Inter-Continental Cup, World Cup, Pan American Games and World University Games. She also has been involved in the National Futures Program as a head coach and has served as a selector for the U.S. National Team. She served on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee for the U.S. Field Hockey Association as the Vice President for High Performance.

Madl served as the camp director for Providence College Field Hockey Day Camps in 2003 and 2004. She is now the owner and director of Circle To Circle Field Hockey Camps, LLC, which she launched in 2005. During the summer of 2006, Madl added a team camp to her Circle to Circle summer circuit. The camp is designed to not only provide comprehensive field hockey instruction, but also to work on team building and team concepts. She also developed a coaching clinic for high school field hockey coaches in the region.

Madl remains active with U.S. Field Hockey on several levels. She was selected to coach one of the three U.S. under-19 teams that competed in the USA/Canadian Challenge Cup in the summer of 2005, and was an assistant coach for the Northeast Region High Performance Training Center Team in 2006 and 2007. During the spring of 2007, Madl was selected as an assistant coach for the U.S. under-16 Olympic Development Select/Futures Elite Team that competed at the International Easter Tournament held in Holland. She also has been active at Futures Development Invitational Camp and "B"-camp.

Madl is a native of Mountaintop, Pa., where she starred in field hockey, basketball and softball at Crestwood High School. She is the daughter of Ruth Ann and David Madl.
