**THIS WEEK'S GAMES...** The Providence College Friars will host the Boston University Terriers on Saturday, February 11 at Schneider Arena at 1:00 p.m. The very next day, the Friars travel to Durham, N.H. to face the UNH Wildcats on Sunday, February 12 at the Whittemore Center. Face-off is slated for 2:00 p.m.

**FRIARS Vs. BU TERRIERS...** In 17 all-time meetings, the Providence College Friars hold a 16-1 record in the all-time series dating back to the 1976-77 season. On November 19, 2005, the Friars shutout the Terriers for the seventh time, 4-0, at PC's Schneider Arena. Most recently, Providence suffered its first loss to BU, 2-1, on December 3, 2005 at Walter Brown Arena.

**FRIARS Vs. No. 1 UNH WILDCATS...** In 114 all-time meetings, the Providence College Friars hold a 40-64-10 record in the all-time series dating back to the 1976-77 season. The Friars fell to UNH twice this season, despite taking a 1-0 in the first period in both losses. The Friars are 3-6-1 versus New Hampshire in their last 10 meetings.

**FRIARS ON THE AIRWAVES...** PC's women's ice hockey home games are broadcasted on the radio this season on WARL 1320 AM The Drive. In addition, the Friars will be featured as the USCHO.com Game of the Week on February 19 against Boston College at 2:00 p.m.

**FIRST PERIOD FRIARS...** The Friars are +19 in first period scoring as they have scored 33 goals and allowed only 14. Providence has outshot its opponents by 79, as the Friars have unleashed 292 shots and allowed only 213.

## 2005-06 Providence College Women's Hockey Notes

**SCOUTING PROVIDENCE...**The Providence College women's ice hockey team posted a 2-1 record last week. The Friars suffered a 2-1 loss to No. 2 New Hampshire on Wednesday, February 1 at Schneider Arena. The Friars defeated Vermont, 4-1 on Saturday, February 4 and 5-1 on Sunday, February 5. Senior Ashley Payton (Chesterfield, Mo.) assisted junior Kristin Gigliotti (Sauquoit, N.Y.) on the lone goal for the Friars versus the Wildcats. On Saturday, Watrous led the Friars with two points, including the game winner at 11:52 of the first period. Freshmen Katy Beach (Middlebury Heights, Ohio), Maura Grainger (Ithaca, N.Y.) and Stephanie Morris (South Burlington, Vt.) each notched a goal in the win. Freshman Stacey Scott (Massena, N.Y.) posted 18 saves in net for the Friars. On Sunday, senior Katelynn Laffin (Norwell, Mass.) led the Friars with a single game career-high four points on two goals and two assists. Watrous enjoyed a three-point effort with two goals and one assist. Freshman Rachel Crissy (Naperville, Ill.) posted her first career short-handed goal, which proved to be the game winner at 3:34 of the first period. Junior Lauren Florio (North Providence, R.I.) recorded 16 saves in net for the Friars.

**SCOUTING BOSTON UNIVERSITY...**The Boston University Terriers are on a five-game losing streak. Most recently, the Terriers fell to Harvard, 2-1, in overtime in the First Round of the 2006 Beanpot. BU's last victory was a 3-0 home shutout against Connecticut on January 15. BU is led by freshmen Laurel Koller (12 goals, 13 assists) and Gina Kearns (11 goals, 14 assists) each with 25 points.

**SCOUTING NEW HAMPSHIRE...**The University of New Hampshire (23-2-1) is currently riding a 19-game unbeaten streak which began with a 5-2 win at Yale on Sunday, November 13. Most recently, the Wildcats ran off with a 6-1 win at Boston College on February 4. Sam Faber (one goal, two assists) and Jennifer Hitchcock (two goals, one assist) led all scorers with three points each. With only seven league games remaining in the regular season, top-ranked New Hampshire (12-1-1) sits atop the HOCKEY EAST standings with 25 points. The Wildcats are led by Hitchcock with 38 points on 17 goals and 21 assists. Sade Wright-Ward follows with 33 points on 19 goals and 14 assists.

**FRIARS Vs. HOCKEY EAST...**The Friars have a 9-4-2 record and are in third place in the HOCKEY EAST standings with 20 points. In three of the four league losses, the Friars scored only one goal. In all nine league victories, the Friars scored at least four goals. Both league ties were against Maine.

**'FOUR' THE RECORD...**13 of the Friars' 15 wins have come when PC scores four goals or more. The two exceptions were a 3-1 victory vs. Yale on Nov. 25 and a 2-1 win vs. No. 7 Princeton on Jan. 2.

**SHORT-HANDED THATCHER...**Senior Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) is second in the nation with four short-handed goals. Thatcher single-handedly tied the 2004-05 Friars' short-handed goal output of last season in only nine games.

**GIGLIOTTI GOING FOR THE GOAL...**Junior defenseman Kristin Gigliotti (Sauquoit, N.Y.) leads the nation's defensemen averaging 1.14 points per game. Gigliotti leads the nation's defenders with 32 total points and goals scored with 15. She is the nation's only defender to register double-digit goals scored.

**FRIARS FOR MULTIPPOINT CONTESTS...**The Friars are 15-0-0 this season, winning all of their games, when any player scores two or more points.

## FRIAR NATIONAL TOP-10 LIST...

**(1st)** - Junior Kristin Gigliotti leads the nation amongst defenders with 1.14 points per game.

**(2nd)** - Senior Karen Thatcher is second in the nation with four short-handed goals.

**(2nd)** - Providence is second in the nation with 16.5 penalty minutes per game. The Friars are second in the nation with 463 total minutes.

**(4th)** - Karen Thatcher is fourth in the nation with 0.86 assists per game.

**(T4th)** - Junior Sonny Watrous is tied for fourth in the nation with five game-winning goals.

**(5th)** - Karen Thatcher is fifth in the nation in scoring with 1.46 points per game.

**(6th)** - Junior Kristin Gigliotti is tied for sixth in the nation with seven power-play goals as she averages 0.25 per game.

**(6th)** - Providence is ranked sixth in the nation in scoring offense with 3.29 goals per game.

**(7th)** - Providence is seventh in the nation with a 20.4% power play percentage going 37-for-181.

**(10th)** - Providence is 10th in the nation with a combined special teams percentage of 52.3, going 193-for-369.

**(T10th)** - Karen Thatcher is tied for 10th in the nation with six power play goals.

**THATCHER ON A SCORING RAMPAGE...**Senior captain Karen Thatcher is third in the nation in scoring with 41 points (17 goals, 24 assists) and fifth with 1.46 points per game. She is one of only three student-athletes to reach the 40-point mark this season. Thatcher trails Wisconsin's Sara Bauer (19 goals, 23 assists) and St. Lawrence's Sabrina Harbec (18 goals, 30 assists) with 42 and 48 points, respectively.

**BALANCED SCORING THREAT...**Providence is the only HOCKEY EAST team to have every forward and defender on the roster to register a point. Senior netminder Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) recorded an assist this season in a 4-2 loss to Clarkson on Sunday, November 6. The only two student-athletes on the roster that have not tallied a point are goalies junior Lauren Florio (North Providence, R.I.) and freshman Stacey Scott (Massena, N.Y.).

**TWO FRIARS IN 30-POINT RANGE ...**Juniors Sonny Watrous (14 goals, 19 assists) and junior Kristin Gigliotti (15 goals, 17 assists) both have reached the 30-point mark in only 28 games. Watrous is second on the team with 33 points, while Gigliotti is third with 32 points. Senior Karen Thatcher leads all with 41 points on 17 goals and 24 assists. Senior Ashley Payton is nearing the 30-point mark with 28 points on 11 goals and 17 assists.

**SMITH AMONGST NATION'S TOP DEFENSIVE SCORERS...**Sophomore defender Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) is fifth on the team and 14th in the nation in scoring amongst defenders with 18 points on five goals and 13 assists. Her 18 points is second best amongst sophomore defenders in the nation. Sophomore Annie Guay (four goals, 21 assists) of St. Lawrence leads the sophomore class defenders with 25 points.

**SHUT UP OR SHUTOUT...**Bugden recorded 10 saves and her 12<sup>th</sup> career shutout in the 4-0 win over Boston University on Saturday, November 19. Bugden's last shutout decision was a 3-0 win over New Hampshire in the 2004 HOCKEY EAST Finals on March 21 in Boston, Mass.
