THIS WEEKEND... The Friars return from winter break with a two-game series against the Purple Eagles of Niagara University on January 4 and 5. To open the second half of the season, the Friar will play four straight games versus teams from the CHA conference.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS NIAGARA... The Friars hold a 10-4-3 record all-time versus the Golden Eagles, dating back to the team's first meeting on February 27, 1999. The Friars won 2-1 on that day in Providence, R.I. Under head coach Bob Deraney, the Friars hold a 8-4-3 mark versus Niagara. The Friars currently have a two game winning streak versus Niagara. Last season, the Friars earned a 4-0 victory versus the Purple Eagles. Current junior Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) led the Friar attack, as she notched two goals, including the game-winner. Classmate Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) also scored in the Friar victory.

SCOUTING THE PURPLE EAGLES... Entering the weekend, Niagara has posted a 6-8-4 overall record, and a 0-2-0 mark in conference play. Most recently Niagara played in the Nutmeg Classic on December 29 and 30. On the 29, the Purple Eagles tied Yale 4-4. Then on December 30, they tied Quinnipiac 3-3. In the tournament, junior forward Ashley Riggs led the Niagara offense with four goals in two games. For the season, Riggs leads the team in goals (16) and points (21). Sophomore Mary McKinnon and senior Shannon Moulson are tied for the team lead in assists with nine apiece. In net, sophomore Jill Zelonis and junior Nikki Rudy have split time between the pipes. Zelonis has posted a 3-4-3 record to go with a .883 save percentage and a 3.18 goals against average. Rudy has a 3-4-1 record, a .878 save percentage, and a 4.15 goals against average.

FRIARS VERSUS THE CHA... The Friars will play four straight contests versus teams from the College Hockey America conference. In the Friars' only game versus a CHA team thus far, PC defeated Robert Morris by a score of 7-1 on November 25. The Friars' all-time record versus the CHA stands at 18-9-4, good for a .645 winning percentage.

THREE IS THE KEY... In each Friar victory thus far, PC has scored three or more goals. Overall, the Friars have scored three or more goals in eight of their 16 games. In the eight games in which they have scored three or more goals, the Friars have posted a 6-1-1 record. In games in which they have not scored three goals, they have a 0-7-1 mark.

DEFENSEMEN SCORING... In HOCKEY EAST play, senior Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) ranks tied for first in defensemen scoring with six points (2 Goals, 4 Assists). Freshman Amber Yung (Rockville, Va.) ranks tied for third with five points (5 Assists), and Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) ranks tied for seventh with four points (1 Goal, 4 Assists).

ROOKIE RANKS... In HOCKEY EAST play, freshman forward Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) ranks tied for first in goals with seven. Ruff also ranks tied for third in PPG's with three... Freshman defenseman Amber Yung (Rockville, Va.) ranks tied for sixth in assists in HE play with five... Freshman Jean O'Neill (Strafford Pa.) is one of two freshmen to have notched a short-handed goal in HE play this season... Among freshmen, Ruff ranks second in points (7), Yung ranks tied for fourth (5 points), and O'Neill ranks tied for ninth (4 points)... Ruff is one of two Hockey East skaters to have notched a hat-trick this season, along with Vermont's Kate Lesniak.

SCORING DISTRIBUTION... Of the 20 Friar skaters who have suited up this season, 17 have recorded at least one point (85%). Additionally, 14 have scored at least one goal.

GRANATO HONORED... The NHL honored former Friar great Cammi Granato '93 as a 2007 recipient of the Lester Patrick Award. Given annually, the award is one of the most prestigious in all of hockey. Granato, PC's all-time leading point and goal scorer was given the award at a luncheon on November 7. Granato has the distinction of being the first individual female recipient of the award. In addition, Granato will be inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame on February 16, 2008.

SKATING STRIDES... The Friars will face the Northeastern Huskies at 2:00 p.m. in Schneider Arena in a game that is part of Skating Strides 2008, an event to raise money to fight breast cancer. Skating Strides 2008 is a two-day event raising both awareness and dollars in the fight against breast cancer. The Women's Ice Hockey team is excited to announce that the first 500 fans in attendance on Sunday, February 17 will receive a free Friar Mr. Potato Head toy. All eight women's HOCKEY EAST teams will participate in Skating Strides 2008. Providence College and Northeastern will participate in the event on both February 16 and 17. Mari Pehkonen was credited with an assist on the play. Then at 15:32 the Friars struck again as Pehkonen netted a goal off of an assist from Feldman.
