**LATEST RESULTS...** With two games at home this past weekend, the Friars were able to add one more win to their season stats. On October 25, PC hosted Boston College to Schneider Arena but fell, 3-1. Providence got on board first at 12:07 of the initial period. Freshman Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.) netted her first career goal for the Friars. The short-handed tally was assisted by senior Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio). The goal remained unanswered until the final period when the Eagles were able to slide in three unanswered goals to remain undefeated. The Friars' netminder, Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario), finished the game with a total of 27 saves but fell to 2-3 on the season. On Sunday, October 26, the Friars were able to bounce back from the loss to earn their second Hockey East victory against the University of Maine, 4-2. The Friars put over 50 shots (51) on goal for the first time since shooting 65 on net in a 7-2 victory over Maine on December 1, 2007. At 12:05 of the second period, Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) netted the game winner, her second of the game. The Friars also saw goals from Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) and Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario). PC netminder Danielle Ciarletta finished with 22 saves to earn her first conference victory as she improved to 1-2-0 overall and 1-1-0 in Hockey East play.

**HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN...** The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. In the two games this past weekend, Laura Veharanta registered her fifth and sixth goals of the season. She now leads the team in points (7), goals (6), and power-play goals (5). Kate Bacon scored her first career goal against Boston College on October 25. Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) scored a highlight reel goal while defending a penalty in the 6-2 victory over Colgate on October 11. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored in the 3-2 defeat at the hands of Ohio State on October 4. Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse was able to tack on a second victory to her first season at PC in the 4-2 win at Vermont on October 19. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 47% (9 of 19) of the goals scored this season while contributing 33% (15 of 45) of the team's points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Bacon and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play unit as well.

**FIRSTS...** Freshman Kate Bacon tallied the first goal of her career on Saturday, October 25 in the 3-1 loss to Boston College. The feisty forward put home the short-handed goal off a rebound. Junior Arianna Rigano netted her first goal in Providence colors in the 4-2 victory over Vermont on Sunday, October 19. Freshman Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper in the game as well.

time record against the Terriers. Last year, PC won the season series, 2-1, over BU. The Friars were defeated in the final game against the Terriers 3-1. Goaltender Danielle Ciarletta recorded 21 saves. In the two victories over Boston University in 2007, the Friars outscored the Terriers, 7-4. In the three contests, Katy Beach netted one game-winning goal and two assists.

**SCOUTING THE TERRIERS...** Boston University comes into Saturday's contest ranked #8 in the country with a season record of 5-2-2. They are 3-0 in Hockey East action. On Saturday, October 25, BU defeated Maine, 8-1. The Terriers were led by sophomore Lauren Cherewyk who registered the third hat trick in program history. On Thursday, October 30, Boston University traveled to Durham, N.H. to take on the fifth-ranked WildCats. The game ended in a 2-2 tie before BU defeated UNH, 2-0, in a shootout. The Terriers saw goals from Caroline Bourdeau and Jenelle Kohanchuk. Alyse Wilcox stopped 34 shots to improve to 3-1-2 and 1-0-1 in Hockey East play.

**BU BETWEEN THE PIPES...** Senior Alyse Wilcox has started six games on the season and currently stands at 3-1-2 and 1-0-1 in Hockey East. She ranks fifth in the conference in goals against average (1.95) and save percentage (.931). The Terriers have also looked towards junior Melissa Haber in three contests this season. She owns a 2-1 record while posting a 2.02 goals against average to go with a stellar .925 save percentage.

**QUICK HITS...** Among all Hockey East freshman, Laura Veharanta ranks first with six goals scored on the season. She also leads the conference with five power-play goals. Veharanta's five power-play goals are tied for the most in the nation. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse ranks fourth in save percentage (9.33) and total saves (152) among Hockey East goaltenders. Senior Danielle Cairletta is currently fourth in Hockey East with a 1.70 goals against average. Providence power play percentage (17.9) is third in the conference.

**FRIARS VS. THE NATIONAL POWERS...**

Providence is looking for it's first win against a nationally ranked opponent this season. The Friars lost by identical scores of 3-1 to #7 St. Lawrence and #8 Boston College. Last season PC went 3-7-1 against ranked opponents.

**MILESTONES...** Senior Mari Pehkonen's next game will be her 100th career game played.

Pehkonen transferred to Providence following her freshman campaign at the Univeristy of Minnesota-Duluth. The Tampere, Finland native has played in 72 games for the Friars. Over her career the talented forward has registered 37 goals and 30 assists for 67 points.

**STEPHANIE O'SULLIVAN HONORED...**

The former Friar great (1991-95) will be inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Hall of Fame on Wednesday, November 19 at Lombardo's in Randolph, Mass. O'Sullivan finished her amazing career with Providence ranked 1st in assists (127), 2nd in goals (126), and 2nd in total points (253). O'Sullivan was named to the ECAC All-Star Team as a sophomore, junior and senior. In 1995, O'Sullivan was named ECAC Player of the Year and New England Hockey Writers Player of the Year. She was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year in 1992. O'Sullivan was also named to the ECAC All-Decade Second Team. She served as a member of several U.S. National Teams from 1993-2001.
