LATEST RESULTS... Providence traveled to New Haven, Conn. on Tuesday December 30 to drop the puck on the second half of the season and fell to the Bulldogs of Yale, 2-1, in overtime. Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) netted her team-leading eighth power-play goal of the season, 13th overall, in the second period. Classmate Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) and senior Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) each registered their 10th assists on the play. The Friars went up, 1-0, on Veharanta's goal but the lead would not last as Yale netted the game tying goal in the third. The two teams went into overtime before Yale would score the game winner just 14 seconds in. The loss snapped the Friars' four-game unbeaten streak. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) denied 34 shots in the game as her record now stands at 8-5-0 on the season.

HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN... The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. Veharanta netted the lone goal for the Friars in the 2-1 overtime defeat at Yale on Tuesday, December 30. She continues to lead the team in points (19), goals (13), and power-play goals (8). Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse earned her second shutout as a Friar on Saturday, November 29 in the 1-0 victory over Brown. Her first shutout came in a dominant performance on Sunday, November 16 against UConn. Lacasse stopped 30 shots and earned the first shutout by a PC freshman in almost five years. For her efforts, she was named Mission Rookie of the Week for the week of Nov. 17. She has started 13 games while posting a 1.63 goals against average to go along with a .949 save percentage. Kate Bacon netted her second short-handed goal of the season, giving her four overall against UConn. Ashley Cottrell registered four assists in the 5-2 victory over RMU on Saturday, November 8. Her four assists were the most in one game by a Friar since Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) registered four against Northeastern on February 17, 2008. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 45.5% (20 of 44) of the goals scored this year while contributing 39.8% (43 of 108) of the team's total points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Bacon and defensemen Christie Jensen (Delta, B.C.) and Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play units as well.

FIRSTS... Senior captain Brittany Simpson netted her first goal of the season in the 4-1 victory over Maine on December 6. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse tallied an assist against Brown in the 14th annual Mayor's Cup on November 29. The assist was the first by a Friar netminder since Jana Bugden recorded the feat on March 4, 2006. Lacasse earned her first shutout on Sunday, November 16, making 30 saves in the 2-0 victory. Kate Bacon tallied the first goal of her career on Saturday, October 25. The feisty forward put home the short-handed goal off a rebound. Junior Arianna Rigano netted her first goal in Providence colors in the 4-2 victory over Vermont

on Sunday, October 19. Freshman Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper in the game as well. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored against Ohio State on October 4.

THE ALL-TIME SERIES... Providence owns a 32-3-1 record all-time against Cornell. In their last meeting, the Friars defeated the Big Red, 3-1, on January 2, 2007 at Schneider Arena.

SCOUTING THE BIGRED... Cornell comes into this weekend's series after earning a 4-4 draw with conference foe # 3 St. Lawrence on December 6. The Big Red now stands at 6-5-2. Sophomore Rebecca Johnston registered a hat-trick to lead Cornell. Junior Netminder Jennie Niesluchowski stopped 27 shots in the contest. Johnston leads the team with 12 goals and 11 assists for 23 points. Her 2.30 points per game is good for the top spot in the nation.

CORNELL BETWEEN THE PIPES... The Big Red have split the netminding duties this year between Niesluchowski and sophomore Kayle Strong. Niesluchowski has started seven games while posting a 3.13 goals against average to go with a .897 save percentage. Strong stands at 3-2-1 with a 2.12 goals against average.

QUICK HITS... Among all Hockey East freshmen, Laura Veharanta ranks first with 13 goals scored on the season. She also leads the conference with eight power-play goals. Veharanta's eight power-play goals are good for the number two spot in the nation. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse ranks second in save percentage (.949) among Hockey East goaltenders.

CIARLETTA CLIMBS THE LEADERBOARD... Coming into this weekend's games, senior netminder Danielle Ciarletta stands at fifth place with 52 games played defending the Friar cage. She only needs three more appearances to tie assistant coach Amy Quinlan (55) for fourth all-time. Ciarletta's 1142 career saves place her fourth all-time while her 2.23 goals against average is tied for seventh all time.

STEPHANIE O'SULLIVAN HONORED... The former Friar great (1991-95) as inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Hall of Fame on Wednesday, November 19. O'Sullivan finished her amazing career with Providence ranked first in assists (127), second in goals (126), and second in total points (253). She was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year in 1992. O'Sullivan was also named to the ECAC All-Decade Second Team. She served as a member of several U.S. National Teams from 1993-2001.
