**THIS WEEKEND...** The Friars hit the road for a pair of away games as they begin Hockey East play. PC will face off against Northeastern on Saturday at 1:00 p.m. before traveling to Vermont for a 3:00 p.m. contest. Providence is looking to build on their success from its 6-2 victory over Colgate last weekend. The Friars exploded for six goals to earn their first victory of the season. In a game that saw 26 penalties called, the Friars capitalized with four power-play goals and one short-handed score. Senior Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) tallied two goals on the night while freshman goaltender Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) made 42 saves to earn the victory, the first of her career. Providence also received goals from Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.), Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) and Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.). On Friday, the Friars fell to No. 7 St. Lawrence, 3-1. Lacasse registered 26 saves while Veharanta scored the lone goal for the Friars.

**HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN...** The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. In the two games this past weekend, Laura Veharanta registered her second and third goals of the season. Both were power-play tallies. Ashley Cottrell scored a highlight reel goal while defending a penalty in Saturday's 6-2 victory over Colgate. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored in the 3-2 defeat at the hands of Ohio State on October 4. Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse earned the first victory of her career against Colgate as she stopped 42 shots in the game. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 50% (5 of 10) of the goals scored this season. Veharanta, Cottrell, Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.) and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play unit as well.

**PROVIDENCE VERSUS NORTHEASTERN...** The Friars own a 54-36-9 all-time record against the Huskies. In the last meeting between the two Hockey East foes on February 18, 2008, the Friars hosted Northeastern and handed the Huskies an 8-3 defeat. Alyse Ruff notched her second hat-trick of the season with all three goals coming in the third period. In the three contests last season, there were 24 goals scored between the two teams with PC scoring 16. PC is 18-2 against the Huskies in the last 20 meetings. Saturday's game is the Huskies' 2008-09 home opener. Northeastern is 21-4-3 all-time in home openers, with their only losses coming in 2006-07, 1999-00, 1985-86, and 1981-82, four seasons over which the Huskies went a combined 49-47-8 (.510). When the Huskies win or tie their home opener, they are a combined 422-242-53 (.625).

**SCOUTING THE HUSKIES...** Northeastern comes into Saturday's game undefeated, as the Huskies are 2-0-2 in 2008. Northeastern earned a 3-2 victory over Rensselaer on the third of October before defeating Union, 6-0, on October 4.

Against Rensselaer, Alyssa Wohlfeiler tallied two goals and one assist. In the 6-0 victory over Union, sophomore forward Kristi Kehoe recorded a hat-trick while Colleen Sanborn added two goals. For her efforts, Kehoe was named TPS Player of the Week. The Huskies then recorded 0-0 and 2-2 draws as they traveled to Bemidji State for a weekend series.

**HUSKY NETMINDERS...** Florence Schelling, a Northeastern freshman and five-year veteran of the Swiss National team, is already contributing for the Huskies and turning heads across the Hockey East. After earning a win in her first career start against Rensselaer, Schelling blanked the Bemidji State Beavers through regulation and overtime, making 40 saves on the way to her first career shutout. The effort earned her Hockey East's Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week Honor on Oct. 13. She is the second Husky to earn conference honors this season, after sophomore forward Kristi Kehoe was named Hockey East Player of the Week Oct. 6.

**PROVIDENCE VS. VERMONT...** The Friars hold a 16-1-0 record all-time against the Catamounts. In the three games last season, the Friars outscored Vermont, 8-6, as they won by scores of 4-2, 3-2 and lost by a score of 2-1. The 2-1 victory on January 26 was Vermont's first-ever victory against the Friars.
