THIS WEEKEND... The Friars return to conference action this weekend with two Hockey East games. On Saturday, January 19 the Friars will travel to Durham, N.H. to face No. 1 New Hampshire at 2:00 p.m. at UNH's Whittemore Center. Then the Friars will host Boston University for a 2:00 p.m. game at Schneider Arena on Sunday, January 20. Sunday's game will be broadcast online by USCHO as the game of the week, and can be accessed by clicking on the link found on the right-hand side of the women's homepage at: www.uscho.com/women

PROVIDENCE VERSUS NEW HAMPSHIRE... The Friars hold a 40-65-10 record all-time versus the Wildcats, dating back to the team's first meeting during the 1976-77 season when UNH beat the Friars, 4-3, at Schneider Arena. The Friars are winless in their last seven games versus the Wildcats, though they were able to tie UNH 2-2 on January 28 of last season at the Whittemore Center. Current junior Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) scored a goal in that game, while classmate Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) made 40 saves. The two teams most recently met in the 2007 Hockey East Championship game. UNH came out on top, earning a hard fought 3-1 victory that was in the balance until the Wildcats scored an empty net goal with 26 seconds left. Normore had the lone Friar goal.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS... UNH has posted a 20-3-0 overall record, and a 10-0-0 mark in Hockey East play. Most recently, New Hampshire played Dartmouth on Thursday, January 17 and they were able to beat the Big Green 3-1. For the season, UNH's offensive attack has been led by forwards Sam Faber and Sadie Wright-Ward. Faber has 33 points (17 goals, 16 assists) while Wright-Ward has 27 points (15 goals, 12 assists). Senior forward Leah Craig leads UNH with 19 assists. In net, freshman Kayley Herman has played in 21 games, recording 18-2-0 record, a 1.16 goals against average and a .934 save percentage.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS BOSTON UNIVERSITY... The Friars hold a 19-2-0 record all-time versus the Terriers, dating back to 1980-81 season when the Friars defeated BU by a score of 13-1 in Boston, Mass. Last season, the Friars posted a 2-1-0 record against BU. In PC's last meeting with the Terriers, BU came out with a 3-1 home victory. Current junior goaltender Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) got the start in PC's second game versus the Terriers last season, leading the Friars to a 4-2 victory, making 29 saves.

SCOUTING THE TERRIERS... Entering the weekend, BU has posted a 7-9-2 overall record and a 4-3-0 record in Hockey East play. Before facing off against the Friars, BU will host Connecticut on Saturday, January 19. The BU attack has been led by Melissa Anderson (seven goals, seven assists), Erin Seman (five goals, nine assists) and Jillian Kirchner (three goals, 11 assists) who are all tied for the team lead with 14 points. In net, junior Allyse Wilcox has played in 12 games, posting a 6-5-1 record, a 1.77 goals against average and a .929 save percentage.

JUST KILLING TIME... The Friar penalty kill unit has killed off 27 of the last 28 power-play chances it has faced, including nine kills versus Niagara University on January 4. Overall PC has killed 104 of 119 opponent power-plays, good for tenth best in the nation at 87.4 percent. PC's Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) has also notched a short-handed goal.

POINT STREAK... Friar defenseman Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) had a six game point scoring streak until Mercyhurst kept her off the board on January 13. During her career-high six game streak, Smith notched five goals and added six assists for eleven points. Smith, who leads the Friars in scoring, ranks first among Hockey East defensemen in scoring as well with nine goals and 11 assists for 20 points.

SCORING DISTRIBUTION... Of the 19 Friar skaters who have suited up this season, 18 have recorded at least one point (95%). Additionally, 15 have scored at least one goal.

SKATING STRIDES... The Friars will face the Northeastern Huskies at 2:00 p.m. at Schneider Arena in a game as part of Skating Strides 2008 on February 17, an event to raise money to fight breast cancer. Skating Strides 2008 is a two-day event raising both awareness and dollars in the fight against breast cancer. The women's ice hockey team is excited to announce that the first 500 fans in attendance on Sunday, February 17 will receive a free Friar Mr. Potato Head toy. All eight women's HOCKEY EAST teams will participate in Skating Strides 2008. This event is a great chance for student-athletes to give something back to the communities in which they study and play hockey. Fans are encouraged to participate in merchandise sales, raffles, auctions, and/or special events during the games. All of the proceeds from Skating Strides 2008 will be donated to breast cancer charities. The inaugural Skating Strides 2007 raised over \$20,000. LUCKY SEVENS... Versus the Colonials of Robert Morris, the Friars posted a 7-1 victory on November 25. Then, in their next game, the Friars defeated Maine by a score of 7-2 on December 1. It marked the first time the Friars have scored seven goals in back-to-back games since the 2002-2003 season. Seven goals are the most the Friars have scored this season in one game. Most recently, the Friars defeated Mercyhurst by a score of 7-3 on January 12. Prior to this year, the last time the Friars scored seven or more goals was February 4, 2007 versus Vermont when PC was able to put ten goals on the board. The Friars are undefeated when scoring seven or more goals under head coach Bob Deraney, posting a 22-0-0 record.



Katheeln Smith helped the Friars score seven goals against Mercyhurst, as she had two goals and two assists.

CIARLETTA EARNS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS... It was announced by the Hockey East Association on Monday, January 14 that women's ice hockey player Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) was named the Hockey East's Defensive Player of the Week. Ciarletta helped the Friars split a series with No. 4 Mercyhurst this past weekend. It marks the second time this season, and the fourth time in her career, that Ciarletta has earned Defensive Player of the Week honors. Ciarletta led the Friars to a 7-3 victory versus Mercyhurst on January 12, as she made 35 saves. A day later, in PC's 3-0 loss to the Lakers, Ciarletta made a season high 44 saves. On the week-



end, she stopped 79 of the 84 shots she faced. In 2008, which includes two games versus Niagara and two games versus Mercyhurst, Ciarletta has stopped 119 of the 124 shots she has faced, and posted a 1.25 GAA and a .960 save percentage.

CIARLETTA GOES BACK-TO-BACK... Junior goalie Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) shutout Niagara in back-to-back games. It marked her second and third shutouts of the season. Additionally, she became the first HE goalie to record consecutive shutouts this season, and the first Friar to do so since Ciarletta's former teammate Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) blanked Northeastern on March 6 and 7 during the 2003-04 season. Overall, Ciarletta has not been scored upon in her last 150:05 of play in the Friar net.

THREE IS THE KEY... In each Friar victory thus far, PC has scored three or more goals. Overall, the Friars have scored three or more goals in 11 of their 20 games. In the 11 games in which they have scored three or more goals, the Friars have posted a 9-1-1 record.



FINISH DUTY... Friar forward Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) has recently returned from playing in the European Air Canada Cup for Team Finland. Over the course of the U-22 tournament, Pehkonen scored a goal and added four assists. Pehkonen and her Finish teammates made it to the championship game but could not knock off Canada, losing by a score of 7-5 to secure the Silver Medal.

DERANEY WINS GOLD... The U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team captured the first-ever gold medal awarded at the inaugural 2008 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's U-18 Championship with a 5-2 victory over Canada. Head Coach Bob Deraney helped lead Team USA to the victory, as he was an assistant coach for the team. Also on the team are future Friars Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.) and Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.). Cottrell finished the tournament as Team USA's third leading scorer, with ten points (five goals and five assists) in five games played. Bacon added three goals in five games played for Team USA as well.

GRANATO HONORED... The NHL honored former Friar great Cammi Granato '93 as a 2007 recipient of the Lester Patrick Award. Given annually, the award is one of the most prestigious in all of hockey. Granato, PC's all-time leading point and goal scorer was given the award at a luncheon on November 7. Granato has the distinction of being the first individual female recipient of the award. In addition, Granato will be inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame on February 16, 2008.



FIRSTS... Sophomore Pamela McDevitt (So. Boston, Mass.) scored her first goal as a Friar against Mercyhurst on January 12, 2008... Freshman Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) notched her first career assist versus Maine on December 1.... Freshman Amber Yung (Rockville, Va.) notched her first career goal versus Robert Morris University on November 25... O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) notched her first career goal as a Friar versus Northeastern on November 6, as did senior Danielle Tangredi (London, Ont.). Freshman Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) notched her first collegiate goal (and point) versus Colgate on October 19. Her goal tied the game at 2-2. A day later, classmate Jennifer Smith (St. Albans, Vt.) saw her first action in net for the Friars, making four saves in over 24 minutes of work against St. Lawrence. Most recently, freshman Amber Yung notched her first career point versus Boston College, as she assisted on PC's game-winner, while Smith earned her first career victory.

Orono, Maine- The women's ice hockey team opened the 2007-08 season with a 2-2 overtime tie at the University of Maine. Seniors Rachel Crissy and Sarah Feldman led the way for the Friars with a goal apiece. The Friars jumped out to an early lead as they were able to net two goals in the game's first three minutes. Crissy put the Friars on the board when she scored on a pass from classmate Kathleen Smith at 1:09 of the first period. Then, less than two minutes later, Feldman put the Friars up 2-0, with her first power-play tally of the young season. Feldman's goal was assisted by Erin Normore and Smith. The Friars continued to pressure the Black Bears as they outshot their opponents 20-7 in the first period. After two periods of play, the Friars held a 2-0 lead, as they were unable to beat Maine goalkeeper Genevieve Turgeon. But Maine cut PC's lead in half when Taryn Peacock scored an unassisted goal at the 17:10 mark of the third period. With 22 seconds left, Maine pulled Turgeon in favor of an extra attacker, and it paid off as Vanessa Vani was able to force overtime when she scored with nine seconds remaining in the third period. Storrs, Conn. - The women's ice hockey team was defeated at the hands of No. 8 Connecticut on Thursday night. The Huskies jumped out to an early lead as Jody Sydor scored a power play goal 59 seconds into the game off of a shot from the top of the left face-off circle that beat PC's Danielle Ciarletta. Moments later, Ciarletta flashed her left pad to keep the Friars within one, as UConn's Dominique Thibault's shot was turned aside by PC's junior goalkeeper. Ciarletta made another save on a Thibault break away attempt at 10:39. But UConn was able to add a second goal when Brittany Murphy scored an unassisted goal at 14:13. Mari Pehkonen had the Friars' best chance from the bottom of the circles at 15:56, but Connecticut's Brittany Wilson made a glove save. After one period of play, the Huskies held a 2-0 lead.
