**THIS WEEKEND...** The Friars enter the second to last weekend of regular season HOCKEY EAST play in possession of the fourth and final HOCKEY EAST playoff spot. This weekend, Providence has a home-and-home series versus the ninth ranked Eagles of Boston College. BC and PC are separated by one point in the league standings.

**FRIARS VERSUS BOSTON COLLEGE...** Providence holds a 47-6-0 record all-time versus Boston College. Most recently, the Friars snapped a three game losing streak against the Eagles when they defeated BC at Schneider Arena on December 3, by a score of 3-2. Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) scored the game-winner for he Friars at the 7:34 mark of the third period. Head coach Bob Deraney holds a 20-5-0 record against the Eagles while at Providence.

**SCOUTING THE EAGLES....** On Tuesday, February 13, Boston College defeated Boston University to win the 29th annual Women's Beanpot Tournament at Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Beanpot Championship was BC's second in a row. Sophomore Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, Kan.) led the Eagles to the victory as she registered a hat-trick and an assist versus BU. For the season, BC has been led in scoring by freshman Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, Ohio), who has 44 points on 14 goals and 30 assists. Classmate Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, Minn.) is second on the team with a team leading 23 goals and 13 assists for 36 points. In all, the Eagles have four players who have scored more than thirty points. In net freshman Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.) has seen the majority of the minutes and has posted a 16-8-2 record, with a GAA of 1.91 and a save percentage of .929. She was also named the most outstanding goaltender of the Beanpot, as she stopped 99 of the 103 shots she faced in the tournament.

**HOCKEY EAST LEADERS....** The Friars have several players who are leading the HOCKEY EAST in various statistical categories. Senior goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) leads the HE in save percentage with a .940 mark. Senior defenseman Kristin Gigliotti (Sauguit, N.Y.) has register the most points by a defenseman, as she has eight goals and 13 assists for 21 points in 17 HE games played. Gigliotti and junior Sarah Feldman (Fall River, Mass.) are tied for first in the HE with 12 power-play points apiece. Fedlman has recorded five goals and seven assists while on the power-play, while Gigliotti has scored two goals and added ten assists while playing with the man advantage.

**WATROUS MOVING ON UP....** After scoring her tenth goal of the season versus BU on 2/10, senior forward Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) has now scored 10 or more goals and 27 or more points in each of her four seasons at Providence. She has also moved into the Friar's top 20 all-time point scorers, as her 133 career points puts her at 17th on PC's all-time points leaders list.

Game-Winning Goal in CAPS

**Providence, R.I.** - The Providence College women's ice hockey team defeated the 10th ranked Eagles of Boston College, 3-2 at Schneider Arena on Sunday, December 3. Sophomore Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) tallied the game-winner at 7:34 in the third period on a power play goal. After a scoreless first period, Boston College tallied the games first goal with a score from freshman Megan Keever (Harrisburg, Pa.). The Friars quickly responded with a goal of their own 44 seconds later. Junior Rachel Chrissy (Naperville, Ill.) registered her first goal of the season on a quick one-timer from sophomore Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ont.). Providence took a 2-1 lead when sophomore Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) found the back of the net by herself on a power play. The goal was Pehkonen's seventh. The Eagles evened the score a 2-2 two minutes into the third period on a goal from sophomore Meghan Fardelmann (Lansing, Kan.) with stellar passes from junior Cristin Stuart (Rochester, Minn.) and freshman Gabrielle Beaudry (Cortland, N.Y.). Providence took the lead for good when Beach took a pass from freshman Jackie Duncan and junior Kathleen Smith and fired it past the Eagle goaltender. The goal was Beach's third on the season. The game ended in an intense fury of action with the Eagles playing with an empty net for the last 1:24. Senior goaltender, Jana Bugden (Cornerbrook, N.L.) made some incredible saves to preserve the 3-2 victory. Bugden finished with 22 saves.

**Boston, Mass.** - The Providence College women's hockey team was defeated by Boston College, 3-1, in the 2006 Hockey East Semifinals at Matthews Arena in Boston, Mass. The Friars suffered their first loss in HOCKEY EAST Tournament history and fall to 33-14 all-time in post-season action. Providence concludes the season with a 17-14-4 overall mark. The Eagles gained redemption from their 9-1 loss in last season's league semifinals round. The Friars conclude the season with a 17-14-4 record. The Friars went one-for-four on the power play and went six-for-six on the penalty kill. PC held the Eagles to only two shots on the penalty kill. Boston College went up 2-0 after the first period. Erin Blood scored the game's first goal at 10:59. Shannon Webster and Becky Zavisza were awarded the assists on the play. At 14:48, Sarah Feldman netted a goal while Deb Spillane and Brie Baskin earned assists. Both teams played hard defensively in the second period as the score was held to a standstill. Zavisza increased the Eagle advantage, 3-0, with a goal at 5:55 of the third period. Webster earned her second assist of the game on the play. At 14:29, the Friars made one last push with a power play goal by sophomore Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario). Boston College switched lines when senior Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) slung the puck to freshman Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) who passed the puck to Smith for the goal. The Friars were outshot 22-18. Bugden posted 19 saves in 57:58 for the Friars, while Alison Quandt of BC recorded 17.

**Chestnut Hill, Mass** - The Providence College women's hockey team (16-12-4, 10-7-2 HOCKEY EAST) was defeated by Boston College (18-9-4, 15-3-1) by the score of 4-2 at Kelley Rink on Sunday afternoon. Junior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) led the Friars with two goals and freshman goalie Stacey Scott (Massena, N.Y.) recorded 17 saves in net. BC's Jill McInnis got the Eagles on the board first as she slapped a shot from inside the right face-off circle at 8:47. Shannon Webster assisted on the play. Junior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) netted her 17th goal of the season at 12:21, two feet away from the goal. Freshman Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) passed the puck to sophomore Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) who slapped it to Watrous for the goal. The Eagles gained the first period advantage with a goal by Deborah Spillane and the right face-off circle at 18:47. Freshmen Brie Baskin and Meghan Fardelmann earned assists on the play. The Friars continued to go back-and-forth in the scoring column in the second period. At 2:31, Lee-J Mirasola scored her first goal of the season with an assist from Sarah Courtney. At 5:59, senior Katelynn Laffin (Norwell, Mass.) and freshman Katey Beach (Middlebury Heights, Ohio) earned assists to Watrous' second goal of the game. Laffin and Beach skated behind the net and passed the puck to each other before slapping it to a streaking Watrous on the left side of the net for the goal. Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.), Sarah Feldman (Fall River, Mass.), and Kristin Gigliotti (Saugoit, N.Y.) are tied for fourth in the league with 13 assists each in HOCKEY EAST play... Gigliotti ranks fifth in the nation in points scored per game among defensemen with a 1.07 rate... Under Bob Deraney, the Friars hold a 38-24-2 record in the month of February... The Friars are the most penalized team in the HOCKEY EAST, with 264 PIM and a 15.5 PMPG average.

### GAMES PLAYED...

Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Saugoit, N.Y.) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) have moved into the top 20 in career games played at Providence College. With 134 games played, Gigliotti currently ranks 10th all-time. Watrous, with 131 games played, ranks 15th all-time.

### SHORT HANDED RESULTS...

After not scoring a short handed goal in the first 27 games of the 2006-2007 season, the Friars were able to net two short handed tallies in a 45 second span versus Vermont on February 4. Senior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) scored the Friars' first SH goal of the season at 8:05 of the third period. 45 seconds later, Brittany Nelson (Shelburne, Vt.) scored Providence's second SH goal.

### FRIARS EXPLODE FOR TEN GOALS...

On February 4, the Friars beat the Catamounts of UVM by a score of 10-1. It marked the first time the Friars scored ten or more goals under head coach Bob Deraney. The Friars last scored ten goals during 1998-99 season, when they beat Colby 10-0.
