THIS WEEKEND... The Friars are the third seed in the sixth annual women's Hockey East Tournament, being played at the Freitas Ice Forum in Storrs, Conn on March 8 and 9. In the semifinal round on Saturday, March 8, Providence will take on second seeded Connecticut at 3:00 p.m. The other semifinal match-up features top seeded New Hampshire versus fourth seeded Boston University at 12:30 p.m. The winners will advance to the Championship game on Sunday, March 9 at 12:30 p.m. Both semifinal games will be broadcast by the B2 Networks (www.b2tv.com), while the finals will be broadcast on NESN, on tape delay at 6:00 p.m. All games involving the Friars will also be internet broadcast through Friars.com.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES... Most recently, Connecticut was swept by New Hampshire on March 1 and 2. At UNH on March 1, UConn dropped a 5-0 decision. A day later, UConn was defeated 6-1 at the Freitas Ice Forum. Dominique Thibault scored the lone Connecticut goal on the weekend. On the season, Thibault leads the UConn offense with 48 points on 24 goals and 24 assists. Jaclyn Hawkins is second on the team with 40 points on 14 goals and a team-high 26 assists. In net, junior Brittany Wilson has played in 27 games, posting a 16-6-4 record as well as a .922 save percentage and a 2.25 goals against average.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS UCONN... The Friars have posted a 1-2-0 record versus the Huskies this season. In their most recent meeting, Providence was able to defeat UConn by a score of 5-3 at Schneider Arena on February 10. Five different Friars scored on that day including Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland), Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario), Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.), Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) and the game-winner by Cherie Hendrickson (Boxford, Mass). A day earlier, UConn beat Providence in Storrs, Conn. by a score 3-0. UConn has a 1-3-0 record all-time in the Hockey East Tournament. The Friars hold an all-time record of 22-6-2 against the Huskies.

PROVIDENCE IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNEY... The Friars have posted a 7-2-0 mark all-time in the Hockey East Tournament, the best record among all HE schools. PC was able to win the first three HE Tournaments (2003, 2004, 2005). Overall, the Friars have played in the Championship game in four of the five previous tournaments. Last season, the Friars beat Boston College, 3-2, in the semifinal round before falling to UNH, 3-1, in the Championship game.

FRIARS IN POST SEASON PLAY... The Friars have qualified for post season play for the twenty-fifth straight year. In 24 seasons of post season play, Providence has posted a 34-15 record. Additionally, ten of those post season trips resulted in Championships for the Friars (7 ECAC Championships, 3 Hockey East). Under head coach Bob Deraney, the Friars have a 10-5-0 record in post season play.

TOURNAMENT MVP'S... The Friars boast four of the five Hockey East Tournament MVP award winners. In 2003 and 2004, Friar great Kelli Halcisak '04 won MVP honors. In 2005, Rush Zimmerman '05 won the honor while Jana Bugden '07 garnered the award in last year's tournament. Bugden became the first player to earn MVP honors from a team that did not win in the championship game.

FRIARS AT FREITAS... The Friars last played a post season game at UConn's Freitas Ice Forum in Storrs, Conn. in 2002. Providence was able to beat Northeastern by a score of 1-0 to win the ECAC Championship in that game. Former Friar Jackie Tamsin '02 scored the game-winner for the Friars, while current graduate assistant coach Amy Quinlan '04 made 10 saves to earn the shutout victory.

LEADING THE BLUE LINE... Senior defenseman Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) ranks first in points scored by a defenseman with 15 (8 goals, 7 assists) in HE play. Smith ranks second in the nation in goals scored by a defenseman, with 15. She also ranks fifth in the nation in points per game average among defensemen with a 0.85 mark. Smith leads the Friars with 29 points (15 goals, 14 assists).

FRIARS IN OVERTIME... The Friars have played in four overtime games this season, posting a 0-0-4 record in those contests. Last season, in five overtime games, PC posted a 1-0-4 record. The Friars last dropped a decision in overtime on January 9, 2005 when they lost to Niagara by a score of 5-4.

QUICK HITS... Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) leads the Friars in power-play goals with six... Both Danielle Tangredi (London, Ontario) and Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) have scored three game-winning goals to lead the Friars this season... Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) remains the only Friar to have scored a short-handed goal this season... Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) ranks third in points among HE rookies in HE play with 15 (11 goals, 4 assists), while O'Neill ranks fifth, with 13 points in league play (6 goals, 7 assists).

ON THE PLUS SIDE... Junior defenseman Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) and sophomore defenseman Colleen Martin (Woburn, Mass.) lead the Friars in plus/minus ranking this season. Normore's plus 17 mark leads the team, while Martin's plus 15 is a close second. The next closest Friar has a plus eight mark.

HAT TRICK HERO... Freshman forward Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) notched a hat trick in the third period of Providence's game versus Northeastern on February 17. It marked the second hat trick of the season for Ruff. She became the first Friar to notch multiple hat tricks in the same season since the 2004-05 season, when Friar great Karen Thatcher '06 had two hat tricks as well. For her efforts against NU last weekend (3 goals, 2 assists), Ruff was named the HEA's Rookie of the Week on February 18. It marked the third time this year Ruff earned Rookie of the Week honors. Additionally, she is one of three Hockey East skaters to record a hat trick this season, and the only one with more than one hat trick.

Skating Strides 2008

The Friars raised \$2,091.00 as part of Skating Strides 2008, which took place as part of a home-and-home series against the Northeastern Huskies on February 16 and 17. All eight women's HOCKEY EAST teams participated in Skating Strides 2008. Money was raised through merchandise sales, raffles, auctions, and special events during the games. All of the proceeds from Skating Strides 2008 are being donated to breast cancer charities. The final figures for 2008's effort have yet to be released, but the inaugural Skating Strides 2007 raised over \$20,000.

THREE'S THE KEY... In each Friar victory thus far, PC has scored three or more goals. Overall, the Friars have scored three or more goals in 17 of their 34 games. In the 17 games in which they have scored three or more goals, the Friars have posted a 15-1-1 record.

MOVIN' ON UP... Seniors Kelli Doolin (Dorchester, Mass.) and Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) are moving up the all-time games played list at Providence College. Doolin (137) is now tied for the fifth most games played as a Friar, while Smith (136) is tied for eighth place.

FEAR NOT THE WHITT... At UNH's Whittemore Center, one of the toughest places to play in college hockey, junior netminder Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) has posted some impressive numbers. In three career games played at the Whitt, Ciarletta has stopped 91 of the 96 shots she has faced, good for a .948 save percentatge.

O'NEILL-RUFF-PEHKONEN CONNECTION... Since PC's weekend series versus Mercyhurst beginning on January 12, freshmen Jean O'Neill (Straford, Pa.) and Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) along with junior Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) have been playing on the same line. In the 16 games in which they have played on the same line, Ruff, O'Neill and Pehkonen have combined for 29 points. The trio has been particularly effective in the Friars' last seven games, as they have combined for 20 points in that seven-game span.

A CAREER WEEKEND... In Providence's 8-3 win over Northeastern on February 17, several Friars posted career high marks. Freshman Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) registered a career-high four points (3 goals, 1 assist). In the same game, Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) had a career-high four assists to go along with a career-high five points. A day earlier, Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ontario) notched a career-high three assists in PC's 4-0 win against the Huskies. Senior Danielle Tangredi (London, Ontario) tied her career-high for goals and points with two goals.

O'NEILL FIRSTS... In the Friars' 5-3 win over Connecticut on February 10, freshman Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) registered her first career power-play goal. The goal also turned out to be the game-winner, the first of O'Neill's career as well. O'Neill has now been credited with a power-play, game-winning, and short-handed goal on the season. She is one of only eight Hockey East players to do so this season.

SCORING DISTRIBUTION... Of the 19 Friar skaters who have suited up this season, each one has recorded at least one point. Additionally, 15 have scored at least one goal.

DERANEY WINS GOLD... The U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team captured the first-ever gold medal awarded at the inaugural 2008 International Ice Hockey Federation World Women's U-18 Championship with a 5-2 victory over Canada. Head Coach Bob Deraney helped lead Team USA to the victory, as he was an assistant coach for the team. Also on the team are future Friars Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.) and Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.). Cottrell finished the tournament as Team USA's third leading scorer, with ten points (five goals and five assists) in five games played. Bacon added three goals in five games played for Team USA as well.

LUCKY SEVENS... Versus the Colonials of Robert Morris, the Friars posted a 7-1 victory on November 25. Then, in their next game, the Friars defeated Maine by a score of 7-2 on December 1. It marked the first time the Friars have scored seven goals in back-to-back games since the 2002-2003 season. Most recently, the Friars defeated Northeastern by a score of 8-3 on February 17. The Friars are undefeated when scoring seven or more goals under head coach Bob Deraney, posting a 23-0-0 record.



CIARLETTA GOES BACK-TO-BACK... Junior goalie Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) shutout Niagara in back-to-back games. It marked her second and third shutouts of the season. Additionally, she became the first HE goalie to record consecutive shutouts this season, and the first Friar to do so since Ciarletta's former teammate Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) blanked Northeastern on March 6 and 7 during the 2003-04 season. Overall, Ciarletta posted a shutout streak that lasted a career-high 150:05 of play.

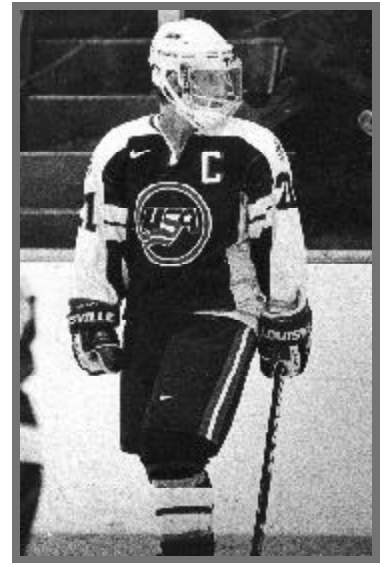


FINISH DUTY... Friar forward Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) has recently returned from playing in the European Air Canada Cup for Team Finland. Over the course of the U-22 tournament, Pehkonen scored a goal and added four assists. Pehkonen and her Finish teammates made it to the championship game but could not knock off Canada, losing by a score of 7-5 to secure the Silver Medal.



POINT STREAK... Friar defenseman Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ontario) had a six game point scoring streak until Mercyhurst kept her off the board on January 13. During her career-high six game streak, Smith notched five goals and added six assists for eleven points. Her six game point streak was the longest streak by a Friar this season.

GRANATO HONORED... The NHL honored former Friar great Cammi Granato '93 as a 2007 recipient of the Lester Patrick Award. Given annually, the award is one of the most prestigious in all of hockey. Granato, PC's all-time leading point and goal scorer was given the award at a luncheon on November 7. Granato has the distinction of being the first individual female recipient of the award. In addition, Granato was also inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame on February 16, 2008.



FIRSTS... Freshman Leigh Riley (Lexington, Mass.) registered an assist versus UVM on January 25, her first point as a Friar... Sophomore Pamela McDevitt (So. Boston, Mass.) scored her first goal as a Friar against Mercyhurst on January 12, 2008... Freshman Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) notched her first career assist versus Maine on December 1.... Freshman Amber Yung (Rockville, Va.) notched her first career goal versus Robert Morris University on November 25... O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.) notched her first career goal as a Friar versus Northeastern on November 6, as did senior Danielle Tangredi (London, Ont.). Freshman Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) notched her first collegiate goal (and point) versus Colgate on October 19. Her goal tied the game at 2-2. A day later, classmate Jennifer Smith (St. Albans, Vt.) saw her first action in net for the Friars, making four saves in over 24 minutes of work against St. Lawrence. Most recently, freshman Amber Yung notched her first career point versus Boston College, as she assisted on PC's game-winner, while Smith earned her first career victory.
