THIS WEEKEND... The Friars enter the HOCKEY EAST Tournament as the #3 seed by virtue of sweeping Connecticut this past weekend. The Friars will face the #2 seeded Eagles of Boston College on Saturday, March 3 in the second semi-final matchup. The game will be played at 3:00 p.m. at the Whittemore Center in Durham, N.H. The other semi-final game, between UNH and UConn, will be played at noon on Saturday. The winners of each semi-final game will square off for the HOCKEY EAST Championship at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, March 4.

FRIARS IN THE POSTSEASON TOURNAMENT... The Friars are making their fifth consecutive HOCKEY EAST Tournament appearance. Before playing in the HOCKEY EAST, the Friars played in the ECAC and qualified for 19 straight ECAC Tournaments. Collectively, this year marks PC's 24th straight post-season tournament appearance, dating back to the 1983-84 season when the Friars defeated UNH to earn the ECAC Tournament Championship. Over the previous 23 seasons, PC has posted a 33-14 record in post-season play.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS BOSTON COLLEGE... Providence holds a 44-8-0 record all-time versus Boston College. Most recently, the Friars dropped both games of a home-and-home series with the Eagles on February 17 and 18. Before that, PC defeated BC at Schneider Arena on December 3, by a score of 3-2. Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) scored the game-winner for the Friars at the 7:34 mark of the third period. Head coach Bob Deraney holds a 20-7-0 record against the Eagles while at Providence.

PC VERSUS BC IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars and Eagles have met twice before in the HOCKEY EAST Tournament. In 2005, Providence defeated the Eagles by a score of 9-1 on March 12 at Walter Brown Arena in Boston, Mass. Current Friar seniors Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) and Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) each scored two goals for the Friars on that day. Watrous' first score proved to be the game-winner. But last season BC exacted some revenge, beating the Friars 3-1 in the semi-finals at Matthews Arena in Boston, Mass. Junior Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ont.) scored the lone Friar goal. Sarah Feldman (Fall River, Mass.) scored the game-winner for BC, as she played for the Eagles last season.

SCOUTING THE EAGLES... Last weekend BC defeated Maine 4-0 in its final regular season game to finish with a 23-8-2 record overall, and at 15-6-0 in HE. Sophomore Becky Zavisza (Suffield, Conn.) helped the Eagles to the victory over Maine by scoring two goals. For the season, BC has been led in scoring by freshman Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, Ohio), who has 50 points on 17 goals and 33 assists. Classmate Allie Thunstrom (Maplewood, Minn.) is second on the team with a team leading 28 goals and 16 assists for 44 points. In all, the Eagles have five players who have scored more than thirty points. In net freshman Molly Schaus (Natick, Mass.) has seen the majority of the minutes and has posted a 19-8-2 record, with a GAA of 1.86 and a save percentage of .932.

GIGLIOTTI NAMED HE PLAYER OF THE WEEK.... It was announced on Monday, February 26 that senior defenseman Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) was named the TPS Player of the week by HOCKEY EAST. Gigliotti registered three goals and three assists over the weekend in PC's pivotal sweep of UConn, to help lead the Friars to the third seed in the WHEA Tournament. In Saturday's contest, Gigliotti assisted on the game-winning goal, then on Sunday, she scored the game-winner. In Sunday's contest, she had two goals and two assists; and her assist on Colleen Martin's goal was the 100th point of Gigliotti's collegiate career.

BUGDEN NAMED HE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK... It was announced on Monday, February 26 that senior goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) was named the Pure Hockey Defensive Player of the Week by HOCKEY EAST. Bugden stopped 61 of the 65 shots she faced over the weekend in PC's pivotal sweep of UConn, to help lead the Friars to the third seed in the WHEA Tournament. In Saturday's contest, Bugden stopped 31 of the 32 shots she faced, then on Sunday, she made another 30 saves.

SCORING STREAKS ... Junior Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, Mich.) has registered a goal in the last four games for the Friars, dating back to PC's 6-2 loss versus Boston College on February 17... Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) both have three-game point streaks intact. Over that stretch, Gigliotti has recorded 7 points (3 goals, 4 assists), while Watrous has added 4 points (1 goal, 3 assists).

POWER PLAY LEADERS.... Senior Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) has recorded the most power-play points in HOCKEY EAST play with 16 (3 goals, 13 assists). Junior Sarah Feldman (Fall River, Mass.) ranks second in the league with 14 points (5 goals, 9 assists). Sophomore Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) and senior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) are tied for third with 12 power-play points each. Pehkonen has 10 goals and 2 assists while on the power-play, and Watrous has scored 3 goals and 9 assists. Pehkonen's 10 goals rank her first in the HOCKEY EAST.

THEY'VE GOT SKILLS... Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) and Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) were chosen to participate in the 2007 Pontiac Frozen Four Skills Challenge to take place on Friday, April 6, at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis. Gigliotti is one of six skaters chosen to represent the East, while Bugden is one of the two goalies for the East squad.

SCORING FROM THE POINT... Senior Kristin Gigliotti (Saquoit, N.Y.) ranks first in scoring among defensemen in HOCKEY EAST. In 21 HE games, she has registered 11 goals and 17 assists for a 1.33 points per game average. In 33 total games played, Gigliotti has 38 points (17 goals, 21 assists) ranking her second in the nation with a 1.15 points per game average. She is one of six defensemen in the nation to average more than a point per game.

SHORT HANDED RESULTS... After failing to score a short handed goal in the first 27 games of the 2006-2007 season, the Friars were able to net two short handed tallies in a 45 second span versus Vermont on February 4. Senior Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) scored the Friars' first SH goal of the season at 8:05 of the third period. 45 seconds later, Brittany Nelson (Shelburne, Vt.) scored Providence's second SH goal. Then, four games later, junior Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, Mich.) scored PC's third shorthanded goal against BC on February 18.

2006-07 Providence College Women's Hockey Notes

PERFECT TEN... On February 4, the Friars beat the Catamounts of UVM by a score of 10-1. It marked the first time the Friars scored 10 or more goals under head coach Bob Deraney. The Friars last scored 10 goals during 1998-99 season, when they beat Colby 10-0. It was the first time the Friars scored 10 or more goals against a league opponent since the 1996-97 season when PC, then playing in the ECAC, beat Yale 10-0.

BUGDEN BECOMES CAREER SAVES LEADER... Against the University of Maine on January 21, senior goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) became Providence College's all-time leader in career saves. Bugden now has 2,730 saves while at Providence College. She passed former Friar great Sara DeCosta '00, who had held the record with 2,324 career saves.

WATROUS MOVING ON UP... After registering two assists versus UConn on 2/25, senior forward Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) has now scored 31 points this season (11 goals, 20 assists). It marks her fourth consecutive season with at least 10 goals and 27 points. She has also moved into the Friars' top 20 all-time point scorers, as her 137 career points puts her at 16th on PC's all-time points leaders list. Her 67 career goals is also 16th best on PC's career goals scored list.

GAMES PLAYED... Seniors Kristin Gigliotti (Sauguit, N.Y.) and Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) have moved into the top-10 in career games played at Providence College. With 138 games played, Gigliotti currently ranks 5th all-time. Watrous, with 135 games played, ranks 9th all-time.

EVEN DISPERSEMENT... Providence scored 91 goals in regulation during the regular season. Of those, 29 came in the first period, while the Friars scored 31 in both the second and third periods. Of the 70 goals PC has scored in regulation in league play, they have scored 23 in the first period, 23 in the second period, and 24 in the third.

Championship Profiles



2002-03 HOCKEY EAST Champions: The 2002-03 squad captured the HOCKEY EAST regular season and tournament titles. PC won the regular season with a 13-1-1 record and defeated New Hampshire, 1-0, to win the inaugural Women's HOCKEY EAST Tournament title. They also won a school-record 24 games, posting a 24-6-6 mark overall for the season.

2003-04 HOCKEY EAST Champions: The 2003-04 squad captured their second HOCKEY EAST tournament title and their third league title in as many seasons. They defeated New Hampshire, 3-0, to win the Women's HOCKEY EAST Tournament title. They also posted a 21-13-2 mark overall for the season, their 13th 20-win campaign and their 27th with a winning record.

2004-05 HOCKEY EAST Champions: The 2004-05 squad captured their third HOCKEY EAST tournament title and their fourth straight league title in as many years. The team also won the HOCKEY EAST regular season title and earned the program's first NCAA Tournament bid.

QUICK HITS... Sophomore defenseman Erin Normore (Cambridge Ont.) ranks fourth among defensemen in the HOCKEY EAST with 14 points (5 goals, 9 assists) in 21 HE games played... The Friars are unbeaten in the 2006-2007 season when scoring 4 or more goals (12-0-0)... Sophomore forward Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) leads the Friars with 4 game-winning goals... Providence ranks third in the Nation with an average of 15.8 penalty minutes per game... PC's penalty kill ranks 8th best in the nation with a 88.4 kill percentage... Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) ranks second in HOCKEY EAST with a .925 save percentage in league games... Providence leads the HOCKEY EAST with 332 penalty minutes in 21 league games... The Friars have not given up an over-time goal in the 2006-2007 season, posting a 1-0-4 mark in games that have gone to the extra stanza.

Game-Winning Goal in CAPS

Providence, R.I. - The Providence College women's ice hockey team defeated the 10th ranked Eagles of Boston College, 3-2 at Schneider Arena on Sunday, December 3. Sophomore Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) tallied the game-winner at 7:34 in the third period on a power play goal. After a scoreless first period, Boston College tallied the games first goal with a score from freshman Megan Keever (Harrisburg, Pa.). The Friars quickly responded with a goal of their own 44 seconds later. Junior Rachel Chrissy (Naperville, Ill.) registered her first goal of the season on a quick one-timer from sophomore Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ont.). Providence took a 2-1 lead when sophomore Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) found the back of the net by herself on a power play. The goal was Pehkonen's seventh. The Eagles evened the score a 2-2 two minutes into the third period on a goal from sophomore Meghan Fardelman (Lansing, Kan.) with stellar passes from junior Cristin Stuart (Rochester, Minn.) and freshman Gabrielle Beaudry (Cortland, N.Y.). Providence took the lead for good when Beach took a pass from freshman Jackie Duncan and junior Kathleen Smith and fired it past the Eagle goaltender. The goal was Beach's third on the season. The game ended in an intense fury of action with the Eagles playing with an empty net for the last 1:24. Senior goaltender, Jana Bugden (Cornerbrook, N.L.) made some incredible saves to preserve the 3-2 victory. Bugden finished with 22 saves.

Game-Winning Goal in CAPS

Providence, R.I. -Boston College took advantage of four first period goals and went on to beat the Friars by a score of 6-2 at Schneider Arena. The Eagles jumped out to an early 1-0 lead on Anna McDonald's short-handed strike at 1:42 of the first period. McDonald was able to take a Deborah Spillane pass and beat Friar goaltender Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.). The Friars evened the score at one when junior Jenna Keilch (Clinton Township, Mich) jammed home a loose puck in front of the Eagle net. Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) and Kathleen Smith (Waterloo, Ont.) were credited with the assists. But BC then went on to score three more goals to close out the first period. Allie Thunstrom gave the Eagles the lead once again at 7:47. The goal was assisted by Becky Zavisza and Maggie Taverna. McDonald then netted her second goal of the period, with assists from Kelli Stack and Erin Blood. Zavisza struck for the Eagles' final goal of the period at 17:37, with assists going to Spillane and Thunstrom. The Friars got back into the game when they opened the second period scoring at the 3:18 mark. Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) was the beneficiary of several nice passes that ultimately ended up with Pehkonen slotting the puck into an empty net. The goal, which came on the power-play, was assisted by Sara Feldman (Fall River, Mass.) and Erin Normore (Cambridge, Ont.). Minutes later Pehkonen found herself alone in the slot, but she was unable to bring the Friars any closer as she was unable to beat Eagle goaltender Molly Schaus. Gabrielle Beaudry scored the next Eagle goal at 8:23 to put the game out of reach. The goal, assisted by McDonald and Stack, was scored while the Eagles were skating with the two-man advantage. BC closed out the scoring 17 seconds into the third period when Thunstrom scored her second of the night.

Game-Winning Goal in CAPS

Boston, Mass. -For the second consecutive day, No. 9 Boston College took advantage of four first period goals and went on to beat the Friars by a score of 6-2. Boston College struck first, at 4:04 of the first period, as freshman Anna McDonald put the Eagles up 1-0 with a power-play goal when she jammed in a loose puck in front of PC goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland). Kelli Stack scored the next BC goal at 6:35 with assists from Meghan Fardelmann and Erin Blood. Thunstrom put the Eagles up 3-0 just over a minute later, at 7:55, when she converted on a pass from Becky Zavisza. Stack scored her second of the period less than a minute later, at the 8:27 mark, to put the Eagles up 4-0, with Fardelmann assisting on the goal. Providence got on the board while skating short-handed, as junior Jenna Keilch forced a turnover at the BC blue line, took control of the puck and fired it high to beat Schaus on the glove side. BC was able to add two goals in the second period, while the Friars scored one of their own to make the score 6-2, after two periods of play. Fardelmann and Thunstrom scored unassisted goals for the Eagles at 2:01 and 8:24 respectively. Senior Sonny Watrous added the second Friar goal, with an assist from Kristin Gigliotti. Neither side was able to score in the third period. Schaus made 25 saves in net for BC, while Bugden and Lauren Florio combined to stop 28 shots for the Friars, including 22 saves by Florio.
