LATEST RESULTS... The Friars finished the weekend with a 0-1-1 record, falling to No. 10 Boston University, 3-1, in Schneider on Saturday, October 31 before earning a 1-1 tie at Connecticut on Sunday. The Friars earned an extra point in the Hockey East standings with a 3-2 shootout victory over Connecticut. Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) scored the lone goal for Providence on the power play at 18:16 of the second period. Sophomores Lauren Covell (Akron, Ohio) and Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) earned assists on the play. On Sunday, Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) scored the opening goal of the game at 7:24 of the second period. Covell and freshman Jessica Cohen (Anchorage, Alaska) assisted on the play. Lacasse made 29 saves in the game. Veharanta, Cottrell and Cohen all scored goals in the shootout and Lacasse made a critical stop on the Huskies' first shooter to earn the extra point in Hockey East.

COUNTDOWN TO 600... The Friars took another step towards the 600-win mark with the 4-1 victory over Colgate on October 16, 2009. The current count puts Providence a mere four victories (596) away from 600. Providence's 596 victories are the second-highest total in the country behind New Hampshire.

COACHING MILESTONE... Coach Deraney needs only 7 wins to join former coach John Marchetti as the only two Providence coaches to reach 200 victories behind the Friar bench. Deraney stands at 193 during his tenure at PC.

TOP-OF-THE-LINE ROOKIE... Freshman Jessica Cohen was announced as Hockey East Rookie of the Month on Tuesday, November 3. Cohen finished her first nine games as a Friar with three goals and three assists for six points, the second-highest mark on the team. She recorded two points (1 g, 1 a) in the first game of her career in PC's 4-0 victory over Maine on Oct. 2. Of her three goals, two have come as game-winners (10/2 vs. Maine, 10/16 vs. Colgate). Cohen also led PC with a +2 on the plus/minus scale for October.

EARLY SEASON HARDWARE... Jessica Cohen was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Week for the second time (10/5/09) on Monday, October 19, after scoring a goal in both games on 10/16 and 10/17, including the game winner against Colgate. She now leads the team with two game-winning goals and is second with seven total points (3 g, 4 a).

STREAKS AND RANKINGS... Sophomore Lauren Covell has flipped back and forth from defense to forward this season and now has an assist in back-to-back games. She has four assists on the season after failing to register a point in 24 games as a freshman. Genevieve Lacasse leads all of Hockey East and is third in the nation with 227 saves on the season.

STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE... Providence has not given up a first-period goal in the last six games. The last time the Friars gave up a goal in the first 20 minutes was against No. 5 St. Lawrence on October 10.

SECOND PERIOD SUCCESS... Providence has outshot its opponents, 103-60, in the second

period, leading to a 13-7 edge in scoring in the second stanza. Comparably, PC has been outscored 3-2 in the first period and 11-6 in the third.

PROVIDENCE VS HOCKEY EAST... The Friars stand at 87-41-15 all-time in Hockey East play. Only UNH owns a better record in conference play since the league's creation in 2002. Providence won the first three Hockey East Championships. Providence College holds the distinction of winning the inaugural Hockey East Championship in both the men's and women's leagues.

SCOUTING MAINE... Maine comes into Friday's contest boasting a 2-7-1 record with the only wins coming against Sacred Heart to begin the season. Senior Jenna Ouellette leads the team with nine assists and 11 points. The Black Bears have scored eight of their 26 goals while on the power play this season.

ALL-TIME VS. THE BLACK BEARS... The Friars boast an impressive 89.7 winning percentage against Maine, the highest over any team. The Friars stand at 28-1-5 all-time vs. Maine with the lone loss coming in a 3-2 defeat in Orono on November 23, 2003.

SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN.. The Huskies come into Sunday's contest with a 7-1-1 record and a No. 9 ranking in both polls. Northeastern is led by sophomore goaltender Florence Schelling. Schelling, the WHEA Goaltender of the Month, stands at 6-1-1 and leads the nation with a .74 goals against average and a .970 save percentage.

ALL-TIME VS. THE HUSKIES... Providence and Northeastern have faced off 102 times. Only UNH (123) has faced off with the Friars on more occasions. PC stands at 55-38-9 against NU. Last season, the two teams played three games all decided by one goal. Northeastern came out ahead, 2-1, in the season series. The Friars outshot NU, 131-59, highlighted by a 56-24 advantage in a 3-2 overtime victory in Providence on 2/6/09.

HOME SWEET HOME... With three victories this season, the Friars boast a 266-91-32 (.725) all-time record at the friendly confines of Schneider Arena. Bob Deraney stands at 107-55-20 (.643) at home during his 11 seasons with the Friars.

WATCH OUT DECOSTA, MOVE OVER BUGDEN... Lacasse made her mark on the Providence record book as a freshman. She finished 2008-09 with 756 saves, the fourth-highest total in program history. Former All-American Sara DeCosta holds the top-three marks while Jana Bugden stands at fifth all-time in a season with 752. Lacasse's 756 saves are the second most by a freshman. Decosta's 794 saves as a freshman in 1996-97 stands as the top mark. Lacasse's 1.94 goals against average stands at fourth best in a single season.

THE FEARLESS LEADERS... Senior defenseman Colleen Martin (Woburn, Mass.) has been announced as the captain of the 2009-10 Friars. Martin finished her junior season with seven assists and a team-high +11 on the plus/minus ranking. Coming into 2009, she has 15 points on three goals and 12 assists. Junior Jean O'Neill will wear the "A" on her sweater as the assistant captain. O'Neill finished 2008-09 with five goals and three assists for 8 points. As a freshman, she tallied seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points.

2009 YEAR IN REVIEW... The Friars finished the 2008-09 season with a 17-16-3 overall record with a 12-8-1 mark and a fourth-place finish in the Hockey East Conference. Providence qualified for the Hockey East Tournament and advanced to the semifinal game for the seventh consecutive season, joining New Hampshire as the only two teams to reach the conference semifinals in every year of Hockey East play. As the No. 4 seed in the six-team tournament, Providence defeated No. 5 seed Connecticut, 3-0, in the quarterfinals at Schneider Arena. The Friars fell to No. 1 seed and fifth-ranked New Hampshire, 3-1, in the semifinal game in Durham, N.H.
