LATEST RESULTS... The Friars finished the weekend with a 1-1 record splitting a home-and-home with No. 8 Boston University. The Friars fell by a score of 5-3 at BU on Saturday, November 14. Juniors Jean O'Neill and Alyse Ruff each netted a power-play goal and an assist. Sophomore Ashley Cottrell also scored on the power play. On Sunday, PC came away with a 6-2 victory behind a hat trick from freshman Nicole Anderson and a four point (1 g, 3 a) performance from Cottrell. Anderson tied the game in the first with assists from Cottrell and Jennifer Friedman. Junior Leigh Riley put home a game-tying goal in the second. It was the first of her career. Anderson completed the hat trick with two goals in 46 seconds, including the game winner and a power-play strike. Cottrell and Alyse Ruff added goals to finish out the scoring. Sophomore goaltender Genevieve Lacasse made 41 saves to earn the win.

COUNTDOWN TO 600... With the 6-2 victory over BU on Sunday, November 15, Providence stands a mere three victories (597) away from 600. Providence's 597 victories are the second-highest total in the country behind New Hampshire.

COACHING MILESTONE... Coach Deraney needs only six wins to join former coach John Marchetti as the only two Providence coaches to reach 200 victories behind the Friar bench. Deraney stands at 194 during his tenure at PC.

ROOKIES SHINE BRIGHT.. Jessica Cohen was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Week for the second time (10/5/09) on October 19, after scoring a goal in both games on 10/16 and 10/17, including the game winner against Colgate. Nicole Anderson was named ROW on November 16 after registering four points with a hat trick and an assist against No. 8 BU on Sunday, November 15.

TOP-OF-THE-LINE ROOKIE... Freshman Jessica Cohen was announced as Hockey East Rookie of the Month on Tuesday, November 3. Cohen finished her first nine games as a Friar with three goals and three assists for six points, the second-highest mark on the team. She recorded two points (1 g, 1 a) in the first game of her career in PC's 4-0 victory over Maine on Oct. 2. Of her three goals, two have come as game-winners (10/2 vs. Maine, 10/16 vs. Colgate). Cohen also led PC with a +2 on the plus/minus scale for October.

LETS SEE THOSE HATS...

Freshman Nicole Anderson's hat trick on Sunday, November 15 was the first by a PC player since Alyse Ruff recorded the rare feat against Northeastern on February 17, 2008.

54 of 57 shots on the weekend and denied 12 of 13 shooters in a shootout victory over No. 9 Northeastern on Sunday, November 8.

STREAKS AND RANKINGS... Genevieve Lacasse leads all of Hockey East and is second in the nation with 347 saves on the season. Ashley Cottrell has a four-game point-scoring streak. In that span, she's recorded three goals and five assists for eight points. Cottrell also has found the net in three-consecutive games. She had a four-game goal-scoring streak to start the season.

LACASSE MOVING UP THE RANKS... Genevieve Lacasse now has 1,103 saves in her career and joins only five other Friars with over 1,100. Next on the all-time list is Shannon Sweezy ('91) with 1,158.

SETTING THE PACE... Ashley Cottrell ranks second in Hockey East with nine goals on the season. In conference play, she leads all players with six goals and 12 points. She leads PC in goals (9), assists (7) and points (16).

STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE... Providence has allowed a first period goal in only six of the 14 games this season.

SECOND PERIOD SUCCESS... Providence has outshot its opponents, 156-127, in the second period, leading to a 17-11 edge in scoring in the second stanza.

QUICK ON THE DRAW... Of players with at least 30 attempts, Ashley Cottrell leads PC with a winning percentage of 55 percent (196-160) on the face-off dot. Alyse Ruff stands at 52.5 percent (152-137). As a team, the friars are drawing at 52.3 percent (464-423). In 12 games this season, PC has won the face-off battle nine times. The Friars have yet to win a game in which they lost more face offs than they won.

HOCKEY EAST HISTORY... Providence took part in it's third-consecutive shootout on Sunday, November 8 when they defeated Northeastern in 13 rounds. Christie Jensen, the 26th shooter of the day, put home the shootout winner. The three-straight shootouts and the 26 shooters are the longest such records in Hockey East history.

PC WELL REPRESENTED... Providence will send three players and one coach to the All-Star Game pitting the best of Hockey East vs. Team USA in Durham, N.H. on November 22. Junior defender Amber Yung and sophomores Genevieve Lacasse and Ashley Cottrell will

EVERYDAY IS GAMEDAY... Providence has faced ranked teams in six of the 14 games this season. The Friars are 1-3-2 on the season against ranked teams. Last season, PC finished 2-9-2 against teams in the top ten.

PROVIDENCE VS HOCKEY EAST... The Friars stand at 88-42-17 all-time in Hockey East play. Only UNH owns a better record in conference play since the league's creation in 2002. HOME SWEET HOME... With four victories this season, the Friars own a 267-91-33 (.724) all-time record at the friendly confines of Schneider Arena. Bob Deraney stands at 108-55-21 (.644) at home during his 11 seasons with the Friars.

FIRE AT WILL... Providence ranks first in the league with 428 shots on net this season. PC has averaged 30.6 shots a game, good for second in the league.

MAKING THINGS HAPPEN... Sophomore Jennifer Friedman leads all defenders with a plus-six on the plus/minus scale. No other defender has a positive rating on the season. Ashley Cottrell leads all forwards with a plus-four on the season.

SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN.... The Huskies are led by Swiss National Team netminder Florence Schelling. The sophomore goaltender leads the nation with a 0.81 goals against average and a .970 save percentage. Schelling has allowed only nine goals in 11 games this season and has been named Defensive Player of the Week on five separate occasions including the past three weeks. The Huskies are coming off a weekend split with Maine. Northeastern won, 5-1, before falling, 1-0, at home. Northeastern has three players in double digit scoring this season. Kristie Kehoe leads the Huskies with 11 points (5 g, 6 a), Alyssa Wohlfeiler stands at 10 points (6 g, 4 a) as does Lindsay Berman (4 g, 6 a).

LAST TIME OUT... Providence hosted NU on November 8 as the teams battled to a 1-1 tie before competing in a record breaking 13-round shootout. Ashley Cottrell scored a second period goal before NU's Kristi Kehoe evened the score in the third. Husky forward Danielle Kerr scored her shootout attempt in the seventh round only to have Friar forward Alyse Ruff even the score at 1-1. The next six Northeastern attempts were denied by Lacasse before sophomore defender Christie Jensen put home the shootout winner with a wrister just under the bar.

ALL-TIME VS. THE HUSKIES... After the early season tie between the two long-time programs, Providence owns a 55-38-10 all-time record over Northeastern. Providence stands at 18-17-7 against the Huskies in Providence. Providence has faced NU (102) more times than every team except UNH (123).

WATCH OUT DECOSTA, MOVE OVER BUGDEN... Genevieve Lacasse made her mark on the Providence record book as a freshman. She finished 2008-09 with 756 saves, the fourth-highest total in program history. Former All-American Sara DeCosta holds the top-three marks while Jana Bugden stands at fifth all-time in a season with 752. Lacasse's 756 saves are the second most by a freshman. Decosta's 794 saves as a freshman in 1996-97 stands as the top mark. Lacasse's 1.94 goals against average stands at fourth best in a single season.

THE FEARLESS LEADERS... Senior defenseman Colleen Martin (Woburn, Mass.) has been announced as the captain of the 2009-10 Friars. Martin finished her junior season with seven assists and a team-high +11 on the plus/minus ranking. Coming into 2009, she has 15 points on three goals and 12 assists. Junior Jean O'Neill will wear the "A" on her sweater as the assistant captain. O'Neill finished 2008-09 with five goals and three assists for 8 points. As a freshman, she tallied seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points.

FRIENDS OF FRIAR ROOM... The 2009-2010 season marks the completion of the Friends of Friar Room in Schneider Arena. This room was created for the men's and women's ice hockey donors and supporters. The Friends of Friar Room includes plasma televisions, high-top counters and a media library room displaying the history of Friar Hockey.

PACKING THE HALL... The 1998 Olympic women's hockey team has been announced as a 2009 inductee into the US Hockey Hall of Fame. The 1998 US women's team won the inaugural gold medal in women's hockey. Providence had the distinct honor of sending the largest contingent to the Olympics in 1998. PC was represented by seven former Friars including; team captain Cammi Granato ('93), Chris Bailey ('94), Laurie Baker ('97), Alana Blahoski ('96), Sara DeCosta ('00), Lisa Brown-Miller ('88) and Vicki Movsessian ('94).
