**LATEST RESULTS...**The No. 9 women's hockey team finished the week 2-0 with a pair of victories over No. 3 New Hampshire. The Friars won both games, 3-2. On Saturday in Durham, N.H., junior forward Jean O'Neill assisted on the game's opening goal by freshman Jessica Cohen in the first period before tallying a power-play goal in the second period and the game-winning goal in the third period. Junior Alyse Ruff assisted on all three goals. Sophomore Genevieve Lacasse made 25 saves in net to earn the victory. On Sunday, Ruff opened the scoring with a power-play goal at 19:20 of the first period with assists going to O'Neill and freshman Jessica Vella. Senior Arianna Rigano scored PC's second goal. Sophomore Jennifer Friedman notched the game winner at 16:56 of the second period. Lacasse made 21 saves in the game. For her four-point weekend, O'Neill was named Hockey East Player of the Week. With the win on Sunday, coach Bob Deraney earned his 200th career victory.

**SKATING STRIDES...** Providence will host the fourth annual Skating Strides game on Saturday vs. Boston College. The Friars will donate all proceeds from the game to the Gloria Gemma Breast Cancer Resource Foundation. Providence will have a pre-game presentation on Saturday to donate a check to help raise breast cancer awareness.

**SCOUTING BC...** Boston College comes into this weekend looking for its first victory since a 3-2 defeat over Northeastern on December 4. Since then, the Eagles have gone 0-3-3. Senior Allie Thunstrom leads the eagles with 17 points and 13 goals. Freshman Corinne Boyles has seen the majority of the action for BC. She owns a 4-4-7 record with a 2.36 goals against average and a .922 save percentage. Freshman forward Caitlin Walsh was named Hockey East Rookie of the Week on Monday after recording three goals and an assist last week.

**HOLIDAY SPIRIT CONTINUES...** Providence owns the second-longest unbeaten streak in the nation at eight games (6-0-2). The Friars are undefeated since the start of December.

### PROVIDENCE COLLEGE MAKES HISTORY....AGAIN...

Providence joined UNH as the only two teams in NCAA Division I women's hockey history with 600 wins as a program. Providence defeated Cornell, 6-3, on Saturday, January 9 to reach the 600-victory milestone.

Coach Deraney recorded his 200th victory on Sunday, January 17 when PC defeated UNH, 3-2. Deraney joins former coach John Marchetti as the only two Providence coaches to reach 200 victories behind the Friar bench.

**O'NEILL NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK...**Jean O'Neill was named Hockey East Player of the Week on Monday, January 18 after leading PC to a pair of victories over No. 3 UNH. O'Neill tallied two goals, including the game winner, and an assist in PC's 3-2 victory on Saturday before registering an assist in the 3-2 victory on Sunday.

**LACASSE NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK...AGAIN** Lacasse was named Defensive Player of the Week for the second-straight week, the third time overall, after leading PC to a pair of victories over No. 8 Cornell including a 3-0 shutout on Sunday, January 10. Lacasse finished the weekend with 51 saves and a 1.50 goals against average. She has been named DPOW three times this season.

**RUFF BREAKS THROUGH...** Junior forward Alyse Ruff was named Hockey East Player of the Week on January 5 after scoring three goals and adding an assist in the Easton Holiday Showcase on January 2/3. In the process, Ruff notched her 50th career point.

**CLOSING IN ON THE BIG 5-0...** Junior Jean O'Neill (45) and sophomores Ashley Cottrell (45) and Laura Veharanta (42) are all in striking distance of the half-century mark.

**RIGANO ROUNDING 100...** Senior Arianna Rigano is close to the century mark. Including her two years at St. Anselm, Rigano stands at 89 points for her career.

**EVERYDAY IS GAMEDAY...** Providence has faced ranked teams in 14 of the 25 games this season. PC went through a stretch of seven-straight games against a ranked opponent. The Friars are 6-5-3 on the season against ranked teams. Last season, PC finished 2-9-2 against teams in the top ten.

**STREAKS AND RANKINGS...** Genevieve Lacasse leads all of Hockey East and is second in the nation with 652 saves on the season. Ashley Cottrell has had two four-game goal-scoring streaks this season (10/2-10/10, 10/8-10/20). Her seven-game point streak (11/6-11/28) was the longest of the season for the Friars. Jessica Cohen has a five-game point streak with one goal and five assists. Jean O'Neill has a five-game point streak (4 G, 6 A).

**FIVE IN A ROW...** Providence has won five consecutive games for the first time since 2005-06.

5. Nicole Anderson was named ROW on November 16 after registering four points with a hat trick and an assist against No. 8 BU on Sunday, November 15. Jessica Cohen was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Week for the second time (10/5/09) on October 19, after scoring a goal in both games on 10/16 and 10/17, including the game winner against Colgate.

**ROOKIE OF THE MONTH...** Freshman Jessica Cohen was announced as Hockey East Rookie of the Month on Tuesday, November 3. Cohen finished her first nine games as a Friar with three goals and three assists for six points, the second-highest mark on the team. She recorded two points (1g, 1a) in the first game of her career in PC's 4-0 victory over Maine on Oct. 2. Of her three goals, two came as game-winners (10/2 vs. Maine, 10/16 vs. Colgate).

**LETS SEE THOSE HATS...** Freshman Nicole Anderson's hat trick on Sunday, November 15 was the first by a PC player since Alyse Ruff recorded the rare feat against Northeastern on February 17, 2008.

**LACASSE MOVING UP THE RANKS...** Genevieve Lacasse has 1,408 saves in her career and now stands at third all-time. Next on the list are all-time greats Sara DeCosta (2,324) and Jana Bugden (2,555). Lacasse stands at sixth all-time with 54 games played.

**KEEPING THE LEAD...** PC is undefeated (10-0-3) on the year when going into the third period with the lead. Providence is winless when trailing after the first or second period.

**SETTING THE PACE...** Ashley Cottrell is one of only five players in the league with double digits in both goals and assists. She ranks fourth in Hockey East with 24 points. Cottrell and Alyse Ruff rank fifth in the league with 10 power-play points. In conference play, she leads all players with seven goals and six power-play points. She leads PC in goals (11), assists (13), points (24) and power-play points (10).

**SOPHOMORE SENSATIONS...** The sophomore class leads the team in goals and assists this season. Last season, the class of 2012 led PC with 36 goals (42%), 48 assists (36%) and 84 points (39%).

**STARTING ON THE DEFENSIVE...** Providence has allowed a first period goal in only ten of 25 games this season. The Friars own a +9 scoring advantage in the opening 20 minutes.

**HOCKEY EAST HISTORY...** Providence took part in its third-consecutive shootout on Sunday, November 8 when they defeated Northeastern in 13 rounds. Christie Jensen, the 26th shooter of the day, put home the shootout winner. The three-straight shootouts and the 26 shooters are the longest such records in Hockey East history.

**MAKING THINGS HAPPEN...** Sophomore Jennifer Friedman leads all defenders with a plus-seven on the plus/minus scale. Jean O'Neill leads all forwards with a plus-six on the season.

**TAKE IT TO THE SHOOTOUT...** Providence has competed in eight shootouts since the shootout was instituted in league play in 2008-09. The Friars stand at 5-3 in two years. In 2009-10, PC boasts a 4-2 record. Ashley Cottrell has scored on 50 percent (4 of 8) of her attempts. Alyse Ruff (2 of 4), Jessica Cohen (3 of 5) and Laura Veharanta (2 of 8) round out the top shooters for PC. Christie Jensen scored on her only shootout attempt in the 13-round victory over NU. Genevieve Lacasse has saved 79 percent (26 of 33) of the shots she has faced in her career.

**PROVIDENCE VS HOCKEY EAST...** The Friars stand at 91-43-18 all-time in Hockey East play. Only UNH owns a better record in conference play since the league's creation in 2002. Providence won the first three Hockey East Championships. Providence College holds the distinction of winning the inaugural Hockey East Championship in both the men's and women's leagues. The Friars became the first Hockey East team to earn a victory over UNH in Durham, N.H. when they upset the No. 3 Wildcats, 4-1, on December 5, 2009.

**PC WELL REPRESENTED...** Providence sent three players and one coach to the All-Star Game pitting the best of Hockey East vs. Team USA in Durham, N.H. on November 22. Junior defender Amber Yung and sophomores Genevieve Lacasse and Ashley Cottrell competed for Providence. Assistant Coach Meredith Roth helped coach the Hockey East All-Stars. Former Friar great Karen Thatcher ('06) registered an assist in the game for Team USA.

**THE FEARLESS LEADER...** Senior defenseman Colleen Martin has been announced as the captain of the 2009-10 Friars. Martin finished her junior season with seven assists and a team-high +11 on the plus/minus ranking. Coming into 2009, she has 15 points on three goals and 12 assists. Junior Jean O'Neill has been named the assistant captain. She came into the 2009-10 season with 25 points on 12 goals and 13 assists.

**KAREN THATCHER MAKES 2010 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM...** Former Friar great Karen Thatcher ('06) was announced as a member of Team USA that will compete in the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver, B.C. in February. The opening ceremonies are slated for Feb. 12, with Team USA's first game taking place on Feb. 14 against China. Thatcher becomes the ninth PC player to compete in the Olympics and the eighth Friar to compete for Team USA. Mari Pehkonen ('09) competed with Finland at the 2006 Olympics in Turin, Italy.

**FRIENDS OF FRIAR ROOM...** The 2009-2010 season marks the completion of the Friends of Friar Room in Schneider Arena. This room was created for the men's and women's ice hockey donors and supporters. The Friends of Friar Room includes plasma televisions, high-top counters and a media library room displaying the history of Friar Hockey.

**PACKING THE HALL...** The 1998 Olympic women's hockey team was inducted into the US Hockey Hall of Fame on December 1, 2009. The 1998 US women's team won the inaugural gold medal in women's hockey. Providence had the distinct honor of sending the largest contingent to the Olympics in 1998. PC was represented by seven former Friars including; team captain Cammi Granato ('93), Chris Bailey ('94), Laurie Baker ('97), Alana Blahoski ('96), Sara DeCosta ('00), Lisa Brown-Miller ('88) and Vicki Movsessian ('94).
