LATEST RESULTS... Providence finished off a six-game road trip with a split of a pair of contests in Ithaca, N.Y. against Cornell University. Game one saw the Friars erase a 3-0 first period deficit to come away with a 4-3 victory. Netminder Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) came off the bench midway through the first period to stop 22 shots and blank the Big Red the rest of the way. Providence saw goals from Jean O'Neill (Strafford, Pa.), Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) and two goals, including the game winner, from Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.). Freshman Abby Gauthier finished the game with two assists, giving her four this season. Ruff's two goals give her eight for the season, including four game winners. After the incredible comeback in game one, PC struggled to match the intensity for game two. Providence gave up two first period goals and eventually lost, 4-1. Freshman Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) netted the lone goal with an impressive breakaway tally in the second. With that tally, Cottrell finished the weekend with three points as she registered two assists in the first game. Ciarletta stopped 23 shots, putting her weekend total at 45.

HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN... The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) continues to lead the team in points (21), goals (13), and power-play goals (8). Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) earned her second shutout as a Friar on Saturday, November 29 in the 1-0 victory over Brown. Her first shutout came in a dominant performance on Sunday, November 16 against UConn. Lacasse stopped 30 shots and earned the first shutout by a PC freshman in almost five years. For her efforts, she was named Mission Rookie of the Week for the week of Nov. 17. She's started 14 games while posting a 1.82 goals against average to go along with a .943 save percentage. Kate Bacon netted her second short-handed goal of the season against UConn, giving her four overall. Ashley Cottrell registered four assists in the 5-2 victory over RMU on Saturday, November 8. Her four assists were the most in one game by a Friar since Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) registered four against Northeastern on February 17, 2008. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 42.9% (21 of 49) of the goals scored this year while contributing 41.3% (50 of 121) of the team's total points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Bacon and defensemen Christie Jensen (Delta, B.C.) and Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play units as well.

FIRSTS... Senior captain Britany Simpson (Barrie, Ontario) scored her first goal of the season in the 4-1 victory over Maine on December 6. Genevieve Lacasse tallied an assist against Brown in the 14th annual Mayor's Cup on November 29. The assist was the first by a Friar netminder since Jana Bugden recorded the feat on March 4, 2006. Lacasse earned her first shutout on Sunday, November 16, making 30 saves in the 2-0 victory. Kate Bacon tallied the

first goal of her career on Saturday, October 25. The feisty forward put home the short-handed goal off a rebound. Junior Arianna Rigano (Malden, Mass.) netted her first goal in Providence colors in the 4-2 victory over Vermont on Sunday, October 19. Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper in the game as well. Abby Gauthier has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored against Ohio State on October 4.

MONTHLY HONORS... Laura Veharanta was named Hockey East Rookie of the Month after she netted a goal in all three games for the Friars in the month of December. The sensational forward added two assists to finish the month with five points (3g, 2a). Genevieve Lacasse was named Rookie of the Month for November after she finished the month with a 4-1 record to go along with a 1.22 GAA and an impressive .966 save percentage. She finished November with two shutouts and a 51 save performance against #10 Mercyhurst. This is the first time in Friar history that two players have garnered Rookie of the Month honors in consecutive months.

THE ALL-TIME SERIES... Providence owns a 40-68-11 record all time against the Wildcats. In what will be a rematch of last two Hockey East Championship games, Providence will look to seek revenge after falling, 1-0 in 2008 and 3-1 in 2007. UNH is one of only eight schools that owns a winning record vs. Providence.

QUICK HITS... Among all Hockey East freshmen, Laura Veharanta ranks first with 13 goals scored on the season. She also leads the conference with eight power-play goals. Veharanta's eight power-play goals are good for the number two spot in the nation. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse ranks third in save percentage (.943) and goals against average (1.82) among Hockey East goaltenders. The Providence scoring defense (2.00) stands at tenth in the nation.

LEADING THE WAY... Laura Veharanta currently leads the Friars with 13 goals scored. The last Providence freshman to lead the team in scoring at the end of the season was Friar great Cammi Granato (1989-93). Granato finished the season with 24 goals.

IN GOOD COMPANY... Ashley Cottrell leads Providence with 12 assists thus far. The last PC freshman to lead the team in assists at the end of the season was Heather Laduke in 1986.

FRIARS VS. THE NATIONAL POWERS... Providence is looking for its first win against a nationally-ranked opponent this season. On Friday, November 21, PC was handed a 3-0 loss to #10 Mercyhurst. The Friars lost by identical scores of 3-1 to #7 St. Lawrence and #8 Boston College back in October. Providence tied #8 Boston University, 3-3, but fell in the shootout, 3-2, on November 1. On the season, the Friars are 0-3-1 vs. ranked opponents. Last season PC went 3-7-1 against ranked opponents.

MILESTONES... Arianna Rigano scored her 50th career goal in the 4-1 victory over Maine on December 6. Senior Stephanie Morris played in her 100th career game as a Friar on Saturday, November 22.

CIARLETTA CLIMBS THE LEADERBOARD... Coming into this weekend's games, senior netminder Danielle Ciarletta moved into fifth place with 54 games played defending the Friar cage. She only needs one more appearances to tie assistant coach Amy Quinlan (55) for fourth all-time. Ciarletta's 1187 career saves place her third all-time while her 2.22 goals against average is good for seventh all time.

STEPHANIE O'SULLIVAN HONORED... The former Friar great (1991-95) was inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Hall of Fame on Wednesday, November 19. O'Sullivan finished her amazing career with Providence ranked first in assists (127), second in goals (126), and second in total points (253). O'Sullivan was named to the ECAC All-Star Team as a sophomore, junior and senior. In 1995, O'Sullivan was named ECAC Player of the Year and New England Hockey Writers Player of the Year. She was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year in 1992. O'Sullivan was also named to the ECAC All-Decade Second Team. She served as a member of several U.S. National Teams from 1993-2001.
