LATEST RESULTS... The Providence College women's ice hockey team defeated the University of Connecticut, 2-0, on Sunday, November 16. Freshman Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) stopped all 30 shots she faced and sophomore Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) netted the game winner to guide the Friars to their third Hockey East victory of the season. Midway through the third period, the Huskies took two penalties giving PC a five-on-three advantage. UConn was able to kill off the first penalty, but at 14:03, the Friars would earn the game winner. Still a man up, captain Brittany Simpson (Barrie, Ontario) sent the puck around the boards to freshman Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) who snapped a pass through the top of the crease to Ruff who deflected the puck under the crossbar for her third game-winning goal and fifth overall on the season. The assists were the seventh for Simpson and third for Veharanta. Providence would finish off the Huskies with an empty-net, short-handed goal by Kate Bacon (Chanhausen, Minn.) with only 20 seconds remaining. Lacasse earned the first shutout by a Providence freshman since Jana Bugden accomplished the feat in the Hockey East Finals on March 16, 2003. She finished the game with 30 saves to improve her record to 5-3-0 on the season.

HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN... The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) put in a dominant performance on Sunday, November 16 against UConn. Lacasse stopped 30 shots and earned the first shutout by a PC freshman in almost five years. For her efforts, she was named Mission Rookie of the Week. She has started eight games while posting a 1.77 goals against average to go along with a .944 save percentage. She stands at 5-3 on the season. In the same game, Kate Bacon netted her second short-handed goal of the season, giving her four total. In the two games against Robert Morris, Laura Veharanta registered three goals, giving her 10 goals for the year. She continues to lead the team in points (13), goals (10), and power-play goals (7). Ashley Cottrell registered four assists in the 5-2 victory over RMU on Saturday, November 8. Her four assists were the most in one game by a Friar since Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) registered four against Northeastern on February 17, 2008. Cottrell's eight assists are now tied for the team lead. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 50% (16 of 32) of the goals scored this year while contributing 40% (32 of 80) of the team's total points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Bacon and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play units as well.

FIRSTS... Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse earned her first shutout on Sunday, November 16, making 30 saves in the 2-0 victory. Kate Bacon tallied the first goal of her career on Saturday, October 25, in the 3-1 loss to Boston College. The feisty forward put home the short-handed goal off a rebound. Junior Arianna Rigano (Malden, Mass.) netted her first goal in Providence colors in the

4-2 victory over Vermont on Sunday, October 19. Freshman Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper in the game as well. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored in the 3-2 defeat at the hands of Ohio State on October 4.

FRIARS VS. THE CHA... The Friars faced off against five opponents from College Hockey America in 2007-08. PC finished the season, 4-1, against foes from the CHA. The Friars defeated Niagara twice (3-0, 4-0), Robert Morris (7-1) and split the series against #4 Mercyhurst (7-3, 0-3). In the five contests, PC outscored the CHA 21-7. This season, Providence stands at 2-0 against the CHA as they earned a weekend sweep over Robert Morris (3-1, 5-2).

PROVIDENCE VS. MERCYHURST... The Friars own a 3-6-0 all-time record against the Lakers. Last year, the two teams split a weekend series at PC. Providence was victorious in game one, 7-3, but the Lakers avenged the lopsided defeat the following day with a 3-0 shutout of the Friars. In game one, All-New England defender Kathleen Smith registered two goals and two assists while Danielle Ciarletta stopped 35 Laker shots to earn the victory.

SCOUTING THE LAKERS... #10 Mercyhurst comes into Friday's contest with a season record of 6-4-0 overall and a record of 2-0 in College Hockey America. The Lakers swept Syracuse in conference action this weekend by scores of 4-1 and 7-1. Junior Meghan Agosta registered four goals and three assists over the weekend, including a hat trick in the 7-1 victory on Saturday. Jesse Scanzano notched three goals and three assists on the weekend. Freshman netminder Hillary Pattenden stopped 34 shots en route towards earning her fifth and sixth wins on the season.

MERCYHURST BETWEEN THE PIPES...

Freshman Hillary Pattenden has started 7 games in net for the Lakers this season. She has posted a record of 6-1-0 to go along with a 1.93 goals against average. Pattenden has a .917 save percentage having denied 157 shots on the season.

PROVIDENCE VS. NIAGARA... The two teams have faced off 19 times with PC holding the edge, 12-4-3. The Friars are 8-1-2 in the last 11 games against the Purple Eagles having shut out Niagara the last three contests. Last season, Providence won by scores of 3-0 and 4-0.

SCOUTING NIAGARA... The Purple Eagles come into Saturday's contest holding a record of 2-9-1. NU split a weekend conference series with Robert Morris with scores of 3-2 and 1-2. The Purple Eagles lost on Friday but came back with a 3-2 victory on Saturday. NU is led by senior Ashley Riggs as she has seven goals and seven assists for 14 points.

NIAGARA NETMINDERS... Sophomore Jenni Bauer has started 11 games this season posting a 2-8-1 record to go along with a 4.04 goals against average and a .880 save percentage.

QUICK HITS... Among all Hockey East freshmen, Laura Veharanta ranks first with 10 goals scored on the season. She also leads the conference with seven power-play goals. Veharanta's seven power-play goals are good for the number one spot in the nation. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse ranks second in save percentage (.944) among Hockey East goaltenders. Providence power play percentage (17.7) is third in the conference.

FRIARS VS. THE NATIONAL POWERS...

Providence is looking for its first win against a nationally-ranked opponent this season. The Friars lost by identical scores of 3-1 to #7 St. Lawrence and #8 Boston College. Providence tied #8 Boston University, 3-3, but fell in the shootout, 3-2. On the season, the Friars are 0-2-1 vs. ranked opponents. Last season PC went 3-7-1 against ranked opponents.

MILESTONES... Arianna Rigano is looking for her 50th career goal. The pesky forward scored 48 goals at St. Anselm College before netting her first goal as a Friar on Sunday, October 19 against UVM.

LEADING THE WAY... Laura Veharanta currently leads the Friars with 10 goals scored. The last Providence freshman to lead the team in scoring at the end of the season was Friar great Cammi Granato (1989-93). Granato finished the season with 24 goals.

CIARLETTA CLIMBS THE LEADERBOARD... Coming into this weekend's games, senior netminder Danielle Ciarletta is tied for sixth all-time with 51 games defending the Friar cage. She only needs four more appearances to tie assistant coach Amy Quinlan (55) for fourth all-time. Ciarletta's 1125 career saves place her fourth all-time while her 2.24 goals against average puts her in tenth, .1 behind Quinlan and Friar great Jana Bugden.

STEPHANIE O'SULLIVAN HONORED...

The former Friar great (1991-95) will be inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Hall of Fame on Wednesday, November 19 at Lombardo's in Randolph, Mass. O'Sullivan finished her amazing career with Providence ranked first in assists (127), second in goals (126), and second in total points (253). O'Sullivan was named to the ECAC All-Star Team as a sophomore, junior and senior. In 1995, O'Sullivan was named ECAC Player of the Year and New England Hockey Writers Player of the Year. She was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year in 1992. O'Sullivan was also named to the ECAC All-Decade Second Team. She served as a member of several U.S. National Teams from 1993-2001.
