**LATEST RESULTS...** The Friars traveled to Robert Morris this past weekend and swept the weekend series with two convincing victories. On November 7, Providence College improved their standing to 4-5-1 after they defeated Robert Morris, 3-1. At only 8:25 of the initial period, senior assistant captain, Katy Beach (Cleveland, Ohio) was able to put the Friars on the board first with her third goal of the year. Freshman Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) netted the game winning goal at 19:13 of the second period, her eighth goal of the season. In the third period, RMU put one in the Friar cage, but it wasn't enough as the Friars added an insurance tally with an empty net goal with only 28 seconds remaining by Providence's Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.). Netminder Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) stopped 27 shots to earn the victory as she improves to 3-3-0. The following day, the Friars were able to yet again finish victorious over Robert Morris with a 5-2 win. The Colonials held leads of 1-0 and 2-1 but the Friars showed resilience in scoring four straight unanswered goals. Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) and senior Erin Nomore (Cambridge, Ontario) each tallied two goals and freshman Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) finished with four assists. Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) was also able to tally one for the Friars during the second period. Captain Brittany Simpson (Barrie, Ontario) finished with two assists on the night, giving her six for the season. Lacasse finished the game with 25 saves to improve her record to 4-3.

**HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN...** The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. On Friday, November 7, Kate Bacon netted a goal and an assist giving her three goals and two assists thus far. In the two games against Robert Morris this past weekend, Laura Veharanta registered three goals, giving her 10 goals for the year. She continues to lead the team in points (12), goals (10), and power-play goals (7). Ashley Cottrell registered four assists in the 5-2 victory over RMU on Saturday, November 8. Her four assists were the most in one game by a Friar since Mari Pehkonen (Tampere, Finland) registered four against Northeastern on February 17, 2008. Cottrell's eight assists are now tied for the team lead. Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) has started seven games while posting a 2.02 goals against average to go along with a .936 save percentage. She stands at 4-3 on the season. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 50% (15 of 30) of the goals scored this year while contributing 40% (30 of 76) of the team's total points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Bacon and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play units as well.

**FRIAR ROOTS...** UConn is coached by former Friar great Heather Linstad '89. As a Friar, Linstad scored 76 goals and added 72 assists for 148 points. Her senior campaign, she registered the most goals (18), assists (30), and points (48) for PC. Linstad was named to the ECAC All-Star Team and received ECAC Player of the Year honors her senior year (1989). On the career scoring lists, Linstad

**FIRSTS...** Freshman Kate Bacon tallied the first goal of her career on Saturday, October 25, in the 3-1 loss to Boston College. The feisty forward put home the short-handed goal off a rebound. Junior Arianna Rigano (Malden, Mass.) netted her first goal in Providence colors in the 4-2 victory over Vermont on Sunday, October 19. Freshman Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper in the game as well. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored in the 3-2 defeat at the hands of Ohio State on October 4.

**PROVIDENCE VERSUS CONNECTICUT...** The Friars own a 23-6-2 all-time record against the Huskies. Last year, PC defeated UConn, 5-1, in the Hockey East Semifinals. Mari Pehkonen netted two goals while Amber Yung (Rockville, Va.) earned three helpers in the victory. Last season, the two teams split their four contests with the Huskies winning the first two games (5-0, 3-0) before PC came out victorious in the final two games (5-3, 5-1).

**LEADING THE WAY...** Laura Veharanta currently leads the Friars with 10 goals scored. The last Providence freshman to lead the team in scoring at the end of the season was Friar great Cammi Granato (1989-93). Granato finished the season with 24 goals.

**CIARLETTA CLIMBS THE LEADERBOARD...** Coming into this weekend's games, senior netminder Danielle Ciarletta is tied for sixth all-time with 51 games defending the Friar cage. She only needs four more appearances to tie assistant coach Amy Quinlan (55) for fourth all-time. Ciarletta's 1125 career saves place her fourth all-time while her 2.24 goals against average puts her in tenth, .1 behind Quinlan and Friar great Jana Bugden.

**ON THE PLUS SIDE...** Senior defenseman Brittany Simpson leads the Friars in plus/minus ranking this season with a +6 mark. Ashley Cottrell is right behind with a +5 ranking this year.

**STEPHANIE O'SULLIVAN HONORED...** The former Friar great (1991-95) will be inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Hall of Fame on Wednesday, November 19 at Lombardo's in Randolph, Mass. O'Sullivan finished her amazing career with Providence ranked first in assists (127), second in goals (126), and second in total points (253). O'Sullivan was named to the ECAC All-Star Team as a sophomore, junior and senior. In 1995, O'Sullivan was named ECAC Player of the Year and New England Hockey Writers Player of the Year. She was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year in 1992. O'Sullivan was also named to the ECAC All-Decade Second Team. She served as a member of several U.S. National Teams from 1993-2001.
