2004-05 Providence College Women's Hockey Notes

SCOUTING NEW HAMPSHIRE... The Wildcats are coming off a winless 0-1-1 weekend versus Connecticut on Saturday and Sunday, February 19-20. On Saturday, both teams skated to a 0-0 overtime tie. New Hampshire held the shot advantage, 34-17, while both teams went 0-for-1 on the power play. On Sunday, UConn broke New Hampshire's five-game unbeaten streak with a 2-1 win at the UConn Ice Arena. Connecticut scored three straight goals, including two in the second period. Megan McLeod netted the game-winning goal at 15:46 of the second period. Freshman Leah Craig and Taylor Palazeti scored for New Hampshire in the loss. Nicole Hekle leads New Hampshire with 45 points (17 goals, 28 assists).

SCOUTING PROVIDENCE... The Friars are coming off a 1-1 weekend against Boston College on Saturday and Sunday, February 19-20. On Saturday, the Friars were defeated, 4-1, at PC's Schneider Arena. Senior Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) scored the Friar lone goal in the loss. On Sunday, the Friars got their revenge as they defeated the Eagles, 4-2, at Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Zimmerman netted two goals and added an assist in surpassing the 150-point career mark in the victory. Senior Hilary Greaves (Cranston, R.I.) posted her seventh goal of the season, while junior Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) scored her fifth game-winning goal of the season. Thatcher and Zimmerman lead the team with identical numbers at 47 points apiece (20 goals, 27 assists).

RUSH NUMBER 13 ON PC'S ALL-TIME POINTS LIST... Senior forward Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) surpassed the 150-point career mark with a pair of goals and an assist in the 4-2 win over Boston College on Sunday, February 20. Zimmerman is currently 13th on PC's all-time points list with 151 points.

THATCHER ON THE 100-POINT CAREER LIST... Junior Karen Thatcher earned her 100th career point at the Whittemore Center, in Durham, New Hampshire on Sunday, January 30. Thatcher set up the Friars' lone goal to Rush Zimmerman, that put her on the 100-point career list, in the 2-1 loss.

ZIMMERMAN HOLDS PC'S ALL-TIME PENALTY MINUTES RECORD... Senior Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) is currently ranked first all-time in penalty minutes as she has accumulated 235 total minutes. She eclipsed the school's all-time penalties record with 116 this season. Both records were once held by Meredith Roth (2000-04) who has 96 total penalties for 219 minutes.

THE PROVIDENCE TRIO... The Providence trio of sophomore Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.), junior Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.), and senior Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) has combined for 126 points this season, making them the highest scoring front line in HOCKEY EAST. Thatcher and Zimmerman lead the league with 47 points respectively.

COACH BOB DERANEY... Head Coach Bob Deraney enters his sixth season at the helm of the Providence College women's hockey program. The 1987 Boston University graduate has guided the Friars to a 118-65-22 overall record, surpassing the 100-win milestone with a 4-2 victory over Boston College on March 13, 2004. Deraney earned his first career win on October 24, 1999 as the Friars defeated eventual national champion Minnesota, 1-0. Deraney earned his first ECAC Tournament win when the Friars defeated Maine, 5-3, on Saturday, March 9, 2002. On March 16, 2003 Deraney led the Friars to the inaugural HOCKEY EAST Tournament title as they defeated New Hampshire, 1-0. He is the first coach in the program's history to win back-to-back titles in different conferences, and the first head coach to post four 20-win seasons in their first five years. Deraney is assisted by Marnie Hill and Bob Bellemore.

FRIARS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS... Providence has suffered two losses to ranked opponents this season as they hold a 3-2-1 record against the nation's top ten. The Friars defeated No. 5 St. Lawrence, 5-1, on Friday, November 7. The very next game, Providence tied with No. 3 Harvard, 2-2, in Cambridge, Mass. on Wednesday, November 10. After a month lay-off, the Friars lost to No. 2 Dartmouth, 10-2, in Dartmouth, N.H. on January 2, 2005. On January 8, the Friars topped No. 5 Mercyhurst, 3-2, in Erie, Pa. On January 29, Providence defeated No. 8 New Hampshire, 5-1, and loss to the Wildcats on Sunday, January 30, 2-1, at New Hampshire.

THATCHER AMONG NATION'S TOP STARS... Junior forward Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) is among the nation's top-ranked stars in five categories. Thatcher is ranked 11th in points per game (1.88), 14th in goals per game (0.80), eighth in assists per game (1.08), and seventh in power play goals (11), and tied for seventh in game-winning goals (5).

GIGLIOTTI LEADS DEFENSIVE SCORERS... Sophomore Kristin Gigliotti (Saugoit, N.Y.) leads HOCKEY EAST defenders in scoring with 16 points (three goals, 13 assists). Gigliotti is ranked 18th nationally in defensive scoring as she averages 0.53 points per game.

THE PROVIDENCE POWER PLAY... The Friars lead the league with 37 power play goals. The Friars are ranked seventh in the nation with a 0.19 power play percentage.

FIRST PERIOD FRIARS... Providence is an unbeaten team when leading after the first period (11-0-1). This season, the Friars have scored 30 goals in the first period, while allowing only 17.

FOUR WINS AWAY... With four games remaining in the regular season, Head Coach Bob Deraney is four wins away from posting his fourth consecutive 20-win season and his fifth in sixth years.

FRIARS PICKED No. 2 IN HOCKEY EAST... The Providence College women's hockey team was picked to finish second in the HOCKEY EAST pre-season poll, as voted by league coaches. The three-time defending league champions, completed the 2003-04 season with an overall record of 21-13-2, finishing second in the conference behind highly-favored New Hampshire.

PROVIDENCE ATTENDS 2004 U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL FESTIVAL AND UNDER-22 TEAM... The Friars were represented at the Festival by eight current and former players. Former Providence standouts Alana Blahoski (St. Paul, Minn.), Head Coach of the Under-22 team, Jessica Tabb (Holland, Mass.), Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.) and Meredith Roth (Dubuque, Iowa.) conclude the Friar alumni line-up. The list of current Providence players that were on the squad include seniors Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) and Ashley Payton (Chesterfield, Mo.). This was the fifth time that Zimmerman was a part of USA Hockey. This would have been the second time Payton had participated in the Festival, however, she was unable to attend due to injury. Rounding out the list of current Friars were junior Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) and first time participant Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) who both played on the Under-22 squad. This was the fourth time that Thatcher was with the National program after making her debut last year at the Festival.

FRIARS GONE TO GRADUATION... The Friars lost five seniors from last season's team to graduation, but welcome six incoming freshmen who will add more talent to an already skilled and committed squad. The five graduated seniors include defenders Kelli Halcisak (Gross Ile, Mich.), who led the team in scoring with 46 points on 20 goals and 26 assists, and Meredith Roth (Dubuque, Iowa), who finished with six goals and 14 assists (20 points). Forwards Darlene Stephenson (Virden, Manitoba) and Sarah Youlen (Postdam, N.Y.) finished the year with 36 points (10 goals, 26 assists) and six points (two goals, four assists), respectively. Goaltender Amy Quinlan (Baton Rouge, La.) completed the season with a 4-1-0 record, a 1.75 goals against average and an .893 save percentage. All five seniors provided leadership to the Friar squad and were key contributors to last season's team.

Game Notes: The Providence College women's hockey team opened its regular season with a 6-2 non-conference victory over the Colgate Raiders on Saturday, October 16, at Colgate's Starr Rink in Hamilton, N.Y. Providence got on the scoreboard within the first 48 seconds of the game. Sophomore [Sonny Watrous](#) (Albuquerque, N.M.) stole a pass from Kate Wolgemuth in front of Colgate's net and fired the puck past Raiders' goaltender Rebecca Lahar. Less than two minutes later, junior [Karen Thatcher](#) (Douglas, Mass.) netted a power play goal from senior [Rush Zimmerman](#) (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) and Watrous. Thatcher scored her second goal of the game at the 11:02 mark of the first period to give the Friars a commanding 3-0 edge to lead off the second period. Thatcher's goal was assisted by sophomore [Kristin Gigliotti](#) (Sauquoit, N.Y.) and senior [Mara Amrhein](#) (Waukesha, Wis.). Colgate found its first goal four minutes into the second period with a goal by Courtney Sekevitch at the 4:26 mark, assisted by Cassie Reid. Zimmerman matched the Raiders' lone goal in the second period with her own at 12:14 with an assist by Watrous. Freshman [Rachel Crissy](#) (Naperville, Ill.), and Gigliotti added one goal apiece in the third period to end the game 6-2. Providence held the shot advantage 25-17, including an 11-3 advantage in the third period. The Friars went 3-8 on the power play. Game Notes: The Providence College women's hockey team closed out their two-game away series with a 2-1 loss to Colgate on Sunday, October 17 at Starr Rink in Hamilton, N.Y. The Friars evened the series, 1-1 with a 6-2 victory over the Raiders on Saturday, October 16. Amanda Barre led the way for Colgate as the only Raider to put the puck in the net. After a scoreless first period, Barre scored at 2:06 in the second with a pass from Allison Paiano and Becky Irvine. At the 3:17 mark of the third period, Barre scored again, as she posted her second goal of the game and her first game-winning goal of the season. Chelsey Rhodes was credited the assist, while Paiano recorded her second of the game and third for the season. The Friars pushed forward in the third period with a power-play goal by [Hilary Greaves](#) (Cranston, R.I.) at the 7:05 mark. Freshman [Kathleen Smith](#) (Waterloo, Ontario) and junior [Katelynn Laffin](#) (Norwell, Mass.) registered their first assists of the season on the play. Colgate's defense stood strong the rest of the period as they kept the Friars off the board. Providence went 1-10 in the power play, while Colgate went 2-10.
