**LATEST RESULTS...** The Friars went on the road for the first time in 2008 and split the weekend games. On October 18, PC traveled to Northeastern for the first Hockey East game of the season. The Friars outshot the Huskies, 31-20, but ran into a hot goaltender and fell, 1-0. Senior Danielle Ciarletta made 19 saves on the day and improved her goals against average to 1.54 on the season. On Sunday, the Friars earned their first Hockey East victory of the season as they caged the Catamounts of Vermont and came away with a 4-2 road victory. The Friars put home four goals in the second period and freshman Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) made 25 saves to earn her second victory of the season. Four Friars scored in the game and Alyse Ruff netted the game winner at 9:33 of the second period. Providence also saw goals from Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.), Jackie Duncan (Kitchener, Ontario), and Arianna Rigano (Malden, Mass.).

**HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN...** The explosive freshman class continues to produce for Coach Deraney. In the two games this past weekend, Laura Veharanta registered her fourth power-play goal of the season. Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) scored a highlight reel goal while defending a penalty in the 6-2 victory over Colgate on October 11. Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) has also found the back of the net for PC. She scored in the 3-2 defeat at the hands of Ohio State on October 4. Goaltender Genevieve Lacasse earned the first victory of her career against Colgate as she stopped 42 shots in the game. So far, the freshman class is responsible for 43% (6 of 14) of the goals scored this season while contributing 32% (11 of 34) of the team's points. Veharanta, Cottrell, Kate Bacon (Chanhassen, Minn.) and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play unit as well.

**FIRSTS...** Junior Arianna Rigano netted her first goal in Providence colors in Sunday's 4-2 victory over Vermont. Freshman Jennifer Friedman registered her first assist on the first goal of the game vs. Vermont. Ashley Cottrell earned her first helper on Sunday as well.

**PROVIDENCE VERSUS BOSTON COLLEGE...** The Friars own a 45-9-1 all-time record against the Eagles. In the last meeting between the two Hockey East foes on March 1, 2008, the Friars hosted BC and the two teams played to a 2-2 draw. Sarah Feldman scored both goals for the Friars as they earned the draw to advance to the 2008 Hockey East Tournament. Providence came into the game needing at least a tie in order to advance to post season play. Providence is 3-6-1 in the last 10 meetings between the two schools and 30-8-1 since Boston College became a varsity program in 1994.

conference play. In the Eagles' only conference game of the season, they lost to New Hampshire in a shootout, which marked the first in the history of the league. The final score was 3-2 in favor of the Wildcats. In their latest contest, the Eagles defeated RPI, 5-2. BC was led by freshman Mary Restuccia as she scored two goals and added one assist in the victory. On the season, Kelli Stack has recorded five goals and three assists. She currently ranks second in the nation in points per game (2.00) and goals per game (1.25).

**EAGLE NETMINDERS...** Junior Molly Schaus has started all four games for the Eagles in 2008. She ranks third in Hockey East with a .927 goals against average and fourth in the league with a .932 save percentage. In 2007-08, she topped her own single-season saves record from 06-07. Schaus now holds the top two spots in this category with 920 and 866 in 07-08 and 06-07 respectively. Schaus also holds the top spot in career goals against average and career wins.

**PROVIDENCE VS. MAINE...** The Friars hold a 23-3-5 record all-time against the Black Bears and a record of 14-1-5 over the past 20 games. During their last contest on December 2, 2007, Providence defeated Maine, 4-0. Erin Normore scored the game winning goal while Danielle Ciarletta stopped all 24 shots she faced to earn the shutout. This game led to their 16th consecutive undefeated game against the Black Bears.

**SCOUTING THE BLACKBEARS...** Coming into Sunday's match-up against the Friars, Maine has a season record of 2-4-0 with one game on Saturday against Boston University. In their last contest, the Black Bears had a win of 11-1 against Sacred Heart. Maine forward Jennie Gallow registered a hat trick and two assists in the victory. Maine currently has two players, Lexie Hoffmeyer and Vanessa Vani, tied for 10th for overall scoring in the conference with seven points each. The Black Bears will begin their conference games this weekend with their first six games all being non-conference.

**MAINE'S LAST LINE OF DEFENSE...** The Black Bears' Genevieve Turgeon is ranked number one in Hockey East with 188 saves on the season. As for defensemen scoring, Maine's Melissa Gagnon is tied for 6th in the conference with one goal and three assists for four points.

**QUICK HITS...** Among all Hockey East freshman, Laura Veharanta ranks first with four goals scored on the season. She also is tied for first in the conference with four power-play goals. Veharanta's four power-play goals are tied for second most in the nation. Freshman netminder Genevieve Lacasse owns the third highest save percentage (9.33) and total saves (125) amongst Hockey East netminders. Lacasse .933 save percentage is good for 10th in the country. Providence power play percentage (18.6) is third in the conference.
