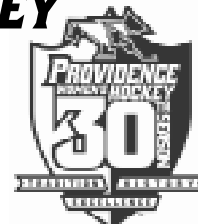
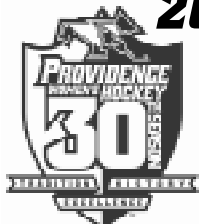

THIS WEEK'S GAMES... The Providence College Friars play a home-and-home series against the HOCKEY EAST foe Boston College to closeout the regular season. The Friars won two games earlier this season against the Eagles, 8-1 and 5-2. The games next weekend were originally scheduled to be played on December 6 and 7 but were postponed due to a blizzard. Providence leads the all-time series with Boston College, 37-2-0.

NEXT WEEKEND'S GAMES... Next weekend Providence, the No. 2 seed in the HOCKEY EAST Tournament, will take on the No. 3 seed Maine. Their semifinal round game will take place on Saturday, March 20 at 1:00p.m. at Northeastern's Matthews Arena. The second semifinal round game will take place at 4:00 p.m. between the No. 1 seed New Hampshire and the No. 4 seed Northeastern. The winners of both semifinal round games will meet in the championship game on Sunday, March 21 at 1:00 p.m. at Matthews Arena.

FRIARS VERSUS EAGLES... This weekend's game will mark the 40th and 41st meetings between the Eagles and Friars. Providence owns a 37-2-0 record in the all-time series which started during the 1976-77 season. The Friars lost the first game of the series, 5-3, before winning the next 32 meetings. Their second loss came on March 3, 2002 by the score of 1-0. The largest margin of victory for the Friars was on November 11, 1981 as they defeated the Eagles, 16-1. Last season Providence swept their three game series with Boston College outscoring them, 17-4. Included in the three games sweep was the inaugural HOCKEY EAST game on November 1, 2002 which the Friars won, 4-1.

SCOUTING BOSTON COLLEGE... The Eagles enter the weekend with a 6-20-3 record overall and a 1-16-1 record in HOCKEY EAST play. The Eagles will miss the HOCKEY EAST tournament for the second straight season as they are currently in last place with three points. Boston College is led in scoring by sophomore Sarah Courtney with eight goals and eight assists for 16 points. Juniors Kerri Sanders and Heidi Seideward are second and third on the team in scoring, respectively. Sanders has nine goals and four assists for 13 points, while Seideward has 12 points (five goals, seven assists). The anchor of the Eagles defense has been junior goaltender Lisa Davis. Davis has played in 24 games and has posted a goals against average of 3.24 with a .904 save percentage and one shutout.

2003-04 Providence College Women's Hockey Notes

FRIARS STATISTICAL LEADERS... The Friars are led in scoring this season by senior Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.) and junior Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) with 41 points on 17 goals, 24 assists and 36 points on 15 goals and 21 assists, respectively. Senior Darlene Stephenson (Viriden, Manitoba) and sophomore Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) are third and fourth on the team with nine goals, 23 assists and seven goals, 17 assists, respectively. Halcisak leads the team in goals (17) and assists (22). Halcisak also leads the team in shots with 147. Zimmerman has the team lead in penalty minutes with 49. Sophomore goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) leads the team in goals against average (2.38) and save percentage (.899).

FRIAR SPECIAL TEAMS... Providence's power play is currently ranked eighth in the nation at 21 percent (38 for 182) and second in HOCKEY EAST at 23.3 percent (21 for 90). Short-handed, the Friars rank 20th in the nation killing off penalties at the rate of 84.4 percent (135 of 160), while scoring five short-handed goals. In HOCKEY EAST play the Friars are second, allowing 11 goals on 81 attempts (86.4 percent).

FRIARS 500... On Sunday, February 22 Providence College defeated Boston College, 5-2, to become the second Division I women's hockey team to reach the 500 victory plateau. Senior Meredith Roth (Dubuque, Iowa) scored the game-winning goal half way through the second period. Sophomore Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) and junior Hilary Greaves (Cranston, R.I.) each earned assists on the historic play. Junior goaltender Amy Thomas (Austin, Texas) turned aside 13 shots to earn the victory. The victory was a perfect ending for the Friars 30th anniversary alumni weekend celebration. On Saturday, February 21 several alumni and their families took part in an early morning alumni game and banquet later that evening to celebrate the program's 30 years of history, tradition and excellence.

PROVIDENCE PRODUCTION LINES... The Friars are led in scoring this season by seniors Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.), Meredith Roth (Dubuque, Iowa) and Darlene Stephenson (Viriden, Manitoba), juniors Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) and Ashley Payton (Chesterfield, Mo.), sophomore Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) and freshman Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.). While they are not always on the ice together in even-strength situations, they do see time together on special teams. So far this season they have accounted for 27 of the team's 39 power-play goals and have scored 76 percent of the team's goals. They have also combined for 75 percent (197 of 262) of the points the team has scored.

STEPHENSON JOINS THE CENTURY CLUB... Senior forward Darlene Stephenson (Viriden, Manitoba) became the 25th woman in Friar history to score 100 points in her career. Stephenson has amassed 123 points so far in her career as a Friar scoring 54 goals and 69 assists in 136 games. This season Stephenson is third on the team in points with nine goals and 23 assists. Last season, senior Jenn Butsch (Berlin, Vt.) and junior Halcisak both eclipsed the century mark two weeks apart. It was the first time two Providence players had accomplished the feat in the same year since Heather LaDuke (Massena, N.Y.) '90 and Kelly O'Leary (Auburn, Mass.) '90 both reached 100 career points during the 1989-1990 season. The all-time leading scorer in Providence women's ice hockey history is Cammi Granato (Downer's Grove, Ill.) from the class of 1993 who finished her career with 256 points.

ROTH LEAVES HER MARK... Senior Meredith Roth (Dubuque, Iowa) has entered the Providence record book twice this season. Roth not only became the 41st woman in Friar history to play in more than 100 games but she also broke the career penalty mark. Roth, who entered the season with 171 penalty minutes, currently has 46 penalty minutes so far this season giving her a total of 217 minutes. Roth passed former Friar career penalty minute leader Valerie Bono (Woburn, Mass.), who amassed 190 penalty minutes, on Saturday November 15 in a 3-1 victory over Yale. Roth has been an integral part of the back-to-back championship teams that Providence has put together in their last two seasons. Always among the top-10 in scoring on the team, Roth is also a steady presence on defense.

FRIARS WEAR CHAMPIONSHIP BADGE... The HOCKEY EAST Association will identify its defending regular season and tournament champions with a special patch each season. The regular season winner will wear a silver star and the tournament champions will wear a gold star. The Friars, champions of both the regular season and postseason tournament in HOCKEY EAST's inaugural season, will wear a gold star with a silver outline on their uniforms. The patch is designed to serve as a season-long honor for the defending champions and motivation for other teams trying to unseat them. HOCKEY EAST Commissioner Joe Bertagna suggested the idea to league coaches having observed the custom during his playing days in Europe.

HALCISAK HIGHLIGHTS... Senior defender Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.) continues to prove that she is among the top athletes in women's hockey. Within the last two weeks, Halcisak has been named to the United States National Team that will compete in the IIHF Women's World Championships this spring and one of 10 finalists for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial award that recognizes the most outstanding player in women's collegiate hockey.

RUSH RACES TO 100... Junior Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) is just two points shy of becoming the 26th player in the program's history to eclipse 100 points in her career. She tallied her first career hat trick and added two assists on Sunday, February 15 in a 7-0 victory over Connecticut. Zimmerman, who has averaged 1.04 points per game in her career, has tallied 98 points in 94 games. She looks to join teammates seniors Darlene Stephenson (Virden, Manitoba), who broke the century mark earlier this season, and Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.).

NEW FRIAR FACES... This year's freshman class has seen significant ice time and have been used in all situations of the game. Kristin Gigliotti (Sauquoit, N.Y.) has recorded two goals and six assists through 30 games. Fellow freshman Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) has 12 goals and 10 assists, while Kristen Porter (Ayer, Mass.) has tallied three goals and one assist. Sophomore transfer-student Karen Thatcher (Douglas, Mass.) sees significant ice time on special teams as well as in full-strength situations. So far this season Thatcher has recorded seven goals and 17 assists in 29 games.

SONNY SHINES... Freshman Sonny Watrous (Albuquerque, N.M.) has continued to light the lamp. In 30 games Watrous has tallied 12 goals, including the overtime game winner on February 18 in a 2-1 victory over No. 10 Brown, and added 10 assists. Her first assist came on senior Darlene Stephenson's (Virden, Manitoba) game-winning goal in a 3-1 victory over Connecticut on January 17. She was named HOCKEY EAST Player of the Week on January 19, Rookie of the Week on February 2 and Itech Rookie of the Month for February.

HALCISAK HAS HOT HAND... Senior defender Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.) leads the team in scoring for the second year in a row. After five months of play, Halcisak has 17 goals and 24 assists for 41 points. She is currently third in the Nation in scoring among defenders. Halcisak has scored at least one point in 25 of Providence's 32 games, with 11 multi-point games including one hat trick.

CANADA CALLS BUGDEN ANSWERS...

Sophomore goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) played in the European Women's Under-22 Air Canada Cup for Team Canada. Canada won the event defeating Finland, Switzerland and Germany. Bugden, who saw action in two games, didn't allow a goal. In her only complete game she shutout the Swiss, 6-0.

FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... This season the Friars are 1-9-1 versus ranked teams. Providence lost its first game of the season on Friday, October 31, 7-2, to No. 2 Dartmouth. Then on Tuesday, November 11 the Friars dropped their second game of the season, 3-0, as they were defeated by No. 3 Harvard. Providence lost its third game of the season on Sunday, November 16, 4-2, to No. 10 Princeton. Providence dropped its fifth game of the season and its second of the year to No. 3 Harvard, 2-1, on December 2. The new year started like the previous year ended as the Friars dropped two 2-1 games to a ranked opponent as they fell to No. 10 Minnesota State on January 3 and 4. Providence continued to struggle versus ranked opponents as they fell, 3-2, to No. 7 Mercyhurst on January 10. Providence was defeated for the second time this season by No. 2 Dartmouth, 8-6, on Wednesday, January 21. The Friars dropped their ninth game to a ranked opponent on Saturday, January 31 against New Hampshire, 4-3. Providence turned the table on the Wildcats Sunday, February 1 as they earned their first victory against a ranked opponent since March 16, 2003 when they defeated the fifth-ranked Wildcats in the inaugural HOCKEY EAST championship game, 1-0. The Friars notched their second victory of the season over a ranked opponent on February 18 when they defeated No. 10 Brown in overtime, 2-1. Providence lost its next two games against No. 9 New Hampshire, 7-4 and 4-3 in overtime on February 28 and 29, respectively. On Sunday, October 19 the Friars played No.7 St. Lawrence to a 2-2 draw. Last season, the Friars were 3-6-2 against ranked teams.

PROVIDENCE LOCKS UP DERANEY...

Providence College Athletics Director Bob Driscoll announced on Monday, November 3 that Bob Deraney, head coach of the women's ice hockey team, and Providence College have agreed to a five-year contract extension. Deraney, entering his fifth season at Providence, is the second most successful coach in the program's history, posting a 99-56-18 career record. He guided the women's team to the 2002 ECAC Eastern League title and the 2003 HOCKEY EAST Regular Season and Tournament titles. Three of his four teams have recorded 20 or more wins. When announcing the extension, Driscoll stated, "Providence College is glad to have such a skilled and dedicated coach to help shape and grow the tradition of women's hockey. We look forward to five more exciting years."

HOCKEY EAST HISTORY

FRIARS PLAY IN THE NEWLY FORMED HOCKEY EAST... Providence began playing in the newly formed Women's HOCKEY EAST during the 2002-2003 season. Other schools in the league include Boston College, Connecticut, Maine, New Hampshire and Northeastern. League play started on Friday, November 1 with Providence College defeating Boston College, 4-1. Sophomore Mara Amrhein (Waukesha, Wis.) scored the first goal in conference history at the 18:28 mark of the first period. Amrhein was assisted on the play by senior Danielle Culgin (Framingham, Mass.).

No. 8 FRIARS DEFEAT BOSTON COLLEGE IN FIRST HOCKEY EAST GAME... On Friday, November 1, Providence College won the first ever game in the Women's HOCKEY EAST. Sophomore Mara Amrhein (Waukesha, Wis.) had a night full of firsts. Amrhein not only netted the first goal of the game, but also the first goal ever in the women's HOCKEY EAST. The goal was also Amrhein's first goal of the season and of her career. Early in the second period the Eagles tied the score when Alaina Clark beat freshman goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland). Freshman Katelynn Laffin (Norwell, Mass.) put the Friars back out in front when she scored her first collegiate goal on the power-play. After Laffin's goal the Friars never looked back as junior Darlene Stephenson (Virden, Manitoba) and sophomore Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) each added a goal in the third period. Freshman goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) started her fourth consecutive game on Friday and made 12 saves. The Friars outshot the Eagles, 36-13. Providence went, 1-5, on the power play and was able to hold Boston College to one goal in four chances on the man advantage.



FRIARS MAKE HISTORY WITH REGULAR SEASON TITLE... In a season of historical firsts for Women's HOCKEY EAST, the Friars defeated Maine, 2-1, on Sunday, February 23 to claim the Women's HOCKEY EAST regular season title. Providence and New Hampshire played a home-and-home series earlier in the month with each team winning at home. The Friars shutout the Wildcats, 3-0, on Saturday, February 1 at Schneider Arena only to lose, 4-1, the next day at the Whittemore Center. In the rubber-match the Wildcats traveled to Providence on Saturday, February 22 and lost, 7-4. Junior Darlene Stephenson (Virden, Manitoba) scored the game-winning goal, short-handed, for the Friars and freshman goaltender Jana Bugden (Corner Brook, Newfoundland) made 35 saves on 39 shots.

HALCISAK WINS HOCKEY EAST SCORING TITLE... Junior Kelli Halcisak (Grosse Ile, Mich.) was awarded the inaugural women's HOCKEY EAST regular season scoring title on Monday, March 3, 2003. Halcisak tallied 21 points (6 goals and 15 assists) in 15 league games to earn the honor. She was also the league's leading scorer when all games were taken into consideration, finishing one point ahead of teammate sophomore Rush Zimmerman (Grosse Pointe, Mich.) who posted 38 points (19 goals and 19 assists).

FRIARS EXPERIENCE DEJAVU ALL OVER AGAIN... On March 16, 2003 the Friars won the inaugural Women's HOCKEY EAST tournament title by defeating New Hampshire, 1-0, in Boston, Mass. For the second time in Providence's storied hockey history they laid claim to winning the first HOCKEY EAST tournament title. In 1985, the men's squad defeated Boston College, 2-1, in double overtime. Former Providence head coach and then Athletic Director, Lou Lamoriello, played an important role in forming the HOCKEY EAST Association and served as the league's first director from 1984-1987.
