THIS WEEKEND... The Friars return to action as they play host to the Saints of St. Lawrence on Friday at 7:00 p.m. before hosting Colgate University on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. PC is coming off an 0-2 weekend after being swept by visiting Ohio State. Providence was defeated in game one, 2-1, on Friday before falling, 3-2, on Saturday. Two freshmen registered their first career goals with PC on the weekend. Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) scored the lone goal for the Friars on Friday while Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) gave PC an early lead on Saturday. Senior Mari Pehkonen recorded two points on the weekend. In game one, Pehkonen earned the assist on Veharanta's power-play tally. Game two saw the star forward score a power-play goal in the second period.

HOW ABOUT THOSE FRESHMEN... The high-touted freshmen class has already paid dividends to Friar hockey in 2008. Two freshmen registered their first career goals with PC over the weekend. Laura Veharanta (La Verne, Calif.) scored the lone goal for the Friars on Friday while Abby Gauthier (Lynn, Mass.) gave PC an early lead on Saturday. Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) made her first start between the pipes on Saturday, making 32 saves in the 3-2 defeat. Veharanta, forward Ashley Cottrell (Sterling Heights, Mich.) and defenseman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) have all seen significant time on the power-play unit thus far.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS SLU... The Friars own a 24-7-3 all-time record against St. Lawrence. In the last meeting between the two northeast powers on October 20, 2007, St. Lawrence welcomed Providence to Canton, N.Y. and handed the Friars an 8-0 defeat. In the last three meetings, the Saints own a 3-0 edge as the Friars have not defeated St. Lawrence since November of 2004 when PC won, 5-1, in Providence.

SCOUTING THE SAINTS... #7 St. Lawrence enters the 2008-09 season after another successful campaign that saw the Saints advance to their fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament and to the ECAC Hockey Championship Game last March. The Saints welcome back five of their top eight scorers, including senior captain Marianna Locke (23-13-34) and assistant captains Carson Duggan (21-13-34), Lisa Batchelor (7-15-22) and Allison Domenico (17-19-36). Between the pipes, the Saints will rely on transfer Brittony Chartier from the University of Minnesota. Chartier had a successful career in the WCHA, posting a 2.13 gaa and a .913 save percentage in 18 games played.

THE SAINTS IN ACTION... St. Lawrence defeated McGill, 5-4, in their lone exhibition contest of the 2008-09 season. In the victory, the Saints received two goals from senior forward Carson Duggan to go along with a tally apiece from classmate Marianna Locke, and sophomores Michelle Zimmerman and Kristen Vanasse.

PROVIDENCE VS COLGATE... The Friars hold a 3-1-2 record all-time against the Red Raiders. Last season, the two squads played to a 5-5 tie in Hamilton, N.Y. Five different players scored for the Friars. Danielle Ciarletta (Blaine, Minn.) came up with 27 saves to earn the draw. Providence is undefeated against Colgate in the last four games going 2-0-2.

SCOUTING THE RED RAIDERS... Colgate defeated Syracuse, 4-3, in their opening game of 2008. The Red Raiders were led by junior Katie Stewart who recorded a goal and an assist on the night. Colgate was able to outshoot the Orange, 38-19. Senior goaltender Elayna Hamashuk and sophomore Lisa Plenderleith split time between the pipes. Both goaltenders made eight saves for the game. Last season, Colgate was led by current senior Sam Hunt who registered 22 goals and 14 points for 36 points. Plenderleith finished the 2007-08 season with a record of 11-14-4 to go along with a 2.50 gaa.

PROVIDENCE VS THE ECAC... Last season, the Friars faced off against six opponents from the ECAC, posting a 1-4-1 record. The lone win for PC against ECAC foes was a 5-2 victory over Brown in the 2008 Mayor's Cup. Last season PC was defeated by Harvard, Dartmouth, Yale and St. Lawrence. Overall, The Friars were outscored 23-13 in the six games
