Warm-up Tosses

- This weekend's games will be Penn State's first in the state of Alabama since the 1995 season, when the Nittany Lions played at Alabama, UAB, Samford and Auburn during a spring break trip.

- The trip this weekend will also mark just Penn State's second trip to Alabama, with the 1995 trip being the only other one.

- Penn State won its season opener for the first time since 2002 last weekend at High Point.

- First baseman **Cory Wine** needs just 45 putouts to move into third place on the all-time Penn State list for career putouts.

- **Drew O'Neil** needs just three saves to tie and four to break the career record for saves at Penn State.

- Outfield **Brian Ernst** hit in all three games at High Point last weekend, the only Nittany Lion to do so.

- Penn State has been picked to finish anywhere from second through fourth in the Big Ten this year by the college baseball publications. The Big Ten itself does not conduct a preseason poll for baseball.

- Relief pitcher **Drew O'Neil** is currently on three different watch lists for major national awards.

- Wake Forest is receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Top 25 poll

Looking Ahead

The Nittany Lions will once again head back to Florida for their annual spring break trip. This year will mark the second time in the last three years the Nittany Lions will play their spring break games in the Sunshine State. This year, Penn State will play eight games eight days, beginning next Sunday, March 9 through the following Sunday, March 16. Seven of the eight games will be neutral site games in West Palm Beach, Fla. while one will be a true road game at Miami (Fla.) in Coral Gables, Fla.

with both meetings coming in the 2001 season when the Trojans were still known as Troy State. The games came at a neutral site at the Texas A&M Aggie Classic in College Station, Texas. Troy won the first game 14-4 while the Nittany Lions rebounded to win the second game 13-3.

Series vs. Kennesaw State

This will be Penn State's first-ever meeting with Kennesaw State.

Series vs. Wake Forest

Penn State has a 1-3 all-time mark against the Deamon Deacons. The Nittany Lions opened the 2001 season with two games at Wake Forest and Wake won both games by scores of 10-5 and 3-2. The teams' other two meetings came in the 1927 and 1928 seasons with Wake winning 5-0 in the teams' first meeting in 1927 and Penn State picking up its only win in the series, a 5-2 victory in the 1928 season.

The Coach

Robbie Wine (Oklahoma State, 2002) is in his fourth season as head coach at Penn State where he has a 80-91 career record. Prior to coming to Penn State, Wine spent eight years at his alma mater as an assistant coach. Prior to that, he spent six years in the professional ranks as a coach. He

Leaping Forward

Penn State will be playing on February 29, also known to some as leap day, for the second straight leap year. The Nittany Lions defeated Norfolk State on February 29, 2004. Prior to that, the last time the Nits had played on February 29 was back in 1992. Overall, in its history, Penn State has played on leap day three times and hold a 2-1 record in those games. The other game was a loss to San Diego in 1988.

O'Neil Moves Closer to Save Record on Opening Weekend

Penn State closer **Drew O'Neil** needed just 11 pitches over 1.1 innings to record his first save of the year in Penn State's 4-2 win over High Point on opening weekend. The save was the 12th of his career, moving him out of a tie with Shawn Fagan (1997-00) and into second place alone. He now needs just three to tie and four to break the record of Clint Eury (2002-05), who holds the career record with 15.

Kelley Makes First Mound Appearance Since '06

Junior OF/P **Scott Kelley** made his first appearance on the mound last weekend since 2006. Solely a pitcher as a freshman and solely an outfielder last year, he is taking on a dual role this year.

O'Neil Garners Numerous Preseason Recognition

Penn State relief pitcher **Drew O'Neil** has been named to the preseason watch lists for three major awards. He is on the watch lists for the Brooks Wallace Award, the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, and the Golden Spikes Award. O'Neil was also a preseason second team All-American by Ping!Baseball and a third team Louisville Slugger preseason All-American by Collegiate Baseball.

Captains Named

For the first time in fourth-year head coach **Robbie Wine's** tenure as the Nittany Lions' skipper, team captains have been named this year. Two fifth-year seniors in catcher **Joe Blackburn** and outfielder **Brian Ernst** and senior pitcher **Paul Hawkins** have been named the first team captains in the Wine era.

Not on the Road for Long

With the new universal starting date as well as Penn State's Medlar Field at Lubrano Park as a home facility, most likely gone are the days of playing as many as 25 games on the road to start the season for Penn State. This year, just like last year, Penn State will play just its first 14 games on the road prior to its home opener on March 21 against Lehigh. After the three games this weekend at High Point, the Lions will play three games in Dothan, Ala. next weekend and then eight games over its spring break trip in West Palm Beach, Fla. Penn State is scheduled to play 23 of its final 41 games at home.

Top Hitters Return

Penn State welcomes back its leading hitter and four of its top five hitters from last year. Leading hitter and starting catcher **Joe Blackburn** (.347) returns as does third-leading hitter **Brian Ernst** (.313) as well as

Drew will enter the 2008 season as an All-American candidate and with an opportunity to be taken very high in the 2008 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft as well as break some more school records if he has another season like he did last year. Drew had the finest season ever for a Penn State relief pitcher and one of the best seasons ever for a Nittany Lion hurler, period. A relatively unknown and quiet junior college transfer from Young Harris College entering last year, he burst onto the Big Ten and national scene last year by putting up some staggering and unprecedented numbers for a Penn State pitcher while emerging as the top closer in the Big Ten. At the conclusion of his record-setting season, he was drafted in the eighth round of last year's MLB Amateur Draft by the Cincinnati Reds, one of a record-tying five Nittany Lions to be drafted off of last year's team. He turned down a chance to play professional ball and to join former teammate Scott Gaffney with the Reds and elected to return to Penn State for his junior season, which will be his fourth year in college since he redshirted as a freshman at Wake Forest. In addition to almost certainly boosting his draft stock this year, Drew will also be very close to earning his degree at the conclusion of this season.

2007: Set a new school record for saves in a season with 11, easily shattering the old record of seven....Moved all the way up to a tie for second on the Penn State career saves list in just one season, and is just five shy of breaking the record of 15....Went 11-for-12 in save opportunities and has not allowed only two of 11 inherited runners to score....Held the opponent without any runs in 18 of his 23 appearances and without any earned runs in 20 of 23....Had a string of 26.2 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run, which spanned over his 17 appearances from March 24 through May 26....In that same span, had a streak of 20.1 straight scoreless innings over 13 straight appearances from April 4 through May 24....Did not allow a walk in nine straight appearances, which spanned from April 4 through May 19 and a total of 15.2 innings....Retired 23 straight hitters over six appearances

from April 15 - May 12, earning three saves and a win in that time frame....Penn State picked up a win in 19 of his 23 appearances....Had a 0.00 ERA and did not allow an earned or unearned run in 16.1 innings to go along with a 2-0 record and eight saves in Big Ten play....Also allowed just six hits and limited hitters to a .113 average in the Big Ten....Overall, allowed just one earned run all year in 22.1 innings to a Big Ten team, and that run came in the Big Ten Tournament in his sixth inning of work in three days....Overall, had a microscopic ERA of 1.34 in 33.2 innings of work and allowed just five earned runs (nine overall) and 22 hits to go along with a 4-2 record while limiting opponents to a .188 batting average....Named first team All-Big Ten.

Joe Blackburn will be looking to end his career with a monster year at the plate and with another solid year of handling the outstanding Penn State pitching staff behind the plate as he hopes to build his draft stock while helping the Nittany Lions to another successful season. Joe will be one of the top hitters in the Big Ten this year after finishing in the top 10 in several offensive categories in the Big Ten last year and will be the team's primary catcher while also playing DH at times and he can also play first base. One of two fifth-year seniors on the team, Joe is known for working well with the pitching staff and his outstanding work with the team's outstanding pitchers is evidenced by the difference in ERA last year when he was the catcher.
