HEAD COACH JEFF TAMBRONI

Veteran head coach Jeff Tambroni is in his first year as head coach of the Nittany Lion men's lacrosse team after ten outstanding seasons as head coach at Cornell University. Entering the season, Tambroni ranked fifth among active Division I coaches in winning percentage. In his last year with the Big Red, he picked up his eighth-straight Ivy League title and led the Big Red to a second-straight national semifinal appearance. Tambroni led Cornell to three NCAA semifinal appearances in the past four seasons (2007, 2009 and 2010), including the NCAA Final in 2009. He currently sports a 116-46 overall record as he enters his 11th season as a head coach. Tambroni is 7-6 at Penn State and in his first year.



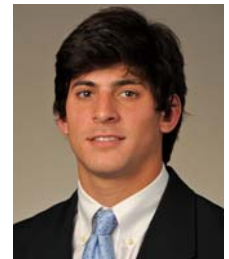

THIS WEEK'S GAMES

Penn State (7-6, 4-2 CAA) will host No. 16 Massachusetts (9-4, 4-2 CAA) in the semifinals of the CAA Playoffs at Jeffrey Field at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, May 4. The Nittany Lions earned the No. 2 seed in the play-off, while Massachusetts holds the No. 3 seed. The Nittany Lions are coming off a 9-4 road loss to No. 8 Hofstra last Saturday. With the win, Hofstra clinched the No. 1 seed in the CAA semifinal, and will take on the No. 4 seed Delaware at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, May 4.

Leading Penn State's offense thus far this season are Shane Sturgis (17 goals, 16 assists), Matt Mackrides (20 goals, nine assists), Jack Forster (12 goals, one assist), Nick Dolik (10 goals, two assists) and Gavin Ahern (eight goals, one assist). Penn State's midfield is led by Colton Vosburgh (nine goals, three assists), Kyle VanThof (six goals, seven assists), and Tom LaCrosse (seven goals, three assists). The Lion defense is led by senior Matt Bernier and freshman goalie Austin Kaut.

The No. 16-ranked Massachusetts Minutemen are coming off an 11-5 win over conference opponent Delaware last Saturday, April 30. The Minutemen are lead in scoring by sophomore attackman Will Manny (20 goals, 21 assists), junior attackman Art Kell (22 goals, 14 assists), junior midfielder Anthony Biscardi (18 goals, 10 assists), and senior midfielder Ryan Hantverk (16 goals, eight assists).

AHERN HAS STANDOUT GAME AGAINST No. 8 HOFSTRA

Freshman attackman Gavin Ahern netted two goals for the Nittany Lions in Penn State's 9-4 loss to No. 8 Hofstra on Saturday. Ahern's two goals led Penn State in scoring while freshman goalie Austin Kaut had eight saves and nine goals against in the game.

MACKRIDES, BOGERT EARN CAA PLAYER AND ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONORS

Junior captain Matt Mackrides earned his first CAA Player of the Week Honor of the year, and freshman defenseman Stephen Bogert earned his first CAA Rookie of the Week Honor after the Nittany Lions' win over No. 19 Delaware last Saturday. Mackrides scored on four of his five shots on goal and added an assist in the win. Bogert logged a team-high seven groundballs and helped limit Delaware to just three goals on a total of 39 shots (15 on goal).

LIONS CLINCH CAA PLAYOFF SPOT WITH KEY WIN OVER #19 DELAWARE

With the victory over No. 19 Delaware last Saturday, Penn State improved to 4-1 in Colonial Athletic Association play, clinching a conference play-off spot for the first time in Penn State's two years in the league.

STURGIS EARNS SECOND CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR

Freshman Shane Sturgis earned his second CAA Rookie of the Week Honor after the Nittany Lions' loss to Drexel last Saturday. Sturgis helped pace Penn State this weekend with a goal and three assists in a narrow one-goal loss. Sturgis has passed out 15 assists this season, which rank him third in the league. Sturgis' 30 total points on the year is tied for fifth-best among conference leaders.

HENNEGHAN CLINCHES WIN OVER LEHIGH

Sophomore face-off man Danny Henneghan scored the game-winner in overtime to secure Penn State's 8-7 victory over Lehigh. Henneghan also had five ground balls in the Lions' match-up against the Mountain Hawks and won nine of 19 face-offs. Henneghan now has three goals on the year.

HENNEGHAN TALLIES FIRST MULTI-POINT GAME AGAINST ST. JOSEPH'S

Sophomore face-off man Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) registered his first two goals of the season in the Lion's match-up against the St. Joseph's Hawks last Saturday, earning the first multi-point game of his Nittany Lion career. Henneghan also won 14 of 21 face-offs for the Nittany Lions and led the team with seven ground balls.

KAUT EARNS CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK AND THIRD ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR

Kaut, a first-time CAA Player of the Week winner and now three-time rookie of the week, tallied a current national-best 25 saves in Penn State's 8-7 upset win at No. 10 Massachusetts Saturday. Kaut's .781 single-game save percentage is a career-best, while his .669 (99/148) season save percentage ranks among the league's best among mainstay keepers.

VANTHOF NOTCHES 4 GOALS; KAUT SETS RECORD AGAINST #10 UMASS

Sophomore Kyle VanThof (Penfield, N.Y.) had a game-high four goals in the Nittany Lions upset of No. 10 Massachusetts. Freshman goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) had a game-high 25 saves against 32 shots. Kaut's 25 stops stand as the most saves registered in a game by any player in NCAA play this season as of 3/21.

STURGIS EARNS CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR FOR VILLANOVA, RUTGERS

Sturgis tallied eight points in the Nittany Lions' split of two games on the week. The frosh tallied a goal and three assists during PSU's loss at Villanova, then scored four of Penn State's final five goals to break a tie and top No. 19 Rutgers Saturday. Sturgis leads the Nittany Lions, and is among the league leaders, with eight goals and a total of 14 points on the season.

STURGIS LEADS LION CHARGE OVER #19 RUTGERS

Freshman Shane Sturgis scored four goals and added an assist to lead Penn State to an 11-6 win over No. 19 Rutgers on 3/12. Sturgis scored his goals in the final 15:05, helping Penn State turn a close 7-6 game into an 11-6 win over the ranked Scarlet Knights.

KAUT EARNS SECOND CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONOR FOR OSU GAME

Penn State Nittany Lion men's lacrosse player Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) has been named the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week for the week ending March 6. The award is the second this year for the freshman goalie Kaut tallied 16 saves in Penn State's 6-5 triple-overtime loss to No. 12 Ohio State on Saturday.

KAUT SUPERB IN HARD FOUGHT LOSS TO NO. 3 NOTRE DAME

Freshman goalie Austin Kaut was superb in Penn State's tough 6-2 loss to

No. 3 Notre Dame on 2/27. Kaut kept Penn State close (trailing only 3-2 in the fourth period), facing a flurry of Irish shots and collecting 15 saves and posting a gaudy .714 save percentage.

KAUT NAMED CAA MEN'S LACROSSE ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Penn State Nittany Lion men's lacrosse player Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) has been named the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week for the week ending February 20. PENN STATE 9, BINGHAMTON 7

Saturday, March 19, 2011 -- University Park, Pa.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team, playing its first game under new head coach Jeff Tambroni, scored four fourth period goals and held off visiting Binghamton 9-7 in the 2011 season opener for both teams. Junior Matthew Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.) scored four points to lead Penn State.

Penn State scored the game's first two goals in the first minute, getting unassisted efforts from Nick Dolik (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.) at the 14:51 mark and Mackrides less than a minute later at 14:09. Binghamton answered however, getting two goals from Matt Springer to send the game into the second period tied 2-2.

The Bearcats took their first lead of the game on a Brandon Planck score with 10:08 left in the second stanza, but Penn State reeled off three straight goals to re-take the lead. Mackrides tied the game at 3-3 with a score off a Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) assist with 6:11 on the clock and Tom LaCrosse (Canandaigua, N.Y.) put Penn State ahead with an assist from Kyle VanThof (Penfield, N.Y.) just over a minute later. Colton Vosburgh (Kennett Square, Pa.) gave the Nittany Lions a 5-3 lead with 4:13 left in the half with an unassisted goal. Binghamton cut into Penn State's lead with just 0:01 left in the half when Springer scored his third goal of the game off a Tyler Perrelle assist.

With Penn State leading 5-4 at the break, Binghamton scored the only goal of the third period, with Springer tallying his fourth score at the 11:04 mark to tie the game at 5-5. The contest remained deadlocked for the remainder of the third period.

Binghamton took its second lead of the game just 0:30 into the fourth quarter when David Raleigh scored unassisted. But Penn State quickly answered, getting an unassisted goal from Sturgis at the 13:47 mark to tie the contest at 6-6. VanThof then broke the tie with the game's only man-up goal. VanThof took a Billy Gribbin (Rockville, Md.) pass and found the back of the net with 10:48 left in the game to give Penn State a 7-6 lead. The Lions would never trail again. Mackrides tacked on a goal off a Vosburgh assist with 8:55 left to put the Lions up 8-6. Perrelle scored for Binghamton at the 5:23 mark and then Billy Lloyd (West Chester, Pa.) took a Mackrides pass and scored with 1:53 left in the game to ice the contest and give the Nittany Lions a victory in Tambroni's first game as head coach at Penn State.

Mackrides' four points was backed up by two each from Sturgis, VanThof and Vosburgh. Freshman goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) was outstanding in goal for Penn State. Kaut, in his first career start, collected 10 saves and gave up only seven goals. Playing all 60:00 for the Nittany Lions, Kaut also had two ground balls. Dolik led Penn State with eight ground balls while sophomore Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) was nearly perfect on face-offs. Henneghan took all 19 for the Nittany Lions and won 16 times. He also had four ground balls. As a team, Penn State won the ground ball war, notching 34 to Binghamton's 25. The Nittany Lions committed 21 turnovers to 18 for BU.

PENN STATE 2, #3 NOTRE DAME 6

Sunday, March 27, 2011 -- University Park, Pa.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team lost to No. 3 Notre Dame 6-2 in non-conference action at Penn State's Bigler Field. The Fighting Irish overcome a strong effort from Penn State goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) to score three fourth period goals and grab the win.

Notre Dame scored the game's first goal when Nicholas Beattie put the Irish on the board with 12:36 on the clock. Penn State answered with a man-up goal six minutes later as Matthew Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.) scored off a Colton Vosburgh (Kennett Square, Pa.) assist at the 6:06 mark. The Irish took the lead for good, however with just nine seconds left in the period. Zach Brenneman scored as the period wound down to put Notre Dame up 2-1 after one period.

The Irish got the only goal of the second period as Ryan Foley scored unassisted at the 13:29 mark. The goal gave Notre Dame a 3-1 lead heading into intermission. Penn State, however, answered with the lone goal of the third period. Tom LaCrosse (Canandaigua, N.Y.) scored with 7:49 left in the third period to inch Penn State to within one, 3-2.

The fourth period was Notre Dame's as the Fighting Irish reeled off three unanswered goals. Max Pfeifer scored a man-up goal with 11:15 on the clock, Westy Hopkins scored less than a minute later and Eric Keppeler scored off a Sean Rogers assist with 3:50 left in the game to give Notre Dame the 6-2 win.

Notre Dame outshot Penn State 42-19, including a 21-10 edge in shots on goal. But Nittany Lion freshman goalie Kaut was superb all afternoon. Kaut ended the game with 15 saves, including five in the opening period and five in the third to keep Penn State within striking distance. Kaut now has 25 saves and has allowed only 13 goals in two games as a freshman starter in the net for Penn State.

Penn State sophomore Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) won seven of 12 face-offs for the Nittany Lions and had two ground balls. Penn State's penalty killing unit was solid as Notre Dame scored only once on four man-up chances while Penn State scored once on two. The Nittany Lions had 16 turnovers to only eight for the Fighting Irish.

Saturday, March 5, 2011 -- University Park, Pa.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team fell to their second ranked opponent in as many games, dropping a tough 6-5 overtime decision against No. 12 Ohio State at Penn State's Bigler Field. Nittany Lion goaltender Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) was stellar in the loss, registering 16 saves, including three in overtime. Freshman attackman Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) led the Penn State offense with two goals and one assist.

Ohio State struck first just over a minute into the first quarter, as the Buckeyes' Tyler Frederick took a feed in tight from Logan Schuss and deposited the ball behind Kaut. That would be the only offense the Buckeyes could muster in the quarter however, as Penn State settled in and scored four straight goals. Sturgis got the Lions on the board at the 10:00 mark on a feed from junior captain Matt Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.). Sophomore Billy Gribbin (Rockville, Md.) registered his first goal of the 2011 campaign to take the lead just a minute and a half later from Kyle VanThof (Penfield, NY.), a lead that the Lions would not relinquish until the last minute of the game. Nick Dolik (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.) scored unassisted at the 6:55 mark, and then Gribbin struck again on a Sturgis assist to put Penn State in front 4-1 at the end of the first quarter.

The second quarter saw several quality offensive possessions from both sides, but neither team could solve the other's goaltender for much of the period. The Buckeyes got the only goal of the second period as Zach Boyt scored unassisted at the 2:36 mark, sending the game into halftime with Penn State ahead, 4-2.

The third quarter was much of the same, until Sturgis found himself playing a cat-and-mouse game with Ohio State defender Matt Kowamota. The Nittany Lion freshman held the ball at X, faking back and forth, waiting for Kowamota to overcommit. Finally Sturgis found his lane and beat the Buckeye's long-stick to his left side, burying the shot to finish the individual effort and push the lead to three. The Buckeyes would answer at the 1:32 mark however; as Jeff Tundo scored on a Schuss assist for Ohio State's only tally of the quarter.

The fourth quarter was dominated by the Buckeyes, as a Ryne Sternberg (Toronto, Canada) illegal body check gave Ohio State a one minute extra-man opportunity at the 8:18 mark. The Buckeyes capitalized, as Brock Sorensen buried a Tundo feed to move Ohio State within one. A Penn State turnover with under a minute left gave the ball to Ohio State, and Schuss beat the Penn State freshman with :34 seconds on the clock, sending the game to overtime.

The three overtime periods saw several sustained offensive possessions from both sides, a number of clutch saves from Kaut, and a :30 second man-up opportunity that Penn State could not capitalize on. It was the third overtime that would see the golden-goal however, as Schuss would find a loose ball in front of the Penn State goal, and bury it behind Kaut to seal the game for the Buckeyes, and give them their second overtime victory against the Lions in as many years, at the 3:18 mark of overtime number three.

Ohio State outshot Penn State 44-36, including a 22-14 edge in shots on goal. But Nittany Lion freshman goalie Kaut was superb all afternoon. Kaut ended the game with 16 saves, including five in the fourth quarter and three in the overtimes to keep Penn State in the game. Kaut now has 41 saves and has allowed only 19 goals in three games as a freshman starter in the net for Penn State.

Penn State sophomore Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) won six of 17 face-offs for the Nittany Lions and had four ground balls. The Penn State man-up failed to score on three chances, while the Buckeyes were 1-1. The Nittany Lions had 19 turnovers to only 14 for Ohio State.

PENN STATE 5, #20 VILLANOVA 17

Tuesday, March 8, 2011 -- Philadelphia, Pa.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team dropped a 17-5 decision at No. 20 Villanova in a non-conference game in Philadelphia. Freshman Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) led Penn State with four points but it was not enough as Penn State lost in its first road game of the season.

Villanova jumped out to an early four-goal lead, shutting down the Nittany Lions while finding the net early against Penn State. Michael Vigilante scored less than a minute into the game and Nick Doherty took a Matt Bell pass at the 12:52 mark to give the Wildcats a cushion. Will Casertano scored two minutes later and C.J. Small found the net at the 5:53 mark to round out the first period scoring with 'Nova up 4-0.

The Wildcats continued their offensive pressure in the second period, scoring two goals in the first two minutes. Kevin Cunningham scored a man-up goal at the 14:45 mark and Vigilante scored his second of the game a minute later to put Villanova up 6-0. Penn State got on the board off the stick of Colton Vosburgh (Kennett Square, Pa.), off an assist from Nick Dolik (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.) with 12:03 on the clock. But Villanova reeled off two more goals to extend their lead. Castertano scored at the 11:05 mark and Small scored again at the 10:06 mark to put Villanova up 8-1. Penn State got a lift at the 4:14 mark when junior Jack Forster (Jenkintown, Pa.) found the net off a Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) assist with 4:14 on the clock. The goal was Forster's first in over a year after missing last season with an injury. Villanova closed out first half scoring getting a goal from Jack Rice with 1:12 left and a Bell goal with just a second on the clock to carry a 10-2 lead into the halftime break.

Penn State scored the first goal of the second half, getting a Matthew Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.) goal off a Sturgis assist just over two minutes into the third period. Sturgis then scored a solo goal at the 7:34 mark to push Penn State to within six, 10-4, but Villanova's Small found the back of the net with 5:58 left in the period to give Villanova an 11-4 lead. A furious third period continued with Penn State's Billy Gribbin (Rockville, Md.) scoring off yet another Sturgis assist to cut the VU lead to 11-5. But the Wildcats scored two quick goals to move back out to a 13-5 lead (Rice and Cunningham scored less than a minute apart at 3:39 and 2:56) at the end of the period.

Wildcat Cunningham scored two-plus minutes into the fourth period to put VU up 14-5 and then Bell and Small added two more before the 7:30 mark to put Villanova up 16-5. Kevin O'Neil added one more Villanova goal as the game wound down to give the Wildcats the 17-5 win. Goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) had 18 saves, again facing daunting offensive pressure in the form of 42 Villanova shots. Penn State had 24 shots. The Wildcats claimed a 38-24 ground ball advantage and won 18 of 23 face-offs. Sturgis led Penn State with a goal and three assists. Matt Bernier (Drexel Hill, Pa.) led the Penn State defense with eight ground balls in the game.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team rode the strong offense of freshman Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) to an 11-6 win over No. 19 Rutgers on Saturday at Penn State's Bigler Field. Sturgis scored four goals and had an assist to spark the Nittany Lions to the win over the ranked Scarlet Knights, handing Rutgers its first loss of the year.

Sturgis' five-point burst helped Penn State offset an early Rutgers lead. The Scarlet Knights scored the game's first two goals quickly, getting scores from Andrew D'Agostino and Scott Klimchak in the first three minutes of play. Senior Colton Vosburgh (Kennett Square, Pa.) got Penn State back into the game quickly, however, netting unassisted goals with 8:27 and 6:52 on the clock to tie the game. Penn State took its first lead off a Gavin Ahern (Rockville Centre, N.Y.), with an assist from Kyle VanThof (Penfield, N.Y.), with 1:49 left in the opening period. Rutgers' Duncan Clancy tied the game with just :35 left in the period but Penn State junior Jack Forster (Jenkintown, Pa.) took a VanThof pass and scored with just :12 left on the clock to put Penn State up 4-3 at the end of the period.

Vosburgh scored his third goal of the game off a Sturgis assist with 1:42 on the clock and Forster netted his second off a Matthew Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.) pass to give Penn State a 6-3 lead with just over 10:00 left in the half. Rutgers cut into Penn State's lead when Michael Diehl scored with 1:01 left, sending the Nittany Lions into intermission with a 6-4 lead.

Rutgers was able to control play for much of the third period and completed a comeback with two Anthony Terranova goals, one with 9:32 left and one with 1:49 on the clock. Terranova's second goal tied the game at 6-6, erasing a three-goal Penn State lead. But Sturgis took over with just :05 left in the third period, scoring an unassisted goal to give Penn State a 7-6 lead, a lead it would never relinquish.

Sturgis ended the game by scoring four of Penn State's last five goals (including the final goal of the third period). He scored at the 11:51 mark and then again four minutes later with 8:11 left. Mackrides notched an unassisted goal with 5:58 to play and Sturgis iced the contest with an unassisted goal at the 3:12 mark to close out the scoring in the game.

Freshman goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) was outstanding in goal once again, allowing only six goals against 39 Rutgers shots (21 on goal). Kaut also had 15 saves three ground balls. Sophomore Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) won 12 of 21 face offs and had a game-high eight ground balls as well. Senior defender Matt Bernier (Drexel Hill, Pa.) anchored a strong Penn State defense, collecting six ground balls. Ryne Sternberg (Toronto, Ontario) had three.

Rutgers outshot Penn State 39-27, but Penn State owned a 22-21 shot on goal edge. The Nittany Lions won 12 of 21 face-offs and forced Rutgers into 17 turnovers (while committing only 15 themselves). Rutgers won the ground balls battle 38-32. The Nittany Lions connected on one of five man-up opportunities while hold Rutgers scoreless on five attempts.

The Penn State men's lacrosse team notched a signature victory over No. 10 Massachusetts, 8-7 to open CAA conference play in Amherst, Mass. The Lions never trailed in the game, relying on a game-leading four goals from sophomore Kyle VanThof (Penfield, NY) and a standout effort from freshman goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.). Kaut's 25 stops stand as the most saves registered in a game by any player in NCAA play this season.

Penn State wasted no time in getting on the scoreboard, as freshman Tom Lacrosse (Canandaigua, N.Y.) got the Lions on the board with an unassisted tally at the 12:51 mark. The Lions would never look back, as classmate Shane Sturgis (Downingtown, Pa.) notched his first goal of the game just under two minutes later at 10:55. VanThof would close out the Penn State scoring in the quarter, putting the Lions up 3-0 with an unassisted tally at 7:13. The Minutemen would score the game's next two goals, and the quarter would end with the Lions ahead 3-2.

VanThof scored the only goal of the second quarter for either side, burying a Gavin Ahern (Rockville Centre, NY) feed to push the Lions' lead to a deuce at the 11:43 mark. That is where the score would stand as Penn State went into halftime leading the 10th ranked Minutemen, 4-2.

Massachusetts came out strong in the second half, as Anthony Biscardi cut the Penn State lead in half at the 11:16 mark of the third quarter. Senior midfielder Colton Vosburgh (Kennett Square, Pa.) would regain a two-goal lead for the Lions however, notching an unassisted tally at 7:59. Massachusetts out shot Penn State 38-27 including a 32-19 edge in shots on goal. But Nittany Lion freshman goalie Kaut delivered another stellar performance for Penn State, as his 25 saves kept the Lions in front for the duration of the game. VanThof paced the Lion offense, accounting for half of the team's goals and setting a career-high with his four tallies.

Penn State sophomore Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) won six of 17 face-offs for the Nittany Lions, while senior captain Matt Shankoff (Flemington, NJ) led the squad with three ground balls.. Penn State's penalty killing unit was solid as UMass scored only once on four man-up chances, while Penn State's man-up unit was blanked on two opportunities. The Penn State men's lacrosse team won their third consecutive contest, downing the Hawks of St. Joseph's, 14-6 at Penn State's Bigler Field. Junior attackman Jack Forster (Jenkintown, Pa.) paced the offense with four goals, while sophomore face-off man Danny Henneghan (Beverly Hills, Mich.) registered his first two goals of the season, the first multi-point game of his Nittany Lion career. Junior captain Matthew Mackrides (Newtown Square, Pa.) contributed three assists.

The Penn State offense was clicking early, as the Lions scored the game's first three goals. Freshman midfielder Gavin Ahern (Rockville Centre, NY) opened the scoring on a Shane Sturgis feed at the 10:18 mark. Mackrides found Forster under a minute later to double the Penn State lead at 9:33, and fed Sturgis at 8:46 to push the Lions' lead to three. St. Joseph's would answer at 7:18 to close out the scoring in the first quarter with Penn State on top, 3-1.

Penn State opened the scoring in the second quarter on a man-up goal from Forster at 12:21 with Sturgis assisting on the play. The Lions scored the game's next two goals after lengthy possessions, with freshman Tom LaCrosse (Canandaigua, NY), and sophomore Billy Gribbin (Rockville, Md.) chipping in unassisted tallies to put the Lions up, 6-1. St. Joseph's attempted to close the gap with a goal at the 1:08 mark, but Henneghan would promptly win the ensuing faceoff forward and score on the fast break just six seconds later at 1:02. The Hawks would have the last laugh of the half however, as Kyle Mahoney put one behind freshman goalie Austin Kaut (Morton, Pa.) with :31 seconds to play to send the game into half-time with Penn State ahead, 7-3.

The third quarter opened with end to end action, until Mackrides finally struck with an unassisted goal at the 8:27 mark. The Hawks would score at 5:24 before Dolik pushed the Penn State lead back to five off a Sturgis assist at 2:40. St. Joseph's tallied again just :30 seconds later at 2:10, but it was all Penn State to close out the quarter. Forster completed the hat-trick at 1:09 on a Mackrides assist, and Dolik buried an unassisted left-handed shot at 0:19 to close the quarter with Penn State on top, 11-5.

The fourth quarter was all Penn State, as Forster scored his fourth and final goal of the game just :44 seconds in at the 14:16 mark. Henneghan added his second of the game just six seconds later at 14:10 after winning the ensuing faceoff. Junior midfielder Ryan Link (Englewood, Co.) closed out the Penn State scoring on an unassisted effort with 4:05 to play. The Hawks scored the final goal of the game with 0:31 on the clock, but it was too little too late, as the Lions won the ensuing face-off and ran out the clock for a 14-6 victory.

Penn State outshot St. Joseph's 33-30, including a 19-14 edge in shots on goal. Nine different players scored for the Nittany Lions, and both Mackrides and Sturgis had three assists. In addition to Forster and Henneghan's multi-goal efforts, Dolik also struck twice for Penn State, while Mackrides, Sturgis, Link, Ahern, Gribbin, and LaCrosse each had a goal apiece. Kyle VanThof (Penfield, NY) also had an assist for the Lions. Kaut was solid in goal with eight saves.

Henneghan won 14 of 21 face-offs for the Nittany Lions and led the team with seven ground balls. The Penn State man-up was perfect on the day, converting on their only opportunity. The Lions' man-down unit was flawless as well, holding the Hawks scoreless on six attempts. Penn State had 14 turnovers to only 13 for St Joseph's.

Penn State is now 4-3 on the year while St. Joseph's moves to 0-7.
