Nittany Lion Preview

With a 3-0 sweep of Princeton in the EIVA Semifinals and a 3-1 win against George Mason in the EIVA Championship, Penn State won its 14th consecutive EIVA title and earned an automatic berth into the NCAA National Semifinals. The Nittany Lions are making their 27th overall appearance in the NCAAs and their 14th straight.

In the EIVA Championship, redshirt senior Joe Sunder (Greensburg, Pa.) led Penn State with 3.71 kills per set, while junior Tom Comfort (Orchard Park, N.Y.) registered 3.17. Redshirt senior Edgardo Goas (San Juan, Puerto Rico) dished out 10.71 assists per set and was third on the team with 1.71 digs per set. Freshman Aaron Russell (Ellicott City, Md.) led the team with 0.86 aces per set and tied for the lead on the squad with junior Nick Turko (Lewisberry, Pa.) in blocks per set with 0.86. Redshirt freshman Connor Curry (Newport Beach, Calif.) had team-leading 2.43 digs per set and sophomore Jace Olsen (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) had 1.86.

For the tournament Penn State hit .335 and averaged 12.57 kills per set, 11.57 assists per set, 2.57 aces per set, 8.43 digs per set and 2.29 blocks per set.

Penn State vs. UC Irvine

This will be the first meeting between the Anteaters and Nittany Lions this season. UC Irvine leads the series with Penn State, 5-4. The squads last met at the Penn State Invitational on Feb. 4, 2011 with the Anteaters claiming the victory, 3-1. Penn State last met UC Irvine in NCAA action on May 4, 2007 in Columbus, Ohio. The Anteaters won the NCAA Semifinal with a 3-1 (30-25, 30-22, 26-30, 30-23) win against Penn State.

Scouting the Anteaters

UC Irvine won the MPSF Championship on April 26 with a 3-2 win against USC to earn an automatic berth into the NCAA Championship. The Anteaters are 24-5 overall this season and boast two AVCA All-Americans in their lineup. UC Irvine has won four consecutive matches heading in the NCAA National Semifinals. The Anteaters are ranked No. 2 in the AVCA Div. I-II Coaches Poll.

Penn State vs. Potential NCAA Championship Opponents

USC

Penn State last met USC on March 9 in Los Angeles with the Trojans earning a 3-0 sweep. The Trojans are 18-6 all-time versus the Nittany Lions. The teams previously met in 2010 in Penn State's season opener at the Hawaii Outrigger Invitational. USC won the match, 3-0. Penn State last met the Trojans in NCAA action on May, 7 2009 in the semifinals. Despite the Lions winning set one, 30-27, USC won the match, 3-1 (27-30, 30-26, 30-26, 30-24).

Lewis

The Nittany Lions own a 16-8 all-time record against Lewis. The squads last met on Jan. 21 with the Flyers taking a 3-1 victory. Prior to 2012, Penn State has won eight straight matches against Lewis. Penn State and Lewis have never met in NCAA Tournament play.

Weekly Recap

The Nittany Lions played in their final two matches at Rec Hall of the 2012 season on April 26 and 28, improving their record to 23-5. Redshirt senior Joe Sunder led the Lions in kills with 26, while junior Tom Comfort and freshman Aaron Russell posted 19 and 17, respectively. Redshirt senior setter Edgardo Goas dished out 75 assists and Russell led the team in aces with six. Redshirt freshman Connor Curry led the Lions defensively with 17 kills, while sophomore Jace Olsen had 13 and Goas tallied 12. Russell and junior Nick Turko were strong at the net with six blocks apiece.

What's Next?

Should Penn State defeat UC Irvine, the Nittany Lions will play for the NCAA Championship on Saturday, May 5 at 10 p.m. ET against the winner of the USC/Lewis match.

Penn State and the NAAs

The Nittany Lions m won their 14th consecutive Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association (EIVA) title on April 28 with a 3-1 (25-16, 25-21, 20-25, 25-22) victory against George Mason. Penn State has earned an automatic berth into the NCAA National Semifinals for the 14th straight season. It is Penn State's 27th overall appearance. The Nittany Lions captured the NCAA National Championship twice, in 1994 and 2008.

Three Nittany Lions Named to EIVA All-Tournament Team

After winning their 14th straight EIVA title with a 3-1 win against George Mason on April 28, three Nittany Lions were honored as members of the EIVA Championship All-Tournament Team. Redshirt senior Joe Sunder was named the EIVA Championship Most Outstanding Player, while freshman Aaron Russell and redshirt senior Edgardo Goas were each named to the all-tournament team. Joining the trio of Nittany Lions on the all-tournament team were George Mason's Andrew Dentler and Javier Perez, Princeton's Cody Kessel and Harvard's Matt Jones.

Sunder Named Second-Team AVCA All-America

Redshirt senior Joe Sunder was named Second-Team AVCA All-America on April 26. This was Sunder's second career honor after he earned first-team laurels in 2011. Sunder's award brings Penn State's total number of All-Americans to 79 since 1971.

Penn State Nets Seven All-EIVA Awards

Six members of the Penn State men's volleyball team picked up seven All-EIVA awards on April 23. Redshirt senior Joe Sunder was named the Uvaldo Acosta Memorial EIVA Player of the Year for the second year in a row, and was named to the All-EIVA first team. Redshirt senior Edgardo Goas, freshman Aaron Russell and redshirt freshman Connor Curry all joined Sunder on the All-EIVA first team. Junior Nick Turko and redshirt freshman Nick Goodell each were named to the All-EIVA second team. The six All-EIVA honors bring Penn State's total number of all-time All-EIVA selections to 183 since 1972. This was also the 13th time a Nittany Lion has been named the Player of the Year and the fifth straight.

Curry Garners Academic All-EIVA Honors

Redshirt freshman Connor Curry earned a spot on the Academic All-EIVA Team. He was one of 10 men's volleyball student-athletes across the EIVA to be honored. To be eligible, a student-athlete must have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher and have participated in at least 60 percent of the matches played by their team. Curry was the starting libero in every match this season, a four-time EIVA Defensive Player of the Week and a First Team All-EIVA selection.

Comfort Earns EIVA Offensive Player of the Week Accolades

Junior Tome Comfort was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week on April 16. This is the first honor of the year for Comfort and the 12th for Penn State. Despite PSU suffering two losses to then fourth-ranked BYU, Comfort led the Lions in both matches. On April 13, Comfort pounded 16 kills before posting nine kills and six digs on April 14. He combined for 25 kills on .315 hitting for the weekend and contributed 12 digs, two aces and two blocks.

Goodell Named EIVA Offensive Player of the Week

Redshirt freshman Nick Goodell was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week on April 9. This is the third honor of the season for Goodell. Goodell aided Penn State to two wins against Sacred Heart and Harvard. Penn State clinched its 28th EIVA title with the win against Harvard. He totaled a team-high 33 kills on .443 hitting for the weekend. Goodell also tied for first on the team with 16 digs and was second on the team in both aces and block.

Penn State Wins EIVA Regular Season Title

The Nittany Lions claimed their 28th EIVA title since 1976 with a 3-2 win against Harvard on April 7. The Nittany Lions secured the No. 1 seed and will serve as hosts for the EIVA Championship on April 26-28. Penn State remained undefeated in EIVA play with the win at 13-0. The Nittany Lions have won 20 of the last 21 EIVA titles, hosting the event for 15 straight years.

Russell and Curry Sweep EIVA Weekly Awards

Freshmen Aaron Russell and Connor Curry were named the EIVA Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively, on April 2. The pair guided Penn State to wins against Princeton and George Mason. Russell registered a .686 hitting percentage for the weekend after pounding 26 kills with only two errors in 35 swings. He averaged 2.89 kills per set, while also contributing seven total blocks for 31.5 points. Curry was Penn State's starting libero in both matches. He posted a career-high 21 digs and had zero reception errors in 36 attempts against Princeton. Against George Mason, Curry tied for first on the team with 11 digs and had zero reception errors in 13 attempts. He averaged 3.56 digs per set for the weekend.

Curry Picks Up EIVA Defensive Player of the Week Honors

Redshirt freshman Connor Curry was named the EIVA Defensive Player of the Week on March 26. It was the third honor of his career. Curry was the starting libero for the Nittany Lions against both NJIT and Rutgers-Newark on March 23-24. Curry led the team in digs with 18, averaging 2.57 digs per set. His effective passing aided Penn State to a .339 hitting percentage for the week. Against NJIT, Curry matched his personal best with 13 digs, and he had zero reception errors in 16 attempts. Against Rutgers-Newark, Curry was second on the team in digs with five and had only two reception errors in 10 attempts.

Sunder Garners EIVA Offensive Player of the Week Laurels

Redshirt senior Joe Sunder earned EIVA Offensive Player of the Week honors on March 19. Sunder helped Penn State remain undefeated in EIVA play with a 3-0 win at Saint Francis on March 17. He posted a team-best 13 kills on .500 hitting, while also tallying a squad-best five digs. He totaled 16 points for the match after also serving three aces. Sunder averaged 4.33 kills, 1.00 aces, 1.67 digs and 5.33 points per set.

Curry Selected EIVA Defensive Player of the Week

Redshirt freshman Connor Curry was named the EIVA Defensive Player of the Week on March 12. It was his second honor of the season. Curry aided the Nittany Lions in battles against two top 15 teams, including No. 10 Pepperdine on March 8 and No. 4 USC on March 9. Against the Waves, Curry was second on the team with seven digs and had zero reception errors in 35 attempts. Against the Trojans, Curry had a team-high 10 digs and just one error in 20 reception attempts. He averaged 2.12 digs per set in the two matches.

Goas Named EIVA Offensive Player of the Week

Redshirt senior Edgardo Goas was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 27. It was the first conference honor of the season for Goas. Goas led the Nittany Lions to two wins against EIVA foes Princeton and George Mason. He averaged 11.17 assists per set and guided Penn State to a .389 hitting percentage for the weekend. In addition, three of his primary hitters had hitting percentages of .364 or higher.

Goodell & Curry Nab EIVA Weekly Awards

Redshirt freshmen Nick Goodell and Connor Curry were named the EIVA Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively, on Feb. 20. The pair guided Penn State to wins against Harvard and Sacred Heart. Goodell hit .750 against Harvard with 15 kills on 20 errorless swings before tallying eight kills on .429 hitting. Curry was the starting libero in both matches. He averaged 3.67 digs per set, posting nine digs vs. Harvard and a career-high 13 vs. SHU.

Russell Tabbed EIVA Offensive Player of the Week

Sophomore Peter Russell was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 6. Russell started both matches of the weekend at outside hitter. Against the Trojans, Russell posted a team-high nine kills on 14 errorless swings for a .643 hitting percentage. He also tallied an ace and two blocks. The following night against the Lancers, Russell tied for first on the team with eight kills with three digs and a block. For the weekend, Russell had a team-high 17 kills, averaging 2.83 kills per set on .474 hitting. He also contributed five digs and three blocks.

Goas Named Primetime Performer of the Week

Redshirt senior setter Edgardo Goas was named a Primetime Performer of the Week for men's volleyball. Goas was one of 16 honorees across 21 Division I sports. Goas guided the Nittany Lions to 3-1 victories against No.4 Stanford and No. 12 Pacific on the Ken and Dave Dunlap Invitational hosted by Ohio State on Feb. 27-28. As the starting setter in both matches, Goas paced the Penn State offense to a .377 hitting percentage for the weekend and averaged 13.50 assists per set. His five primary hitters had .333 attack percentages or better. Goas also contributed defensively with 1.62 digs per set and 0.50 blocks per set.

Goodell Earns EIVA Offensive Player of the Week Laurels

Redshirt freshman Nick Goodell was named the EIVA Player of the Week on Jan. 30. He was integral to Penn State's wins against No.4 Stanford and No. 12 Pacific at the Ken and Dave Dunlap Invitational hosted by Ohio State on Jan. 27-28. Against the Cardinal, Goodell played three sets tallying 10 kills on .333 hitting and contributed two blocks. The following night against the Tigers, Goodell made his first start. Goodell led the team with 17 kills on .382 hitting. He also had a team-high three aces, as well as six digs and five blocks. For the weekend, Goodell was second on the team with 27 kills and had a .364 hitting percentage. He was also second on the squad with seven total blocks.

Season Opening Record

The Nittany Lions opened the 2012 season in Columbus, Ohio with a 3-0 sweep of the defending national champion Ohio State Buckeyes. Under head coach Mark Pavlik the Nittany Lions improved to 10-8 in season openers since 1995.

Penn State Newcomers

The Nittany Lions welcome the addition of four newcomers to this year's squad, including 6-4 setter Taylor Hammond, 6-9 middle hitter Aaron Russell, 6-8 middle hitter Kyle Gregan and 6-9 middle hitter Matt Seifert. In addition, redshirt freshmen Connor Curry (6-0, Libero) and Nick Goodell (6-4, Outside Hitter) will also have the opportunity to see time on the court this season.
