PENN STATE TOURNAMENT OVERVIEW

Penn State will take part in its 17th consecutive NCAA Tournament since 1995 beginning with Army on Nov. 11, 2011.

Overall, the Nittany Lions are 11-3 in first round games (PSU received byes from the first round in 1998, 1999 and 2000), but had a seven-game first-round winning streak snapped at Rutgers in 2008.

Penn State is a three-time College Cup participant (1999, 2002, 2005), while advancing to the quarterfinals eight times, posting a 3-5 record.

Penn State has amassed an impressive record of 25-6-0 at Jeffrey Field, outscoring opponents 79-25 in NCAA Play.

Penn State has hosted the first round in eight of the last 11 years. In the previous seven first round games, Penn State went 7-0-0.

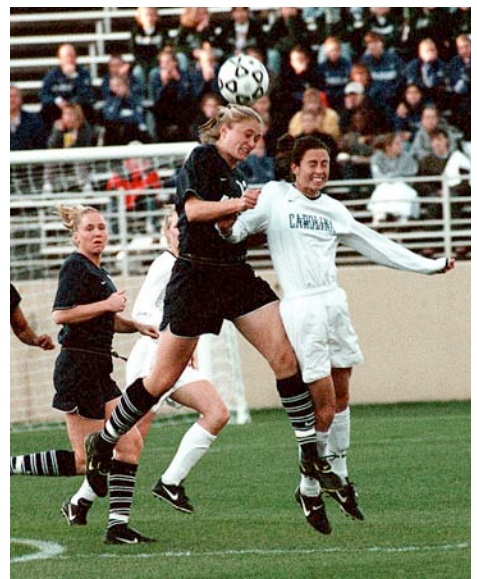

SCOUTING THE DEMON DEACONS

No. 6 Wake Forest (16-3-4) looks to defend its home turf for the third straight NCAA match on Sunday after matching 2-0 wins over Oakland and Boston University. WFU is led by a scoring tandem of Katie Stengel (16 G, 7 A, 39 points) and Rachel Nuzzolese (11 G, 5 A, 27 points). Stengel recently became WFU's single-season record point winner by scoring against BU. In the back, Wake Forest boasts a superb defense that posted 13 shutouts anchored by goalkeeper Aubrey Bledsoe. Bledsoe has a 0.58 GAA with an .818 save percentage on the year.

Wake Forest is making its 16th straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Demon Deacons' best finish was a quarterfinal appearance in the 2009 tournament. Last season, the seeded Deacons were shipped west and fell to host UC Irvine in the NCAA Second Round.

The Demon Deacons and Nittany Lions have played just once previously. WFU captured a tense 1-0 win at the 2009 UConn Classic in a driving rainstorm to sneak by Penn State.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY III

Penn State has compiled a 32-15-1 overall record in the NCAA Tournament and will play in its ninth NCAA Second Round match on Sunday at Wake Forest. The Nittany Lions are 7-1-0 all-time in the third round with a 6-4 overall mark under Erica Walsh, who is 9-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament with three Sweet Sixteen appearances. On the road, Penn State is 4-7-0 including last year's 2-1 loss at West Virginia. The Lions have a 6-5-0 record against ACC squads in the NCAA Tournament, but dropped the last meeting, (Virginia in 2009). Penn State is looking for its first trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals since 2005 when the Nittany Lions were on the doorstep of the NCAA Championship game.

SOARING PAST MARQUETTE

Fourth-seeded and No. 13 ranked Penn State fended off a furious rally by No. 12 Marquette, winning 4-1 on Friday night (Nov. 18) at Spry Stadium. Emily Hurd and Emma Thomson tallied first-half goals to pace Penn State. Maya Hayes added two important insurance goals in the final minutes to quell any overtime thoughts of the Golden Eagles, moving into second on the Penn State and Big Ten single-season scoring list at 29. Penn State moved on to the NCAA Third Round for the first time since 2007 and snapped a four-game skid against Big East teams in the NCAA Tournament. Christine Nairn tallied two helpers on the night while Lexi Marton, Kori Chapic and Maddy Evans added assists. Goalkeeper Erin McNulty won her 21st game between the pipes.

OUSTING THE BLACK KNIGHTS

No. 13 Penn State fought a pesky Army side for over 85 minutes until Christine Nairn broke the scoreless deadlock and give the Nittany Lions a 1-0 win on Friday, Nov. 11 at Jeffrey Field. Nairn tallied her first game-winner of the year to move fourth-seeded Penn State into the NCAA Second Round. The goal came after 27 shots, 12 of which were on net. It came down to Nairn's 10th shot of the match, a new career high, to break the score. Nairn's marker was set up by Bri Hovington on the right wing, who swung a ball to Carly Niness as the senior reserve midfielder found Nairn through the middle of the pitch and into the penalty area. Erin McNulty made one save in Penn State's 14th shutout of 2011. PSU out-shot Army, 29-3.

TOUGHEST NCAA REGION?

The Winston-Salem Regional featured the toughest regional by winning percentage and ranked teams of all eight pods in the NCAA Tournament. Prior to Friday's action, the four teams at Wake Forest combine for 72 wins (.837 winning percentage) and just 12 losses, all four being ranked 14th or higher. Stillwater is closest with 63 wins (.764) featuring teams ranking 24th or higher, while Stanford boasts 20 wins (.763) along with three teams ranked.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

The Nittany Lions secured their sixth 20-win season in school history by defeating Army, 1-0. The last time Penn State won 20 or more games was in 2005 when the Nittany Lions were on the doorstep of the NCAA Championship during a 23-0-2 season. The 21st win came against Marquette on Friday, the third-most victories by a Penn State team in school history. Moreover, goalkeeper Erin McNulty became just the third Nittany Lion to win 20 games between the pipes, joining Erin McLeod (22, 2005) and Emily Oleksiuk (21 in 1999; 20 in '98, 2000-01). McNulty has been apart of all 14 shutouts in 2011, while Oleksiuk was a member of the 2000 squad that set the school record with 17 clean sheets. McNulty can tie the single-season PSU record for wins in a season on Sunday.

COMMON ENEMIES

Penn State and Wake Forest have four common opponents during the 2011 season from the Big Ten (Nebraska), ACC (Virginia, N.C. State) and Conference USA (Central Florida). The Nittany Lions are 3-1-0 against those teams, while Wake Forest is 4-0-0. Moreover, PSU out-scored those teams, 12-9, and WFU, 7-1.

YEAR OF FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS

Penn State has squared off against six first-time opponents and Marquette represented the seventh squad. The Nittany Lions are 6-1-0 this year against first-time foes with the lone loss coming at then-No. 2 Stanford on opening night. For the third straight game, PSU will face a team it has never defeated in the NCAA Tournament.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

PSU has kicked its game into a new gear during the second half of matches this season. Penn State has out-scored opponents 28-11 in the first half, but that number jumps to 40-7 in the second half. Moreover, Penn State has out-scored its opponents 40-4 since Aug. 21 with the only teams to register goals being Nebraska (2, Oct. 14), Minnesota (1, Nov. 4) and Marquette (1, Nov. 18).

LIMITING SHOTS, LIMITING GOALS

Penn State's defense has pitched 14 shutouts in part of good goalkeeping from Erin McNulty (0.84 GAA), but also because of a staunch defensive unit committed to eliminating scoring opportunities. On 13 occasions in 2011, Penn State hasn't allowed an opponent to take more than nine shots on goal and in 10 instances opponents had two or less shots on target. Moreover, Penn State has had eight games where opponents took one or less corner kick.

NITTANY LIONS SETTING THE MARKS

The Big Ten Forward of the Year, Hayes now

owns the Penn State sophomore record for most goals and points in a season at 28 and 64. Hayes also moved into a tie for second in single-season game-winning goals at Penn State with her ninth this season. She matched Christie Welsh's total from 1999, while sitting four game-winners behind Tiffany Weimer's mark of 13. Hayes needs three more goals to tie for first in a single-season at PSU, sitting behind Weimer's 2005 mark of 32. Hayes was riding a nine-game point streak dating back to the Ohio State (Sept. 29) match, but had it snapped vs. Minnesota on Nov. 4. Along with Hayes, Taylor Schram is in second in sophomore assists (12), while Jess Rosenbluth is second in assists by a senior (10). Schram's 12 helpers puts her tied for fourth in a single-season in the category. Meanwhile, Christine Nairn's two helpers on Friday vs. Marquette moved her into second for PSU juniors in assists and third overall for a single-season. **(Career leaders can be found on Page 10 of the match notes)**

This season has seen all but four of the 68 Nittany Lion goals helped by an assist. In total, PSU has 84 assists, which leads the Big Ten and is a single-season school record. This year's squad averages 3.36 assists per game. Against West Virginia, PSU set a new school record with nine helpers, led by Taylor Schram's career-high three. Maya Hayes matched Schram's WVU effort with three of her own in the OSU victory. Four of the five goals PSU scored that night featured double assists and the Lions would add two more double assists in its game against N.C. State. Christine Nairn leads the Big Ten with 13 assists, while Taylor Schram has 12 and Jess Rosenbluth has 10. Seventeen Nittany Lions have tallied helpers this season including goalkeeper Erin McNulty, who has a Penn State record three assists. McNulty started a Hayes goal in the team's season opener vs. WVU and another Hayes goal in the comeback over Ohio State. McNulty added a third assist on a Hayes tally against Indiana.

MONTHLY WINS

Penn State ended October with a perfect 7-0-0 record. The Nittany Lions are 132-22-4 all-time in October for an astounding .848 winning percentage. As for November, Penn State is 62-22-4 all-time (.727). PSU went 3-1-0 in August to up its all-time record to 16-9-2 (.630), while posting a 7-2-0 mark in September to improve to 113-30-13 (.767) all-time.

Hagen of UW-Milwaukee). Hayes's 27 goals have contributed mightily to Penn State's overall offensive success as PSU has poured in 64 goals, fifth per game in NCAA. The 64 tallies are the most since the 2005 season scored 78.

NATIONAL RANKINGS REVIEW

Penn State is featured in every national poll this week thanks to superb play through out the year. Penn State ranks 13th in the NSCAA poll. Soccer America pegged Penn State at 16th, the 10th straight week the Lions have been in the publication's poll. TopDrawerSoccer.com ranked PSU 16, while the NCAA Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) was released for the seventh time this season with the Nittany Lions moved down to 13th, tops amongst all Big Ten sides. Penn State is the second highest No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament according to the RPI behind Memphis (fifth).

SCORING STREAK

Sophomore Maya Hayes concluded a career-high seven-game scoring streak in September, tallying a goal from the Nevada match on Aug. 21 to Sept. 11 at Virginia. Hayes's streak is tied for third all-time in PSU history with Christie Welsh (2000) and Katie Schoepfer (2009). Hayes was six games from matching Tiffany Weimer's 2004 streak of 13. Weimer holds a share of the NCAA record at 17 set in 2005. The sophomore striker has scored in 16 of her last 21 matches and recently had a six-game streak snapped vs. Purdue.

ILLINI SNAP 13-GAME WINNING STREAK

No. 11 Penn State fought a tough No. 18 Illinois team and a strong wind, falling to the Illini, 2-1, in

overtime at Lakeside Field in the Big Ten Tournament Final Sunday evening (Nov. 6). Maya Hayes tallied her 27th goal of the year with a terrific combo play from Christine Nairn and Taylor Schram. Emma Thomson and Jess Rosenbluth were named to the All-Tournament Team.

BOUNCING THE GOPHERS

No. 11 Penn State downed Minnesota, 3-1, on Friday evening (Nov. 4) at Lakeside Field to advance to the Big Ten Tournament Championship. Jess Rosenbluth's tally 4:08 into the match set the tone as the Nittany Lions dominated the Golden Gophers for PSU's 13th straight victory. Maddy Evans totaled a three-point day with a goal and an assist, while Ali Schaefer scored her fifth of the season. Penn State has received six goals in the Big Ten Tournament from six different players in two games.

ELIMINATING THE HOSTS

Penn State scored on two of its first three shots of the game en route to a 3-0 victory in the Big Ten Quarterfinals over host Northwestern on Nov. 2. Kori Chapic knocked home an Emily Hurd corner kick midway through the first half. Chapic then boosted the Nittany Lions with a long ball to Maya Hayes, who slotted home her nation-leading 26th goal of the season just three minutes later. Penn State capped the scoring in the second half when Christine Nairn converted a spot kick after an onslaught of Nittany Lion pressure led to a handball in the penalty area.

ALL-BIG TEN HONOREES

Penn State led all Big Ten teams with 10 Nittany Lions to the postseason honors list. Sophomore Maya Hayes was named the conference's Forward of the Year, while earning All-Big Ten First Team honors with Christine Nairn (third time), Lexi Marton (first) and Ali Schaefer (first). Sophomore striker Taylor Schram and goalkeeper Erin McNulty garnered their first All-Big Ten laurels on the second team with Emma Thomson (second). Kori Chapic, Emily Hurd and Whitney Church each were named to the All-Big Ten Freshman Team, too.

SENIOR SEND OFF WIN OVER PURDUE

Penn State recognized the six departing graduates of the women's soccer program on Friday night (Oct. 28) with a senior celebration. The Nittany Lions honored Meghan Gill, Carly Niness, Jess Rosenbluth, Ali Schaefer, Emma Thomson and

Krissy Tribbett with a pre-game ceremony. Emily Hurd and Taylor Schram tallied second-half goals to overcome the Boilermakers, 2-0. Schram and Maya Hayes each added an assist in PSU's 12th shutout of the year.

CLINCHING THE BIG TEN AT U-M

No. 14 Penn State won Big Ten title No. 14 on Sunday, Oct. 23 in a 4-0 victory at Michigan. The title signaled the most consecutive titles by a Big Ten women's program in any sport, putting PSU one ahead of the current Northwestern women's tennis squad. Sophomore Taylor Schram opened the scoring in the 22nd minute with a goal from Jackie Molinda as Penn State cruised to victory. Super sophomore Maya Hayes capped an impressive weekend with two more goals on Sunday, giving her four for the weekend. The Nittany Lions also captured their 10th straight win in the process, the longest winning streak since 2005. For the third straight year, Penn State celebrated a Big Ten title against Michigan including for the second time in three years in Ann Arbor. Ali Schaefer pitched in with a goal and an assist to round out the scoring for PSU, who completed its 11th shutout of the year.

ROARING BACK IN EAST LANSING

No. 14 Penn State used three second-half goals in 15 minutes to take a 3-1 contest at Michigan State on Friday (Oct. 21) afternoon. Sophomore sensation Maya Hayes scored twice to put Penn State ahead, while Maddy Evans made her return from injury known with an insurance goal to cement PSU's nine-game winning streak (longest since 2007). Christine Nairn, Taylor Schram, Emma Thomson and Kori Chapic recorded tallies to tie Penn State's single-season record for assists at 67.

IOWA BARNSTORMING

No. 15 Penn State looked lethargic early on, but Maya Hayes sparked the Nittany Lions in the 38th minute on an Iowa miscue en route to a 4-0 win over the Hawkeyes on Sunday, Oct. 16. Emily Hurd set up Hayes's first goal of the day and set up another goal by Taylor Schram who also notched two goals on the afternoon in the rout. Penn State's pinpoint shooting saw the Nittany Lions score on four of five shots on goal. Kori Chapic, Jess Rosenbluth and Carly Niness tallied an assist each as Penn State improved to 17-0-0 all-time against Iowa. Rosenbluth moved into a tie

Penn State welcomed the Cornhuskers to Happy Valley for the first time as a Big Ten member in any sport and the two teams treated fans to a goal-fest. The 5-4 match in Penn State's favor featured four lead changes and three ties. Whitney Church capped the nine-goal onslaught with a 79th minute goal, her first of her collegiate career from Carly Ninness and Ali Schaefer. Taylor Schram led all scorers with five points behind two goals and an assist, while Emily Hurd and Maya Hayes provided the other markers. Schaefer notched two helpers; Hayes, Kori Chapic, Jess Rosenbluth also recorded assists.

NITTANY LION TRIO HAUL IN AWARDS

Sophomore striker Taylor Schram was named player of the week by TopDrawerSoccer.com and the Big Ten Conference on Monday, Oct. 17, while redshirt-freshman Emily Hurd captured her first Big Ten laurel as Freshman of the Week. Sophomore forward Maya Hayes also tallied an honor by TopDrawerSoccer.com by being named to the Team of the Week alongside Schram.

HAYES'S THIRD BIG TEN AWARD

Sophomore sensation Maya Hayes was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for the third time on Monday, Oct. 10, after her two-goal effort at Indiana. Penn State also improved its record when Hayes scores a goal to 10-1-0 on the year as the sophomore tallied her sixth multi-goal game of the season. Hayes has tallied a point in 11 of Penn State's 15 matches this year. Hayes's third Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week recognition represents the fourth Penn State award on offense, including Ali Schaefer's accolade on Sept. 26. The last Nittany Lion athlete to win three player of the week honors in the same season was Alyssa Naeher and Katie Schoepfer in 2009, with four and three, respectively.

SHORTHANDED WIN AT INDIANA

Despite playing without four key starters, No. 18 Penn State cruised to a 3-0 win at Indiana on Sunday, Oct. 9. Maya Hayes scored twice to move into sole possession of the national lead in goals (18) and points (41) as Carly Ninness tallied her first of the season in the three-goal win. Hayes scored in the sixth minute off a Jess Rosenbluth helper, her eighth of the season, for a 1-0 lead. Penn State broke the game 19 minutes into the second half as Ninness headed home an Ali Schaefer corner kick. Two minutes later, Hayes scored when she chipped the goalkeeper off a punt from Penn State netminder Erin McNulty. The assist was McNulty's third of the season, a new school record.

GOPHER TRIUMPH

No. 24 Penn State tallied a crucial 1-0 road win at Minnesota's Robbie Stadium on Sunday, Oct. 2. Sophomore striker Maya Hayes scored her nation leading 16th goal and sixth game-winner of the season in the 84th minute to push the Nittany Lions past the Golden Gophers. Carly Ninness tallied her first assist on the play, setting up a pass to Taylor Schram who sent Hayes in on net. Erin McNulty recorded her third solo shutout in the Nittany Lions' conference leading eighth clean sheet of the year.

PSU CRACKS THE BUCKEYES

No. 24 Penn State women's soccer overcame a 1-0 halftime deficit with a trio of lightning-strike goals in a 3-1 victory over Ohio State on Thursday night, Sept. 29 at Jeffrey Field. Taylor Schram notched the tying goal 15 seconds after halftime to begin the scoring barrage, while Kori Chapic headed home the game-winner 1:44 later. Emily Hurd scored her third goal of the year to give PSU the two-goal margin, while Maya Hayes recorded a career high three assists in the victory over the conference leader. The result coupled with Minnesota's 2-2 tie at Wisconsin, vaulted Penn State into first in the Big Ten.

CHAPIC & HAYES EARN AWARDS

Penn State standouts Kori Chapic and Maya Hayes earned weekly awards on Monday, Oct. 3. Chapic was tabbed as the Freshman of the Week in the Big Ten, while Hayes corralled a spot on the TopDrawerSoccer.com's Team of the Week. Chapic received her first notable award of the season thanks to a game-winning goal against Ohio State this past Thursday and outstanding defense in a perfect 2-0 week for the Nittany Lions. Hayes scored the game-winner at Minnesota and tallied three helpers in the win over Ohio State.

NAIRN & WALSH CALLED TO DUTY

On Tuesday, Sept. 27, junior midfielder standout Christine Nairn was tabbed by U.S. Soccer to participate in a six-day training camp with the U-23 squad running from Oct. 2-7. Nairn, who was unable to participate in California due to an injury suffered at Minnesota, was set to be accompanied by Penn State head coach and U.S. National Team assistant coach Erica Walsh to the camp. In all, 24 players took part in the unique training camp that featured U.S. head coach Pia Sundhage as well as the U.S. women's development director Jill Ellis and technical director April Heinrichs. Nairn has two caps with the senior U.S. squad from 2009, scoring the game-winning goal against Canada in July 2009. Nairn was a starting member of the 2008 U-20 World Cup champion team with former Nittany Lion teammate Alyssa Naeher and went on to captain the U-20 team at the 2010 World Cup.

BIG TEN HOME SWEEP

Penn State swept its Big Ten opening home stand (Sept. 23-25) with a dominating 4-0 win over Northwestern and a staunch 1-0 defensive effort against then-No. 22 Illinois. Ali Schaefer and Maya Hayes each scored twice to pace Penn State past Northwestern with Bri Hovington, Christine Nairn, Jess Rosenbluth, Taylor Schram and Ali Schaefer tallying assists each. Against Illinois, a packed midfield didn't allow either team's offense to get rolling. Schaefer broke through in the 39th minute with a cleverly placed shot to the upper left corner of the net off a pass from Whitney Church for the deciding goal. Erin McNulty earned her second shutout with three saves, while PSU earned its seventh blanking of the year.

ALI SCHAEFER REAPS REWARDS

Senior reserve midfielder Ali Schaefer deservingly captured the awards that come with a three-goal, seven-point weekend. She was named the Big Ten's Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in her career along with a SoccerSavings.com/Philly Soccer News Player of the Week nod. started and played all 90 minutes in the second match on Sept. 22 in front of 18,000 fans at JELD-WEN Stadium in Portland, Ore. Included on the Canadian National Team were former Nittany Lion standouts Erin McLeod, who started for the Canadians in the 2011 FIFA World Cup, and Carmelina Moscato. On the American side, Ali Krieger featured in her normal defensive role on the right flank. Krieger made headlines all over the world for her match-clinching penalty kick against Brazil in the World Cup Quarterfinals en route to the Cup Final.

PENNSYLVANIA DOMINANCE

Sept. 20th's meeting at Bucknell allowed PSU to extend an amazing run of play against Pennsylvania teams. Since starting its program in 1994, Penn State has become the premier women's soccer program in Pennsylvania. All-time, the Nittany Lions are an impressive 32-2-1 against its Keystone foes, with the only team ever defeating PSU being Villanova. In fact, the Lions are riding a 14-year unbeaten streak since its last loss, a 2-1 defeat at Nova in 1997. PSU is currently enjoying a 26-0-1 stretch, which includes a 15-0-1 mark against Bucknell and an 8-0-0 mark vs. Pittsburgh.

BISON STAMPEDE

Penn State made quick work of Bucknell in a 4-0 thrashing at Emmitt Field on Tuesday night, Sept. 20. The Nittany Lions used goals scored by four different players and eight Lions tallied a point on the evening. Taylor Schram opened the scoring with Christine Nairn, Emily Hurd and Maya Hayes adding insurance goals. Emma Thomson and Meghan Gill tallied their first points of the year on helpers, while Jess Rosenbluth added one of her own on the final goal. Penn State dominated the Bison, who failed to register a shot on goal.

BIG TEN OPENING LOSS

No. 21 Penn State dropped its Big Ten opener, 1-0, at Wisconsin on Saturday, Sept. 17 at the McClimon Sports Complex. UW's Laurie Nosbusch scored a 17th minute goal in a very physical game that had six yellow cards and 38 fouls between the two teams, 27 on Wisconsin alone. UW picked up four yellows, while Christine Nairn hit the post on a free kick and Michele Dalton pitched a shutout.

VIRGINIA STUNNER

Penn State used two goals by Maya Hayes including the game-winner in the 66th minute to down seventh-ranked Virginia, 3-2, on Sunday, Sept. 11 at Klöckner Stadium. The super sophomore scored PSU's first goal and Taylor Schram notched a three-point afternoon for Penn State (6-2-0) who handed Virginia (6-1-1) its first loss of the season. Christine Nairn, Maddy Evans, Schram and Hayes all tallied assists on the day, while goalkeeper Erin McNulty made seven saves to secure the upset victory.

UCF DISAPPOINTMENT

Penn State battled Central Florida to double overtime, but fell 2-1 on Friday evening, Sept. 9, at Klöckner Stadium in the opening match of the Virginia Nike Soccer Classic. Sophomore forward Maya Hayes tallied her 10th goal of the season for the Nittany Lions (5-2-0) whose run of five straight wins was snapped. Christine Nairn assisted on the goal. After a scoreless second half and first overtime period, Nicolette Radovic scored in the 104th minute on a cross to win the game for UCF (3-1-1). Radovic also tallied the Knights' first goal

in the first half.

PITT SOCCER CLASSIC CHAMPIONS

Maya Hayes notched her first career hat trick and 20th in program history as Penn State ran away from Pittsburgh, 3-0, at Ambrose Urbanic Field on Sept. 4. Hayes scored in the 18th, 78th and 85th minutes, while PSU out-shot Pitt, 28-3. The victory gave PSU its fifth straight overall, the longest streak since a five-gamer Oct. 25-Nov. 13, 2009, and second straight tournament after taking the Penn State Invitational the previous week. Erin McNulty recorded her first solo shutout for the Nittany Lions. Hayes was named MVP of the tournament, while Christine Nairn, Emma Thomson and Taylor Schram were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Two days earlier, Penn State won its first comeback match of the season in a 3-1 victory over North Carolina State on Sept. 2. Hayes recorded a two-goal, five-point effort, while her counterpart up top, Schram, made her homecoming well known with a game-icing goal in the second half. Fellow Pittsburgh native Jackie Molinda added her first career assist, while Jess Rosenbluth and Emily Hurd each had a helper. Nairn had her second two-assist day of the year to move into 10th all-time in PSU history. Hayes scored in the 40th minute to tie the game before scoring her sixth goal of the season in the 51st. Schram iced the game in the 69th minute off a cross from Hurd.

HAYES SWEEPS AGAIN

For the second straight week Maya Hayes received top honors from regional and national publications. The Big Ten bestowed the Offensive Player of the Week honor (shared with Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough) on Hayes, while TopDrawerSoccer.com tabbed Hayes the National Player of the Week (Sept. 6). Hayes was also recognized as the SoccerSavings.com/Philly Soccer News Player of the Week for the second straight time. And released late Wednesday, she was tabbed Soccer America's National Player of the Week.

PENN STATE INVITATIONAL DOMINATION

The Nittany Lions exited the Penn State Invitational as champions after a 2-0-0 record and a +8 goal differential. The Nittany Lions scored early and often as it trounced No. 17 West Virginia, 5-0, at Jeffrey Field on Friday night (Aug. 26). PSU put three on the board in the first eight minutes of play. Taylor Schram notched a five-point night with three assists as the Nittany Lions set a new school record for most helpers in a game with nine. Midfielders Maddy Evans and Jess Rosenbluth tallied three-point evenings, netting the first two goals to shock the Mountaineers. PSU set a new school record for assists in a game with nine. One of those assists came from an unusual source as goalkeeper Erin McNulty set up the third goal in the eighth minute on a clearance to Schram, whose header was inch-perfect for Hayes. Christine Nairn also managed two helpers and Bri Garcia chipped in with one of her own.

On Sunday (Aug. 28), Penn State team took a while to get on the board, but when it did, Richmond could not respond in a 3-0 victory. Rosenbluth scored and assisted another for a three-point afternoon, while Hayes's fourth goal of the season proved to be the game-winner. Jackie Molinda notched the final tally of the weekend, her first goal of the 2011 season. McNulty put on another

Penn State's 2-0-0 weekend with a combined 8-0 score over WVU and Richmond did not go unnoticed by regional, conference and national publications this week (Aug. 31). Maya Hayes racked up three honors: Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week, Philly Soccer News Player of the Week and a spot on the Soccer America Team of the Week. Nittany Lions midfielders Christine Nairn and Jess Rosenbluth landed on the CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer list and TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week, respectively.

CALIFORNIA SPLIT

PSU (1-1-0) showed no ill effects of Aug. 19's 4-0 loss at No. 2 Stanford, pushing play from beginning to end, opening a 2-0 halftime lead behind the strength of Kori Chapic's and Emily Hurd's goals. 2009 BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR

Head coach Erica Walsh is enjoying one of the best seasons of her career in 2011 as Penn State enters the NCAA Tournament for the 17th straight year with its 14th straight Big Ten title. The 14-title mark stands as the most consecutive in Big Ten championships by a women's program, one ahead of the present Northwestern tennis team. The Nittany Lions are 21-4-0 with a 10-1-0 Big Ten record this season and a rank of 13th in the NSCAA poll.

This past summer, Walsh had an extraordinary experience of being one of the top assistants to Pia Sundhage and the 2011 United States women's national team at the FIFA World Cup in Germany. The U.S. made a sparkling run through knockout play to the final, falling to eventual champions Japan.

During the 2010 season, Walsh's young club made a remarkable turnaround mid-season, overcoming a two-game deficit in the league standings over the final weeks to capture a share of a record-breaking 13th straight Big Ten title.

After a tough 2-4 start to the 2009 season, Walsh led the Nittany Lions to a remarkable turnaround, going 10-1-2 in the last 13 games of the regular season, earning her the 2009 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award for her efforts. In March of 2010, Walsh's alma mater, William & Mary, honored her by inducting her into the W&M Athletics Hall of Fame.

With the impressive end to the season, Walsh and her charges captured the program's 12th-straight Big Ten Championship, tying a record for most consecutive women's Big Ten titles won held by the Michigan swimming & diving program. By winning the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions continued their string of NCAA

Tournament berths, making their 15th-straight appearance in the 64-team field in 2009. For the second time in three years, Penn State hosted the first and second rounds of tournament play.

Walsh also orchestrated one of the finest awards seasons in Penn State history when Katie Schoepfer, Alyssa Naeher and Christine Nairn swept the year-end Big Ten Player of the Year awards. Schoepfer was named the Offensive Player of the Year, Naeher the Defensive Player of the Year and Nairn the Freshman of the Year. Danielle Toney was named to the All-Big Ten First Team, while Lexi Marton garnered Second Team mention. Walsh has now coached two players of the year to three awards as Naeher was also the 2007 recipient of the Defensive Player of the Year honors in Walsh's first year in Happy Valley.

Walsh continued her success from the 2007 campaign into a 16-8-0 record that saw Penn State capture its 11th-straight Big Ten Championship and the 2008 Big Ten Tournament crown.

Her transition to Penn State was quite smooth as the 2007 team finished 18-4-2, including a 9-1-0 mark in conference play, and was ranked 12th in the final NSCAA poll of the season.

When she came to Penn State, Walsh brought with her a wealth of experience at both the international and collegiate levels. She already has coached at six different universities, including three stints as head coach as well as serving as an assistant for the U.S. U-19 team in 2004. Walsh served as head coach of the U-17 team from December 2004 until her hire at Penn State in February of 2007.

As of January 2009, Walsh was appointed as a member of the Panel of Instructors and Lecturers for FIFA Courses. In addition, she was appointed as the Chairman of the Women's Technical Committee for the period of January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

In January of 2008, Walsh was named as the assistant coach by Pia Sundhage for the U.S. National Team. With Walsh's help and guidance the U.S. team completed its historic run with a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Even sweeter was that Walsh's main responsibility was the U.S. Team's defense, which held fellow world power Brazil scoreless in the gold medal game.

The head coach at Harvard University as well as the U.S. Under-17 team prior to her hiring at Penn State, Walsh has consistently been active among the coaching ranks both at the Division I level and the U.S. Youth National Team program for nearly a decade. Prior to her time with the Crimson, she was part of a Florida State staff that led the Seminoles to one of its most successful years to date. FSU joined Penn State in the 2005 Women's Soccer College Cup, with both programs reaching the national semifinals.

Walsh's coaching path began in 1997 as a graduate assistant with Bucknell University. In 1998, she accepted a position at Dartmouth, where she was an assistant coach for two seasons. After helping the team to a final NSCAA ranking of No. 8 at the conclusion of the team's 1998 NCAA quarterfinal run as well as an Ivy League championship in 1999, Walsh assumed head coaching duties before the 2000 season.

As head coach, Walsh led the Big Green to back-to-back Ivy League co-championships in 2000 and 2001. Her squad was ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 each year, rising as high as No. 13 in 2001. In her three seasons as head coach, Dartmouth was invited to the NCAA Tournament each season and reached the round of 16 twice. All three of her teams earned the NSCAA's Academic Team Award.

Walsh left Dartmouth to earn her Master's in business administration at Lehigh University where she served as a graduate assistant from 2003-04.

Beginning in the spring of 2004, Walsh joined the United States Under-19 team as an assistant coach where she helped with preparations for the Under-19 World Cup. The U.S. finished with the bronze medal in Thailand after defeating Brazil in the third place match. After the World Cup, Walsh was appointed the U.S. National Team's U-17 head coach, a position which she held for three years.

As a player, Walsh was an NSCAA All-Region selection at William & Mary. A two-time first team All-CAA pick, she propelled her team to four NCAA Tournament appearances as well as two CAA regular season and two CAA league championships.

A high school All-American at Lower Moreland, she was also a member of the U.S. Under-17 National Team.

Walsh earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997 and resides in State College, Pa.
