Previewing Penn State

The Nittany Lions return nine letterwinners and all seven starters – including four AVCA All-Americans – from last year's 34-2 NCAA National Championship squad that finished the Big Ten season with an unblemished 20-0 record. The squad encompasses three AVCA First Team All-Americans in senior outside hitter Nicole Fawcett (4.44 kills per game), senior middle hitter Christa Harmotto (3.10 kills per game, .492%) and junior outside hitter Megan Hodge (4.60 kills per game) along with AVCA Second Team All-American junior setter Alisha Glass (13.02 assists per game). Also returning to the squad is 2007 Big Ten Freshman of the Year middle hitter Arielle Wilson (2.39 kills per game, .446%), Big Ten All-Freshman team opposite Blair Brown (1.91 kills per game), senior libero and 2007 team digs leader Roberta Holehouse (3.92 digs per game), junior middle hitter Kelsey Ream and sophomore defensive specialist Alyssa D'Errico. Penn State will also gain the services of 6-5 freshman outside hitter Katie Kabbes (Raleigh, N.C.), Boston College transfer and defensive specialist Cathy Quilico (Thousand Oaks, Calif.), Kishwaukee CC transfer and setter Kimi Hohl (DeKalb, Ill.), freshman defensive specialist and setter Megan Shifflett (Falls Church, Va.) and freshman defensive specialist Heather Tice (Allentown, Pa.).

For the second consecutive year, Penn State ended the season with the best cumulative hitting percentage mark in the nation. The Nittany Lions attacked at a Big Ten-record clip of .350, and over the last two seasons have accumulated a combined hitting percentage of .336. Christa Harmotto ranked second nationally and Arielle Wilson ranked fifth.

In addition, Penn State also ended the season ranked first in winning percentage (.944), second in blocks per game (3.82), ninth in kills per game (17.08) and 10th in assists (15.61). Individually, Alisha Glass ranked 24th in assists per game while Arielle Wilson (1.80) and Christa Harmotto (1.65) ranked third and sixth, respectively, in national blocks per game.

The Series: Penn State vs. Hawaii

Penn State leads Hawaii, 3-0, in a series that began in 1993. The last meeting was a five-game Nittany Lion victory (22-30, 17-30, 30-27, 30-18, 15-11) on Sept. 2, 2005 in Honolulu.

The Series: Penn State vs. UCLA

UCLA leads Penn State, 6-3, in a series that began in 1983. The last meeting was a three-game Bruin victory (30-11, 30-28, 30-18) in the NCAA Second Round at Rec Hall on Dec. 1, 2001. The last Nittany Lion victory was a three-game win (15-11, 15-9, 15-5) in the NCAA Regional Final at Rec Hall on Dec. 10, 1999.

The Series: Penn State vs. Ohio

This will be the first meeting between Penn State and Ohio in the sport of women's volleyball.

Last Time Out

Penn State defeated Stanford in five games (30-25, 30-26, 23-30, 19-30, 15-8) to capture the NCAA National Championship title on Dec. 15, 2007 at ARCO Arena in Sacramento, Calif. Megan Hodge, named the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Championship, set a new season high with 26 kills and three other Lions also added in double-digit kills, including Nicole Fawcett (19), Christa Harmotto (13) and Arielle Wilson (12). Alisha Glass directed the offense to a .317 hitting percentage while recording a season-best seven kills and 65 assists. Roberta Holehouse led five Lions in double-digit digs with 17 as Kate Price closed out her Penn State career with 15 and Alyssa D'Errico set a new personal best with 12. Playing in her first NCAA Tournament, Wilson led the squad with five blocks.

Next Up

The Nittany Lions return home to host the Nittany Lion Invitational on Friday and Saturday, Sept. 5-6 at Rec Hall. Penn State opens up its home season on Friday against Long Island at 7:00 p.m. ET. The Nittany Lions then host George Washington at noon on Saturday before closing out the tournament with Villanova at 8:00 p.m.

Top Three

The top three winningest coaches in NCAA Division I women's volleyball history - with a combined win total of 2,938 - will roam the sidelines at the Hawaiian Airlines Classic this weekend. UCLA's Andy Banachowski (1,060 wins in 38 years), Hawaii's Dave Shoji (953 wins in 33 years) and Penn State's Russ Rose (925 wins in 29 years) are the only three coaches to ever surpass the 900 career win plateau.

Lions Open 2008 Ranked No. 1 In AVCA Coaches Poll

The defending NCAA Champion Penn State women's volleyball team will start the 2008 season ranked first in the country, according to the CBS College Sports Network/AVCA Division I Top 25 Preseason Coaches Poll released on Aug. 19. The five-time defending Big Ten titlists garnered 1,498 total points and 59 of the 60 first-places votes in the poll. Stanford, who Penn State defeated in the national championship match last year, earned 1,431 total points for second place while Texas (No. 3), Southern California (No. 4) and California (No. 5) rounded out the top five.

"The preseason coaches poll is based on potential not performance," said head coach Russ Rose, who is beginning his 30th season in Happy Valley. "We have to work hard and see if the results on the court will match up to the goals of the team."

Penn State will face 10 teams listed in the initial CBS College Sports Network/AVCA poll, including five ranked in the top 25 in the nation. The Nittany Lions will square off against No. 6 UCLA, No. 12 Hawaii, No. 13 Wisconsin, No. 16 Minnesota and No. 25 Purdue while also facing Michigan, Michigan State, Louisville, Ohio and Illinois, who received votes in the poll.

Penn State Picked To Win The Big Ten; Places Five On Preseason List

The Nittany Lions have been voted as the preseason favorite for the fourth consecutive year by the league coaches, conference officials announced on Aug. 14. In addition, a conference-leading five Nittany Lions earned Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches. Senior outside hitter Nicole Fawcett, junior setter Alisha Glass, senior middle hitter Christa Harmotto, junior outside hitter Megan Hodge and sophomore middle hitter Arielle Wilson all earned the accolade, with Fawcett and Hodge picking up unanimous selections to the squad. It is the third preseason honor for Fawcett and Harmotto, the second for Hodge and the first for Glass and Wilson.

Rewriting The Record Books

Penn State accomplished something in 2007 that no other team in the history of Big Ten women's volleyball had done - for the second consecutive year. In 2006, the Nittany Lions clinched their fourth consecutive outright title which was unprecedented in the conference in volleyball. Penn State also captured four consecutive conference titles from 1996-99 but shared the 1996 crown with Michigan State and 1997 title with Wisconsin. The only other program to win more than two consecutive league titles was Illinois, whose 1986-88 teams captured three solo titles.

Last year in 2007, with the wins over No. 9 Wisconsin and Illinois on Nov. 16-17, Penn State captured its fifth consecutive outright Big Ten title, the first time in league history that one team has claimed five titles in a row, outright or shared.

The women's volleyball squad has now won 11 Big Ten titles (1992, 1993, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007) in the 17 years since joining the league for the 1991 season, securing that every senior class at Penn State since 1992 has claimed at least one conference championship. The Nittany Lions boast an astounding 95-7 record in their last five championship seasons and Penn State holds an overall conference record of 297-43, including a 158-12 mark at Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions have currently won their last 25 Big Ten matches dating back to the 2006 season.

Nittany Lions By Month

Penn State is 26-4 (.867) all-time during the month of August. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State 3-2 in the opening round. The Lions fell to UCLA in the first round of the NACWAA in 2000 and fell to defending national champion Stanford in the first round of the AVCA/NACWAA Showcase in 2005, hosted by the Qwest Center in Omaha, Neb.

Penn State is 312-49-4 (.860) all-time during the month of September. Amazingly, the Lions are 136-10 during September dating back to the 1995 season and 51-4 (.927) over the last five years.

The Lions are 344-64 (.843) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 79-11 (.878) mark in October over the last 10 seasons and 32-3 (.943) over the last four years.

Penn State is 245-54 (.819) all-time during the month of November, including a 95-8 (92%) mark over the last 10 seasons. The Lions had a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month and over the last five seasons, Penn State has a 41-1 (98%) mark in November.

Quick Sets

• During a period from Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State had won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten for the 1991 season, Penn State has played in 585 total matches, winning 515. Amazingly, 410 of those 515 wins, or 80%, have been three-game sweeps. Over the last four years, Penn State has won 102 of its 126 victories in three games (81%), including 26 out of 34 (76%) in 2007.

• Over the last 12 years, the Lions have lost only 45 matches. And of those 17 teams that defeated the Lions – Brigham Young, Florida, Illinois, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only seven of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Florida and Michigan State) have been able to beat Penn State three times. The Lions have compiled a 164-45 (78%) mark in the last 12 years versus these teams.
