On the Air: Boilermaker baseball fans will have a chance to keep up with all of the action this year, as all 55 games during the regular season, Big Ten Tournament and NCAA Tournament will be broadcast live. Locally fans can tune into WSHY 1410 AM, while those outside of the Lafayette broadcast range can subscribe to Purdue All-Access and hear the game play over the internet ... Additionally, fans can follow all of the action via live stats with CSTV's GameTracker available at the Purdue baseball schedule page at purduesports.com.

For Openers: The Purdue baseball team opens the 2009 slate, its 122nd year of action on the diamond, at the first Big East/Big Ten Challenge. Hosted at various sites around St. Petersburg, Fla., the Boilermakers will square off against Cincinnati, Michigan, South Florida and Notre Dame.

Sunshine Starts: The Boilermakers open play at a neutral site in Florida for the first time since 2003 (in Homestead) and the 12th in school history ... The Boilers last started a season in St. Petersburg in 1981, a 4-3 win over Buffalo on March 6 ... Purdue has also started a season at a neutral sites in Deland (1994), Boca Raton (1990, '91 and '92) and Lakeland (1979, '80, '82, '83 and '84) ... The Boilermakers have opened at Florida Atlantic (1989 and 2005), at Stetson (1993) and at Miami (1988) in the Sunshine State.

The Road Well Traveled: The Boilermakers will be on the road (and at neutral sites) for their first 20 games of the season. After St. Petersburg, Purdue heads to Cape Girardeau, Mo., San Marcos, Texas, Evansville, Ind., Chicago and Martin, Tenn., before finally opening the home slate on March 24 against IPFW. All totaled, the Boilers will have traveled 5,406 round trip miles before getting a chance to play at Lambert Field ... The 20 games away from home is the longest such stretch for Purdue to open a season in school history.

Purdue vs. The Big East: The Boilermakers have faced eight schools that currently call the Big East home, including all three that Purdue is scheduled to play this weekend ... The Boilers are 55-89-3 in 146 all-time meetings with Big East schools.

Purdue vs. Cincinnati: The Boilermakers and Bearcats will square off for the 15th time in an all-time series that dates back to 1888 ... The two last played in 2005, when the Boilermakers won 12-3 in Cincinnati ... The Boilers lead the all-time series 9-5 ... Purdue has won three straight games and seven of the last eight dating back to 1960 ... Purdue and Cincinnati have never met on a neutral field ... The Boilermakers recorded the first win in school history against Cincinnati when they defeated the Bearcats 21-2 on May 3, 1888 ... Purdue has never opened its season against Cincinnati ... Head coach Doug Schreiber is 4-1 all-time against the Bearcats.

Purdue vs. Michigan: Not slated to face each other during the Big Ten schedule for a second straight year, Purdue and Michigan will meet up for the lone time this season in a non-conference game on Feb. 21 ... Michigan, the 2008 Big Ten regular season and tournament champions, upended the Boilermakers twice in

the league championship tournament last year in the only two meetings between the two ... Dating back to the first contest in 1893, Michigan leads the all-time series 131-52 and has won five straight over the Boilers ... Head coach Doug Schreiber is 12-16 all-time against the Wolverines as the Boilermakers' skipper.

Purdue vs. South Florida: The Boilermakers and Bulls will meet up for a third time in each school's respective history ... Purdue is 2-0 all-time against South Florida, winning 6-2 in the first meeting in 1993 and 3-2 in 1995. Both games were played at South Florida in Tampa.

Purdue vs. Notre Dame: The Boilers and the Fighting Irish will meet up for the 119th time in a series that dates back to 1894 ... Notre Dame sports a 77-38-3 edge over Purdue all-time and has won the last four straight dating back to 2003 ... Butler is the only non-Big Ten school to have squared off more against Purdue (131) than Notre Dame ... The last time Purdue and Notre Dame met up, in 2007, current Purdue junior Matt Bischoff took a perfect game into the ninth inning before surrendering a leadoff single. The Fighting Irish eventually prevailed 1-0 in 10 innings ... Purdue head coach Doug Schreiber is 1-4 against Notre Dame as the Boilers' skipper.

Welcome Back: The Boilermakers return their starting catcher (Eric Nielsen), three-fourths of the infield (2B Ben Wolgamot, 3B Dan Black and SS Nick Overmyer) and two-thirds of the starting outfield (LF Brandon Haveman and CF Jonathan Moore) from last season's squad ... Offensively, the Boilermakers return 77 percent of their hits, 73 percent of their Big Ten-leading 124 doubles, 92 percent of their triples, 71 percent of their home runs and 77 percent of their RBIs from last season ... Individually, third baseman/catcher Black highlights the returners offensively. Black led Purdue with 18 home runs and 70 RBIs in 58 games played in 2008. The two-year starter returns for his junior season despite getting drafted in the 35th round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft by the San Francisco Giants ... Haveman, a 2008 first team All-Big Ten selection, led all Big Ten players with a .444 average in league games in his first year at Purdue. He also led the Boilermakers with 60 runs scored.

Pitch Back: The Boilermaker pitching staff returns a stout rotation and a number of arms to come out of the pen. Ace Matt Bischoff, a 2008 first team All-Big Ten selection, comes back for his junior season to anchor the starters. Bischoff finished the 2008 campaign 6-3 overall with a 3.96 ERA. The right-hander went 5-1 in league games and Purdue posted a 7-1 mark in Big Ten contests in which he was starter ... Looking to join Bischoff in the starting rotation this season are left-hander Matt Jansen (4-3, 5.44), right-hander Matt Morgan (1-0, 5.01) and southpaw Connor Sestak (1-3, 6.65) ... Top returning arms in relief include lefty Kyle Cook (5-3, 4.65) and right-hander Drew Wurdack (2-0, 5.75) ... The task of replacing second-round pick Josh Linblom and his 12 saves from last season will fall on the arm of right-hander Kevin Cahill (3-0, 4.28).

Looking Back: The Boilermakers struggled early in 2008, opening the season with a 2-11 record through the first four weeks play. Upon returning to West Lafayette for its home opener, Purdue posted a 24-6 record from March 22 to May 3 to raise its season record to 26-17. After defeating Indiana in the series opener on May 3, the Boilermakers slumped to the tune of a 1-6 record over an 11-day span. Purdue got back on track to win three of its last four games in the regular season to finish second in the Big Ten standings and earn a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. The Boilers outlasted Penn State and the rival Hoosiers in the Big Ten Tournament in Ann Arbor before finally falling twice to host Michigan to end the year.
