SERIES HISTORY

Purdue holds a 3-2 edge over Wake Forest in a series that will be renewed for the first time since 1989. Tuesday's matchup will be the first at a campus site since 1964, as the last three meetings have taken place on neutral courts. The Old Gold and Black won the last meeting, a 66-52 decision in Tucson, Ariz., as part of the Fiesta Bowl Classic. The series has historically been close, as the average margin of victory for both teams has been only slightly better than seven points in the five meetings.

THE TIP-OFF

The lone unbeaten team in the Big Ten, Purdue will take the court on Tuesday looking to move to 6-0 on the season and snap a two-game losing streak in the Big Ten-ACC Challenge ... The Boilermakers are 3-6 all-time in the Challenge, with both victories coming at Mackey Arena ... A win over the Demon Deacons would give Purdue six-straight wins to open the season, matching the second-longest winning streak in the Matt Painter Era ... A victory on Tuesday would also give Purdue its first 6-0 start to a season for the first time since the 2003-04 campaign ... The Boilers have played their way to a +6.4 average turnover margin this season, and are 61-17 under Painter when winning the turnover battle ... Purdue is also 56-8 under Painter when its shoots more free throws than its opponent.

UP NEXT

Purdue will remain at home in West Lafayette for its first-ever meeting with Buffalo, which led the Mid-American Conference in overall road wins a season ago. Buffalo is the second of three MAC teams on the Boilers' schedule, and Purdue owns a 47-15 record against the league after its victory over Central Michigan on Saturday.

BOILERMAKERS GARNER HIGHEST RANKING IN 14 YEARS

Purdue is ranked fourth in the latest Associated Press poll, its highest ranking since reaching the same position on March 5, 1996 - a span of 236 polls.

Purdue's ranking marks the 26th week in program history that it has been ranked in the top five of the Associated Press poll.

PURDUE FORCING OPPONENTS INTO LONG FIELD GOAL DROUGHTS

In five games this season, the Boilermakers have forced opponents into 13 field-goal droughts of four minutes or more, including seven basketless periods of five minutes or more.

Purdue forced Central Michigan to three field-goal droughts of more than five minutes, including a season-long 8:08 slump, in its last outing. In the championship game of the Paradise Jam, the Boilermakers held ninth-ranked Tennessee to a stretch of 7:58 without a basket from the floor in the second half to move from a three-point deficit to a five-point lead.

PURDUE HOUNDING OPPONENTS INTO EARLY-SEASON TURNOVERS

In five games this season, Purdue has induced its opponents into 98 turnovers, an average of 19.6 per contest. The havoc created by the Boilermakers' defense has also limited opposing teams to an assist-to-turnover ratio of just 0.43, and propelled the Boilers to a +6.4 turnover margin in the early stages of the campaign.

After turning over Cal State Northridge 25 times in its season opener, Purdue forced Saint Joseph's into a 23-turnover night in the semifinals of the Paradise Jam and caused 16 in each of its last two outings.

The Boilers forced double-figure turnovers in a single half from both of its first two opponents at the Paradise Jam, hassling South Dakota State 12 second-half miscues and inducing 14 turnovers from SJU in the first half of the semifinal game.

BOILERS LOOKING TO CONTINUE ONE OF LONGEST WINNING STREAKS OF PAINTER ERA

With five-straight wins to open the season, the Boilermakers have equaled the fifth-best winning streak under head coach Matt Painter, and a win over Wake Forest would move the current Purdue squad into a tie for second on that list.

The longest winning streak under Painter came during Big Ten play in 2008, when the Boilers didn't lose for more than a month en route to capturing 11-consecutive decisions.

DEFENSE THE KEY TO WIN OVER CENTRAL MICHIGAN

Purdue turned up its defensive heat on Saturday in its win over Central Michigan, limiting the Chippewas to just 38 points to equal the fewest points allowed in just over four years under head coach Matt Painter.

The Boilermakers held CMU to just five field goals in the first half, and only 13 for the game, while Central Michigan's 14 first-half points were just two more than Purdue's modern-day record for low points allowed in a half. CMU's leading scorer on the day had only eight points, while just one Central Michigan player connected on more than two field goals.

KRAMER LOCKING DOWN ON THE DEFENSIVE END

Senior guard Chris Kramer is making good on his reputation as one of the nation's premier lockdown defenders early in the 2009-10 season. Of his five primary defensive assignments this season, four have turned the ball over at least four times, and only two have reached double figures in points.

In Purdue's most recent outing, Kramer held Central Michigan's Jordan Bitzer, who entered the game with an average of 14.0 points per game, to just three points on 1-of-9 shooting from the floor and 1-of-5 from long distance.

Kramer has hounded Saint Joseph's guard Garrett Williamson into an eight-turnover, no-assist game, while Rashuan McLemore of Cal State Northridge and Garrett Callahan of South Dakota State both turned the ball over five times under Kramer's pressure. The Huntington, Ind., native also turned Tennessee guard Scotty Hopson over four times in the Boilers' victory in St. Thomas.

PURDUE PREVAILS IN TOP-10 MATCHUP FOR FIRST TIME IN MORE THAN A DECADE

While Purdue's win over No. 9 Tennessee was significant to the early-season fortunes of both the team and the Big Ten as a whole, it was also important from a historical perspective.

The victory marked the Boilers' first win in a matchup of top-10 teams since No. 9 Purdue upset third-ranked Michigan, 95-94, in Ann Arbor on March 6, 1994 - a span of nearly 16 years.

BOILERMAKERS CAPTURE FIRST IN-SEASON TOURNEY TITLE IN SIX YEARS

Purdue's championship run at the Paradise Jam marked its first in-season tournament title since winning the Great Alaska Shootout in 2003. The title in St. Thomas was also Purdue's 15th in-season tourney crown in records dating back to 1957 (much of that time was spent under a restriction which permitted teams to play in only two exempt tournaments every four years).

The Paradise Jam crown is Purdue's fourth away from the U.S. mainland, as the Boilers won 1994 Big Island Invitational in Hilo, Hawaii, and are a two-time winner of the Great Alaska Shootout.

MOORE BRINGS HOME PARADISE JAM MVP TROPHY

After erupting for 22 points on 8-of-16 shooting against No. 9 Tennessee in the Boilers' championship-game victory, junior guard E'Twaun Moore was named Most Valuable Player of the Paradise Jam.

Moore led the Paradise Jam in points per game (18.3), field goals per game (7.7) and free throws per game (2.3), while also tying for fifth with an average of 1.3 steals per contest.

The East Chicago, Ind., native is the first Purdue player to be named MVP on an in-season tournament since Kenneth Lowe earned the acclaim after the Boilmakers knocked off second-ranked Duke, 78-68, to win the 2003 Great Alaska Shootout.

MOORE BREAKS 1,000-CAREER POINT BARRIER

With a pair of free throws at the 3:58 mark of the first half of Purdue's win over Tennessee in the championship game of the Paradise Jam, junior guard E'Twaun Moore became the 43rd player in program history to score 1,000 points for his career.

Moore needed only 75 games to reach the milestone, averaging 13.5 points per game during his time in West Lafayette. He currently ranks 42nd on Purdue's career scoring list with 1,013 points.

The Boilers' leading scorer this season at a clip of 15.8 points per game, Moore has led Purdue in scoring in each of his first two seasons on campus, and will look to become the first Purdue player since Walter Jordan (1976-78) to pace the Boilmakers in scoring in three-consecutive seasons.

BOILERS TURN HALFTIME LEADS INTO VICTORIES

Each game in Purdue's 5-0 start to the season has seen the Boilmakers take a lead into the locker room at halftime. After taking a 35-point advantage into the break against Cal State Northridge in the season opener, the Boilers had to fight for halftime leads at the Paradise Jam, averaging just a 1.3-point average first-half edge in St. Thomas.

Including their five games this season, the Boilmakers are 76-13 under head coach Matt Painter when leading at the break.

BOILERMAKERS FIND SUCCESS WHEN MOORE HAS AT LEAST FIVE ASSISTS

While junior guard E'Twaun Moore's ability to score the ball is certainly a key to Purdue's success, he has also shown a knack for influencing the game by setting up his teammates for buckets.

Moore has piled at least five assists on 13 occasions in just over two collegiate seasons, and the Boilmakers are 12-1 in those contests. Purdue was a perfect 6-0 when Moore had at least five assists as a freshman, 5-1 when he hit that mark in 2008-09 and 1-0 this season.

Moore's 22-point, five-assist outburst against South Dakota State in the first round of the Paradise Jam marked the first occasion on which he scored at least 20 points while handing out five or more assists.

PURDUE'S JUNIOR TRIO EVOKING MEMORIES OF THE BOILERS' FAMED "TRIPLETS"

Known simply as the "Triplets," Troy Lewis, Todd Mitchell and Everette Stephens dazzled Purdue fans for four years during the prosperous 1980s, winning two Big Ten titles and advancing to the NCAA Tournament in each of their four seasons in West Lafayette. With the "Triplets" at the helm, Purdue's class of 1988 finished its career with 96 wins, at the time a program record, while cementing their names in the school record books a countless number of times. There is perhaps no other group of players in program history more revered and respected than the "Triplets."

More than two decades after the "Triplets" played their final game in the Old Gold and Black, a new Boilermaker trio has emerged to lead the program. Current juniors Robbie Hummel, JaJuan Johnson and E'Twaun Moore have propelled Purdue basketball back into the national spotlight, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in each of their first two seasons on campus, reaching the Sweet 16 in 2009.

An examination of the groups' team accomplishments and statistics reveals an eerie similarity between two trios of players, separated by more than two decades, who became the faces of Purdue basketball for their respective eras.

JOHNSON'S DOUBLE-DOUBLES LEAD TO SUCCESS IN THE PAINT AT PARADISE JAM

Thanks to a pair of double-doubles from junior forward/center JaJuan Johnson, the Boilermakers enjoyed a 94-64 scoring advantage in the paint during the Paradise Jam.

Johnson scored 13 points in the tournament opener to help Purdue outscore South Dakota State, 36-16, in the lane, and followed that up with an 18-point performance as the Boilers topped Saint Joseph's, 34-10, in the paint during their 25-point semifinal victory.

A huge part of his repertoire in the paint, Johnson threw down a team-high seven dunks in three games at the Paradise Jam.

SMITH STEPS UP HIS PLAY IN ST. THOMAS

Sophomore guard Ryne Smith elevated his play at the Paradise Jam, averaging 7.7 points per game on 44.4 percent shooting from the beyond the arc. The Toledo, Ohio, product was also a catalyst for key moments in the Boilers' first two games on the island.

Smith, who netted just 19 points as a freshman in 2008-09, exploded for a career-best 16 in Purdue's victory over Saint Joseph's in the semifinals, including a stretch of 2:08 in which he poured in 13 points. He was 3-of-5 from distance and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe versus the Hawks.

With Purdue leading by a margin of just 41-39 just over 16 minutes to play in its win over South Dakota State in the first round of the Paradise Jam, Smith drilled an 18-foot jumper to spark a 9-0 Boilermakers run. In just over three minutes, Purdue opened up a 50-39 lead, capped when Smith connected on a three from the left wing.

PURDUE NEARING RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE WEEKS RANKED IN AP POLL

The Boilermakers have been ranked in the Associated Press poll for 29-consecutive weeks, a streak that began on Feb. 4, 2008. The Boilers' current run is just five shy of the program record of 34 weeks, established twice from 1992-94 and 1997-99. Purdue has spent eight of those 28 weeks in the poll's top 10, and 16 weeks in the top 15 spots of the AP rankings.

PURDUE LOOKING TO WIN 100 GAMES IN A FOUR-YEAR STRETCH FOR FIRST TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

With 79 victories since the beginning of the 2006-07 campaign, Purdue enters Tuesday's game 21 wins away from posting the first four-year period in program history with at least 100 wins.

The current record for a four-year time frame is 98 wins, established in from both 1993-96 and 1994-97. The Boilermakers won 96 ballgames from 1985-88, and captured 91 decisions from 1997-00.

GRANT, KRAMER LOOK TO TAKE THEIR PLACES AMONG PURDUE'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST PLAYERS

Senior guards Keaton Grant and Chris Kramer have been two of the primary catalysts of Purdue's transformation from a nine-win team to one that has made three-straight NCAA Tournaments and appeared in the Sweet 16. BOILERS COULD SEND FOUR OVER 1,000-POINT MARK IN 2009-10

Purdue fans could witness a rare foursome this season, as the Old Gold and Black has four players within striking distance of the 1,000-point mark for their careers. Junior guard E'Twaun Moore has already accomplished the feat and has 1,013 points to his credit, while junior forward Robbie Hummel (847), senior guard Keaton Grant (835) and junior forward/center Jajuan Johnson (744) could also reach the milestone this season.

In its 111-year history, Purdue has only had four 1,000-point scorers on the same roster at one time, when Troy Lewis, Todd Mitchell, Melvin McCants and Everette Stephens took the floor for the Boilermakers during the 1987-88 season. Purdue has had three 1,000-point scorers on the same roster five times (including 1987-88), most recently in 1999-00, and the Boilers have boasted at least a pair of 1,000-point scorers on the same team 17 times.

PURDUE ROSTER BOASTS TWO OF MOST PROLIFIC THREE-POINT SHOOTERS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

Two of the key ingredients of Purdue's three-point success in recent years, senior guard Keaton Grant and junior guard E'Twaun Moore are already ranked among the top long-distance shooters in program history.

Grant, who led the team with 61 trifectas a season ago, is currently ranks sixth on Purdue's career list for three-pointers made (146) and fifth in trifectas attempted (402). He needs five triples to tie Troy Lewis for fifth on the school's all-time ledger, and a third-consecutive season with at least 60 three-point field goals would make him just the fourth player in program history with 200 or more for his career.

Purdue's freshman record holder for three-point field goals, Moore stands in ninth place on the makes list (126) and 11th on the attempts chart (336).

KRAMER RANKS AMONG NCAA'S ACTIVE LEADERS IN STEALS

Kramer has registered at least on steal in 65 of his last 71 outings for the Boilermakers. He's also led Purdue in thefts 55 times in 103-career games, or 53 percent of his appearances in the Old Gold and Black.

MINUTES PILING UP FOR BOILERMAKER FOURSOME

Four Purdue players are in the process of etching their names on the program's top-25 chart for career minutes played.

Senior guard Chris Kramer moved into 25th place on the list during the win over No. 9/11 Tennessee, passing for Purdue star James Bullock. Entering Tuesday's game with 2,856 minutes to his credit, Kramer is 132 minutes shy of catching Alan Eldridge for 24th place the list.

Classmate Keaton Grant has played 2,724 minutes, while junior guard E'Twaun Moore has played 2,400 and junior forward Robbie Hummel has logged 2,017.

Moore, who is just the third player in school history to play at least 1,000 minutes in each of his first two seasons at Purdue (also Russell Cross and Glenn Robinson), has a chance to establish a new program record for court time by the time his career in West Lafayette is over. His 2,400-career minutes are 1,459 shy of Troy Lewis' school record of 3,859, and Moore has averaged 1,131 minutes per season during his collegiate tenure.

Moore moved into second place on Purdue's single-season minutes list as a sophomore with 1,222 on the year, and has a chance in 2009-10 to become only the fourth player in program history to register three 1,000-minute seasons, joining Russell Cross, Lewis and Keith Edmonson.

BOILERS' STRING OF 20-WIN SEASONS NOT A COMMONPLACE FEAT

Purdue has won at least 20 games in each of the last three seasons, a feat that had only been accomplished four times prior to the team's current stretch. Such a streak also hadn't occurred in West Lafayette since the 1997-98, 1998-99 and 1999-00 seasons.

Another 20-win campaign in 2009-10 would give the current Purdue team the second-longest streak in program history, trailing only the six-consecutive seasons of 20 or more wins put together from 1983-88.

BOILERS COUNTING DOWN TO 500 WINS AT MACKEY

Now in its 42nd season as home to the Boilermakers, Mackey Arena has provided Purdue with one of the top home-court advantages in all of college basketball.

Following their victory over Central Michigan, the Boilers own an all-time record of 494-114 (.813) at Mackey, leaving them just seven wins shy of a milestone 500th victory on their home floor. The fastest Purdue could attain that milestone is its Jan. 5 showdown with Minnesota, the team's Big Ten home opener.

HUMMEL, MOORE REPRESENT BOILERS ON WOODEN WATCH LIST

Purdue juniors Robbie Hummel and E'Twaun Moore have been named two of the 50 preseason candidates for the 2010 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy. Bestowed upon the nation's best player while taking into account academic considerations as well as on-court accomplishments, the Wooden Award is the most prestigious individual honor in college basketball.

Purdue is one of just nine schools in the nation to place more than one player on the preseason watch list.

HUMMEL NAMED TO NAISMITH TROPHY PRESEASON WATCH LIST

In addition to earning inclusion on the preseason watch list of the Wooden Award, junior forward Robbie Hummel was also one of just 50 players from across the nation to be named to the watch list for the Naismith Trophy. The list featured 33 upperclassmen, including 19 seniors and 14 juniors.

The list will be narrowed to 30 in late February, and four finalists will be chosen in March before the trophy is awarded at the 2010 Final Four in Indianapolis.

KRAMER ONE OF 30 CANDIDATES FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Purdue senior guard Chris Kramer has been selected as one of just 30 men's candidates from across the nation for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

To be eligible for the award, a player must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and exemplify excellence in four areas: classroom, character, community and competition. The list of candidates will be narrowed to 10 midway through the season, and the award will be bestowed at the 2010 NCAA Final Four in Indianapolis.

THREE OF BOILERS' SIX CAPTAINS REPRISING THE ROLE FROM PREVIOUS SEASONS

Head coach Matt Painter has bestowed the captain's role upon his six upperclassmen for the 2009-10 season, as seniors Keaton Grant, Chris Kramer and Mark Wohlford will serve in the role along with juniors Robbie Hummel, Jajuan Johnson and E'Twaun Moore.

The captain selection is the third of Kramer's career, placing him alongside Terry Dischinger (1960-62), Brian Walker (1979-81) and Cuonzo Martin (1993-95) as the only four three-time captains in Purdue history.

With the declaration of their captainship in 2009-10, Grant and Hummel become the 28th and 29th Boilermakers, respectively, to figuratively wear the "C" more than once in their careers.

Johnson, Moore and Wohlford become the 158th, 159th and 160th players in program history to earn the captain's role.

PURDUE RECOGNIZED AMONG COLLEGE BASKETBALL'S ALL-TIME ELITE

The Big Ten's all-time leader in conference championships and a two-time Final Four participant, Purdue's place among college basketball's elite programs was recognized in early October when the Boilermakers were awarded the No. 8 spot on the ESPN/Sagarin All-Time Rankings, compiled as part of the ESPN College Basketball Encyclopedia.

Noted computer rankings analyst Jeff Sagarin also put together lists of the top 40 programs in each decade from the 1940s to the present. Purdue was one of only four programs, along with Indiana, Kansas and Kentucky, to garner a spot on each decade's list.

In addition to their No. 8 overall ranking, the Boilers were rated No. 7 in the 1940s, No. 30 in the 1950s, No. 28 in the 1960s, No. 10 in both the 1970s and 1980s, No. 11 in the 1990s and No. 40 in the 2000s.

BOILERMAKERS ADD ANOTHER CHAPTER TO HISTORY OF INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

Purdue head coach Matt Painter and junior forward Robbie Hummel added another chapter to Purdue's legacy of success with USA Basketball during the summer of 2009, winning gold and bronze, respectively, in international competition.

Painter served as an assistant coach for United States' U19 World Championship team in Auckland, New Zealand, helping Team USA win its first U19 gold medal since 1991. Hummel, meanwhile, averaged 7.3 points and 5.6 rebounds per contest to help spur the U.S. to a bronze medal at the World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia.

Including the Boilers' success in 2009, six different members of the Purdue basketball program have now won international medals:

"I think it's a great class for our needs," Painter said. "We were able to add two big guys who are totally different from each other. One is a true post, and the other is guy who can play inside or out. Those two guys will complement each other well. We also signed two very talented guards. Addressing the need to replace Keaton Grant and Chris Kramer in our backcourt was a must, and we feel like we did that by getting two all-around guards who can play at both ends of the court."

In addition to signing a highly sought-after talent from Chicago in Anthony Johnson, the Purdue staff also once again asserted its formidable in-state recruiting prowess, as Carroll, Hale and Terone Johnson are each Indiana products and were teammates on the Indiana Junior All-Stars in 2009.

"I've always said that it's important for us to recruit our backyard, and recruit kids hard in the state of Indiana and neighboring states," Painter said. "We feel that we have enough players in this area to help us compete in the Big Ten, and we're going to continue to target them with our recruiting efforts."

THE MACKEY ARENA PROJECT



Purdue University's Mackey Arena is currently undergoing a construction project designed to complement it not only as a basketball venue, but also benefit each of the university's nearly 500 student-athletes.

The scope of the Mackey Arena Complex project is the most comprehensive and significant facility undertaking in the university's athletics history, said Morgan J. Burke, director of intercollegiate athletics. It will bring a 40-year-old campus landmark into the 21st century, while preserving its rich history and tradition.

A three-level structure is planned to the north of Mackey, and is currently being referred to as the Student-Athlete Development Center. Its highlights include:

- A sports medicine facility approximately three-and-a-half to four times larger than the current area in Mackey
- A strength and weight training facility approximately four times larger than the existing Intercollegiate Athletic Facility weight room
- An oversized basketball practice facility with a full-size court and three breakout shooting area

The Mackey Arena Complex will significantly enhance the overall fan experience at Purdue home games. The concourse width will be approximately doubled, while both concessions and restrooms will increase. In addition, the lower seating sections on the east side will be modified to allow for premium seating, with club seats and logo seats provided. A limited number of premium courtside seats will also be available in the west pit area. Accessible seating will increase approximately six times, and two club spaces will be created - one for general fans on the west side and a premium club to the east.

Other upgrades will include new locker rooms and lounges, meeting rooms, offices, laundry facilities and equipment storage. The entire upper level of the IAF will be transformed into an academic center spanning approximately 10,000 square feet.

"Mackey Arena is one of the top places in the country for basketball," Purdue head coach Matt Painter said. "One of the best aspects of this renovation is that the integrity of the arena will remain the same. This plan is integrating state-of-the-art facilities and still preserving the tradition of the past."

Since it opened in 1967, Mackey Arena, named for late Purdue athletics director Guy "Red" Mackey, has earned a reputation as one of the premiere basketball arenas in the nation. The men's program tops all Big Ten schools with 21 conference championships, while the women's program has won seven regular-season titles and six postseason tournament crowns, all since 1991.

With a Sweet 16 appearance, three-consecutive NCAA Tournament berths, a Big Ten championship and an international gold medal on his résumé, Matt Painter heads into his fifth season at Purdue as one of the brightest and most-respected coaches in the college game.

In four short years, Painter has taken a program that won only nine games in his initial campaign and returned it to the ranks of the nation's elite, reaching the Sweet 16 for the first time in almost a decade in 2009. The Boilermakers have won 52 games over the course of the last two seasons, the second-best two year total in the school's storied history, while claiming Purdue's first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship in 2009.

Painter has proven himself as a master of personnel development during his time at the helm of the Purdue program, mentoring a squad that known just two seasons ago as the "Baby Boilermakers" into one of the nation's most formidable teams.

The 2008-09 season was a testament to that development, as Painter guided the Boilers to a 27-10 record and their first-ever Big Ten Tournament title. The team smashed the previous program record with 176 blocked shots on the year, while Purdue's 27 victories were its most since 1997-98 and tied for the fourth-best total in school history.

The Boilers were at their best in the postseason, rattling off double-digit victories over both Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to cut down the nets.

The Big Ten Tournament, however, was just the first act of Purdue's postseason script in 2009, as the Boilers earned the fifth seed in the West Region and headed out to Portland, Ore., for the NCAA Tournament. After defeating Northern Iowa in its first-round game, Purdue earned a 76-74 triumph over Washington in front of a highly-partisan crowd at the Rose Garden to earn its first Sweet 16 berth since 2000.

Purdue was also a constant presence in the national polls during the 2008-09 campaign, rising as high as ninth to mark the Boilermakers' first appearance in the AP top-10 since 1999.

Both Painter and his players were widely recognized for their accomplishments in 2008-09. Sophomore Jajuan Johnson became the third-straight Boiler to earn first-team All-Big Ten acclaim, while classmates E'Twaun Moore and Robbie Hummel took home second and third-team honors, respectively. Junior Chris Kramer captured honorable mention all-league honors in addition to his third-straight nod to the Big Ten All-Defensive Team, and freshman Lewis Jackson earned a place on the league's All-Freshman squad.

Johnson and Hummel were also named to the USBWA All-District V team, making Purdue the only school with multiple honorees, while the former also earned inclusion on the NABC District 7 first team.

As the architect of one of the finest seasons in program history, Painter was named a finalist for the Henry Iba Award, given annually by the USBWA to its coach of the year, for the second-consecutive season.

Despite counting four true freshman, two sophomores and a junior college transfer among his top seven scorers in 2007-08, Painter led Purdue to a 25-9 record, a second-place finish in the Big Ten and a second-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. With a 15-3 record in the Big Ten, the Boilermakers finished just one game out of first place and swept

league champion Wisconsin to hand the Badgers their only two Big Ten losses of the year.

Purdue ranked as high as 14th in the polls in 2007-08, wrapping up the campaign at No. 20 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today rankings. The Boilers also showed a knack for knocking off some of the nation's top teams that season, posting three victories over squads ranked in the top-11 of the polls.

For his efforts, Painter was named Big Ten and NABC District 10 Coach of the Year, becoming just the second Purdue floor leader to earn the first acclaim. He was also a finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award, the Jim Phelan Award and the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, and secured a nomination for the Iba Award.

Several of Painter's players were also honored following the 2007-08 campaign, as Hummel and Moore were named first and second-team All-Big Ten, respectively, and Kramer took home league Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

In his second season at the helm, Painter led Purdue back to the NCAA Tournament, where it defeated Arizona in the first round before dropping a seven-point decision to eventual national champion and top overall seed Florida.

Purdue won nine conference games in 2006-07, setting a school record for improvement after capturing just three Big Ten victories the year before. The Boilermakers' 13-game turnaround was also a program record, and ranked as the fourth-best in the nation that season.

Boilermaker seniors Carl Landry and David Teague also excelled on the individual level in 2006-07, collecting first and second-team All-Big Ten honors, respectively.

In the fall of 2006, Painter signed the Big Ten's top-ranked recruiting class, a haul that was widely regarded as one of the nation's five best by various recruiting publications.

Painter's transition into the head coaching job was a planned one, as he was tabbed in April of 2004 to succeed legendary Purdue coach Gene Keady and lead the Boilermakers into the future. Following a one-year stint as the Boilers' associate head coach, Painter officially became Purdue's 18th head coach on April 1, 2005.

Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 55-9 (.859) record at home in his first four seasons as the Boilermakers' head coach. The Boilers went 16-1 at Mackey Arena in both 2006-07 and 2007-08, setting a new program record for home wins in a season, while the 2007-08 campaign also included Purdue's first 9-0 home conference record since the 1987-88 season.

In July of 2009, Painter extended his reach past the collegiate game and into the international arena, serving as an assistant coach with the United States squad that captured the gold medal at the FIBA U19 World Championship in Auckland, New Zealand. Despite medaling in seven of the last nine U19 Worlds, Team USA hadn't won gold since 1991.

Painter spent the 2003-04 season as head coach at Southern Illinois, where he led the Salukis to a 25-5 record and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. SIU

was ranked as high as 15th in the AP poll during the campaign, and Painter was rewarded for the team's success with Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Southern Illinois, Painter served as the Salukis' top assistant for five years under longtime Purdue assistant Bruce Weber, helping quickly reverse the fortunes of a program that suffered three-straight losing seasons before the duo arrived in Carbondale.

Painter helped put the Southern Illinois program on the map during the 2001-02 season, mentoring a team that set a school record with 28 wins and earned a spot in the Sweet 16. The Salukis made a return trip to the Big Dance with Painter on the bench in 2003, and were featured in a nationally-televised documentary on MTV.

After graduating from Purdue in 1994, Painter made three coaching stops before heading to Southern Illinois. He coached one year each at Washington & Jefferson College (1993-94) and Barton College (1994-95) before breaking into the Division I ranks, spending three years at Eastern Illinois (1995-98).

Painter helped guide Washington & Jeff to the Division III Elite Eight and an overall record of 22-3 in his lone year on the bench. He was also heavily involved in recruiting Eastern Illinois stars Kyle Hill and Henry Domercant, who later led EIU to the 2001 NCAA Tournament.

The Muncie, Ind., native played guard at Purdue from 1990-93, leading the Boilers to three NCAA Tournament bids and an NIT appearance. Painter also piled up 276 assists during his playing days in West Lafayette, a figure that still ranks 17th on the program's career chart. He served as a team captain during the 1992-93 season, which saw him collect honorable mention All-Big Ten accolades after dishing out 127 assists in 28 games, an average of better than 4.5 per contest.

In addition to his bachelor's degree from Purdue, Painter also earned a Master's degree from Eastern Illinois in 1998. He and his wife, Jerri, have three children: Maggie, Brayden and Emma.

Jajuan Johnson scored 15 points, freshman reserve DJ. Byrd scored 13 and Chris Kramer added 11 points and four assists for the Boilermakers, who were playing without starting point guard Lewis Jackson.

Kevin Menner led Northridge with 18 points. Willie Gallick scored 11 and Kenny Daniels added 10, but Northridge shot only 39 percent from the field, turned the ball over 25 times and made just 23 of 43 free throws.

Purdue made eight 3-pointers to lead 55-20 at halftime.

Boilermakers coach Matt Painter had said he respected Northridge, which went 17-14 last season and tested Memphis in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

The Matadors lost five of their top six scorers from that team, though, and it showed early. Purdue made seven of its first eight shots and led 25-3 just 5 minutes into the game. Johnson scored 10 points during that opening run.

Purdue's shooting cooled off slightly the rest of the half, but its defense didn't rest. The Boilermakers forced 14 turnovers and held Northridge to 22 percent shooting, surpassing the 50-point barrier on a 3-pointer by Byrd with 1:44 left.

The Matadors cut their deficit to 30 early in the second half before Hummel and Kramer each made two baskets during an 8-2 run to make it 65-29.

Purdue shot just 40 percent in the second half, and the Matadors outscored the Boilermakers 44-34 after halftime, although they were never threatened after the break.

Purdue's freshmen, led by Byrd, combined for 27 points.

However, the Boilermakers weren't outscored.

ET'wan Moore scored 22 points and beat South Dakota State 74-63 on Friday night in the first round of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam.

"The key was the flow of the game, and I thought they were tougher than us and quicker than us," Painter said. "We talked at halftime about staying tight with them and carrying out our assignments."

Robbie Hummel added 14 points despite missing much of the action because of foul trouble, and Jajuan Johnson had 13 points and 10 rebounds for the Boilermakers (2-0). Purdue will play St. Joseph's on Sunday night in second round.

Clint Sargent led the Jackrabbits (2-1) with 16 points, and Garrett Callahan scored all 13 of his points in the first half.

"We were where we wanted to be," Sargent said. "We knew if we could tighten it up on offense we had a shot at this. We just stubbed our toes too many times, and in the end it cost us."

The Jackrabbits committed 18 turnovers, 12 in the second half.

"Defensively, we played good enough to win the game," South Dakota State coach Scott Nagy said. "I was displeased with the number of turnovers in the second half, but some of that was Purdue turned it up. You don't see a lot of teams that defend like they do with their physicality."

The Jackrabbits took advantage of Purdue's overaggressive defense early, making 13 of 15 free throw attempts in the first half.

Purdue led 39-37 at the half, and South Dakota State was still hanging close at the 16:08 mark on Kai Williams' basket that cut it to 41-39.

But the Boilermakers heated up. Ryne Smith's jumper ignited a 9-0 run that he capped with a 3-pointer that gave Purdue a 50-39 lead with 13:12 remaining.

"Any time you have close games, and any time somebody can outplay you and out-tough you, and you still win, those are good games," Painter said. "We have to be patient and play a lot smarter."

STTHOMAS, U.S. Virgin Islands (AP) - Purdue coach Matt Painter said he thought the team with the ball last would win the game.

Technically, he was right: Kelsey Barlow of the sixth-ranked Boilermakers chased down Wayne Chism's miss from the top of the key with 2 seconds left to secure a 73-72 victory over Tennessee (No. 11 ESPN/USA Today, No. 9 AP) on Monday night in the title game of the Paradise Jam.

"That was a great college basketball game right there," Painter said moments after the Boilermakers (4-0) stormed the court to celebrate before the capacity crowd at the University of Virgin Islands Sports and Fitness Center. "We were very fortunate to pull that out."

Barlow missed two free throws with 17.6 seconds remaining to give the Volunteers (4-1) an opportunity to set up the possible game-winning shot.

Tennessee point guard Bobby Maze, who had 13 points, looked to penetrate. Painter had anticipated as much, and Purdue turned Maze away, forcing a kick-out pass to Chism at the top of the key, beyond the 3-point arc.

"That's a shot we'll take every time," Maze said.

The 6-foot-9 Chism scored 24 points, hitting 8 of 13 shots from the field and going 7 of 7 from the free throw line.

The Boilermakers led 42-41 after a tightly contested first half and appeared to take charge just past the midway point of the second half.

E'Twaun Moore, who scored 22 points and was named the tournament MVP, had a steal and layup that gave Purdue a 59-58 lead with 9:06 remaining. He capped the 8-0 run with a jumper that put Purdue up 64-59 with 6:16 left.

"E'Twaun got into a nice rhythm early," Painter said. "He made a couple of big shots, and he stayed really aggressive."

Robbie Hummel scored 20 points for the Boilermakers, and Jajuan Johnson added 11 despite playing 18 minutes before fouling out.

"It was a physical game, but it would have been even more physical if both teams weren't a little fatigued from playing [Sunday] night," Tennessee coach Bruce Pearl said. "I thought both teams played very well, and I thought we played well enough to win."

Joining Moore on the all-tournament team were Hummel, Chism, Tyler Smith of Tennessee, DePaul's Will Walker and Northern Iowa's Kwadwo Ahelegbe.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. (AP) - Purdue coach Matt Painter will take this kind of defensive masterpiece any time.

The No. 6 Boilermakers used their staunch defense to overcome a sluggish offensive start, routing Central Michigan 64-38 on Saturday.

"It was a different pace of the game for us, not as many possessions, and I thought our guys struggled at times," Painter said. "But anytime you hold a team to 38 points and you have no guys in double figures, that's a good job."

Especially under the circumstances.

The game fell perfectly between Monday's big win over No. 9 Tennessee and next Tuesday's game against Wake Forest, came two days after Thanksgiving and included a rare 11:30 a.m. start time - all factors that had Painter worried.

So he changed the team's pregame routine. Instead of eating pasta four hours before tip-off, players gathered an hour later than usual for breakfast. And instead of their usual gameday shoot-around, players slept in.

The result: Purdue (5-0) went 9 of 22 from the field in the first half before waking up in the second half. E'Twaun Moore led the Boilermakers with 15 points, Robbie Hummel added 11 points and 11 rebounds, and Chris Kramer not only was held scoreless for the first time since last December, he didn't even attempt a shot.

Defensively, however, the Boilers were relentless.

They limited the Chippewas (2-4) to five baskets in the first half and 13 for the game. Finis Craddock finished with eight points, the only Central Michigan player to top six, and William McClure was the only Central player with more than two baskets. He had six points.

The Chippewas scored only 14 in the first half, two more than Purdue's modern-era record of 12. Plus, the 38 points allowed matched the lowest point total allowed by Purdue in the Painter era, now in its fifth season. Michigan State also scored 38 on Feb. 7, 2007.

All this against a team that was Mid-American Conference West Division co-champs last season and is favored to win the division outright this season.

How impressive was Purdue?

"We ran into a buzzsaw here defensively and it actually reminded me a lot of some of those teams we had at Pittsburgh," said Central coach Ernie Zeigler, a former Ben Howland assistant. "These guys all buy into that level of toughness, a lot like we had with some of those Big East championship teams."

The 38 points were also the fewest in Zeigler's tenure, now in its fourth season.

Purdue will gladly take it.

"We have a tendency to sometimes, like last year, win a big game and then come out sort of lackluster," Keaton Grant said. "I think we did a pretty good job coming out today."

It still took a while for the Boilermakers to get going, and seven minutes into the game, the scrappy teams were locked in a 9-9 tie.

Moore's only 3-pointer of the game was the break the Boilermakers needed. It started a 9-0 run, which Purdue used to take control for good.

Over the final 32 minutes, Central Michigan endured four long droughts without a basket. The total elapsed time consumed more than 25 1/2 minutes, with the longest being 8:10 separated by the halftime break. Central Michigan finished the game shooting 26.5 percent from 2-point range and 33.3 percent from beyond the arc. It also committed 19 fouls and 16 turnovers, and once the Boilermakers defense started causing havoc, it didn't stop.

"We got a little momentum and once you get a turnover, you start following that with another one and another one," Grant said after scoring 10 points.

Purdue took advantage of the miscues.

It forced turnovers on Central's last four possessions of the first half, closing on an 11-0 spurt to make it 29-14. After Central Michigan made it 29-17 on Craddock's driving, spinning layup, with 17:58 to go, the Boilers went on a 7-3 mini-run and used a 10-0 run to make it 49-24. The Chippewas didn't get closer than 19 the rest of the way.
