THIS DATE IN BOILERMAKER FOOTBALL HISTORY

Purdue has played on Sept. 5 just once prior to this season, downing Syracuse 51-0 in 2004 ... The whitewashing of the Orangemen marked the last time the Boilers have shut out an opponent on the gridiron ... Led by 287 yards passing and four TD throws from Kyle Orton, the Purdue offense posted 571 yards of total offense in the contest ... The Boiler defense limited the Orange to just 197 total yards, including only 40 on the ground, and a scant 12 first downs in the game.

SEASON OPENERS

Purdue is 71-44-6 (.612) overall in its first game of the season dating back to 1887 ... The Boilers have won five straight season openers dating back to 2004 and have outscored the opposition 254-93 during those five games ... The Boilers will be opening the year at home for the eighth time in the last 10 years. Purdue is 6-1 when starting the season at home since 2000 with the lone blemish coming in the form of a 27-26 loss to Bowling Green in 2003.

GETTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

When Purdue takes on Toledo on Sept. 5, Danny Hope will become the 34th person to lead the Boilermakers on to the field as the head coach. Dating back to the first season in 1887, first-time Purdue coaches have gone 17-16 in their initial game.

Oakland Raiders. Woodson finished his pro career with 725 tackles and 71 interceptions (the third-most in league history), with 12 interceptions returned for touchdowns. His 1,483 interception return yards are an NFL record.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Boilermakers voted on their 2009 team captains following the spring practices and elected seniors Joey Elliott (QB), Mike Neal (DT), Jason Werner (LB), Torri Williams (S) and Jared Zwilling (C).

PURDUE VS. TOLEDO - THE LAST TIME OUT

The Boilers and Rockets last met up in 2007 in Toledo ... The Boilermakers answered Toledo's touchdowns to open the first and second quarters with a pair of TDs in each frame to take a 28-14 halftime lead and posted 21 fourth-quarter points in a 52-24 win in the Glass Bowl ... Purdue racked up 488 yards of total offense, including 244 of them on the ground, and quarterback Curtis Painter tossed four touchdown passes in the win ... Dorien Bryant returned a kickoff 91 yards in the fourth quarter for a touchdown ... Defensively, Ryan Kerrigan and Mike Neal each collected their first collegiate sacks while the secondary knocked down six Toledo passes and Torri Williams and Justin Scott each picked off passes.

PURDUE VS. THE MAC

Purdue has faced 10 of the 13 schools that currently call the Mid-American Conference home ... The Boilers are 36-7-1 all-time against MAC schools ... Purdue has never played MAC members Buffalo, Northern Illinois or Temple in football, but NIU is slated to come to West Lafayette this season on Sept. 19 ... Miami (Ohio) is the most-played opponent out of the MAC for the Boilermakers - 13 games since 1945 ... The most recent meeting with a school from the conference came last season when the Boilermakers defeated Central Michigan 32-25 in Ross-Ade Stadium.

USELESS FUN FACT

There are four players and one coach with the last name of Williams on the Purdue roster this season (players - Charlton, Eric, Torri and Walter; coach Terrell). The Williams surname tops the list this year, but in the history of Purdue football letterwinners it only ties for third. Since 1887 there have been 20 Smiths that have lettered at Purdue (including Keith), 13 players with the last name of Johnson, 12 named Jones (including Zach) and 12 named Williams (including Torri).

IRON MEN

Senior cornerback Brandon King has started in the defensive backfield in a team-high 25 consecutive games and is followed closely by classmate Zach Jones' 24 straight starts at offensive tackle. Sophomore linebacker Joe Holland has started all 12 games of his young Purdue career, while junior defensive end Ryan Kerrigan started the final 11 games of the 2008 season after missing the first game due to an ankle injury.

WELCOME BACK

Purdue will welcome back four potential starters that missed all or parts of the 2008 season due to injury. The biggest beneficiary will be the offense as senior running back Jaycen Taylor (knee, season), senior quarterback Joey Elliott (shoulder, 5 games) and junior tight end Kyle Adams (knee, 11 games) have all fully mended. On the defensive side of the ball, senior linebacker Jason Werner (back, season) returns after sitting out the entire 2008 season.

GOOD GOING KID

Head coach Danny Hope has awarded scholarships to four deserving walkons as training camp came to a close. The quartet is quarterback Chris Bennett, long snapper Andy Huffman, fullback Jarrod Shaw and wide receiver Adam Wolf.

EVERYONE HAS TO START SOMEWHERE

Senior Joey Elliott is slated to start his first career game under center against Toledo on Sept. 5. Known as the "Cradle of Quarterbacks", Purdue has had more than its fair share of prolific signal callers. A look at some of the notable first starts for Boilermaker QBs.

RYAN'S EXPRESS

Junior defensive end Ryan Kerrigan is poised for a breakout season. The second-year starter is coming off a 2008 campaign that saw him lead the Boilermakers with seven sacks and 11.5 tackles for loss in 11 games played. He recorded a career-best three sacks against Michigan last year and his eight career sacks leaves him just outside of the top 20 list at Purdue.

NO PASSING ZONE

Coming off a 2008 season that saw it lead the Big Ten in passing defense, the Boilers' veteran defensive backfield returns intact and is looking for more of the same. The all senior quartet of cornerbacks Brandon King and David Pender and safeties Dwight Mclean and Torri Williams limited the opposition to a 183.25 yards per game average, combined to break up 30 passes and haul in six interceptions last season. Williams is Purdue's leading returning tackler (83), King has started the most games of any Purdue player on the current roster (25) and Pender is already among the top 20 players in school history in passes defended (20 career PBU, 19th).

WATCH THIS

Sophomore kicker Carson Wiggs has been named to the watch list to the Lou Groza Award. The Groza Award is presented annually to the top place kicker in the country. As a

— Nestled on the northern edge of the Purdue University campus, Ross-Ade Stadium is in its 86th season as the home of Boilermaker Football.

— From 2001 to 2003, Ross-Ade underwent a \$70 million renovation that has made it one of the most attractive and fan-friendly facilities in all of college football.

— The current sod was laid in June of 2006, and Ross-Ade became the first Big Ten stadium with a Bermuda surface.

— During the summer of 2007, a new 31-foot by 68-foot Daktronics video board, priced at \$1.7 million, was installed at the south end of Ross-Ade that significantly enhanced replay and other entertainment possibilities.

— Ross-Ade was dedicated Nov. 22, 1924, in a game against intrastate rival Indiana (the Boilermakers won 26-7). The stadium is named for its two principal benefactors, alumni David E. Ross, late president of the Board of Trustees, and the late George Ade, playwright and humorist.

— The stadium's original seating capacity was 13,500 (with standing room for an additional 5,000). Six expansions, plus end zone bleacher seating, eventually raised it to 69,200 in 1970. Capacity presently is 62,500.

— Purdue has an all-time record in Ross-Ade of 256-150-13, a .626 winning percentage.

true freshman last year, Wiggs was 8 for 11 on field goal attempts. Among his successful conversions last year was a school-record 53-yarder at Ohio State.

FRESH FACES

The Boilermakers' depth chart for the opener against Toledo is dotted with newcomers on both sides of the ball. At wide receiver, true freshmen Gary Bush and Antavian Edison are listed as backups, as are junior college transfers Cortez Smith and Keith Carlos. All four receivers will be counted on heavily throughout the 2009 season. On the defensive side of the ball, true frosh Kevin Pamphile (DT), Dwayne Beckford (LB), Antwon Higgs (LB) and Josh Johnson (CB) are all listed as reserves at their respective positions.

READY TO RUN

The Boilermakers lost a good one with the graduation of all-time touchdown scorer Kory Sheets, but first-year running backs coach Cornell Jackson has a plenty to work with this season. As noted above Jaycen Taylor returns for his final year of eligibility after missing out on 2008 with a knee injury. Taylor has rushed for 1,237 yards on 220 carries in 23 games played. His 5.62 yards per carry average is currently fourth in school history. Joining Taylor in the backfield this season will be sophomore Ralph Bolden, sophomore Jared Crank, junior Dan Dierking, senior Frank Halliburton and true freshman Al-Terek McBurse.

THEIR TIME TO SHINE

Playing wide receiver for a school that boasts the top three reception leaders in Big Ten history (not to mention five of the top 10) means you're probably going to get the ball thrown to you a time or two. Junior Keith Smith and senior Aaron Valentin have been tabbed as the next in line as the top pass catching threats for the Boilers. Smith is the leading returning receiver from last season (49-486 yards, 2 TDs) and Valentin averaged 20.4 yards per catch and posted 635 all-purpose yards in 2008.

NOT SO GREEN

Last year at this time Joe Holland was making his way over from safety and Chris Carlino was attending his first few weeks of college. A year later the linebacking duo enter the football season a little longer in the tooth with a combined 24 games played, including 17 starts, and 112 total tackles. The more experienced pair will team up with senior Jason Werner to form the starting linebacking corps.

MONSTER MIKE

Senior Mike Neal is big, athletic and most impressive strong. The defensive tackle describes his team-best bench press as: "510 pounds is my max; I probably could do more if I tried, but once I obtained that goal I just stopped. It feels pretty good to be able to achieve that number." Neal returns for his final year coming off of a 2008 season that saw him post a career-high 33 total tackles, which included 10 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks.

THE CRADLE INDEED

Excerpts from Cory Giger's *Altoona Mirror* Aug. 23, 2009 story about which school should be considered "Quarterback U.":

College and NFL criteria reveal several elite programs and, surprisingly, Purdue as leading candidates for distinction

"When people debate which school deserves to be called Quarterback U, (Len) Dawson's alma mater, Purdue, probably doesn't get much consideration. Higher-profile programs like Miami and USC first come to mind for many, along with perhaps Notre Dame, Alabama or Michigan.

Truth be told, a case can be made for all of those schools, just as a case can be made for Purdue. It all depends on the criteria used ..."

"Purdue, one of Notre Dame's biggest rivals, belongs in the Quarterback U debate for two reasons. Boilermaker alums have started more NFL games (704) than any other school, and Purdue is the only program to have four quarterbacks start at least 100 games (Jim Everett, Bob Griese, Drew Brees, Dawson).

The passing attack was a big part of Purdue football more than 50 years ago - long before most other schools - and continued under recently retired head coach Joe Tiller."
