LAST WEEK'S QUICK HITS — VS. IOWA

Purdue converted over half of its third downs (9 for 17) and recorded its longest fourth-down conversion of the season (18 yards) ... Brandon Taylor's fumble recovery for a touchdown in the second quarter was the first for the Boilermakers since 2006 (Alex Magee vs. Illinois) ... Ralph Bolden averaged 5.1 yards per carry, rushing 14 times for 71 yards with a touchdown. The score was Bolden's fifth of the season ... Caleb TerBush finished the contest 10 of 16 for 86 yards and a touchdown. TerBush has thrown at least one touchdown in nine of 11 games this season ... Antavian Edison extended his streak to 19 consecutive games with a reception after finishing with a career-high nine grabs for 97 yards ... Gabe Holmes



hailed in his first collegiate touchdown on a 14-yard catch in the first quarter ... Robert Marve's fumble for a touchback on the goal line in the fourth quarter was the first fumble lost by a Purdue rusher this season (423 carries) ... Taylor's touchdown on the fumble recovery was his first score on any level of football ... Dwayne Beckford finished with 11 tackles, shared a sack with Will Lucas and forced the fumble in the Hawkeye end zone. It was Beckford's third straight game with double-digit tackles and his fifth in the last six games ... Beckford's effort pushed his tackle total of the season to a team-best 91 for the year, a new career high (84 last season) ... Ricardo Allen tied Beckford with a game-high 11 total stops, including nine solo ... Josh Johnson finished with 10 tackles ... Joe Holland and Bruce Gaston each recorded sacks, for Holland it was his first solo sack of the season and the second for Gaston ... Iowa's five sacks were the most by a Purdue opponent this season.

positioning itself for Ewald's game-winner. For the game, Indiana out gained Purdue 403 to 310 in total offense and posted 26 first downs to Purdue's 13. Individually, IU's Ben Chappell finished the contest 31 of 50 for 330 yards and three scores. Purdue's Henry was 16 of 30 for 252 yards and three scores.

PURDUE-INDIANA/OLD OAKEN BUCKET FACTS

- 2011 will mark the 114th all-time meeting between Purdue and Indiana.

- First game played for the Old Oaken Bucket was in 1925. That game ended in a 0-0 tie.

- Purdue leads the overall series 70-37-6 and is 56-27-3 in Old Oaken Bucket games.

- Since 1891, Purdue and Indiana have played every year except 1895, 1896, 1903, 1906, 1907, 1918 and 1919. The first-ever meeting between Purdue and IU was on Nov. 14, 1891 in West Lafayette. Purdue won 60-0.

- The Old Oaken Bucket has changed hands 31 times in the 86 years since the two schools have played for the trophy.

- Purdue has a better winning percentage against the Hoosiers in Bloomington (.667, 33-16-2) than it does in West Lafayette (.623, 36-21-4).

- Purdue's largest victory since the Old Oaken Bucket debuted in 1925 was a 62-10 win in Joe Tiller's final game as Purdue head coach on Nov. 22, 2008.

- Purdue's largest margin of victory ever against Indiana was a 68-0 win in 1892.

- In 1943 it took a valiant goal-line stop by the Boilermaker defense in the fourth quarter to put away an Indiana team 7-0 to preserve the last undefeated season in either school's history (9-0). The 1943 Hoosiers went 4-4-2 that season. That 1943 game snapped a three-game winning streak by IU and was Purdue's lone victory in the series from 1940-47.

- Purdue's longest string of success was between 1948-1961, when it went 13-0-1.

- Indiana's longest string of success in the series was between 1940-47, when it went 6-1.

- The largest crowd in Ross-Ade Stadium, 71, 629, crammed in on Nov. 22, 1980, to watch the Boilermakers stave off IU, 24-23.

- The largest crowd in Memorial Stadium history, 56,223, was on hand to see No. 17-ranked Purdue hold off Indiana 44-21 on Nov. 22, 1969.



CAREER YEAR

Junior linebacker Dwayne Beckford's monster season has pushed the third-year starter past his previous season high totals in tackles, tackles for loss and sacks. The Irvington, N.J., native has 91 total stops for the year, which is seven better than his previous career high of 84 as a sophomore and one better than Logan Link's team season-high total from 2010. His 7.0 TFLs in 2011 are one-half more than the career 6.5 combined from 2009 and 2010 and his three sacks this season blow away his career total of 0.5 from the previous two years. Beckford has posted double-digit tackles in three straight games and in five of the last six for Purdue.

HANGING ONTO THE BALL

"The Ball Is The Program" is a slogan that the Boilermakers have taken to heart. Through the first 11 games of the season, Purdue has lost merely five fumbles (of which only three have been on offense). Perhaps the most impressive part of the ball protection is that Purdue has seen 17 different players rush with the ball this season and merely a single fumble has been lost on 424 carries. Two of the five giveaways have come after receptions, one on a muffed kickoff return and the other on a punt return.

STUDLY SCHOLARS

Linebacker Joe Holland and tight end Crosby Wright were feted with Academic All-District V honors by the Collegiate Sports Information Directors of America. Both are

now eligible for Academic All-America honors. Holland, who is also the recipient of a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete postgraduate scholarship, is the first four-time all-district honoree in school history. He has a 3.96 cumulative grade-point average and plans to attend dental school after his football career comes to an end. Holland is second on the team with 74 tackles, including 5.5 for losses with half a sack. Wright, who has a 3.45 cumulative grade-point average in management, is a first-time honoree and is currently sixth on the team with 10 receptions for 194 yards and two scores.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE

On Oct. 26, linebacker Joe Holland became just the third player in Purdue history to be awarded a postgraduate scholarship by the National Football Foundation (also Drew Bress in 2000 and Ken Loushin in 1979). Holland was named one of 16 players nationally as a NFF Scholar-Athlete. The Indianapolis native will be presented with an \$18,000 scholarship at a national banquet in New York in early December. Holland has posted a 3.96 cumulative grade-point average at Purdue, was a second-team Academic All-American in 2010 and is a three-time Academic All-District V and Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He plans on going to dental school upon the completion of his football playing days.

MOVING ON UP

Linebacker Joe Holland finished with two tackles against Iowa on Nov. 19 to push his career mark to 306 and into 18th all-time in Purdue history. Holland enters the Indiana game five tackles away from Mark Brown for 17th (311) ... Kicker Carson Wiggs has also moved up the career charts at Purdue. The senior has amassed 265 total points in his career making him nine better than Mike Alstott's fourth-place total of 256. He'll most likely finish third all-time, as Kory Sheets' No. 2 spot with 324 points seems pretty secure. Wiggs' 49 field goals are second all-time to Travis Dorsch's 68 and his 72.1 percent success rate is the top mark for any Purdue kicker ... Defensive tackle Kawann Short has also busted his way onto the all-time lists at Purdue. With 12.5 sacks, the East Chicago, Ind., native is tied with Jerrol Williams for 15th at Purdue and his 33.0 tackles for loss are also 15th for the Boilermakers.

STREAKING

Including a career-high nine catches for 97 yards last weekend against Iowa, junior wide receiver Antavian Edison has a team-high 19-game reception streak dating back to the Oct. 9 Northwestern game last season. During the streak, Edison has caught 68 passes for 812 yards and six touchdowns. He is averaging 11.9 yards per catch during the streak.

A NOSE FOR THE END ZONE

Sophomore cornerback Ricardo Allen returned a MarQueis Gray interception 37 yards for a touchdown on Oct. 8. The pick-six marked the third of his career in merely 17 games played and tied him for the school record with former All-American cornerback Rod Woodson (1983-86) and linebacker Mike Rose (1996-99). Allen has racked up 166 return yards on his three pick-sixes.

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) became an official member of the Big Ten Conference on July 1, 2011, increasing the Big Ten's membership to 12 institutions for the first time in conference history. The addition of Nebraska marked the Big Ten's first expansion since Penn State University joined the conference in June of 1990.

On June 11, 2010, the Big Ten Council of Presidents/Chancellors announced unanimous approval of the University of Nebraska's application to join the conference, with competition to begin in all sports for the 2011-12 academic year. UNL has already been granted admission into the Committee on Institutional Cooperation, a consortium of the Big Ten universities and the University of Chicago.

The addition of the Cornhuskers allowed the conference to split football into two divisions, known as the Legends and Leaders, and hold a league championship game for the first time ever.

As a member of the Leaders Division, the Boilermakers will face the other five division teams, crossover rival Iowa and Legends Division foes Michigan and Minnesota in 2011.

The inaugural Big Ten Football Championship Game will be held at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis on Dec. 3, and that facility will also host the title game in 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.

TWO BILLS

Including Purdue's 217 yards on the ground against Minnesota on Oct. 8, the Boilermakers are 9-1 during head coach Danny Hope's tenure in which they rush for 200 or more yards.

IRON MEN

Linebacker Joe Holland, defensive end Gerald Gooden, defensive tackle Kawann Short and offensive tackle Dennis Kelly have all started 34 or more games during their Purdue careers. Holland leads the way, having started 46 of a possible 47 career games. Gooden (36) has more starts than either Short or Kelly (35), but the tackles on both side of the ball have strung them together consecutively.

ODDS AND ENDS

Purdue's kickoff return unit enters the Indiana game ranked fourth nationally and first in the Big Ten with a 26.3 yards per return average ... Raheem Mostert is a huge part of the previous note as he is currently eighth nationally and second in the Big Ten with a 29.2 KOR average ... Caleb TerBush's consecutive starts to open the 2011 season marks the first time since Joey Elliott started all 12 games in 2009 that a Boilermaker signal caller has been under center for 11 straight starts ... Carson Wiggs' 53-yard field goal against Minnesota on Oct. 8 is the longest in the Big Ten this year ... Kawann Short is tied for 11th nationally and third in the Big Ten in tackles for loss per game (1.5).

PURDUE'S 2011 BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Caleb TerBush connected with Antavian Edison on a 35-yard touchdown pass with 49 seconds remaining to lift Purdue to a come-from-behind 27-24 victory over Middle Tennessee before 42,110 sun-drenched fans at Ross-Ade Stadium. The game-winning score capped a nifty 11-play, 85-yard drive. On their ensuing possession, the Blue Raiders drove from their own 20-yard line to the Purdue 30 to set up a potential game-tying 47-yard field goal. The kicked was stuffed by the Boilermakers' Ricardo Allen, setting off a wild frenzy. TerBush, a junior who entered training camp as the No. 3 signal-caller on the roster, made his first career start and second-ever appearance (the other one coming in 2009) and completed 19 of 33 passes for 220 yards and two touchdowns. He hooked up with nine different receivers, led by Justin Siller with five catches for 56 yards. Ralph Bolden rushed for 120 yards on 17 carries (7.1 average) after missing the 2010 season due to injury. Akeem Shavers added 40 yards on seven carries (6.0 average), including a 30-yard touchdown to tie the game at 17-apiece early in the fourth quarter. TerBush's other touchdown pass was a 2-yarder to Jared Crank that capped a 12-play, 98-yard drive in the second quarter and put Purdue ahead 10-7. Carson Wiggs contributed a pair of field goals - from 50 and 47 yards. Wiggs also punted three times for a 42.3-yard average, with all three punts landing inside the Middle Tennessee 20-yard line. Cody Webster averaged 50 yards on four punts, with two inside the 20. Joe Holland led the defense with a career-high 14 tackles and two pass breakups, while Will Lucas had seven tackles and a pass breakup. Dwayne Beckford came up with his first career interception. The Blue Raiders led 14-10 at halftime and at the end of the third quarter. The game-time temperature was 90 degrees.

Game Notes: The Boilermakers finished with 420 yards of offense, including 201 on the ground ... Purdue's 98-yard scoring drive in the second quarter was its longest since a 98-yard scoring drive at Michigan State in 2008 ... HOUSTON - For the second straight week, the outcome came down to a last-second field goal attempt, and this time Purdue fell victim in a 24-22 loss before 25,317 sun-scorched fans at Rice Stadium. Carson Wiggs' 31-yard try as time expired was snuffed at the line of scrimmage. The Boilermakers appeared poised for their second straight come-from-behind fourth quarter comeback when they took over at their own 48-yard line with 1:52 remaining and marched to the Rice 14 to set up Wiggs' attempt. Purdue held leads of 7-3 and 17-10 before the Owls tied it on the final play of the first half. Rice went ahead 24-17 in the third quarter and then Purdue inched closer with a safety and a 27-yard field goal by Wiggs. Caleb TerBush had a solid afternoon, completing 18 of 31 passes for 183 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 68 yards on 16 carries and a score. His touchdown pass was a 19-yarder to Crosby Wright with 5:56 left in the first half. Antavian Edison, O.J. Ross and Justin Siller each caught four passes. Akeem Shavers rushed 11 times for 69 yards, while Ralph Bolden added 46 yards on 11 attempts. Kawann Short led the defensive effort with a career-high 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, to go with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Joe Holland had 10 tackles, and Will Lucas added seven stops. Robert Maci came up with the first two sacks of his career, including one in which he forced a fumble that Short recovered. Wiggs added a 28-yard field goal, Cody Webster averaged 49.4 yards on five punts and Waynelle Gravesande had a career-long 31-yard punt return. The Boilermakers outgained the Owls 366 yards to 352 yards in total offense. The temperature at kickoff was 94 degrees.

Game Notes: A week after winning on a blocked field goal attempt, the Boilermakers saw the script flipped as Rice stuffed the potential game-winning kick as time expired for a 24-22 victory over Purdue ... The blocked 31-yard attempt was the first by a Purdue opponent since 2009 (Michigan State) ... Joe Holland and Kawann Short assisted on recording Purdue's first safety of the season and the latest since the season opener last year against Notre Dame ... Purdue had a total of eight Texans make the trip to their home state for game ... The Boilermakers posted a perfectly balanced offensive output, rushing and passing for 183 yards each ... Thanks in part to four touchbacks and four punts inside the Owls' 20-yard line, Rice's average starting position on offense was its own 17 ... The Boilermakers turned in their first turnover-free game since knocking off Indiana 38-21 to end the 2009 season ... Running back Akeem Shavers led the Boilermakers with 69 yards on 11 carries (6.3 avg.), with a long of 43 ... Quarterback Caleb TerBush completed 18 of 31 passes for 183 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing 16 times for 68 yards and another score ... TerBush's five-yard scoring run in the first quarter was his first on the ground ... Crosby Wright hauled in a 19-yard touchdown pass, the first scoring catch of his career ... Wide receiver Antavian Edison led Purdue with four receptions for 76 yards ... Punter Cody Webster averaged 49.4 yards per punt on five kicks, with a long of 56, and placed a pair inside Rice's 20 ... Carson Wiggs made field goals from 27 and 28 yards, booted four of his five kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks and placed his two punts at the Rice 1- and 13-yard lines ... Waynelle Gravesande had a career-long 31-yard punt return ... Defensively, end Short led all players with a game-high 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, forced a fumble and recovered another ... After racking up a career-high 14 stops against Middle Tennessee, linebacker Holland posted his second straight double-digit tackle effort with 10 against the Owls ... WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Purdue scored early and often and was nearly perfect en route to a 59-0 victory over Southeast Missouri before 46,116 fans on a spectacular football afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers scored their most points and recorded their first shutout since 2004 (they defeated Ball State 59-7 one week after blanking Syracuse 52-0) while posting their most lopsided shutout since a 62-0 win over Rose Poly in 1913. Purdue's 627 yards of total offense was its most since amassing a school-record 763 against Indiana in 2004 and ranks as the third-most in school history. After settling for a 19-yard field goal by Carson Wiggs early in the game, the Boilermakers scored eight touchdowns. Seven scores can via the ground: two apiece by Ralph Bolden, Akeem Hunt and Akeem Shavers and one by Antavian Edison. Robert Marve and Gary Bush hooked up for the other touchdown. After Caleb TerBush started, Marve made his first appearance in nearly a year after recovering from a knee injury and completed 7 of 8 passes for 91 yards. TerBush continued to his fine play, completing 14 of 17 passes for 143 yards. O.J. Ross and Justin Siller both had five receptions, while Waynelle Gravesande had career highs of four catches for 57 yards. Shavers rushed for 75 yards, followed by Brandon Cottom (70), Bolden (57) and Hunt (56) as Purdue gained 393 yards via the ground and did not have a single negative-yardage play. The Boilermakers attempted just pass in the second half after building a 38-0 advantage. Purdue held Southeast Missouri to 153 yards (87 rushing and 66 passing) – the fewest by an opponent since Ball State in 2004 – while coming up with 10 tackles for loss. Chris Carlino and Will Lucas led the way with seven stops, followed by Bruce Gaston and Kawann Short with five apiece. Brandon Taylor recorded two tackles for loss, including a sack. Ricardo Allen came up with a gorgeous interception on the Redhawks first play from scrimmage.

Game Notes: Purdue improved to 82-29-3 all-time when playing an opponent for the first time ... Purdue's 59-0 win marked the largest margin of victory ever at Ross-Ade Stadium (previous record was 52 points) ... The Boilermakers finished with 627 yards of total offense, its highest total under Hope and most since Nov. 20, 2004 against Indiana ... The 393 yards rushing were Purdue's most since a 315-yard effort against Toledo on Sept. 5, 2009, and just shy of a 397-yard effort at Indiana on Nov. 24, 1995 ... Purdue's defense limited the Redhawks to just 153 yards of total offense. It was the first time the Boilermakers held an opponent under 200 yards since Sept. 11, 2004 (vs. Ball State), and the first game under 100 yards passing by an opponent since Oct. 10, 2009 (at Minnesota) ... The Boilermaker defense had 10 tackles for loss for 29 yards, including a pair of sacks ... The Boilermakers topped the 50-point plateau for the first time since Sept. 5, 2009 (52-31 vs. Toledo) ... It was Purdue's first shutout since a 51-0 win vs. Syracuse on Sept. 5, 2004 ... Purdue improved to 8-1 under Hope when rushing for over 200 yards, including 2-0 this season ... Purdue's 33 first downs were their most since Nov. 22, 2008 (35 vs. Indiana) and tied for the eighth most in school history ... Caleb TerBush completed 14 of 17 passes for 143 yards ... Robert Marve made his first appearance of the season at quarterback. He completed 7 of 8 passes for 91 yards and a touchdown ... Akeem Shavers led the Boilermakers with 70 yards rushing on 10 carries, scoring a pair of touchdowns ... Ralph Bolden carried the ball 11 times for 57 yards and his first two touchdowns of the season. They were his 10th and 11th career rushing touchdowns and he now has 13 for his career ... Antavian Edison had his first career rushing touchdown. He carried the ball three times for 32 yards and had one catch for 26 yards ... Akeem Hunt saw his first career action at running back, rushing for 56 yards and two scores on six carries ... Brandon Cottom also saw his first career carries in the backfield, rushing for 70

yards on seven attempts ... Justin Siller and O.J. Ross paced the receiving core with five catches each. Siller had 61 yards and Ross had 46 ... Waynelle Gravesande smashed his career-highs with four receptions for 57 yards ... Gary Bush scored his first touchdown of the season, his second-career scoring grab ... Chris Carlino and Will Lucas led the Boilermaker defense with seven tackles apiece ... Ricardo Allen grabbed his first interception of the season and fourth career pick.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Notre Dame took advantage of a Gary Gray interception on Purdue's first offensive play of the game and didn't look back in a 38-10 Fighting Irish victory in the seventh night game ever at Ross-Ade Stadium. Gray picked off Caleb TerBush's first pass of the game, and Tommy Rees converted the turnover into seven points two plays later when he hit Michael Floyd on a 35-yard touchdown pass merely 24 seconds into the contest. Notre Dame led 21-3 at the half and didn't allow the Boilermakers to find the end zone until 21 seconds remained in the fourth quarter. Rees finished the game 24 of 40 for 254 yards with additional scoring passes to TJ Jones and Tyler Eifert. Led by 191 yards and a touchdown by Cierre Woods, the Irish racked up 287 yards on the ground and got another scoring rush by Jonas Gray. TerBush led the Boilermakers with 101 yards through the air, finishing 10 of 15 with a 13-yard touchdown to Antavian Edison. Purdue mustered merely 276 yards of total offense on 65 plays and were held under 100 yards rushing for the first time in 2011. Defensively Manti Te'o paced the Irish with eight solo tackles, including three for losses with a pair of sacks. Albert Evans finished with a career-high 11 tackles in the loss for the Boilermakers.

Game Notes: The Boilermakers were held to just 276 yards of total offense (84 rush/192 pass) ... The Boilermakers failed to rush for 100 yards in a game for the first time this season ... WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Purdue opened Big Ten Conference play with a convincing 45-17 victory over Minnesota before 38,207 fans at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers scored on their first four possessions while racing to a 24-0 advantage in the first quarter. It was 31-0 before the Golden Gophers got on the scoreboard with a late second-quarter field goal. Purdue featured a balanced offensive attack, rushing for 217 yards and passing for 155 yards. Akeem Hunt led the ground game with 60 yards on nine carries (6.7 average), followed by Akeem Shavers with 52 yards on 10 carries (5.2 average). Caleb TerBush completed 14 of 21 passes for 140 yards and one touchdown, while Robert Marve was 4 of 6 for 15 yards and one score. O.J. Ross had a team-high five catches for 63 yards and a touchdown. Shavers scored two touchdowns (one rushing and one receiving), while Ralph Bolden and Raheem Mostert both added ground scores. Ricardo Allen tied the school record with his third career interception return for a touchdown, a 37-yarder late in the first quarter. Ryan Russell also equaled a school mark with two fumble recoveries. The Boilermakers had three takeaways and no giveaways. They limited Minnesota to just 213 yards of total offense (113 passing and 100 rushing), including merely 88 in the first half. Dwayne Beckford and Will Lucas both came up with eight tackles to top the team. Kawann Short had 2.5 tackles for loss, including a sack. Carson Wiggs nailed a season-long 53-yard field goal and now owns the five longest field goals in school history.

Game Notes: Purdue's offense had 372 yards of total offense, gaining 217 yards on the ground and 155 yards passing ... The Boilermakers are 9-1 under Hope when rushing for at least 200 yards, it was their third 200+-yard rushing effort of the season ... UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Purdue's offense fared well against the nation's fourth-ranked defense, but the Boilermakers came up short on the scoreboard, falling 23-18 to Penn State before 100,820 fans at Beaver Stadium on a windy afternoon in the shadow of Mount Nittany. The Boilermakers amassed 344 yards of total offense against a unit that came into the game allowing an average of merely 251 yards. Purdue trailed 13-12 with four minutes to go in the third quarter, with a missed extra point keeping the game from being tied. Less than two minutes later, Penn State scored a touchdown to go ahead 20-12, but the Boilermakers answered midway through the fourth quarter on a 1-yard plunge by Akeem Shavers. Purdue's two-point conversion failed, and the Lions added a field goal on their ensuing possession to round out the scoring. Ralph Bolden rushed for 97 yards on just 13 carries (7.5 average), while Shavers added 54 yards on 13 carries. Caleb TerBush completed 12 of 25 passes for 162 yards and one touchdown, a 14-yarder to O.J. Ross. Justin Siller had five catches for 67 yards, and Antavian Edison caught three balls for 46 yards. The Boilermakers had the longest rush (39 yards by Bolden) and the longest pass (50 yards from TerBush to Siller) by a Penn State opponent thus far this season. Dwayne Beckford paced the defense with 11 tackles, while three players had seven apiece: Albert Evans, Bruce Gaston and Joe Holland. Josh Johnson had two pass breakups and forced a fumble. Ryan Russell also forced a fumble and came up with a sack. Carson Wiggs kicked a pair of field goals from 28 and 32 yards, and Cody Webster averaged 45.7 yards on three punts. Raheem Mostert had a season-long 71-yard kickoff return to set up the TerBush-to-Ross touchdown.

Game Notes: The Boilermakers rushed for 162 yards and passed for 182 more for 344 yards of total offense ... Penn State's defense has only allowed more yardage in a game this season once through its first seven games (359 yards to No. 2 Alabama) ... Purdue's 162 yards rushing for the day were 69 more than the Nittany Lions defense had averaged ceding in their six games heading into the contest ... All totaled, Purdue had only seven negative yards of offense all day against the then-fourth-ranked defense in the nation ... Quarterback Caleb TerBush's 50-yard pass to wide receiver Justin Siller in the first quarter was the longest offensive play surrendered by Penn State and the longest play for Purdue this season ... TerBush finished the game 12 of 25 for 162 yards and a touchdown ... TerBush's 14-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter was his sixth scoring throw of the year ... Wide receiver O.J. Ross hauled it in for his second TD reception of the year ... Siller tied his career and season-high with five reception for a career-best 67 yards ... Running back Ralph Bolden's 39-yard rush in the second quarter was the longest for him this year and the most yardage ceded on the ground on a single play by Penn State in 2011 ... Bolden averaged 7.5 yards per carry, rushed for 97 yards and did not have a single negative yardage carry for the day ... Running back Akeem Shavers scored his team-leading fifth touchdown of the year in the fourth quarter ... Shavers finished with 54 yards on 13 carries for the game ... Receiver Antavian Edison's 20-yard reception in the first bumped his consecutive games with a catch to 14 straight ... Kicker Carson Wiggs' two field goals moved him to 11 consecutive games with at least one make ... Receiver Raheem Mostert ripped off a season-high 71-yard return in the third quarter ... WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - An energized and spirited Purdue football team earned a well-deserved 21-14 Homecoming victory over 23rd-ranked Illinois before 45,146 fans at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers built a 21-0 halftime advantage and dominated before the Fighting Illini scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns. Caleb TerBush connected with Justin Siller for a 6-yard score late in the first quarter, Raheem Mostert found the end zone on a 21-yard scamper early in the second and TerBush hooked up with Jared Crank on a 4-yard pass midway through the second to account for Purdue's points. The first two scoring drives covered 91 and 88 yards, while the last touchdown was set up when Mostert tackled the Illinois punter at the Illini 14-yard line. TerBush was solid, completing 16 of 25 passes for 178 yards. Siller, Antavian Edison and O.J. Ross each caught three balls, as TerBush hooked up with eight different receivers. Eight Boilermakers carried the football, as well, led by Akeem Shavers and Ralph Bolden with 29 and 28 yards. Purdue's defense was stout, limiting Illinois to just 128 yards in the first half and 366 for the game. The Illini came into the game averaging 30.7 points and 424 yards. They were converting 53 percent of their third-down conversions, as well, but were limited to 35 percent (6 of 17) by the Boilermakers. Dwayne Beckford and Joe Holland both recorded 11 tackles, while Ricardo Allen had a career-high tying 10 to go with an interception. Kawann Short came up big with a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss, including two sacks to equal his career best. The Boilermakers had a season-high four sacks for the game. Purdue claimed the Cannon Trophy for the sixth time in the last seven matchups and won its second straight Homecoming contest under head coach Danny Hope.

Game Notes: The Boilermakers won their fifth consecutive home game against the Fighting Illini. Illinois' last victory in Ross-Ade Stadium was in 2001 ... The Illini entered the game ranked seventh in the nation in third-down efficiency, but converted six of 17 third-downs against the Boilermakers ... Purdue regained possession of the Cannon Trophy for the sixth time in the last seven games against Illinois ... The win was Purdue's first against an AP-ranked opponent since knocking off No. 7 Ohio State on Oct. 17, 2009 ... The Boilermakers had 304 yards of total offense, collecting 126 on the ground and 178 passing ... Purdue's 91-yard touchdown drive in the first quarter was its third 90+-yard scoring drive this season (98, 95, 91). The Boilermakers have seven touchdown drives of at least 85 yards this season ... The Boilermakers scored first for the third time this season, doing so via touchdown for just the second time ... The Purdue defense pitched a shutout in the first half, marking the third half of play this season in which they've held an opponent without a point (first and second halves against Southeast Missouri) ... The Boilermaker defense had a season-high four sacks ... Purdue special teams picked up its first turnover on downs of the season, stuffing the Illini punter in the second quarter and tackling him for a 10-yard loss ... Caleb TerBush connected on 16 of 25 passes for 178 yards and two scores ... Raheem Mostert took the ball 21 yards to paydirt on his only carry of the day, marking his second touchdown of the year. Both of his touchdowns have come from over 20 yards out ... Justin Siller scored his first touchdown of the season, hauling in a six-yard grab for Purdue's opening score of the day. It was his second career receiving touchdown and the third overall of his career. He finished with three catches for 45 yards and three carries for 13 yards ... Jared Crank had his second career receiving touchdown of the season, scoring on a four-yard grab. Both of his receptions in 2011 have been for touchdowns ... Crank rushed for a season-high 19 yards on four carries ... Antavian Edison has caught a ball in 15 consecutive games, finishing with three grabs for 33 yards ... Ricardo Allen grabbed his third interception of the season and sixth of his career. He finished with 10 tackles, matching his career high set against Notre Dame this year ... Kawann Short earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors with a pair of sacks, matching his career-high total from the 2010

game at Illinois, and 3.5 tackles for loss, setting a new career high. He finished with six tackles ... Dwayne Beckford and Joe Holland paced the defense with 11 tackles apiece. It was Beckford's second straight game with double-digit tackles, and Holland's second of the year.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Michigan's versatile offense proved too much for the Boilermakers, who dropped a 36-14 decision before 112,115 Homecoming fans on a cool afternoon at Michigan Stadium. Purdue scored on its opener - a snappy five-play, 67-yard drive capped by a 48-yard touchdown pass from Caleb TerBush to Gary Bush - before the Wolverines put up 36 straight points. Following a 7-apiece tie at the end of the first quarter, Michigan led 22-7 at halftime and 29-7 after three quarters. The Boilermakers' second touchdown came on a 19-yard pass from Robert Marve to O.J. Ross in the final seconds. Purdue amassed 311 yards of total offense but surrendered 535 yards (339 rushing and 196 passing). TerBush completed 9 of 13 passes for 156 yards, while Marve was 8 of 14 for 66 yards with an interception. Justin Siller, playing in his home state, had five receptions for 58 yards. TerBush led the ground attack with 38 yards on just three carries, including a 41-yarder. Purdue's defense came up with two interceptions - by Joe Holland and Josh Johnson - but could not parlay either of them into points. Holland topped the team with 10 tackles, while Dwayne Beckford and Albert Evans both had nine stops. Kawann Short came up with two tackles for loss and Gerald Gooden chipped in with a sack.

MADISON, Wis. - Wisconsin scored early and often en route to a 62-17 victory over Purdue before 80,566 fans at Camp Randall Stadium on Nov. 5. Leading 14-10 after one quarter, the Badgers scored 24 points in the second quarter and 24 more in the second half to avenge their back-to-back losses. The 62 points marked the most the Boilermakers have allowed in school history. Raheem Mostert enjoyed a record-setting day for Purdue, with five kickoff returns for 206 yards – an average of 41.2 yards per return. He topped school records for yards and average held by Stan Brown for 42 years. Brown averaged 39.5 yards on four kickoff returns vs. Iowa on Oct. 18, 1969, and amassed 184 yards (on six returns) at Ohio State on Nov. 15, 1969. Mostert's yardage total ranks eighth in Big Ten annals. Caleb TerBush completed 10 of 19 passes for 103 yards and a touchdown – a 30-yarder to Crosby Wright in the first quarter to tie the game at 7. O.J. Ross had four receptions for 42 yards, and Ralph Bolden rushed for 49 yards on nine carries. The Boilermakers' other touchdown was a 2-yard run by Justin Siller late in the second quarter, and Caron Wiggs drilled a 25-yard field goal. Dwayne Beckford had a career-high 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops, two for loss and one sack, while Logan Link added a career-high tying 13 tackles, including nine solos. Will Lucas forced and recovered a fumble. Wisconsin outgained the Boilermakers 605 yards to 284 yards. Cody Webster averaged 45.7 yards on three punts.

Game Notes: Purdue's opening scoring drive was its shortest in terms of number of plays (two) and time of possession (15 seconds) ... Raheem Mostert broke the Purdue records for both total kickoff return yardage (206) and average yards per return (41.2) against the Badgers ... Mostert's 74-yard return in the first quarter was the longest of the season by any Purdue player ... Caleb TerBush and Crosby Wright connected on a 30-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter. TerBush has thrown at least one touchdown pass in six consecutive games and in eight of nine contests this season ... Wright's 30-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was the longest catch of his career and his second touchdown as a Boilermaker ... Antavian Edison had one reception to extend his streak to 17 straight games with a catch ... Edison also averaged 9.0 yards per rush on two carries ... O.J. Ross led all Boilermakers with four catches for 42 yards. Ross has a catch in all nine games this season ... Ralph Bolden averaged 5/4 yards per carry, gaining 49 yards on nine rushes ... Dwayne Beckford recorded a career-high 14 tackles, including two losses with a sack ... Logan Link chipped in with 13 stops ... Kawann Short finished with a pair of tackles, including one for loss. Short has posted at least one TFL in seven of nine games this season and enters the Ohio State game tied for 19th nationally and fifth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss per game (1.39) ... Will Lucas' strip and recovery of Russell Wilson in the second quarter was merely the second lost fumble of the season for the Badgers. Lucas finished with five tackles, including four solo stops.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Purdue earned another signature win under head coach Danny Hope with a thrilling 26-23 overtime verdict over Ohio State before 43,334 fans at Ross-Ade Stadium on Nov. 12. The Boilermakers led virtually all of regulation until the Buckeyes tied the game at 20 by scoring a touchdown with 55 seconds to play. Bruce Gaston kept it deadlocked when he blocked the point-after attempt. In overtime, after Ohio State kicked a field goal to go up three on its first possession, Purdue answered and won the game on a 1-yard sneak by Robert Marve. One play earlier, Marve kept the drive alive by connecting with Gary Bush for 14 yards on third-and-12. The victory set off a festive on-field celebration by Boilermaker Nation reminiscent to two years ago when the Boilermakers beat the Buckeyes. Marve finished 10 of 13 passing for 94 yards. Caleb TerBush was 15 of 24 for 140 yards. The pair combined to hook up with nine different receivers, led by Justin Siller (career-high six catches for 45 yards), Antavian Edison (5 for 47), Bush (career-high 4 for 46) and O.J. Ross (4 for 30). Ralph Bolden rushed for 80 yards on 18 carries. Defensively, the Boilermakers equaled their season best of 10 tackles for loss, which included a season-high five sacks. Kawann Short had a career-high three quarterback snuffs, while Dwayne Beckford and Gaston both had one. Beckford topped the team with 10 total tackles, followed by Logan "Night Fever" Link with nine and Joe Holland seven. Purdue's other touchdowns came on a 4-yard run by Akeem Shavers in the first quarter to make it 10-0 and a 7-yard run by Bolden in the second quarter to make it 17-7. Carson Wiggs made a pair of field goals from 19 and 44 yards. The Boilermakers amassed 363 yards of total offense and limited to the Buckeyes to 298 yards. Ohio State came into the game 15-1 in November games dating to 2005, including 8-0 in road games.

Game Notes: With the victory, Purdue defeated Ohio State in Ross-Ade Stadium in back-to-back appearances by the Buckeyes for the first time in school history ... The win was Purdue's first overtime victory since 2006 (a 38-31 win over Miami (Ohio)) and the Boilermakers improved to 4-7 all-time in extended play contests ... Purdue converted 50 percent of its third-downs, going nine for 18 ... The Boilermakers scored on their opening drive for the third-straight game and fourth time this season ... Purdue completed passes to nine different receivers and nine different players finished with at least one rush on the day ... The defense posted a season-high five sacks and equaled the season high with 10.0 tackles for loss (also vs. Southeastern Missouri) ... Purdue had 363 yards of total offense, including 234-yards passing which matched the season-high (also Middle Tennessee) ... The Boilermaker defense held Ohio State under 300-yards total offense (295), including its third-lowest rushing total of the season (163) ... Robert Marve scored the game-winning touchdown in overtime, rushing in from half-a-yard out. He was 10 of 13 passing for 94 yards and an interception while also rushing three times for 10 yards with the game-winning touchdown ... Caleb TerBush completed 15 of 24 passes for 140 yards ... Ralph Bolden punched in his fourth rushing score of the season and 13th of his career. Bolden carried the ball 18 times for 80 yards, his third-best rushing total of the season ... Akeem Shavers scored his team-best sixth rushing touchdown of the season (seventh total score). He finished with nine carries for 19 yards ... Justin Siller led the Boilermakers with a career-high six receptions for 45 yards ... Antavian Edison had five receptions for 47 yards, extending his streak to 18 consecutive games with a catch ... Gary Bush had a career-high four receptions, including his overtime grab that put the ball inside the one-yard line ... Kawann Short had a single-game best three sacks on the day, finishing with six tackles, including four solo stops ... Bruce Gaston came up with

his first career block of an extra point to keep the game tied after Ohio State rallied for a touchdown with 55 second remaining. It was the fourth blocked kick by the Boilermakers this season ... Short and Gaston were named the Big Ten Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week, respectively ... Carson Wiggs booted a pair of field goals and converted both PATs for eight points on the day and 262 for his career (third all-time at Purdue).

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - The Boilermakers dropped a 31-21 decision to Iowa in their home finale before 40,106 fans on a blustery afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. With 1:27 to play, Robert Marve scored a touchdown to potentially pull Purdue with three points, but the call on the field was overturned to a fumble, the explanation being that Marve bobbed the ball onto the pylon for a touchback. The Hawkeyes broke a 14-apiece tie with a touchdown late in the second quarter and ultimately went ahead 31-14 early in the fourth quarter. Ralph Bolden's 11-yard touchdown run with 11:58 kept the Boilermakers alive. Bolden finished with 71 yards rushing on 14 carries. Caleb TerBush completed 10 of 16 passes for 86 yards and a touchdown - a 14-yarder to Gabe Holmes on Purdue's first possession of the game. Robert Marve was 7 of 18 passing for 95 yards. Antavian Edison had a career-high nine receptions for 97 yards. The Boilermakers' other touchdown came when Brandon Taylor recovered an Iowa fumble in the end zone. It marked Purdue's first fumble recovery for a score since Alex Magee accomplished the feat at Illinois in 2006. Ricardo Allen and Dwayne Beckford paced the defense with 11 tackles, while Josh Johnson had 10 stops. Beckford forced the fumble that Taylor recovered after teaming with Will Lucas to sack Iowa quarterback James Vandenberg. Purdue amassed eight tackles for loss, including three sacks. Joe Holland, one of 22 seniors playing in his final home game, had two pass breakups. Iowa amassed 408 yards of total offense, compared with 282 for the Boilermakers.

Game Notes: Purdue converted over half of its third downs (9 for 17) and recorded its longest fourth-down conversion of the season (18 yards) ... Brandon Taylor's fumble recovery for a touchdown in the second quarter was the first for the Boilermakers since 2006 (Alex Magee vs. Illinois) ... Ralph Bolden averaged 5.1 yards per carry, rushing 14 times for 71 yards with a touchdown. The score was Bolden's fifth of the season ... Caleb TerBush finished the contest 10 of 16 for 86 yards and a touchdown. TerBush has thrown at least one touchdown in nine of 11 games this season ... Antavian Edison extended his streak to 19 consecutive games with a reception after finishing with a career-high nine grabs for 97 yards ... Gabe Holmes hauled in his first collegiate touchdown on a 14-yard catch in the first quarter ... Robert Marve's fumble for a touchback on the goal line in the fourth quarter was the first fumble lost by a Purdue rusher this season (423 carries) ... Taylor's touchdown on the fumble recovery was his first score on any level of football ... Dwayne Beckford finished with 11 tackles, shared a sack with Will Lucas and forced the fumble in the Hawkeye end zone. It was Beckford's third straight game with double-digit tackles and his fifth in the last six games ... 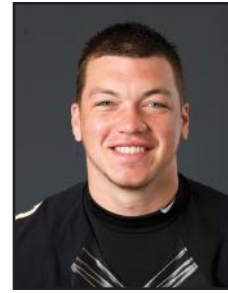
