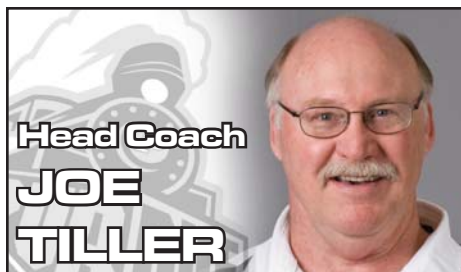

A LOOK AT THE BOILERMAKERS

The 23rd/20th-ranked Purdue football team, under 11th-year head coach Joe Tiller, entertains fourth-ranked Ohio State in Big Ten Conference action on Saturday, Oct. 6, at Ross-Ade Stadium in West Lafayette, Ind. Purdue is 5-0 (1-0 Big Ten) for the second time under Tiller (also 2004) and for just the second time since 1945. The Boilermakers are ranked in The Associated Press poll for the first time since the week of Sept. 26, 2005, when they were 22nd. It marks the 80th week Purdue has been ranked in the AP poll under Tiller, tied for the most by any coach in school history (also Jack Mollenkopf, 1956-69).

Joe Tiller has put Purdue back on the college football map.

With each passing year, Joe Tiller further solidifies his reputation as one of the greatest coaches in Purdue football history - perhaps the greatest.

Taking the reins of a program that had just one winning season (with the help of a forfeit victory) and no bowl game appearances since 1984, Tiller has engineered nine bowl berths in 10 years, an average of more than seven wins per season and a Big Ten championship in 2000.

Tiller's teams have qualified for nine of the 14 bowl games in school history: 1997 Alamo, 1998 Alamo, 2000 Outback, 2001 Rose, 2001 Sun, 2002 Sun, 2004 Capital One, 2004 Sun and 2006 Champs Sports.

As for Tiller, who was assistant head coach at Purdue from 1983 to 1986, his 10-plus-year record with the Boilermakers stands at 80-49, a snappy .620 winning percentage. His 16-plus-year head coaching record is 119-79-1, a .601 winning percentage. In Big Ten games, he is 50-32, a .610 winning percentage.

On Nov. 13, 2004, Tiller won his 100th career game with a 24-17 victory over Ohio State at Ross-Ade Stadium.

Tiller served as head coach of the East team in the East-West Shrine Game on Jan. 15, 2005, and earned a 45-27 victory. He played for the West team in 1963 and became just the fifth individual to play and coach in the Shrine Game.

During the 2002 season, Tiller became the second-winningest coach in school history, both for all games and Big Ten games. He trails only Hall of Famer Jack Mollenkopf, who had 84 wins and 57 Big Ten wins from 1956 to 1969. Tiller also ranks second to Mollenkopf with 129 games coached.

IF THE BOILERMAKERS WIN...

- ☆ They will be 6-0 for the first time since 1943 and for only the third time in school history (also 1892 and 1929).
- ☆ They will improve to 51-16 at home under Tiller.
- ☆ They will improve to 8-10 against ranked opponents at home under Tiller.

RANK AND FILE

Purdue has a 2-0 all-time record when ranked No. 23 in The Associated Press poll and a 2-14 record against teams ranked fourth. The Boilermakers have faced Ohio State five times previously when the Buckeyes were ranked No. 4 and are 1-4 in those games.

BACK ON TRACK

Since enduring a six-game losing streak during the 2005 season, the Boilermakers have posted a 16-6 record. They won their last three games in 2005, went 8-6 in 2006 and are 5-0 in 2007. Prior to the losing streak, the Boilermakers had a .634 winning percentage under Joe Tiller (64-37 record); they are at .727 since snapping the skid.

2007 ROSTER

Purdue's 109-player roster consists of - by academic standing - 14 fifth-year players, 26 seniors, 19 juniors, 17 sophomores and 33 freshmen. The Boilermakers have 20 defensive backs, 18 offensive linemen, 15 wide receivers, 11 linebackers, 11 running backs (including two fullbacks), nine defensive tackles, eight defensive ends, six quarterbacks, five tight ends, four kickers-punters and two long snappers. They hail from 18 different states: 39 are from Indiana; 12 from Texas; 11 from Illinois; nine from Ohio; six from California and Florida; five from New Jersey; four from Georgia; three from Kentucky and Michigan; two from Pennsylvania and Wisconsin; and one each from Connecticut, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri and Virginia. In addition, kicker-punter Brody McKnight hails from Vancouver, B.C. He is the first Boilermaker from Canada since offensive lineman Denny Chronopoulos (1990-91), who was from Montreal.

The Boilermakers' 33-19 win over Notre Dame last Saturday marked their 50th home victory under Joe Tiller and their 250th all-time victory in Ross-Ade Stadium. Purdue now is 50-16 at home under Tiller and 250-145-13 overall in 84 seasons in Ross-Ade.

JACK THE RIPPER AND JOLTIN' JOE

Jack Mollenkopf was 10-4 against Notre Dame from 1956 to 1969. With a 4-6 record against the Irish, Joe Tiller is the only other coach in Purdue history to win more than two games against Notre Dame.

The home of Purdue football since 1924, Ross-Ade Stadium has grown from its original capacity of 13,500 to the present-day 62,500.

Dedicated on Nov. 22, 1924, before the Boilermakers defeated intrastate rival Indiana 26-7, Ross-Ade Stadium has witnessed Purdue post a record on its home field of 250-145-13, a .629 winning percentage.

The stadium is named for its two principal benefactors, alumni David E. Ross, late president of the Board of Trustees, and the late George Ade, playwright and humorist. Ross conceived the idea for the stadium and selected the site. He and Ade purchased and presented to the university the 65-acre tract on which the stadium is located.

In recent years, Ross-Ade has undergone numerous changes. From 2001 to 2003, the stadium saw a \$70 million facelift which included the six-level press box and the widening of the concourse to help ease fan traffic. In 2006, a cold-tolerant strain of Bermuda grass was put in place.

POLLING PLACE

Purdue has been ranked in The Associated Press poll 80 weeks (out of 174 possible) under Joe Tiller. That total is tied for the most by any Purdue coach. Jack Mollenkopf also was on the sidelines for 80 ranked weeks from 1956 to 1969, including five at No. 1 during the 1968 season. The Boilermakers have been ranked 238 weeks in their history.

HORN OF PLENTY – PART I

Purdue has scored at least 45 points in four of its first five games (52 at Toledo, 52 vs. Eastern Illinois, 45 vs. Central Michigan and 45 at Minnesota) and has scored in all 20 quarters played. Under Joe Tiller, the Boilermakers have scored 40-plus points 32 times and have a perfect 32-0 record in those games.

HORN OF PLENTY – PART II

The Boilermakers have amassed 500-plus yards of total offense in three of its first five games (533 vs. Eastern Illinois, 583 vs. Central Michigan and 504 at Minnesota). Under Joe Tiller, Purdue has reached the 500-yard plateau 37 times and is 30-7 in those games.

FAST STARTS

Purdue has outscored its opponents 137-20 in the first half – 82-13 in the first quarter and 55-7 in the second quarter.

GRADE ‘A’ PROTECTION

Purdue quarterbacks have been sacked merely four times, tied for the second-fewest in the Big Ten, while throwing 208 passes, the most in the conference. Minnesota leads the conference with three sacks allowed out of 206 passing attempts, and Ohio State has surrendered four sacks out of 136 passing attempts. The Boilermakers’ average of 0.80 sacks allowed per game is tied for 11th in the nation (also six other schools). Last season, Purdue ranked third in the Big Ten and tied for 22nd nationally with an average of 1.43 sacks allowed per game (20 sacks in 541 passing attempts). The Boilermakers are starting a new left guard (Zach Reckman) and a new right tackle (Zach Jones), while two-year starting right tackle Sean Sester now is at left tackle. Center Robbie Powell and right guard Jordan Grimes are in their same positions as a year ago.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Purdue ranks third in the nation with an average of 31.3 yards per kickoff return (20 returns for 626 yards) and shares the top spot with two returns for touchdowns (also Arkansas and Hawai’i). The Boilermakers’ two kickoff returns for touchdowns have come from Dorien Bryant (91 yards at Toledo) and Desmond Tardy (95 yards at Minnesota). It marks the first time Purdue has had two different players return kickoffs for touchdowns in a season in school history. The Boilermakers had two returns for touchdowns by Stan Brown in 1969 and two by Otis Armstrong in 1972. The school record is three – all by Brown – in 1970. Tardy’s touchdown came on his first-ever return and was Purdue’s first to open a game since Stan Brown had a 93-yarder at Michigan State on Nov. 7, 1970. Jimmy Smith had a 100-yarder vs. Stanford on Sept. 12, 1981, on the first time the Boilermakers touched the ball; however, it came after a Stanford touchdown.

MORE HAPPY RETURNS

Dorien Bryant ranks seventh in the country with an average of 32.4 yards per kickoff return (13 returns for 421 yards). He was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after returning a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at Toledo on Sept. 1, 2007. It marked the first Player of the Week honor in Bryant’s career and the 19th special teams recognition in school history. The last returner to be chosen was Jerome Brooks after his 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2004. Bryant’s return for a touchdown was the second of his career, following a 95-yarder vs. Northwestern on Oct. 15, 2005. Stan Brown (1968-70) holds the school career record with five kickoff returns for touchdowns. In addition to his 91-yard touchdown, Bryant has returns of 60, 58, 40 and 33 yards this season.

ON THE MONEY

Curtis Painter's .776 completion percentage (38 of 49) vs. Eastern Illinois on Sept. 8, 2007, set the school record for 40-plus attempts. The previous mark was .727 (32 of 44) by Drew Brees vs. Michigan on Oct. 7, 2000. Painter's 38 completions set a career high and are tied for fifth in school history (also Kyle Orton vs. Washington State, Dec. 31, 2001; and Orton at Wisconsin on Oct. 18, 2003). Painter's 38 completions came on the fewest attempts among the top five. He connected with 12 different receivers, the most under Joe Tiller. The previous high was 11 by Painter in his first start at Wisconsin on Oct. 22, 2005. Brees hooked up with 10 different receivers on seven occasions.

GET OFF THE FIELD

Purdue ranks second in the Big Ten in opponent third-down conversion at 29.4 percent (25 of 85). Ohio State leads the way at 28.4 percent (23 of 81). The Boilermakers are fourth in opponent fourth-down conversion at 43.5 percent (10 of 23). Wisconsin (28.6 percent, 2 of 7), Penn State (33.3 percent, 1 of 3) and Minnesota (42.9 percent, 3 of 7) are the top three. The 23 fourth-down attempts against Purdue are far and away the most in the conference. Illinois, Indiana and Northwestern are second with 11 each.

THE BUCK STOPS HERE

The Boilermakers have recorded 31 tackles for loss. Anthony Heygood and Cliff Avril rank 1-2 on the team with 6.0 and 5.0. Sixteen different players have been involved in a play behind the line of scrimmage.

IN-VINSON-ABLE

Terrell Vinson paces Purdue with six pass breakups and is tied for the team lead with 34 tackles (also Stanford Keglra), two interceptions (also Justin Scott) and one forced fumble (also five other players). Vinson has recorded two tackles for loss and one sack.

WELCOME BACK WILLIAMS

Torri Williams missed the entire 2005 season with a broken leg suffered during the spring and then suffered a season-ending dislocated knee vs. Indiana State in the third quarter of the 2006 opener. He is back again and came up with his second career interception at Toledo on Sept. 1, 2007, and his first career forced fumble vs. Central Michigan on Sept. 15, 2007.

SUM, SUM, SUMMERS-TIME

After making just 8 of 20 field goal attempts as a true freshman walkon a year ago, Chris Summers has made eight of 10 attempts this season. He has made all 29 of his PAT attempts this year, is 75 of 76 for his career and currently has a school-record streak of 70 in a row. The previous mark was 69 straight by Ben Jones in 2004 and 2005. Summers kicked a career-high four field goals – from 27, 34, 26 and 29 yards – vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 29, 2007.

SCORING ALL WAYS

In addition to scoring four offensive touchdowns and a field goal at Minnesota on Sept. 22, 2007, the Boilermakers reached the end zone via their defense (Cliff Avril 43-yard interception return) and special teams (Desmond Tardy 95-yard kickoff return). The last time Purdue scored defensive and special teams touchdowns in the same game was vs. Ball State on Sept. 30, 1995, when Derrick Winston returned an interception 23 yards and Lee Johnson returned a kickoff 99 yards. Under Joe Tiller, Purdue has scored 21 defensive touchdowns (11 fumbles and 10 interceptions) and 11 special teams touchdowns (four kickoff returns, four punt returns, two blocked field goals and one blocked punt). The Boilermakers are 18-2 when they score a defensive touchdown and 9-2 when they score a special teams touchdown.

ON THE OFFENSE

The Boilermakers' 583 yards of total offense (360 passing and 223 rushing) vs. Central Michigan on Sept. 15, 2007, marked the fifth-most under Joe Tiller and tied for the ninth-most in school history.

TOLEDO, Ohio - The Boilermakers got contributions from all phases of the game and rolled to a season-opening 52-24 victory over Toledo before 26,100 fans at the Glass Bowl in Toledo, Ohio, on Sept. 1.

The offense racked up 488 yards of total offense, perfectly balanced 244 rushing and 244 passing. Curtis Painter threw touchdown passes to four different players: Dustin Keller (80 yards), Kyle Adams (28 yards), Selwyn Lymon (5 yards) and Greg Orton (34 yards). Keller had three receptions for 107 yards, while Lymon caught three balls for 32 yards.

Kory Sheets rushed for 90 yards on 11 carries (8.2 average), including a 13-yard touchdown, and Jaycen Taylor had 84 yards on nine carries (9.3 average). Dan Dierking rumbled for a 30-yard touchdown on his second collegiate handoff.

Defensively, the Boilermakers amassed eight tackles for loss, including three sacks, to go with four pass breakups and two interceptions - by Justin Scott and Torri Williams - while limiting the Rockets to 326 yards of total offense. Anthony Heygood, playing his first game at linebacker, came up with 11 tackles, while Terrell Vinson had a career-high 10, including two for loss, and a pass breakup. Josh Ferguson added a career-high nine tackles, as did Dan Bick.

Dorien Bryant got in on the fun on special teams with his second career kickoff return for a touchdown, a 91-yarder in the fourth quarter. Chris Summers nailed a 44-yard field goal. Purdue broke a 14-14 tie early in the second quarter with 24 straight points.

The win came in Joe Tiller's hometown and was just the fifth by an opponent in the Glass Bowl in the last 43 games, dating to the middle of the 1999 season. The Rockets were 19-3 at home from 2003 to 2006, and head coach Tom Amstutz was 10-0 at home vs. non-conference foes.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Curtis Painter tied the Purdue record with six touchdown passes in just over three quarters of play and hooked up with 12 different receivers - the most under Joe Tiller - as the Boilermakers rolled to a 52-6 victory over Eastern Illinois before 52,504 fans at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 8.

Painter threw for 348 yards, and his .776 completion percentage (38 of 49) set the school record for 40-plus attempts. Painter's 38 completions set a career high and rank tied for fifth in school history.

Dustin Keller came up with two touchdown receptions, while Dorien Bryant, Greg Orton, Jake Standeford and Jerry Wasikowski each had one. Bryant finished with 12 catches for 111 yards, and Orton caught seven balls for 58 yards.

Jaycen Taylor rushed for 85 yards on 16 carries, and Dan Dierking had 54 yards rushing on eight attempts with a touchdown. Chris Summers accounted for the rest of the scoring with a 39-yard field goal.

Purdue led 17-3 after the first quarter and 31-3 at halftime before lightning forced a 65-minute delay before the start of the third quarter.

The Boilermakers amassed 533 yards of total offense, while limiting the Panthers to 236 yards, including merely 124 over the final three quarters.

Josh Ferguson and Anthony Heygood led the defensive effort with seven tackles apiece. Byron Williams recovered a fumble on Eastern Illinois' initial kickoff return.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – The Boilermakers' multi-faceted offense continued to roll with a 45-22 victory over Central Michigan before 60,038 fans at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 15.

Purdue racked up a season-high 583 yards of total offense – 360 passing and 223 rushing. Curtis Painter completed 29 of 39 passes for 360 yards and three touchdowns, while Kory Sheets rushed for a career-high 144 yards on 21 carries and two scores. Dorien Bryant and Selwyn Lymon led the receiving corps with six receptions apiece. Kyle Adams, Dustin Keller and Lymon each caught touchdown passes.

Purdue raced to a 24-0 first-quarter lead on the strength of 300 yards of total offense. MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. – Desmond Tardy returned the opening kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown, and Purdue did not look back in a 45-31 victory over Minnesota before 47,483 fans at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in Minneapolis on Sept. 22. It was the Big Ten Conference opener for both teams.

The Boilermakers raced to a 17-0 first-quarter lead and held a 24-3 advantage at halftime before the Minnesota offense got untracked in the second half.

Curtis Painter completed 33 of 48 passes for 338 yards with three touchdowns and his first interception of the season.

Dorien Bryant had 12 catches, including nine in the second half, for 150 yards and two touchdowns. He finished with 234 all-purpose yards and along the way became the school career record-holder, breaking Mike Alstott's mark of 4,710 yards during a 17-yard kickoff return late in the first quarter.

Kory Sheets had a monster game with 111 yards rushing on 21 carries and one touchdown and a career-high seven receptions for 60 yards and a score.

Cliff Avril returned an interception 43 yards for a touchdown, and Chris Summers added a 24-yard field goal to round out the scoring.

The Boilermakers amassed 500 yards of total offense for the third consecutive game. Purdue scored touchdowns via defense and special teams in the same game for the first time since 1995. Tardy's score came on his first career kickoff return.

Justin Scott topped the team with eight tackles and also forced a fumble and recovered another one. Purdue took advantage of four Golden Gopher turnovers, including a fumble by Jamal Harris after he returned a blocked field goal 34 yards and appeared headed for a touchdown before losing the ball and having it recovered by Purdue holder Jared Armstrong.

The Boilermakers improved to 10-1 in conference openers under Joe Tiller.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – The Boilermakers opened a 23-0 halftime lead and went on to post a 33-19 victory over intrastate rival Notre Dame before a sun-drenched capacity-plus crowd of 65,250 at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 29.

Kory Sheets scored on a 1-yard run, Dorien Bryant caught an 11-yard touchdown pass from Curtis Painter and Chris Summers booted field goals from 27, 34 and 26 yards to give Purdue its halftime advantage.

The Fighting Irish bounced back with three second-half touchdowns – missing two PAT attempts – and closed to within 26-19 with just under eight minutes remaining before the Boilermakers answered with a 14-yard scoring play from Painter to Dustin Keller.

Painter completed 22 of 37 passes for 252 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Sheets rushed for 141 yards (just the fifth time a Purdue player gained 100-plus yards via the ground against Notre Dame) on 27 carries, while Bryant caught eight passes for 82 yards and Keller had five receptions for 36 yards.

Summers added a 29-yard field goal in the third quarter to give him a career-high four for the game.

Stanford Keglär led the defense with nine tackles, followed by Josh Ferguson with eight and Dan Bick with six. Terrell Vinson came up with five tackles, three pass breakups and two interceptions, including one in the end zone. Alex Magee blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter.

Purdue improved to 5-0 for the second time under Tiller (also 2004) and for just the second time 1945. The win marked the Boilermakers 50th home victory under Tiller and their 250th all-time victory in Ross-Ade.
