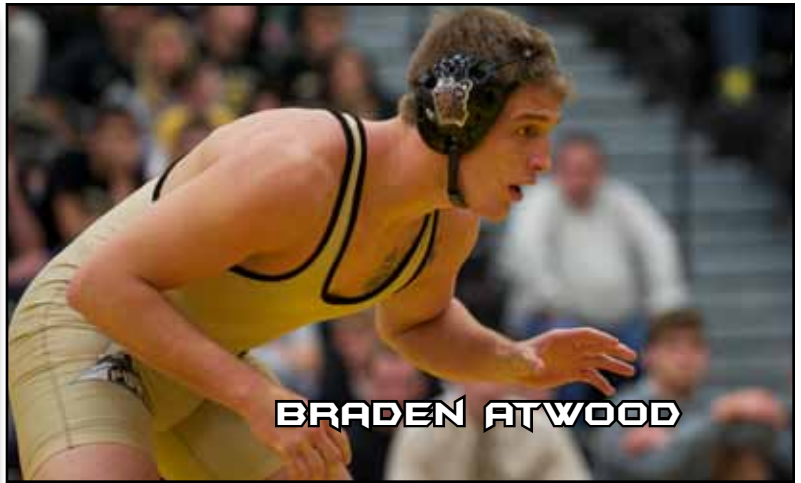

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

LAST TIME OUT...

The Boilermakers finished ninth with 51.5 points at the Big Ten Championships, hosted by Purdue in Mackey Arena. Seven Boilermakers earned a spot on the podium, led by sophomore Cashé Quiroga, who finished fifth at 133 pounds. It marked the second straight ninth-place effort for the Boilermakers; however they scored more points this season, placed more individuals and earned one more automatic NCAA qualifier.

BIG TEN BIDS

The Big Ten Championships was awarded 74 automatic bids to the 2012 NCAA Championships, set for March 15-17 in St. Louis. The number is the highest total for any conference in the short history of the new qualifier system and surpasses the 70 automatic spots given to the Big Ten in the previous system. The 285-pound weight class received the most bids, getting 10 spots in the national championship field.

AT-LARGE ADDITION

The Big Ten finished the selection process with 80 qualifiers for the national championships, earning six at-large bids on Wednesday. The 80 bids allocated to one conference are a record, and with the subtraction of Big Ten Newcomer Nebraska, the 72 bids match the total allocated in the old system. Purdue's Tommy Churchard was one of the six at-large qualifiers for the Big Ten, giving the Boilermakers at least one at-large qualifier in each of the last four years.

MORE THAN HALF

Purdue is one of 28 schools to qualify at least six wrestlers to the national championships this season, and one of 10 schools to do so from the Big Ten Conference. Seventy schools qualified at least one individual to this year's NCAA Championships.

A PAIR OF SEEDS

The Boilermakers have two nationally seeded individuals for the first time since 2006 as sophomore Cashé Quiroga was pegged the No. 9 seed at 133 pounds and junior Ivan Lopouchanski was tabbed the 12th seed at 149 pounds. The last pair to earn national consideration was Chris Fleeger and Ben Wissel as Fleeger was seeded fifth at 133 pounds and Wissel was the No. 3 seed at 184 pounds.

BACK UNDER THE ARCH

The NCAA Championships return to St. Louis for the first time since 2009, after wrestling in Omaha and Philadelphia the last two years. Purdue's last trip to the Gateway City was a good one as the team finished 23rd overall with 24.5 points and Jake Patacsil was an All-American, placing fifth at 149 pounds.

ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Thirty-nine Boilermakers have earned a total of 53 All-America awards in the history of the NCAA Wrestling Championships. Sophomore Cashé Quiroga looks to become the ninth two-time All-American in Purdue history, while the other five Purdue entries aim to be the 40th Boilermaker to earn a spot on the podium. Freshman Braden Atwood has a chance to become the sixth Purdue rookie to earn All-America honors, and senior A.J. Kissel has a chance to become the first 197-pound All-American in school history.

AMONG THE ELITE

The Boilermakers finished the 2012 dual schedule ranked 25th in the NWCA Coaches' Poll, marking the second straight season Purdue has earned a spot in the poll at the year's end. Purdue is one of nine Big Ten programs nationally ranked, including top-ranked Minnesota, four of the top-five and six of the top-10.

MAKING THEIR MARKS

Several Boilermakers have made new marks in the Purdue Career and Single-Season Record Books this season, including senior A.J. Kissel, junior Tommy Churchard and sophomore Cashé Quiroga. Kissel is tied for the career falls record with 47 heading into the weekend, and is 10th all-time with 34 reversals, while Churchard's 14 reversals this year are tied for 17th on the single-season record list. Quiroga's 83 takedowns this season give him 207 for his career, already good for 19th in school history.

SEASON NOTES

SUPPORTING OUR TROOPS

In the Boilermakers' home match against Illinois on Jan. 6, they welcomed U.S. Marine Corporal Matt Bowman as their honorary captain and donned camouflage singlets to support the U.S. Armed Forces. The Purdue faithful showed their support as well, participating in a silent auction for the singlets worn in the match and raising \$1700.00 for the national Semper Fi Fund, a nonprofit set up to provide immediate financial support for injured and critically ill members of the U.S. Armed Forces and their families.

THEY ALL FALL DOWN

With two falls this season and 47 for his career, A.J. Kissel has tied head coach Scott Hinkel for the all-time pin record at Purdue. Kissel's record-tying fall came over Central Michigan's Chad Friend at Cornell University on Feb. 12, as a part of the NWCA National Duals. Kissel already has the top-two single season totals in Purdue history, posting 19 falls in 2007-08 and 17 pins in 2008-09.

WELCOME BACK

The Boilermakers welcome redshirt sophomore Cashé Quiroga back to the lineup after taking a redshirt season in 2010-11. Quiroga became just the fifth freshman in school history to earn All-American honors, and just the third true freshman, taking sixth place at 125 pounds in 2010. Quiroga set a freshman record with 124 takedowns in 2009-10, good for the sixth-highest single-season total in school history.

IMPACT TRANSFER

UNC Greensboro transfer student Ivan Lopouchanski decided to call Purdue his new home after the Spartans dismissed their program after the 2010-11 season, and the Boilermakers welcome him with open arms. Hailing from Florida, by way of Russia, Lopouchanski was a two-time NCAA qualifier for UNC Greensboro, reaching the Round of 12 in 2011, and setting a school record with 41 wins last season.

WHERE DO WE CALL HOME?

Purdue likes to keep its Indiana talent close to home as 22 of the 33 wrestlers on the team hail from the Hoosier State. The other 11 wrestlers come from six states: Illinois, Ohio, Wisconsin, Florida, Texas and California.

STATE CHAMPS

Fifteen members of the Boilermakers' 2011-12 roster have high school state titles on their resumes, including 10 Indiana state champions. Senior Matt Fields, junior Tommy Churchard, sophomores Camden Eppert and Cashé Quiroga, redshirt freshmen Brandon Nelsen, Brock Norton and Frankie Porras and freshmen Drake Stein, Doug Welch and Chad Welch. Senior A.J. Kissel and sophomore Patrick Kissel were both state champions in Wisconsin, while freshmen Andy Hoselton and Danny Sabatello captured state titles in Illinois and junior Ivan Lopouchanski won a Florida state championship.

IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

The Boilermakers retain their family connections within the program in 2011-12 as brothers A.J. and Patrick Kissel remain on the squad, while twin brothers Doug and Chad Welch join the ranks. This marks the seventh straight season Purdue has had at least one set of brothers on the team.

BOILERMAKER FOR LIFE

Head coach Scott Hinkel has been a part of Purdue wrestling for all but three of the last 28 years, competing for the Old Gold and Black from 1984 to 1987, serving as a volunteer and graduate assistant in 1989 and 1990 and working as a full-time assistant from 1993 until he was named the 13th head coach in school history in 2007. He still holds several spots on the Boilermakers' all-time record lists, including the career record for falls (45) and ranking second all-time with 127 career victories. Hinkel's also one of just two wrestlers in school history to earn All-America and Academic All-Big Ten honors in the same season.

FUTURE BOILERMAKERS

Hinkel and his staff have inked three wrestlers to national letter's of intent for the Class of 2012: Kyle Ayersman, Devon Jackson and Tanner Lynde. All three won Indiana State titles in their final high school seasons, turning in undefeated seasons and completing outstanding careers. Ayersman projects at 125 or 133 pounds for the Boilermakers, while Jackson will likely wrestle at 149 pounds and Lynde at 174 or 184 pounds.

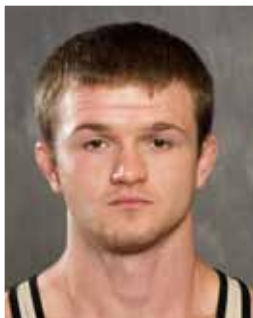

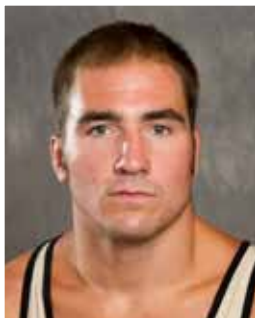
