## The Book on the Boilermakers

**At First Glance:** A Purdue squad (31-19, 13-7 Big Ten) featuring 12 returning players and seven newcomers will battle the Michigan Wolverines with the Big Ten title on the line. Eight position starters and three starting pitchers return from the 2011 squad which finished 30-18-2 and fifth in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers are coached by Kim Maher, who is her seventh year with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Boilermakers went 1-2 last week, dropping a Saturday doubleheader to Minnesota (5-3, 5-2), but rebounding with a 12-2 win on Sunday.

**Statistically Speaking:** The Boilermakers boast a .319 team batting average, including seven batters hitting at a .300 or better clip. Shortstop Molly Garst (.367), first baseman Ashley Courtney (.358) and outfielder Lindsey Rains (.356) and lead the way. Garst has scored a team-best 42 runs, tallied 14 doubles and stolen a team-leading 28 bases. Courtney has accounted for a 32 RBI, 13 doubles and three home runs. Rains has recorded 41 runs, 31 RBI, 24 stolen bases, four triples and three home runs. Outfielder Andie Varsho (.351), third baseman Tori Chiodo (.315), catcher Danielle Fletcher (.314) and pitcher/outfielder Erika Petruzzi (.303) also are batting over .300. Varsho has registered 35 runs, 30 RBI and 16 stolen bases, while Petruzzi has put up a team-best 33 RBI and added seven home runs. Fletcher also has launched seven home runs, while Chiodo, Garst and utility player Lauren Grant each have posted two long balls. All told, Purdue is averaging nearly six runs per game with 118 extra base hits and 96 steals.

Freshman Lexy Moore (20-10) leads the way in the circle, striking out 115 batters in 184 innings and posting a 3.27 ERA. Senior Katie Hackney (7-3) has issued 51 Ks in 70 innings. Freshman Alex Whittemore (3-4) has struck out 25 in 39 innings, while junior Erika Petruzzi (1-2) has struck out 10 in 25 innings.

## Series Information

**Michigan (Michigan leads the series 36-2):** The Wolverines won the first nine games in the series, which began on March 25, 1995. Purdue ended the streak with a 3-1 win in West Lafayette on April 7, 1997. Michigan took the next 17 games, including two extra-inning affairs, before the Boilermakers posted a 5-4 win in Ann Arbor on April 9, 2006. Michigan has won the last 10 games. Purdue is 1-23 at home vs. the Wolverines and 1-13 in Ann Arbor. The team have played three extra-inning games.

## What a Difference a Win Makes ...

If the Boilermakers top No. 22 Michigan on Friday...

- They will move to 32-19, matching the 2008 team's mark through 51 games, which accounted for the second most wins to the 1997 team's 33-18 mark in the 51-game span.
- They will move to 14-7 in Big Ten play, tying the 1997 team (14-12) for the most conference victories in program history.
- They will have defeated a ranked foe for the first time in 2012 in four tries (also #18 Oregon twice, #2 Cal). Purdue has topped eight ranked opponents under head coach Kim Maher.
- They will move to 36-42-1 all-time in the month of May, including a 3-3 mark on May 11.

## Big Ten Scenarios

The Big Ten title race is still very much up in the air. With a three-game sweep of Michigan and an Iowa loss to Minnesota, the Boilermakers could take the Big Ten title with a 16-7 record. If Iowa were to sweep its three games with Minnesota and Michigan were to lose two games to Purdue, the Hawkeyes could steal the title. In that case, Purdue would take third with a 15-8 mark.

In the grand scheme of things, spots 1-7 in the conference are still up for grabs. If Purdue wins at least one game against Michigan, the Boilermakers can finish no lower than fourth.

## The Kim Maher File

• Maher became the second coach in program history on July 14, 2005. She replaced Carol Bruggeman who coached the team from its inception in 1993 through the 2005 season.

• Maher, who spent six seasons as an assistant coach at California, has represented the United States in numerous international competitions, including the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta. She also played in the Women's Professional Softball League from 1997-2000.

• Maher inherited a program that posted a 380-304-3 record in its first 12 seasons.

## Musings About Michigan

**At First Glance:** The No. 22 Michigan Wolverines (36-15, 15-5 Big Ten) carry a four-game losing streak into their games with Purdue this weekend. The Gophers return eight letterwinners, including five starters and two pitchers from the 2011 team which posted a 31-24 mark and finished sixth in the Big Ten. Minnesota is coached by Jessica Allister, who is in her second year with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Gophers went 3-0 last week, topping Eastern Michigan 4-2 in a midweek contest and sweeping a Saturday doubleheader with Wisconsin 7-5, 5-1.

**Statistically Speaking:** Pitcher/designated player Sara Driesenga and first baseman Amanda Chidester lead the Wolverine bats. Driesenga is batting .370 with six home runs and 17 RBI in 29 games, while Chidester boasts a .364 average with 21 extra base hits, including eight home runs, a team-best 40 RBI and 32 runs. Outfielders Bree Evans (.316) and Nicole Sappingfield (.313) also are batting over .300. Evans has stolen a team-best six bases and scored 28 runs, while Sappingfield has added four steals and 24 runs. Catcher Lauren Sweet (.287), outfielder Lyndsay Doyle (.285) and second baseman Ashley Lane (.268) follow. Doyle has scored 30 runs and swiped six bases, while Lane has added launched 11 home runs and driven in 36 RBI. Sweeeyt has tallied 16 extra-base hits, including six home runs. As a team, Michigan is batting .286 with 43 home runs and 39 steals.

Freshman lefty Haylie Wagner (27-5) boasts a 1.55 ERA with 137 strikeouts, six shutouts and two saves in 203 innings. Driesenga (8-10) has struck out 61 batters in 119 innings with a shutout and three saves. Junior Stephanie Speierman (1-0) and senior lefty Hilary Payne also have seen time in the circle. The Wolverine staff has held opponents to a .224 average.

## Among The Nation's Statistical Leaders

The Boilermakers rank among the national top 50 in seven statistical categories, including the top 10 in two listings. The team is third in triples per game (0.36), 10th in stolen bases per game (1.92), 12th in batting average (.319), 16th in doubles per game (1.44), 22nd in scoring (5.56 runs per game), 30th in slugging percentage (.460) and 33rd in double plays per game (0.38).

Individually, sophomore outfielder Lindsey Rains ranks 25th in triples (4) and 39th in stolen bases per game (0.48). Senior shortstop Molly Garst ranks 25th in stolen bases per game (0.56) and 48th in doubles per game (0.28).

## Impacting The Record Books: Game

Sophomore catcher Danielle Fletcher snapped the 15-year old game record for walks with four in Game 2 against Penn State on March 31. The effort surpassed the old mark of three, which had been reached 19 times in program lore, including twice by junior infielder Ashley Courtney in 2012 (2/18 and 2/24). Fletcher also tied the game record for home runs with a pair against Ball State in Game 2 of the April 12, 2012, doubleheader, marking the 20th time a Boilermaker had achieved the feat. Fletcher entered the season top five for walks with her 30th free pass of the year on April 25 against Loyola.

Senior shortstop Molly Garst tied two game records at the Frost Classic, posting five hits against Troy and swiping three bases against Niagara. The five-hit tally matched Angi Roembke's 5-for-5 effort against Indiana in 2002. The steals tally tied the record which has been achieved 20 times in program history, including seven times by Garst.

Sophomore outfielder Lindsey Rains tied the record for steals in a game with three against South Alabama.

Junior pitcher/outfielder Erika Petruzzi tied the game record mark for home runs with two in Game 2 of the series with Indiana. The effort marked the 19th time a Boilermaker player had achieved the feat and the second time for Petruzzi, who also had a two-homer effort on Feb. 14, 2010 against North Dakota State. Fifteen different players have tallied two home runs in a game, including four that have done so multiple times.

The Boilermakers posted a record-tying 18 hits against Troy, matching the mark which has been achieved four times prior, last against IUPUI in 2011. Purdue posted a game-record tying three triples against Niagara, matching the output from the March 6, 1994, game vs. UNC-Wilmington. The Boilermakers have earned a record-tying nine walks twice in 2012: against UT-Martin on March 24 and on March 31 vs. Penn State. The nine-walk tallies match a mark achieved three previous times, once in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

### Impacting The Record Books: Season

In 2012, the Boilermakers have registered 18 triples, tying the program record for triples in season, which was set in 1994 and tied in 2010. The Boilermakers have drawn 172 walks, good for second-most all time. The 2012 squad also has racked up 72 doubles, second-most on the season list and just one away from the record of 73 set in 2007. The team has scored 278 runs, third most in school lore, and driven in 244 RBI, also good for third. Purdue has swiped 96 bases thus far in 2012, just three away from the 2011 team's fourth-place mark of 99.

Individually, catcher Danielle Fletcher has drawn 33 free passes, matching Jesse Jones' third place mark from 2003.

### Impacting The Record Books: Career

Senior shortstop Molly Garst took sole possession of the career runs scored record on April 28, when she scored her 141st in Game 2 of the doubleheader with Wisconsin. The tally topped the previous mark of 140 owned by Andrea Hillsey (2002-2005) and Tricia Lilley (2003-2006). The runs record, now 146, is the second career mark for Garst, who also has posted a record 130 stolen bases.

With 44 doubles, Garst is tied for second place on the career listing, matching Lilley's mark of 44. Garst has tallied 234 hits, tying Jenny Schoen's third place mark of 234 (1995-98). She also has registered 10 triples, matching the fourth-place mark, which has been achieved by four other players.

### Streaky

The Boilermakers have experienced a roller coaster ride in 2012. Purdue won its first 10 games, marking the best start in program history. The team lost nine of its next 14 games, including three to

ranked foes. After returning home from their spring break swing through California, the Boilermakers again hit the winning stride, winning their next eight contests, including seven at home. An April 5 loss to Notre Dame ended the string. Including that game, Purdue is 8-10 over the last 18 contests. The Boilermakers did manage a three-game win streak in the midst of the stretch.

The Purdue offense has experienced similar hot and cold streaks, although through all of the ups and downs, the team has avoided being shutout in 2012 (50 games). The Boilermakers piled up 10 or more hits in nine straight games during the opening 10-0 stretch. During the eight-game stretch midseason, Purdue tallied six or more hits per game, including eight or more in six of the wins. The team has managed three or more hits in all of its games, while posting 10 or more hits 16 times.

Sophomore Lindsey Rains put together a team-best 13-game hit streak from Feb. 25 to March 13 and also has put up streaks of five and six games. Junior Erika Petruzzi had hits in 10 straight games from March 31 to April 15 and also registered a six-game streak earlier in the year. Sophomores Danielle Fletcher and Andie Varsho have boasted nine game streaks. Fletcher's came Feb. 19 to March 2, while Varsho managed nine-game sets twice (Feb. 18-Feb. 26) and March 11 to March 24. Varsho ended an eight game stretch vs. Loyola (April 8-April 22).

Senior Molly Garst boasts the longest current streak at five games. Junior Ashley Courtney has reached base in seven straight games, the current team best. Fletcher reached base in a team-best 17 consecutive games, Feb. 18-March 11.

## Win #200

Head coach Kim Maher earned her 200th victory as leader of the Purdue program when the team posted an 8-6 victory over Cal State Fullerton, March 14. The Boilermakers have registered six-straight non-losing seasons under Maher, including two NCAA Tournament berths. Maher recorded her 100th win against Pacific on Feb. 8, 2009.

The team is 217-169-3 under Maher and is just three wins away from the 600th program victory.

## A Continuing Tradition

The Boilermakers have secured a .500 or better record for the 14th straight season and 17th in program lore. The team also has reached the 30-win milestone, which Purdue squads have reached in 14 of the 18 previous seasons, including 11 of the last 12.

## A Youth Revolution

Of the 19 members of the 2012 Purdue softball team, 14 are underclassmen. Seven sophomores and seven freshmen make up the group. Youth, however, does not spell inexperience for the Boilermakers, as all of the sophomores saw game action in 2011, including five in starting roles. Sophomores Andie Varsho, Lindsey Rains and Lauren Grant picked up raves for their rookie year, as Varsho was named first team All-Mideast Region and third team All-Big Ten, Rains was a first team All-Big Ten selection and Grant earned third team All-Big Ten honors.

Rookie pitchers Lexy Moore and Alex Whittemore got into the game at the season opening Lobo Classic, picking up all four wins for the Boilermakers. Moore struck out six batters in 10 innings, while picking up three wins, including a complete game effort against Northern Colorado. The St. Peters, Mo., native did not allow an earned run and finished off two games for victories. Whittemore struck out three in seven innings, while picking up the win in the opener against Bryant. Freshmen Gabi Brown, Ashley Burkhardt and Alyssa Koorsen also saw the field on opening weekend.

## Road Tested: A Tough Slate

In addition to logging more than 10,000 miles during the first five weeks of the season, the Boilermakers also will face tough foes in 2012, including four teams ranked in the preseason Top 25. Purdue will take on No. 16 Michigan three times, No. 11 Oregon twice and No. 3 California and No. 25 Notre Dame once. The Boilermakers also will experience a Big Ten season featuring three-game series for the first time since 1999. Due to the change in format, Purdue will face just eight of its 11 conference foes. Previously, the Big Ten slate featured two-game series with each conference member.

## 'Rain'-ing in Big Ten Player of the Week Honors

Sophomore outfielder Lindsey Rains was named Big Ten Player of the Week, Feb. 20, for her efforts at the Lobo Classic in Albuquerque, N.M. The Fullerton, Calif., native hit .556 to pace the Boilermakers as they got off to a perfect 4-0 start to the 2012 season.

Rains went 5-for-9 at the plate, while driving in five RBI, scoring five runs and tallying three stolen bases and a home run. The sophomore reached base in 10 of her 14 plate appearances, including three walks and two hit by pitches. She managed a .889 slugging percentage and a .714 on-base percentage. She reached base in all four of the team's games, including two multi-hit efforts.

In the season opener vs. Bryant, Rains went 1-for-1 with two walks, two runs and an RBI, while scoring the game winner. She picked up another run and RBI with a pair of hits against Northern Colorado. A walk and a hit by pitch put her on base against Central Arkansas. She capped the weekend with a 2-for-3 effort in the Lobo Classic finale against New Mexico, including a two-run home run

in the first inning and the game-tying RBI in the fourth. Defensively, she also made good on all four chances in the outfield.

This is the first Big Ten Player of the Week honor for Rains and the first for a Boilermaker player since Andie Varsho was so honored on March 14, 2011.

## Good Golly Miss Molly

Senior shortstop Molly Garst was named Big Ten Player of the Week, Feb. 27, after a monster weekend which included tying two school records and leading the Boilermakers to a 5-0 mark at the Frost Classic in Chattanooga.

Garst paced the Boilermaker hitters with a .667 average, while also tying the school records for hits in a game with a 5-for-5 effort against Troy and for steals with three against Niagara as Purdue moved to 9-0 on the year, its best start in school history. She reached base in 18 of her 23 plate appearances, including 12 hits, four walks and a hit by pitch for a .739 on-base percentage. The senior tallied four extra-base hits, including a triple and home run, slugging at a 1.056 clip. She scored 10 runs, including two or more in four games, while also driving in six RBI. On the base paths, Garst was a perfect 8-for-8 in steals, boosting her career record tally to 111.

The senior went 3-for-3 against Belmont, with two RBI and two runs scored. She reached base in all five plate appearances with two singles, a double, a walk and a hit by pitch. She drove in two RBI with the sixth-inning double, while scoring on her first two plate appearances. Against UT-Martin, Garst drew two walks, reached on an error and scored a run. The Webb City, Mo., native went 3-for-4 with three runs and an RBI against Niagara. She singled and scored, then added an RBI triple as Purdue batted around in the third inning. The senior then singled and scored in the fifth. Garst tallied a hit and a walk against Chattanooga. In the tournament finale against Troy, Garst tied Purdue's record mark with 5 hits, matching Angi Roembke's 5-for-5 effort from the April 14, 2002 game vs. Indiana. The effort included a game starting solo home run, two RBI singles, another single and a double. The senior scored the game-winning run in the contest as well.

## Lauds For Lexy

Freshman pitcher Lexy Moore was named Big Ten Co-Pitcher and Co-Freshman of the Week on April 2 for her efforts against Valparaiso and Penn State. The honors are the first of her career and the first by a Purdue pitcher or freshman this season.

Moore posted three of Purdue's four wins on the week, striking out 10 batters in 21 innings, moving to 15-2 on the season. She threw 10 straight shutout innings, including a complete-game two-hit shutout in the series finale with Penn State. The rookie posted a 1.33 ERA on the week, including a 0.50 ERA in conference games. The St. Peters, Mo., native started the week with a five strikeout effort in a win against Valparaiso. In Game 1 vs. Penn State, the rookie struck out three batters and allowed just one earned run. In the final game against Penn State, Moore allowed just two hits and sat down the final 14 batters in order.

In addition to the honors from the Big Ten Conference, Moore was announced as College Sports Madness's Player of the Week pick from the league.

Moore's conference honors mark the third and fourth for a Purdue player this season. The last Purdue pitcher of the Week selection was Suzie Rzegocki (2/28/11) and the last Boilermaker freshman honoree was Andie Varsho (4/18/11).

## She's Got CLASS

Senior shortstop Molly Garst was selected as one of just 30 candidates nationally for the 2012 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for softball, the corporation announced on Feb. 15.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition. An acronym for "Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School," the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Garst has had a highly decorated Purdue career, garnering All-Big Ten accolades each of her first two years, All-Mideast Region acclaim as a sophomore and three Big Ten Player of the Week awards, while rewriting the school's record books. The Webb City, Mo., native has played a variety of positions, starting in the outfield and third base as a freshman, at third again as a sophomore and at shortstop her junior season. Garst owns Purdue's career stolen bases record with 130 and runs record with 146, set the season steals record with 43 in 2010 and has tied the Purdue game record for stolen bases with three in seven contests. She also owns a share of the game record for runs with four on three occasions, and the home runs mark with two against IUPUI in 2011.

All told, she has batted .364 with 146 runs, 93 RBI and 130 steals. She has chipped in 17 game-winning runs and accounted for 10 game-winning RBI. She has piled up multiple hits in 65 games, and accounted for multiple RBI in 24 contests.

Garst, an organizational leadership and supervision major, also has excelled in the classroom, garnering Academic All-Big Ten acclaim twice and Academic All-District V selection in 2011.

## Giving Back

The Boilermaker softball team is committed to community service. Every fall, the team participates in a variety of activities. Thus far in 2011-12, the team has helped out at the Hanna Fest 2011 on Labor Day, raised funds for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society through the Light The Night Walk and sang Christmas carols to residents of the University Place retirement home.

At Hanna Fest, the Boilermakers helped sell concessions, distribute prizes and run the games, such as moon walk, bean bag toss, soda ring toss, an obstacle course and bingo. The team also stayed until the end of the event and assisted with the breakdown of all of the stations. The event, which featured children's games, a 3-on-3 basketball tournament, live entertainment and more, raised funds for the Hanna Community Center, a non-profit agency that provides programs and social services to the Hanna neighborhood and all residents of Tippecanoe County.

The Boilermakers participated in their second straight Light The Night Walk, with junior Ashley Courtney spearheading the fundraising efforts, and raised \$3,260 while paying tribute to and bringing hope to people battling cancer. The team participated in the event in memory of Ashley's father, Mike. Purdue softball has raised more than \$5,500 for LLS the past two seasons through the walk.

## Awards and Honors

Boilermaker players garnered one All-Mideast Region, three All-Big Ten, three Big Ten Player/Pitcher of the Week and five Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolades in 2011.

Freshman outfielder Andie Varsho was named as an NFCA first team All-Midwest Region selection. The Chili, Wis., native also garnered third team All-Big Ten acclaim and earned four Big Ten Freshman of the Week accolades and one Big Ten Player of the Week honor.

Rookie outfielder Lindsey Rains earned first team All-Big Ten acclaim, while freshman utility player Lauren Grant garnered third team honors.

Shortstop Molly Garst, pitcher Suzie Rzegocki and first baseman Kim McMillan earned Big Ten Player, Pitcher and Freshman of the Week honors respectively once during the season.

## In A Season

In 2011, the Boilermakers set school records for batting average (.313) and slugging percentage (.462), topping marks of .302 and .443 set by the 2003 squad. The 2011 team also ranked among the season top five in: on-base percentage (2nd with .371), runs (3rd with 250), triples (3rd with 14), home runs (3rd with 36), RBI (3rd with 226), stolen bases (4th with 99), total bases (4th with 622). In the circle, the Boilermakers managed spots among the top five in complete games (4th with 38) and ERA (5th with 2.29).

Individually, pitcher Suzie Rzegocki tied the school's season wins record (26) and ranked among the top five in complete games (2nd with 35), shutouts (2nd with 10), strikeouts (2nd with 200), innings pitched (3rd with 259.2), starts (3rd with 41) and appearances (5th with 45).

Outfielder Andie Varsho ranked second all-time in batting average (.427), tied for fifth in triples (5) and fifth in on-base percentage (.457) and stolen bases (34). Junior Molly Garst also posted a fifth-place tally of 34 steals in 2011.

## Stealing A Record

Molly Garst became Purdue's all-time leading base stealer on March 16, 2011, topping the previous mark of 85, set by Liane Horiuchi (2009-2010). Garst tallied two steals against Florida Gulf Coast pushing her career tally to 87. The Webb City, Mo., native has now swiped 130 bases as a Boilermaker, including a season record 43 in 2010 and a game-record three seven times.

The shortstop's first steal of 2011, which came against Bowling Green, moved her into a fourth-place tie with Ashley Hall (69 from 2005-2008), while five steals at the CenturyLink Classic pushed her into third place all-time. Four steals at the Coach B Classic gave her sole possession of second place.

## Big Numbers at the Plate

The Boilermaker bats produced big numbers in 2011. Purdue posted 10 or more hits in 17 of its contests, winning all but one. The Boilermakers racked up a season-best 18 hits against IUPUI on April 6, tying the Purdue game record. The team also recorded nine run-rule victories. Collectively, the Boilermakers batted .313 with 421 hits, including 115 for extra bases. Five players batted .300 or better, while one topped the .400 mark. The Boilermakers outscored opponents 250-165 en route to a 30-18-2 record.

## Senior Salute

The two Purdue seniors - Molly Garst and Katie Hackney - have collectively earned two All-Big Ten honors on the field and four Academic All-Big Ten honors in the classroom. They have beaten five Top 25 opponents during their careers, including wins over No. 4 UCLA and No. 10 Northwestern, while posting a 119-84-2 overall record. The pair was a part of Purdue's last NCAA Regional appearance in 2009, which saw the team advance to the regional championship game.



### **Molly Garst, Shortstop, Webb City, Mo.**

Molly has put her stamp on the Purdue offensive records book during her career. Purdue's career stolen base leader with 130 steals and counting, Garst became the Boilermakers' all-time leader in runs scored in Game 2 on April 28 when she recorded her 141st. She has since upped her total to 146 runs. The shortstop also owns the season steals record with 43 in 2010 and has tied the game record for stolen bases with three in seven contests. The two-time All-Big Ten honoree also owns a share of the game record for runs with four on three occasions and the home runs mark with two against IUPUI in 2011. All told, the Webb City, Mo., native has batted .364 with 146 runs, 93 RBI and 130 steals. She ranks among the Purdue top five in career batting average, on-base percentage, steals, runs, hits, doubles and triples. A three-time Big Ten Player of the Week honoree, Garst has chipped in 17 game-winning runs and accounted for 10 game-winning RBI. She has piled up multiple hits in 65 games and accounted for multiple RBI in 24 contests.

A two-time Academic All-Big Ten and Academic All-District V selection in 2011, Molly was one of 30 players in the nation selected as a Lowe's Senior CLASS Award candidate this year. The 2010 All-Mideast Region selection has played in 205 games, starting 199 at shortstop, third base, designated player and in the outfield. An organizational leadership and supervision major, Molly will graduate in May.



### **Katie Hackney, Pitcher, Huntington, Ind.**

Katie has been example of hard work and dedication on and off the field for the past four years. The two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree has filled a variety of roles, making 36 appearances in the circle, while also batting in 20 games. She pitched in just one game as a rookie, but picked up an RBI and a run at the plate. As a sophomore, Hackney saw action in 11 games, starting two as the designated player. She posted two hits, an RBI and a run at the plate, while throwing 4.1 innings and striking out three batters in relief pitching efforts. In 2011, the Huntington, Ind., native, played in 13 games, starting three, two at pitcher and one as the designated player. She tossed a complete-game victory against IUPUI and struck out 29 batters in 35 innings with a 1.37 ERA. Hackney has made 21 appearances in the circle as a senior, posting a 7-3 record including 51 strikeouts in 70 innings of work. She has tossed three complete-games, including a shutout. An organizational leadership and supervision major, Katie will graduate in May.
