No SUMMER VACATION

With the end of spring practice and the conclusion of the 2008-09 academic year, the Rice Owls football team and coaching staff will take just a short break before resuming preparations for the 2009 season. Most of the squad will be back on campus the first week of June for the start of summer school as well as to begin summer conditioning workouts.

KEY DATES

Following the completion of summer school, the Owls are slated to report on Aug. 7. They will hold their annual Media Day on Saturday, Aug. 8 and take the field later that same day for their first official workout, leading up to the 2009 opener at UAB on Sept. 5.

NEW FACES

Rice head coach **David Bailiff** was faced with the need to replace three members of his offensive coaching staff in the weeks following the Owls victory in the Texas Bowl and he added three veterans who have over 75 years of experience at the collegiate and professional levels.

Ed Zaunbrecher was brought in as the Owls' new Offensive Coordinator, **Larry Edmondson** was hired to coach Rice's receiving corps and **Ronnie Vinklarek** joined the staff as the new offensive line coach.

OPENING AWAY

After opening at home for three consecutive seasons, the Owls will not play their first home game in 2009 until the fourth game of the year. Rice opens with a Conference USA game (third time in the last four seasons) at UAB and follows that game with trips to Texas Tech (Sept. 12) and Oklahoma State (Sept. 19) before playing host to Vanderbilt on Sept. 26. Due to Hurricane Rita, which caused the postponement of the Navy game, the Owls opened the 2005 season with four consecutive road games.

SCHEDULE NOTES

Rice will face seven teams which earned berths to bowls in 2008, including all four of its non-conference opponents. The Owls open on the road for the first time since kicking off the 2005 season at UCLA and will open with a road conference game for the first time since 1989 when they opened on the road at SMU.

For the first time since 2003, Rice and Texas are not scheduled. The series takes a one-year break, then resumes again in 2010.

Rice will make its first appearance in Lubbock in 1995 and will make its first trip to Stillwater, Okla., since 1922 when the Owls lost 21-0. Rice will host Vanderbilt at Rice Stadium for the first time since 1975. For the first time since 2005, the Owls will not close out the season by playing their final two games at home, as Rice closes out the regular season at Houston on Nov. 28.

David Bailiff Post-Spring Evaluation

Overall

I really feel good about this football team. Going into spring we knew we had a great deal of experience returning on defense and I think they played that way during the spring and continue to improve. You could tell that they have had enough repetitions that they are able to react and play fast. We played very fast and aggressive defense all spring. I think that experience and the depth we are now building will also translate into improved play on special teams next year.

Players can only play fast when they are confident in what they are doing and I think we have that confidence on defense.

That was the one thing coming out of spring was that we still have not determined what the offensive personality of this team will be. I thought we had some individuals who played extremely well. **Toren Dixon** and **Corbin Smiter** both had great springs, as I would have expected from a couple of veterans.

This team is going to have to develop its personality. Last year, third and short for us was not really a rushing down. We would throw a quick ball to Jarett (Dillard). We don't yet know what kind of personality this team will have.

Leadership will emerge. By the end of the spring, you could see players who had not stepped forward in the past making attempts to do so. But, as we have seen over the past three years, leadership does not have to come from the senior class. Chase (Clement), Jarett and Brian (Raines) were three-year captains. Andrew Sendejo has been a two-year captain. The opportunity is there for leaders to step up.

The fact that we will start two-a-days with 99 players tells you the progress this program is making. We barely had 50 players for that first spring in 2007. We're growing the numbers every year.

Quarterback

The quarterback battle is still three guys vying for one spot. **John Thomas Shepherd** had a head start because he has run the offense while **Nick Fanuzzi** and **Ryan Lewis** spent all their time last fall running scout team for us. They're still learning our plays and our procedures.

All three are talented, we just need one to separate from the pack. During the course of the spring, that didn't happen. One would have what you would think was a breakout scrimmage or practice and then complete 30 percent of his passes the next practice. We're still looking for somebody there that is going to play consistent. We understand they are not going to be Chase, and they are going to have to utilize all the other guys in the offense to make it work.

There's talent there and no one eliminated themselves, so that is a good thing. You would hope that 10 days into fall camp, we'll have our starting quarterback identified and he can then get the majority of the reps as we get ready for the first game. The good thing is having **Ed Zaunbrecher** as their coach. He's been doing this for 30 years, and every step those guys made, every decision, every pass is charted and we'll have a great deal of information when it comes time to make a decision.

One thing that was different this spring is that Ed had them each call their own plays in practice when we went to a 2-minute drill. I thought it was great to do that, since it made each of the quarterbacks a better student of the game. It forced them to think about where we were on the field, what kind of routes we needed to run. I had never seen that before, but I really liked it. It created more mistakes, but it also forces them to be better players.

We look at the end results, and this gave them a chance to work under game conditions and a hectic pace. It's all about getting our quarterback ready for UAB.

Running Back

Tyler Smith had a great spring. Through hard work and his commitment to the game, he overcame a catastrophic knee injury to become our most productive running back by the end of spring. He knew what he was doing, he carried his pads well, he fought for extra yardage but also had tremendous ball security. He has great hands coming out of the backfield, and has a burst that we were missing at times last year. It was good to see that big smile on his face, because he knew he was back and now has a lot of confidence in the spring.

Jeremy Goodson had a good spring, and is someone else who has made the long comeback from an injury and looks ready for an expanded role. **Marcus Knox** worked hard this spring and I will be excited to see **Charles Ross** enter the mix in August.

Justin Hill will move to linebacker, but we also will continue to use him in short yardage situations on offense. Tragically this spring he was hurt, so he really never got a chance to get reps at running back, nor could we start the move to linebacker.

Wide Receiver

We have a skilled group of receivers. As I mentioned, Dixon and Smiter had great springs. **Taylor Wardlow** really showed that he has matured as a player this spring. He realizes this is his last year and is putting all the effort he can into it. **Patrick Randolph** is someone who has great speed and just needs to stay healthy to get a chance to showcase what he can do.

You look at the production we have returning and a lot of folks would be excited about them. Toren caught 50 balls last year, Corbin had 30. We just had two amazing performers at the stop of the stats, but we have some experienced and productive options in the lineup.

Offensive Line

We have one junior and four sophomores who are set to start on the offensive line. They are athletic and talented. They just need more game experience. **Scott Mitchell** and **Jake Hicks** have the most starting experience, but **Tyler Parish** played extensively in every game in addition to making three starts.

Davon Allen and **Keshawn Carington** have no real game reps going into the fall. Davon is a very dominant and strong player. When you look at who backs them up, you have a combination of a hard-working senior in **Travis Mason** and several younger players who benefited from being able to red-shirt and are getting better all the time.

Defensive Line

I felt pretty good about the progress that **John Gioffre** and **Brian Stacy** made in the spring. They saw that it was their opportunity and they made great progress. **Michael Smith** is right on track to be ready for fall camp after his knee surgery. He played very well when he got his chance last fall. **Chance Talbert** really improved every week last fall and he will be ready to go for the start of camp.

I think we have one of the best sets of defensive ends in the country. **Scott Solomon** plays with such incredible intensity that we had to keep the leash on him during the spring. **Cheta Ozougwu** is a tremendously athletic player. **Arnaud Gascon-Nadon** stepped right in and played with a great motor. **Kramer Lucio** was finally healthy this spring. He is someone who always has had great production when he's been able to get on the field.

Linebacker

Tanner Shuck really made a strong move at the end of spring practice. In his last four practices, he looked like a natural at the position. When you are a defensive end all through high school and all the sudden you are thrown into a new position, it takes some time. At the end of the spring, he looked like he really understood his responsibilities and played at a much faster pace. He has great speed, but until now, that speed

was nullified by his indecision.

I think **Terrance Garmon** has the potential to be an all conference performer. He was able to stay healthy most of the fall and in the spring and his production shows it.

Safety

We have great talent and depth at the safeties. At strong safety, you have **Chris Jones** starting, backed up by **Max Aniyam** and **Willie Garley**. You have **Andrew Sendejo** at free safety with **Xavier Webb** backing him up. **Travis Bradshaw** is at the weak safety (KAT) and he obviously came up big last year when he got a chance to play regularly.

This is a group of people who will hit you.

Cornerback

We'll be young at corner, but we think we have some exciting talent. **Jarrett Ben** was probably the MVP of the spring because of his improvement. He gained some confidence in his responsibilities and all of a sudden you saw the 10.3 speed flying around down field. If you are in high school and all you play is Cover Three and you get to college with all the different assignments, it's a lot to handle.

Chris Jammer competes on every snap and will be in his second year of starting.

I knew both those young corners were going to be okay when I would see them last fall fighting to get the spot in line so they could cover a Jarett Dillard or a James Casey. They wanted that challenge.

Just because of our numbers, we'll see some of the incoming freshmen corners on the field this fall. But the forgotten guy right now is **Joseph Leary**. Joe is a great player, and if we can get his leg healthy, that will give us three very talented corners.

Special Teams

Clark Fangmeier had surgery after the bowl game, but has been cleared to start kicking. People didn't realize it at the time, but part of our offensive personality last year was dictated because Clark was hurt and we did not have an option to try any long field goals. If it

was a manageable fourth down, we just went for it. But he is an incredibly accurate kicker and is someone we will rely on heavily.

Chris Boswell is someone we think will come in and give us a real weapon on kickoffs. **Kyle Martens** really improved as the year went on, but even if he had an off day, he never put us in a total bind with his punts.

Our options in terms of the return game are wide open right now. We'll be taking a look at a number of folks during camp, but I think we have some exciting options.

As I said at the start, I feel good about this football team and the direction of this program. We're counting down the days until the freshmen will get here for summer school and can't wait until we have a chance to get them all on the field in August.

Jess Neely was honored three times in his legendary tenure on South Main (1949, 1953 and 1957), while Todd Graham was selected by the media as their C-USA Coach of the year in 2006.

HOT AT HOME

The Owls concluded 2008 by winning six straight at Rice Stadium for the first time since they won seven straight over the course of the 2000 and 2001 seasons. The Owls were unbeaten at home in a season for the first time since 2001 when they were

5-0, and were 6-0 at home for the first time since 1949.

CANADIAN CONNECTION

When the Owls open camp in August, there will be six members of the team whom are products of the Canadian high school football circuit.

Junior Scott Mitchell joined the program in 2007 and has started the last 18 games at left tackle. He was joined on the field in 2008 by defensive end Arnaud Gascon-Nadon, who duplicated Mitchell's 2007 effort by earning All C-USA Freshman honors.

Two other Canadians (offensive lineman Stefan Nazar and tight end Luke Willson) redshirted last fall. They will be joined this year by two members of the 2009 recruiting class (Tolu Akinwumi and Hosam Shahin)

IN THE CLASSROOM

In April of 2009, seven of Rice's 16 teams received the NCAA's Public Recognition Award for having an Academic Progress Rate (APR) in the top 10 percent for their sport. This is the third-highest percentage for any school in the Bowl Subdivision in football. (The APR is a term-by-term measure of eligibility, retention and graduation for student-athletes).
