### No. 99

The Rice Owls begin their 99<sup>TH</sup> season of football with Saturday's opener against Texas in Reliant Stadium. The Owls hold a 428-548-32 overall record in 98 seasons of football.

Saturday's game marks the third time the two schools have met in Reliant, with Texas winning 48-7 in 2003 and 52-7 in 2006. It will be the first time the two schools have met in a season opener since 1981 when Texas took a 31-3 victory in Austin.

### Under the Sliding Big Top

Rice will be playing its seventh game in Reliant Stadium, with the Owls having split the previous six contests. Saturday's game also marks the second time in school history the Owls have opened their season at the home of the Houston Texans.

Rice captured the Bayou Bucket in 2004, defeating Houston 10-7 on Sept. 5, 2004. The Owls made their Reliant Stadium debut on Oct. 5, 2002 when they defeated Louisiana Tech, 37-20.

In their most recent appearance in Reliant Stadium, the Owls defeated Western Michigan on Dec. 30, 2008 to win the Texas Bowl. The victory marked Rice University's first bowl win since 1954.

### Reliant Crowds

Rice University's largest attendance figure in Reliant Stadium came in the Owls' last appearance in the venue. The 2008 Texas Bowl drew a Rice-partisan 58,880.

## Verses the Horns

Saturday's meeting is the 91<sup>st</sup> between Rice and Texas in a series which began in 1914. Texas holds a 69-21-1 overall lead in the series, including a 28-13-1 mark in games played in Houston.

Rice University's last win in the series came in front of a national-television audience on a rainy Sunday night in 1994 as the Owls held on for a 19-14 victory. The win snapped a 28-game winning streak by the Horns which began the year after Rice's last victory in Austin, a 20-17 win in 1965.

In the first 14 games of the series, the winning team posted a shutout 10 times (Texas 8, Rice 2), but since the Owls posted their last shutout of Texas (7-0 at Rice Stadium in 1960), there have only been two shutouts by the Longhorns, and none since a 34-0 Texas win at Rice Stadium in 1978.

The Owls' top point total in the series came in Austin in 1993 when they scored 38 points in a 55-38 Texas win.

## Lone Star State of Mind

Rice will open the season by playing seven games before the Owls ever cross the Texas border.

After the opener against Texas, Rice travels to Denton to take on North Texas next Saturday. The Owls' Rice Stadium opener against Northwestern on Sept. 18 begins a three-game home stand which includes a couple in-state rivals, Baylor and SMU.

The Owls are on the road at UTEP on Oct. 9 before playing host to crosstown rival Houston on Oct. 16. Rice finally journeys out of state, taking on UCF in Orlando, Fla. on Oct. 23.

## Tubin' It

The Owls are currently scheduled for six television appearances, including five national broadcast appearances in 2010.

Four of the five national telecasts will originate in Houston. Saturday's game against Texas will be broadcasted by ESPN.

The Baylor is set for CBS College Sports, while

Comcast Sports Southwest is set to broadcast the Owls' homecoming battle with Houston, the team's road contest at UCF and a late November home game against East Carolina.

The Owls' road game against Tulane will be shown in New Orleans on a delayed basis.

## What's Your College?

Answering the question "What's your college?" starts as soon as a new Rice student walks through the sallyport of iconic Lovett Hall the first night of O-Week (new student orientation).

One of the unique aspects of Rice University is the residential college system. Students often cite the college system as one of the best, most rewarding things about Rice.

All students are randomly assigned to one of 11 self-governing residential colleges. More than just a residence hall, Rice's colleges are students' primary place for dining, studying and socializing.

Each member of the Owl football team displays the pride and traditions instilled in being a part of a college by wearing a sticker with his university's college on their football helmet.

The Owls' football team has representation in all 11 colleges including the school's two newest colleges which opened in time for the 2009-10 academic year - Duncan College and McMurtry College.

## New Look to the Staff

David Bailiff retooled his coaching staff during the winter and his revamped staff made an immediate impact during spring practice.

David Beaty has taken over as the offensive coordinator, returning to Rice after two seasons as the wide receivers coach at Kansas. He is joined on the offensive staff by John Reagan, who will serve as running game coordinator, in addition to coaching the Owls' offensive tackles and tight ends.

Rick LaFavers has shifted from coaching tight ends as well as serving as the team's special teams

## Radio Coverage

ESPN 97.5 FM (KFNC) has been the home of Rice football and men's basketball since the 2007-08 season. This spring a new contract extended the relationship between Rice and ESPN 97.5 through the next two years. Rice will celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> season of football in 2011.

David Saltzman begins his fourth season as a member of the Rice broadcast team and the third calling the play-by-play for Rice football. Nate Griffin is in his third year as the broadcasts' analyst. Jorge Vargas returned to the broadcast team in 2009 and provides an onfield perspective as sideline reporter.

ESPN 97.5 and Rice Sports Properties also announced during preseason drills that Rice football coach David Bailiff will appear on a weekly, one-hour radio show on the station. The David Bailiff Show airs each Monday during the season from 7:30-8:30 p.m. Saltzman serves as host of the show with Bailiff, recapping the previous week's game and breaking down the upcoming opponent. The show also includes special features and Q & A from Rice fans. The show originates from the Mezzanine Lounge located at Southwest Expressway and Greenbriar in Houston.

## Owls on Fox Sports Houston

"Owls Insider" airs weekly prior to Rice regular-season games in HD on Fox Sports Houston. The show airs at 5 p.m. Thursday and 1:30 p.m. Central on Fox Sports Houston. It is also available on FSN Southwest as Comcast Sports CSS.

Fox Sports Houston will send a production crew on the road with the Owls to capture highlights and postgame reactions. Weekly segments will feature head coach David Bailiff reviewing each week's previous game as well as a look at the upcoming opponent, weekly highlight packages, player interviews and features, as well as an expansion of Rice's "Tomorrow's Leaders" series that has been a staple on RiceOwls.com the past four years.

**Preseason Honors**

Offensive tackle **Scott Mitchell** and defensive lineman **Scott Solomon** lead the way in terms of earning preseason recognition.

Mitchell was named to the 2010 Rotary Lombardi Award Watch list at the end of August, while both were named to the All C-USA team in voting by the league's 12 head coaches.

The tandem were joined by nine Owls who appeared on *Phil Steele's College Football Preview's* preseason honors' list. Both were tabbed as first team selections, while **Travis Bradshaw**, **Cheta Ozougwu**, **Kyle Martens** and **Sam McGuffie** were second-team

picks. **Davon Allen** was named to the third team, while **Jake Hicks** and **Charles Ross** were named to the fourth team.

Solomon and Bradshaw were also named to *Dave Campbell's Texas Football's* Preseason All-Texas College first team, while Mitchell, Ozougwu and Martens were all named to the second team.

**Plenty of Hits**

Running back **Sam McGuffie** may have been out of action the past year after transferring from Michigan, but that didn't stop the sophomore from Cy Fair from being the most popular Owl on the web.

In a one-year period from July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010, McGuffie's bio was the most viewed athlete page on RiceOwls.com.

**The Anglers**

Rice quarterback **Taylor McHargue** and linebacker **Trey Briggs** might face off against each other in practice each day, but the pair have teamed up in the offseason to compete in the growing world of collegiate fishing tournaments.

The pair competed in June at the National Guard College Fishing Texas Division Tournament on Toledo Bend Lake and earned a spot in the national tournament this fall. However, their football duties will prevent them from competing.

The pair caught four bass during the tournament for a total of eight pounds, finishing seventh in the event. With two teams who placed ahead of them previously qualifying for nationals, the pair of Owls were bumped into fifth and final qualifying spot.

**Youth Movement**

Rice concluded the 2009 season with 14 starters who were either freshmen or sophomores. The Owls listed 27 players who were redshirt sophomores or younger among the 44 players on its final two-deep chart of the season.

That total matched Western Kentucky for the fifth youngest two-deep in the country. Texas A&M led the way with 31, followed by Missouri (30), Akron (29) and SMU (28).

Rice started more true freshmen (five) than seniors (four) vs. SMU. The Owls listed just one senior on the defensive two-deep for the SMU game compared to seven freshmen (six true freshmen) and seven sophomores.

Six true freshmen made starts for Rice during the 2009 season. The Owls had 25 starts this season by true freshmen, 23 of them on defense (nine by **Alex Lowry**, five by **Phillip Gaines**, four by **Trey Briggs** and **Kevin Gaddis**, one by **Cody Bauer**). **Charles Ross** (two) had the lone starts by a true freshman on offense.

**Injury Bug**

Based on the projected lineup heading into the 2009 season, as well as on players who later stepped into the starting lineup, Rice lost a total of 75 starts to injuries.

The Owls' linebacking corps took the biggest hit. Seniors **Terrance Garmon** and **Robert Calhoun** entered the year as the starters, but Calhoun was lost for the year after an injury in the opener. Garmon went on to start 10 of 12 games (missing two because of injury), but started with five different partners (Calhoun, **Tanner Shuck**, **Matt Nordstrom**, **Justin Hill** and **Trey Briggs**) due to either injury or illness.

Rice's defense was able to start the same lineup in consecutive games once during the 2009 season (Vanderbilt and Tulsa).

**Gamers**

Deep snapper **Brandon Long** (37) enters the 2010 season as the Owls' leader in games played, followed by **Chris Jones** (36). **Scott Solomon**, **Taylor Dupree**, **Cheta Ozougwu**, **Willie Garley**, **Scott Mitchell**, **Justin Hill** and **Patrick Randolph** all en-

ter the 2010 season having played in 30 or more games.

**Walk On In**

**Travis Bradshaw**, who originally came to Rice as a walk-on in 2007 last year led the national in unassisted tackles. He is one of three walk-ons listed on the two-deep at the start of the 2010 season.

**Brandon Yelovich** is back to handle kickoff duties for a third consecutive season. **Martin Uwah** is looking for his first playing time at corner.

### Solomon's Losses Climb

**Scott Solomon** entered the 2010 season as the eighth Owl to top 30 career tackles for loss. He had at least one tackle for loss in six of seven conference games last year and in nine of his last 10 C-USA games dating back to 2008.

Solomon became the sixth Rice player since 1989, and the first since **Jeff Vanover** in 2002, to record three sacks in a game with his effort against Tulsa. It was Solomon's first career game with multiple sacks and he added a career-high 11 tackles in the contest.

Solomon became the first Rice defensive lineman to reach double-figures in tackles in a game since **John Syptak** was credited with 11 vs. Houston in 2005.

### Bookends

**Scott Solomon** (63) and **Cheta Ozougwu** (61) led all Conference USA linemen in tackles in 2009.

The tandem combined for 124 tackles, 21 tackles for lost yardage and 11 quarterback sacks. Their combined total was the most by a Rice defensive line duo since **John Syptak** (81) and **Jeremy Calahan** (49) combined for 130 in 2004.

## David Bailiff

- David Bailiff enters his fourth season at Rice, leading a program that has achieved success on the field, in the classroom, in the community, and on the recruiting trail.
- In his first three seasons, has led the Owls to their first bowl title in over 50 years while also improving the team's cumulative grade point average each year. The Owls have led Conference USA football teams in GPA in each of their five seasons in the conference and continue to rank among the nation's best in terms of graduation rates.
- Bailiff's staff has made the state of Texas a priority in recruiting, solidifying relationships with high school coaches throughout the state. This past spring, their entire 16-man recruiting class came from Texas.
- Has also made good on his promise to keep the Owls active in community work, as the Owls have been tireless in their efforts with local schools and hosting a series of free clinics. In July of 2009, Bailiff accepted an invitation to join with four other college football coaches on a goodwill tour to visit military personnel stationed in Afghanistan.
- In 2008, the Owls endured a series of challenges as well as the aftermath of Hurricane Ike and produced the first 10-win season for Rice since 1949 and the Owls' first victory in a bowl game since their memorable win over Alabama in the 1954 Cotton Bowl. For his efforts, Bailiff was honored by his conference peers as the 2008 Conference USA Coach of the Year.
- Bailiff came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference championship and the semifinals of the NCAA Division 1-AA playoffs in 2005.

### Career Year For Cheta

**Cheta Ozougwu** reached career highs in tackles (61), tackles for loss (10.5) and sacks (4.5) in 2009. Over his last six games, he racked up 39 of his 61 tackles, along with eight tackles for loss and four sacks.

### Running Buddies

**Tyler Smith** and **Charles Ross** each topped 100 yards rushing in the Houston game, marking the first time the Owls had produced multiple rushers over the century mark since 2005. Smith closed with back-to-back, 100-yard games, the first Owl to do so since his brother Quinton accomplished the feat in 2006.

### Experienced Front

Rice returns every offensive lineman who earned a start in 2009 and is tied for 22<sup>nd</sup> in the nation with a total of 90 career starts among the linemen.

Three of the Owls' five starters on the offensive line received all-conference recognition by the league's coaches at the conclusion of the season and Rice returns every lineman who earned a start last year for the 2010 campaign.

**Scott Mitchell** earned second-team All C-USA honors, while guards **Davon Allen** and **Jake Hicks** earned honorable mention recognition.

### Defense Shut Out

After scoring five defensive touchdowns in 2008, Rice defenders were held out of the end zone for the first time since 1998. Rice did not return at least one turnover for a score for the first time since 1999 (**Dan Dawson** returned a fumble 100 yards for a score that season).

### Nick on Target

**Nick Fanuzzi** finished the season completing 60 percent of his passes (162 of 270), becoming the second Rice quarterback to top 60 percent for a season.

**Chase Clement** set the school mark a year earlier (2008) by completing 66.5 percent of his passes.

Fanuzzi connected on a season-high 69 percent of his pass attempts against SMU (29-of-42). He also moved onto the Rice season charts with his 162 completions (fifth) and 11 touchdown passes (tied for eighth).

## Against the Run

Rice held opposing runners to a 4.7 average per carry, the lowest season mark by an Owl defense since 2004. The '04 squad held opposing ball carriers to a 4.2 average.

## Turner Returning

Shane Turner posted the top two single-game kickoff return totals in school history in 2009, and just missed the Rice season record despite missing five games because of injuries.

Turner set the Rice single-game mark when he totalled 200 yards on six returns at UAB and then registered the second-best mark with 196 kickoff return yards against Navy.

After missing five games because of injury and illness, he returned to the field against Houston and finished with 139 yards to finish the season with 881 yards, four yards shy of the school record set the previous season by Ja'Corey Shepherd.

## Special Teams Looks to End Skid

Rice University's special teams will look to end the two longest streaks in the country in terms of kick returns without a touchdown.

The Owls have not returned a kickoff for a touchdown since Antonio Brinkley took one back 90 yards vs. Baylor on Nov. 17, 1984 (284 games).

Rice also has the longest active streak in the country without a punt return for a score. The Owls have not returned a punt for a score since LaDoughyous McCalla took one 84 yards for a score against TCU on Nov. 8, 1997 (140 games).

## Closing with a Rush

Rice is 13-5 in games after the first of November since 2006.

The Owls were 4-1 that year, 2-2 in 2007, 5-0 in 2008 and 2-2 in 2009.

## C-USA Six Pack

Rice is 19-21 (.475) overall in five seasons of Conference USA play, including 12-12 (.500) in three seasons under head coach David Bailiff.

The Owls are 11-9 all-time in conference action at home and 8-12 on the road in conference play.

Rice has the sixth-most wins in conference action over the course of its five years as a member of C-USA. Below is the won-lost record for the league's membership since 2005:

## Down to the Wire

The Owls have seen most of their 18 conference wins over the past four years come down to the final play.

Rice has won four times on their last offensive play of the game (UAB, Tulsa and ECU in 2006 and

SMU in 2007), once on a interception return with 11 seconds remaining (Memphis 2008) and once by eating up the final 7:30 of the clock to preserve a seven point lead (UTEP 2006).

In eight other games, Rice took the lead for good in the final 4:00 (SMU in 2006 and UTEP in 2007), needed a fumble recovery with 1:08 left to seal a win (at Southern Miss in 2007), and has twice had to recover an onside kick attempt late in the game (Southern Miss and UTEP both in 2008).

Additionally in 2009, Rice recovered a pair of fumbles in the last five minutes to hold on to a one point lead (UTEP) and scored a touchdown with 54 seconds to play to gain some breathing room in a victory over Tulane.

## No Blankings

Rice has not been shutout in a game since a 37-0 loss at TCU in 2000, a span of 110 games.

Current Rice tight ends and special teams coach Rick LaFavers was a defensive graduate assistant for TCU that season. Rice has not shutout an opponent since blanking UNLV 38-0 to open the 1995 season (172 games).

## Rice Stadium

The Owls closed the 60<sup>th</sup> season of competition at Rice Stadium by winning their final two home contests to raise their all-time mark to 150-177-7.

One of the few existing on-campus facilities to host a Super Bowl, the historic stadium debuted a new FieldTurf Duraspine system in 2008. It is the same playing surface used at the home stadiums of the New England Patriots, Ohio State Buckeyes and West Virginia Mountaineers among others.

## Coming Home

In the last two years, the Owls have seen four high-profile, Texas high school products who signed with BCS conferences make the decision to return home and transfer to Rice.

Quarterback Nick Fanuzzi transferred from Alabama prior to the start of classes in late August of 2008, followed by running back Sam McGuffie (Michigan) in January of 2009 and quarterback Taylor Cook (Miami) in August of 2009. Linebacker Kyle Prater (LSU) transferred to Rice this past summer.

Additionally, linebacker Justin Allen, who was a two-year starter at Idaho, made the decision to return home to Texas after the 2008 season and is also eligible to see action this fall.

## Sneak Peak

Rice football fans were treated to a pair of stand-out efforts by groups of the Owls' incoming freshman class during a pair of televised high school all-star games over the summer.

Wide receiver Andy Erickson earned Offensive MVP honors at the Texas High School Coaches Association All-Star Game played in the Alamodome in San Antonio. Erickson returned both a punt and kick-off for touchdowns, caught a touchdown pass and on defense intercepted a pass during the game.

Future Owl teammate Bryce Callahan also had an interception THSCA All-Star Game.

At the Bayou Classic in late June, freshman linebacker Cameron Nwosu was credited with 10 tackles, a force fumble and a fumble recovery.

## Cheta's Community Involvement

Rice defensive end Cheta Ozougwu has been selected a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award as well as the 2010 Allstate American Football Coaches Association's Good Works Team.

Ozougwu is one of 30 NCAA Football Bowl Sub-division student-athletes who have excelled both on and off the field to be selected as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible, a student-athlete must be considered a senior and have notable achievement in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

Throughout his career, Ozougwu has highly involved on campus and in the community.

This summer, he volunteered as a mentor at the Krause Children Center in Katy, a foster center that specializes in treating abused, neglected and troubled youths ages 11-17. In addition to mentoring the youths at the center, he also organized a group of volunteers to do repairs and landscaping at the center.

## In the Classroom

Rice was one six FBS schools to be honored by the NCAA with a Public Recognition Award for posted a graduation rate that ranked in the top 10 percent among all football programs based on their APR tracking system.

For the fifth consecutive year (in the five years of Rice's membership in the conference), the Owls posted the top GPA among C-USA football teams and the squad's combined 2.906 grade point average was a team record and represented the third consecutive year under David Bailiff that the team's GPA has improved (2.786 in 07-08; and 2.843 in 08-09)

The football team provided 41 of a record 227 Rice student-athletes who earned a spot on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll.

A pair of Owls, David Falgout and Tanner Leland, were awarded Commissioner's Academic Medals by maintaining a GPA of 3.75 or better.

Andrew Sendejo, Clark Fangmeier and Terrence Garmon were named to the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame as members of the 2010 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, which is comprised of college football players from all divisions of play who each maintained a 3.2 GPA or better.

Overall, Rice student-athletes earned six Academic All America honors in addition to a record four NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarships.

The department won its fifth C-USA Institutional Excellence Award, representing the highest overall GPA among all student-athletes in the conference, and Rice's combined GPA of 3.167 was its highest in any of its five years as a member of C-USA.

## Bowl Advancement

Rice faced seven teams during the 2009 season who earned berths to bowl games, including three of the Owls' four non-conference opponents - Navy, Oklahoma State, Texas Tech.

Rice's 2009 opponents posted a combined 82-73 record (.529).

Starting with a Texas team which played in last year's Citi BCS National Championship Game, Rice will play six opponents in 2010 who are coming off bowl seasons.

**Owls in the Pros**

Six former Owls remained on professional rosters as the 2010 seasons were ready to kick off.

**Ryan Pontbriand** is in his eighth season as the Cleveland Browns' deep snapper and has twice been named to the Pro Bowl.

**James Casey** (Texans) and **Jarett Dillard** (Jaguars) were both drafted in the fifth round of the 2009 NFL draft and are entering their second year of action.

**Chase Clement** (Las Vegas), **Terrance Melton** (Florida) and **Andrew Sendejo** (Sacramento) are active in the UFL.

**Etcetera ..**

Rice defeated UTEP for the fourth consecutive season in 2009 ... the last time Rice has had four consecutive wins over an opponent was in 1996 when the Owls defeated both TCU and Tulsa for the fourth consecutive year ... the Owls defeated Tulane on Homecoming, capturing their fifth consecutive Homecoming victory in 2009 ... Rice enters 2010 with a two-game home, winning streak and has won eight of its last 12 games played at Rice Stadium along with nine of the last 13 the Owls have played in the City of Houston.

**Texas Connections**

In addition to the countless high school connections between Rice and Texas players, a pair of Owls have fathers who played for Texas, while two others had uncles play for the Longhorns.

Both of safety **Travis Bradshaw's** parents competed for Texas. His father, **Freddy** was a defensive back for the Horns from 1976-78, while is mother **Leslie (Gardell)** was a member of the Texas women's swim team at the same time.

**Bret McDonald**, the father of Owls' starting tight end **Vance McDonald**, was a linebacker for the Longhorns from 1979-81.

Offensive lineman **Clay Hebert's** uncle, **Bruce Hebert**, was an All-SWC pick at Texas in 1974 while cornerback **Chris Jammer's** uncle, **Quentin Jammer**, was an All-America defensive back for the Horns from 1997-2001.
