OWLS GO INTERNATIONAL IN SEASON 106

The Rice Owls will open their 2017 season in historic fashion by taking on Stanford in the second annual Sydney Cup in Sydney, Australia on August 26, commencing a season that will see the Owls wrack up over 25,000 miles in travel while also starting a season on the earliest date in school history.

BRIGHT AND EARLY

Thanks to the combination of their earliest opener in history in addition to new NCAA rules regarding the elimination of two-a-days, Rice will open its 2017 training camp on Monday, June 24 with a 6 a.m. workout. The Owls will get the jump on all but two NFL teams in terms of opening their full camp. The Arizona Cardinals open on July 21 while the Dallas Cowboys open camp to both rookies and veterans the following day. Rice will hold a total of five practices which are being held in the mornings to avoid conflicts with the final week of summer session classes. The team will then have a five-day break before returning the practice field on August 3 to being full preparations for the Sydney Cup.

WHOSE BACK?

Rice returns a total of 13 players who made the majority of the starts from last in addition to a 14th who was a starter in 2015 before missing last season with an injury. Rice returns eight defensive starters in addition to cornerback Justin Bickham, who earned C-USA All-Freshman honors in 2015 before suffering an injury in training camp prior to the '16 season. He joins linebacker Emmanuel Ellerbee, the preseason C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, defensive tackle Preston Gordon, defensive ends Blain Padgett and Brian Womac, corner V.J. Banks, and safeties J.T. Ibe and Destri White. Seniors Peter Godber and Trey Martin lead the five returning members of the Owls offensive line who all return (Calvin Anderson, Sam Pierce & Corey Klingler). Running back Sam Stewart is not officially listed as a returning starter due his being limited to just four starts due to injuries last year.

ELLERBEE LEADS THE HONORS PARADE

Senior linebacker Emmanuel Ellerbee became the second Rice player in the last four years to be tabbed by conference coaches as Conference USA's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and also has been named to the Nagurski Award Watch List. Senior center Trey Martin, who joined with Ellerbee in being selected by the C-USA coaches to their preseason all-conference team, was also named to the Rimington Award Watch List.

BOWL TEAMS DOMINATE '17 SCHEDULE

Rice and Tulsa are the only two BCS schools in conferences to play 2016 bowl teams in each of its four non-conference games this year. Rice opens with Stanford, and plays at Houston and Pittsburgh while hosting Army. Tulsa will face Oklahoma State, Louisiana, Toledo and New Mexico. The Owls also will face four C-USA opponents who went bowling in 2016 (Louisiana Tech, North Texas, Old Dominion and Southern Miss).

SETTING THE STANDARD

Rice has posted a 33-31 record since 2012, and its 30 wins from 2012-15 matched the most wins over a four-year stretch in school history.

LONE STAR WINNERS

Rice is one of six FBS programs in the state of Texas to have posted a winning record over the last four years. Rice is 26-25 since 2013, joining Baylor (38-12), Houston (38-13), TCU (32-16), Texas A&M (31-18), and Texas Tech (25-25) as teams at .500 or better during that stretch. They are followed by Texas (24-25), Texas State (18-29), UTSA (19-28), North Texas (18-30), UTEP (17-30) and SMU (13-33).

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Rice opens the 2017 season by taking the longest football road trip in school history, logging better than 17,000 air miles to reach Sydney, Australia for the Sydney Cup. Three weeks later, they will board buses to navigate the local Houston traffic for a total of just under seven miles to face the Houston Cougars at TDECU Stadium.

MEDIA SEES OWLS FIFTH

Conference USA polled members of the media who regularly cover the conference and they have installed Louisiana Tech to repeat as West Division champions in 2017. UTSA is second, followed by Southern Miss, North Texas, Rice, UTEP and UAB.

NOT HOW YOU START...

Each year, Dave Campbell's Texas Football takes a look back at the recently graduated recruiting classes of all the FBS programs in Texas to evaluate the actual impact of a class. While none of David Bailiff's first six recruiting classes were ranked higher than eighth in Texas in the initial rankings, each class improved its ranking after those players had completed their eligibility. Rice is the only state school to show improvement by each class over that span. In the most recent survey, the Owls 2012 class, which initially had been ranked eighth in the state was placed fifth overall with a score of 57.2 (just .3 behind Texas A&M for fourth) and ahead of Texas (48.8), Texas State (44.3), Texas Tech (37.6), UTEP (31.2), SMU (29.9), UTSA (28.0) and North Texas (27.3).

BEST DECADES

The Owls enters 2017 averaging 5.9 wins in the current decade (41-47) and just off the the most successful decade in school history. Rice won 63 games during the 1940's, closing the decade with a 63-36-4 mark. The Owls' 41 wins in the seven years of this decade already have surpassed the win totals from five earlier decades and moved them into striking distance to move into fourth.

In four seasons since C-USA reconfigured, Rice is 18-14 in conference action, which ranks second in the West and fourth in the league. Marshall, Middle Tennessee and Louisiana Tech ar each 22-10 over that span.

DIPLOMAS IN HAND

The Owls will have three graduate students on the 2017 roster, as D.J. Green, Parker Smith and Cole Thomas all received their degrees last spring. All three are enrolled in the Masters of Accounting program at Rice.

DOUBLING UP ON THE STOPS

Linebacker Emmanuel Ellerbee matched the 10th most tackles in a season (118) in school history thanks in large part to seven games with double-digit tackle totals, putting together a streak of four consecutive games from Baylor through UTSA and he ended the year with a streak of three straight vs. Charlotte, UTEP and Stanford. His seven games in double figures were the most for an Owl since Larry Izzo had seven in 1995.

BEST AND BRIGHTEST

Darik Dillard became the fourth Rice football player in David Bailiff's 10 seasons at Rice to be awarded the Bob Quin Award as Rice's top male student athlete, joining David Berken (2009), Travis Bradshaw (2011) and Gabe Baker (2014). Dillard graduated last May with a 3.35 GPA while majoring in Mechanical Engineering & Economics. He finished his career at Rice ranked sixth with 26 touchdowns, seventh in carries (446) and rushing (2,196) and tied for 10th with 156 career points. He combined with older brother Jarett for 86 career touchdowns to set an NCAA record for total touchdowns by siblings. He was also a two-time selection to the C-USA All Academic team, a four-time member of C-USA Academic Honor Roll a three-time Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar. He was a Rice Honor Athlete in 2015 and a Rice Scholar Athlete in 2016.

SIGNAL CALLERS EVERYWHERE

In addition to the five players listed as quarterbacks on the roster, Rice has six other lettermen who played quarterback for their high schools before switching to new positions in college: CB D'Angelo Ellis, P Jack Fox, SAF Cole Thomas, WR Aston Walter, TE Robby Wells, SAF Destri White as well as a pair of true freshmen (WR Chris Boudreaux Jaeger Bull, TE Jager Bull).

COACHING MILESTONE

On the 50th anniversary of Jess Neely's final home game and final win in his Hall of Fame career, David Bailiff reached a milestone of his own as the Owls' 44-24 win over UTEP allowed him to move past Ken Hatfield for second on the Rice career coaching list with his 56th win.

CLOSERS

Rice has won 17 of its last 19 home games in November or later (18 regular season, one C-USA championship game). Rice saw its 15-game home November streak with the Homecoming loss to Southern Miss in 2015. The Owls are 18-4 under David Bailiff at Rice Stadium in the final month of the season. Rice is 32-15 in all games played in November or later since 2006. The Owls were 4-1 in 2006, 2-2 in 2007, 5-0 in 2008, 2-2 in 2009, 2010 and 2011, 4-0 in 2012, 4-1 in 2013, 4-2 in 2014, 1-2 in 2015 and 2-2 2016. The Owls have not had a losing November since 2005.

C-USA

Rice is 46-50 (.479) in Conference USA since entering the league in 2005. The Owls were 1-7 in their initial season in C-USA and have posted a 45-43 record since 2006 (39-41 under David Bailiff). Rice has an overall mark of 28-19 in Conference USA at Rice Stadium and 0-1 at Reliant Stadium, 18-30 on the road. David Bailiff has a CUSA home record of 24-14 in the regular season.

CLOSING THEM OUT

Rice finished 2nd in C-USA and 20th nationally with a .897 efficiency inside the Red Zone (35/39). Their lone trips to the Red Zone that did not result in points were an interception late in the opener at WKU, the game-ending play in overtime vs. North Texas, a the fourth quarter interception vs. FAU and a blocked field goal vs. UTEP.

GRANSON ANSWERS THE CALL

One year after true freshman Kylan Granson was leading Austin's Westlake High School on a run to the Class 6A D1 championship game and four games into a redshirt year, he took to the field and became the Owls hottest receiver. Granson became just the fifth Rice receiver of the spread era to reach top double figures in receptions in a game when he caught 11 for 90 yards at Charlotte. In eight games since he pulled his redshirt due to injuries to the Owls' receiving corps, he caught 33 passes for 381 yards and two touchdowns (27/332/2 in the last five. His 33 receptions are the most by a true freshman at Rice since James Casey had 46 in 2007.

**SHUTTING DOWN THE
GROUND GAME**

Facing two of C-USA's top rushing teams in the last two conference games of the year, Rice held Charlotte to 41 yards under its season average and UTEP to 115 under its average while also holding a pair of running backs (Kalif Phillips of Charlotte and Aaron Jones of UTEP) who have combined to rush for nearly 8,000 yards to just 162. Over a four quarter stretch from the last half of the Charlotte game and the opening half against UTEP, Rice allowed just 68 yards on 25 carries, while outscoring the 49ers and Miners by a combined 46-3.

LOSE THE NAMETAGS

Rice started the same offensive line for the last four games in 2016 after a stretch of five different lineups in the first eight as well as seeing a total of eight linemen make a start this year. Over those last three games, Rice averaged 452 yards per game while winning two of three. Crockett Mokry became the eighth offensive lineman to make a start for the Owls this year, starting in place of Isaiah Edwards at guard vs. Prairie View. All told, the Owls have had four first time starters along the offensive line, and two of those four (Patterson and Dill) were later lost for the year because of injury.

**WRACKING UP THE
LOSSES**

Owls defenders amassed 68 tackles for loss in 2016, including a season-high 12 vs. North Texas. The total against the Mean Green was their best mark since they piled up 12 against Fresno State in the 2014 Hawai'i Bowl. A total of 22 players were credited with a TFL this season. Tabari McGaskey led the way with 11, followed by Brian Womac (9.0), Emmanuel Ellerbee (8.0) and Preston Gordon (6.5). The Owls were also credited with five sacks vs. North Texas, their most since they racked up eight at FIU in 2014.

NEXT MAN UP

Defensive tackles Zach Abercrombia and Carl Thompson were the fifth and sixth starters from the original depth chart to be lost for the season. Cornerback Justin Bickham, who earned All Freshman C-USA honors last year, suffered and injury in training camp guard Connor Patterson was lost during the opener at WKU and Darrion Pollard was lost after North Texas game. The Owls were down a total of five starters at Southern Miss and started a true freshman (Joseph Dill) in the offensive line for the first time since 2007. Dill was injured in the game and was lost for the year as well. Through 10 games, the Owls have lost 52 starts to players

who opened camp at the top of depth chart at their position.

NEXT GENERATION

Rice played a total of 45 freshmen (30 redshirts and 15 true freshmen) over the past two years. They played 31 total (21/10) in 2015, the most of any team in the nation, and saw four earn All-Freshman honors from Conference USA. Cornerback Justin Bickham, wide receiver Parker Smith, running back Samuel Stewart and running back/kick returner Austin Walter were honored. The four selections to the team matched Middle Tennessee and FAU for the most from any school in the conference and tied the most for Rice as a member of C-USA. Rice also saw four players honored in 2012 (Christian Covington, Dennis Parks, Luke Turner and Caleb Williams).

TRIPLE FIGURES

Rice reached triple figures in plays for the third time in school history, finishing with 100 vs. North Texas. The last time they have topped the mark was in 2007 when they set a school record with 104 plays vs. Tulsa, breaking the old mark of 100 set in 2004 at San Jose State. The Owls added 94 plays vs. Charlotte, matching the fifth most in school history and making the first time they have had two games with 94 or more plays in a season.

TEAM LEADERS

Seniors Emmanuel Ellerbee and Trey Martin were selected by their teammates as captains for the 2016 season. They will be joined each week by game captains and a second team vote will be conducted at the end of the year to select captains to join Ellerbee and Martin.

WALK-ONS

A total of 10 walkons saw action in 2016. Seven of the 37 players who saw action in the opener at WKU originally came to Rice as walk-ons: Ford Corbett, Cameron Johnson, Connor Johnson, J.P. Thompson, Matt Morris, Haden Tobola and Zach Wright. They were joined in action by Jae Phan and Josh Rahman against Army and Clayton Malcom at LA Tech.

IN THE LEAGUE

Eight Rice products opened the 2016 season on NFL rosters (Chris Boswell, Bryce Callahan, Phillips Gaines, Vance McDonald, Andrew Sendejo, Jordan Taylor and Luke Willson). Five of the eight were draft picks, while Boswell, Callahan and Taylor earned a spot in the league as undrafted free agents. Rice had a record nine players active in the league in 2015. The Owls also had nine playing between the NFL and AFL

in 1961 and also had nine between the NFL and the All American Football Conference in 1948.

IN THE LEAGUE-II

Of the eight Rice products currently playing in the NFL, Chris Boswell is the only of those eight who came to Rice with more than two stars by any recruiting service (three stars by Rivals).

NFL BACKGROUND

Rice added a second coach on the staff with NFL experience when David Bailiff promoted former GA Frank Okam to coach the defensive line to replace Michael Slater, who joined the staff at Kansas. Okam played 25 games over four seasons with Houston, Seattle and Tampa Bay. He joins tight end coach David Sloan, a former All-Pro with Detroit who played in 110 games over nine years.

CANADIAN OWLS

Rice's continued efforts to recruit Canada have yielded standout offensive guard Peter Godber, as well as incoming freshman Gregor MacKellar. Since 2007 the Owls have signed a total of seven Canadians thanks to the efforts of Assistant Head Coach Darrell Patterson, who played linebacker in the CFL from 1984-89. Among the notable Canadian recruits to play for the Owls is Seattle Seahawks tight end Luke Willson and Houston Texans defensive tackle Christian Covington.

COBB MAKES CFB HOF BALLOT

Trevor Cobb, who shredded the Rice football rushing record book during a stellar four-year career with the Owls, was among 76 Football Bowl Subdivision players on the 2017 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame, which was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame in early June. This marks the third consecutive year the 1991 Doak Walker Award winner had earned a spot on the ballot. Cobb became the first Owl to win one of college football's major individual awards when he received the Walker Award as the nation's top running back. He was a consensus All-American in 1991 and went on to be named the 1992 Southwest Conference Offensive Player of the Year. He completed his career ranked second on the SWC career rushing list with 4,948 yards, which ranked eight on the NCAA career list at that time and now ranks 22 in NCAA history. He became the first Owl to rush for over 1,000 yards in three seasons and holds the top three

season totals in school history, capped by his 1,692 yards in 1991 during his run to the Doak Walker Award. In addition to his yardage total, Cobb holds the Rice season and career marks for rushing attempts (306/1,091), and all-purpose yards (6,512) in addition to the career mark for rushing touchdowns (36).

BONUS BALL

Rice is 6-5 all-time in overtime games, including a 3-3 mark on the road and a 3-2 mark at home. The Owls have won their last three road overtime games, including two in 2013. Luke Turner scored from 1-yard out to defeat UAB while Darik Dillard snared a 25-yard TD pass from Taylor McHargue at Tulsa. Darik Dillard's older brother Jarett caught a 25-yarder at Tulsa in 2006 to start the streak of road overtime wins. Rice's first OT game came in 1998 when they beat SMU 23-17:

NO BLANKINGS

Rice has not been shut out in a game since a 37-0 loss at TCU in 2000, a span of 198 games overall. Rice was last shut out at home on Dec. 2, 1989 by Houston (65-0), a span of 134 games. Rice hasn't shut out an opponent since blanking UNLV 38-0 to open the 1995 season (260 games).

TEAM ZIGGY

The Owls have a special honorary member of the team in eight-year old **Fre'derick "Ziggy" Stoval-Redd** in conjunction with Team IMPACT, which pairs Division I athletic teams with children with life-threatening illnesses. Ziggy and his mother, Phila Stoval, relocated to the Houston in 2015 to be closer to his doctors. He has fought off acute lymphoblastic leukemia twice and is currently in remission. As an Honorary Owl, he is listed on the Owls roster and attends as many practices and team functions as possible.

RICE REVEALS NEW BRANDING IDENTITY



Rice Athletics embarked on a fresh and dynamic branding identity with the release of a new set of graphic elements which were released to the public on April 11.

The results of two years of research and planning were unveiled during a press event as well as during a live webcast from the new Brian Patterson Sports Performance Center at Rice Stadium.

“Our goal with the brand refresh was to create a consistent aesthetic that best represents Rice,” Joe Karlgaard, Rice Director of Athletics said. “We saw an opportunity to create something clear and visually memorable that would complement our primary mark, the Old English R.”

The new family of design elements were designed to establish the best representation of an authentic Rice Athletics brand. These elements retain the iconic Old English R, which has been the primary mark for the Owls since the 2007-08 season, while incorporating a new wordmark, owl body, owl head, fonts and numerals in order to be consistent and solidify what the brand represents. Through refinement, the aim is to reinforce and amplify the brand for Rice Athletics for years to come.

Our Branding team researched the history of the Rice Athletics marks, conducted over 50 interviews with various constituencies (alumni, donors, fans, university personnel including Public Affairs, coaches, student-athletes and students), and sent a survey to over 25,000 people - those currently engaged with Rice and local Houstonians who are not engaged with Rice.

The feedback received through this process revealed:

1. Strong affinity for the Old English R but a lack of broad recognition.
2. Mixed feelings for the Old English Script with a sense it is disconnected from the direction of Rice Athletics.
3. Fondness towards being an owl and all that it represents but a desire for an owl mark that is dynamic, sharp, aggressive and relevant.
4. Need for marks that are legible, usable, recognizable and consistent.

Rice University Athletics partnered with Torch Creative and adidas to create an identity that addressed the key points from the feedback in order to create visual assets aligned closely with the department’s vision, to further reinforce a commitment to athletic excellence.

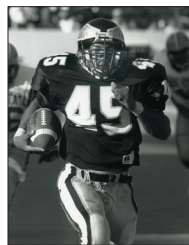

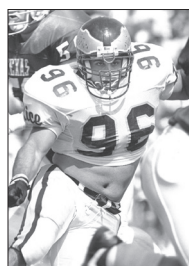

11TH SEASON

As he enters his second decade at the helm of the Rice Owls, David Bailiff continues to deliver an unparalleled standard of success on the field and in the classroom.

Bailiff is just the fourth head coach to lead the Owls for more than a decade, joining Jess Neely (27 years), Ken Hatfield (12 years) and Phillip Arbuckle (11 years) and his 56 career wins on South Main rank second to Neely in school history. He has led the Owls to two of the three 10-win seasons in school history and has won eight or more games three times, matching Jess Neely for the most at Rice while his three bowl victories also match Neely's mark during his Hall of Fame career.

In 10 seasons on South Main, Bailiff has built a program that has become one of the most consistent in Conference USA. Under his watch, the Owls have earned four bowl berths and won three bowl championships and have produced the most wins in school history over a two (18), three (25) and four (30) year periods. Rice's 18-9 mark from 2013-14 was the second best of any FBS program in Texas.

Bailiff has twice been honored by his peers as C-USA Coach of the Year (2008 & 2013) and after leading the Owls to their first outright conference championship in 56 years in 2013, he joined Art Briles (Baylor), Mark Dantonio (Michigan State), Gus Malzahn (Auburn) and David Shaw (Stanford) as Bear Bryant Coach of the Year award finalists. He was also honored by the San Antonio Express News as its Co-Sportsman of the Year.

While reaching new heights on the field, Bailiff's teams continue to excel in the classroom while also making a profound impact on the Houston community. Last year, football contributed 59 of the 255 Rice student-athletes to earn a spot on the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll. Twice in his tenure, the Owls were honored by the American Football Coaches Association with its Academic Achievement Award, having posted a 100 percent graduation rate. Rice has led Conference USA football teams in GPA in seven of his 10 seasons and has dominated Texas on the conference in the NCAA's annual graduation rate studies.

Four of his players (David Berken, Travis Bradshaw, Gabe Baker and Darik Dillard) have been honored with the Bob Quin Award as Rice's top male student-athlete.

He was honored with the Greater Houston Football Coaches Association's John Kelley Distinguished Service Award and by the Conference USA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) Coaches Choice Award winner for 2011-12. He was also cited by the Houston Press as "Houston's Best Sports Role Model" in its 2013 Best of Houston edition.

Bailiff's staff has made the state of Texas a priority in recruiting, solidifying relationships with high school coaches throughout the state and the result has shown itself both in the team success and in the number of players reaching the NFL as well as in his successful efforts to bring the Texas High School Coaches Association Convention to Houston in 2015.

The Owls have had eight players taken in the NFL Draft during Bailiff's tenure, matching the output of the previous 23 years prior to his arrival. A total of six players from his first six recruiting classes have been selected. A record nine Owls recruited by Bailiff saw action in the NFL in 2015 and a 10th, Jordan Taylor, was on the practice squad with Denver and became the second Bailiff recruit in the last four years to win a Super Bowl ring (Luke Willson, Seattle, 2014). Nine Owls were active in 2016.

He has also made good on his promise to keep the Owls active in community work, as the Owls have been tireless in their efforts with local schools as well as reaching out to Rice's diverse student population through an annual International Students' Clinic each August. In July of 2009, Bailiff accepted an invitation to join with four other college football coaches on a goodwill tour to visit military personnel stationed in Afghanistan and again honored our troops in 2011 by participating as a driver in the "Crossing of America" tour. The Owls also are regular participants in efforts to send care packages to members of the armed forces deployed overseas.

The Rice football team was honored by the Texas Association of Partners in Education with their TAPE's Crystal Award for the program the Owls conducted in 2007 with the students at Arizona Fleming Elementary School in Houston. The Owls support of Big Brothers helped Rice Athletics be honored in 2012 as one of the Houston chapter's Community Partners of the Year. In 2008, the Owls endured a series of challenges as well as the aftermath of Hurricane Ike and produced the first 10-win season for Rice since 1949 and the Owls' first victory in a bowl game since their memorable win over Alabama in the 1954 Cotton Bowl. For his efforts, Bailiff was honored by his conference peers with his first Conference USA Coach of the Year honor.

Bailiff came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference

championship and the semifinals of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in 2005.

He produced a total of 14 All Southland Conference first team selections, and 13 players who were named to the academic all-conference squad in his last two years. The 2005 season was truly a magical one. The Bobcats went 9-2 during the regular season and earned the school's first berth in the Division I-AA playoffs.

In their first game, the Bobcats stormed back from a 35-16 deficit against Division I-AA national power Georgia Southern to score 34 unanswered points and beat the Eagles 50-35. The Cats then defeated Cal Poly 14-7 to move on to the national semifinals. Only a 40-37 overtime loss to Northern Iowa stood between Texas State and an appearance in the Division I-AA title game.

Bailiff was named the American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 Coach of the Year and finished third in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA. Prior to being named Texas State head coach, Bailiff spent three seasons on the staff at TCU. He served as the Horned Frogs' defensive coordinator in both 2002 and 2003 while working with the team's defensive linemen.

The 2003 Horned Frogs posted an 11-2 record and were ranked 25th in the final Associated Press writer's poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Bailiff was part of a staff which built a tradition on defense at TCU. During his three seasons in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs were ranked 24th, 1st and 38th in the country in total defense and 10th, first and ninth against the run.

In 2002, TCU allowed just 240.2 yards of total offense per game which led the country. The Horned Frogs surrendered an average 64.8 yards on the ground. During the year, the Frogs held Tulane to a school-record -53 yards rushing. TCU also ranked second in the country in pass efficiency defense, allowing opponents to complete less than 39 percent of their passes.

Six TCU defensive players earned all-conference accolades in 2002 including Conference USA Defensive Player of the year and Second-Team All-American LaMarcus MacDonald.

While at TCU, the Horned Frogs played in a bowl game every season - the galleryfurniture.com Bowl (2001), AXA Liberty Bowl (2002) and the Plains Capital Fort Worth Bowl (2003).

He began his coaching career as the defensive line coach at New Braunfels High School (1982-84). He went into private business from 1984-88 before returning to the coaching ranks as a defensive graduate assistant coach at Texas State in 1988. He was elevated to the Bobcats' defensive line coach in 1989.

Bailiff left Texas State in 1992 for an assistant coaching position at New Mexico. He returned to Texas State in 1997 as defensive coordinator and added assistant head coach responsibilities to his role in 1999.

It was in 1999 that Bailiff was selected the NCAA Division I-AA Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. While at TCU, Bailiff was also honored as the Top Assistant Football Coach by the All-American Football Foundation following the Horned Frogs' 2002 season. As a player, Bailiff was named All-Lone Star Conference as well as All-America honorable mention while playing at Texas State from 1977-80. He served as a team captain in 1980 and was named honorable mention to the Lone Star Team of the Decade.

Bailiff is married to the former Angie Daniels of Versailles, Mo. He has a daughter, Brooke and the couple has twin 20-year-old sons, Grayson and Gregory.
