## CITADEL BULLDOGS 0-0 AT RICHMOND SPIDERS 0-0

## THE LATEST

▶ Coming off an NCAA Tournament appearance and final Associated Press Top-25 ranking the Spiders return 14 of 16 players from last years roster, including Atlantic 10 Player of the Year Kevin Anderson and add what head coach Chris Mooney has called his most talented recruiting class. Richmond, which was ranked in last February for the first time in 24 years and the second time in 52 years last season, is receiving votes in both the ESPN/USA Today and Associated Press Top-25 Preseason Polls for the first time in school history.

▶ Richmond has been picked to finish third in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll. Last year the Spiders finished third in the regular-season standings, just a two-point double-overtime loss at Xavier from winning the conference regular-season. Richmond then defeated Xavier in the semifinals in overtime, the Spiders' second win in the last three meetings with the Musketeers, to advance to their second A-10 title game in nine seasons in the league. Richmond lost to Temple 56-52 in the championship game.

▶ Kevin Anderson will look to become the sixth two-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and just the fourth to win it outright at least twice. The last Atlantic 10 player to win the award outright in back-to-back years was David West, who won it three-straight seasons from 2001-03. Anderson was a First-Team All-Atlantic 10 selection and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American last season and is on the Preseason All-Atlantic 10 First-Team and All-Defensive Team. He was also named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top-50 List and ESPN's Jay Williams ranked him as the No. 7 point guard in the nation. He is just the fifth A-10 Player to win both the conference's Rookie of the Year/Freshman of the Year Award and Player of the Year Award, joining Jameer Nelson (Saint Joseph's), Marcus Camby (UMass), Mark Macon (Temple) and Kenny Green (Rhode Island).

▶ Kevin Anderson is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be selected as a candidate, the student-athlete must have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. Off the court Anderson is a Business major with a concentration in Marketing in the University of Richmond's undergraduate Business School which ranked No. 12 in the nation last year, including No. 1 for academic quality according to Business Week. He is also heavily involved in the community with his teammates, including being involved with CARITAS, The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, The Special Olympics, The Arthritis Foundation and St. Joseph's Villa.

▶ Richmond, Xavier and Temple are the only 3 teams to finish in the top-5 of the A-10 in each of the last 3 seasons. Last year's third-place league finish and 13-3 record were Richmond's best since joining the league in 2001-02.

## THE TEAMS

**SCOUTING RICHMOND:** The Spiders return 14 of 16 players off the 2010 NCAA Tournament team that finished the season ranked No. 24 in the final Associated Press Top-25 Poll. Starters David Gonzalez and Ryan Butler have graduated, but the Spiders look to have more depth than last season with the addition of what Chris Mooney has called the best recruiting class that he's signed at Richmond. That bodes well for the future, but this year's senior class is no slouch with Atlantic 10 Player of the Year Kevin Anderson, NBA prospect Justin Harper, highlight reel filler Kevin Smith and 2008 Atlantic 10 All-Conference center Dan Geriot.

**SCOUTING THE CITADEL:** Lefty Driesel's son Chuck takes over at The Citadel following a 16-16 season last year for the Bulldogs. Cameron Wells enters his senior year third on The Citadel's all-time scoring list with 1,497 points, nine points shy of Art Musselman for second. Zach Urbanus is The Citadel's all-time career three-point leader with 231.

**QUICK HITTERS ▶**

Richmond is 34-12 since Feb. 18, 2009...Richmond was 5-2 on neutral court games last season with wins over No. 13 ranked Florida, No. 24 ranked Xavier, Missouri, Mississippi State, UMass and a loss to No. 17 ranked Temple in the A-10 title game...the Spiders were 2nd in the A-10 in turnover margin (+3.99) and 15th in the nation last season...UR was 2nd in the A-10 in fewest turnovers (11.3 tpg), which ranked 23rd in the nation...Richmond led the A-10 and was 26th in the nation in steals (8.3) and had more steals than turnovers in 12 games last season...the Spiders tied the school record for steals in 2008-09 with 262 and broke that record last season with 289...Richmond set the school record for blocks last season with 158...last season the Spiders had 10 wins against teams that played in the 2008-09 postseason...Richmond broke into the Top-25 on Feb. 15, 2010 for the first time in 24 years and was ranked again on Feb. 22, the first time the Spiders were ranked in back-to-back weeks in 52 years... prior to last season, the Spiders had been ranked for 1 week (Jan. 30, 1986) since the 1957-58 season and just 6 weeks in school history...last year was just the second time Richmond was ranked 3 weeks in a season...last March's A-10 title game loss to No. 17 Temple snapped a four-game winning streak vs. ranked teams for UR...since last March Richmond has wins over No. 24 Xavier (3/13), No. 17 Temple (2/6), No. 13 Florida 12/19 and No. 17 Xavier...Richmond has won 5 of its last 8 vs. ranked teams in the last three seasons under Chris Mooney...Richmond and Xavier tied for the best road record in the A-10 play last season at 6-2, the second-straight season the Spiders have had the best road mark in conference play... the Spiders have the best A-10 conference road record over the past 2 seasons at 11-5, having won 9 of their last 11 A-10 road games...Richmond finished 14-1 at home, the 3rd highest home win total in school history and best home winning percentage when playing more than 9 homes games in school history...the 1981-82 team went 15-3 and the 1954-55 team was 15-5...last season was Richmond's 17th 20-win season, including its 2nd straight...Richmond's 8-game winning streak that ended Feb. 28 was the longest since the 1997-98 season and the longest conference winning streak since the 1990-91 season, when the Spiders played in the CAA...Richmond has been getting plenty of national publicity, prompting a Washington Post blogger to write, "the Spiders are getting so much love from ESPN, you would think Brett Favre was their point guard"...the Spiders were featured with articles in USA Today and Sports Illustrated in the last week of February and were featured in the New York Times on March 7...the Spiders held 16 of 35 opponents to 60 points or less last season and held 23 of 35 opponents to 65 points or less...the Spiders defeated Saint Louis 62-36 on Jan. 30, 2010 holding the Billikens to the lowest point total for a Richmond opponent in A-10 play since joining the league in 2001-02...the Spiders were 3-2 vs. teams from BCS conferences last season, giving Richmond the most wins against teams from the Power 6 conferences since the 1985-86 team defeated Providence, Wake Forest, Stanford and Virginia...Chris Mooney has 9 victories over teams from a BCS conference in 6 years as a D-I head coach, including 7 in his 5 seasons at UR...the Spiders have won 4 of the last 6 games against BCS teams...the Spiders have erased deficits of 8 or more in 9 wins this season...last December Richmond held Florida to its lowest point total in a loss in Billy Donovan's 16 seasons as head coach of the Gators...it was just the 5th time in 500-plus games under Donovan that Florida did not reach 54 points...Richmond held Missouri to the second-lowest point total under fourth-year head coach Mike Anderson and the 2nd lowest shooting percentage of the season behind Kansas...UR led by double-figures in 19 of its 35 games and by at least 6 points in all but 3 games.

## HEAD COACH CHRIS MOONEY

When Richmond athletic director Jim Miller announced the hiring of Chris Mooney as head coach of the Spiders on May 6, 2005, he said Mooney would "attract student-athletes who make the community proud, while sustaining Richmond's place among the Atlantic 10 elite."

By the time Mooney coached his first game that fall, the team was down to seven scholarship players and it was clear that the Philly native had a bigger challenge than sustaining success. He had to create some from scratch.

With his first recruiting class receiving their diplomas in May 2010, it is clear he has attracted student-athletes who make the community proud and he has the Spiders not only among the Atlantic 10's elite, but cracking the Top-25 Polls. The Spiders broke into the Top-25 for the first time in 24 years and the 2nd time in 52 years in 2009-10 and finished the season ranked No. 24 in the AP Poll.

In his fifth season at Richmond, the Spiders finished 13-3 in Atlantic 10 play, a two-point double-overtime loss at Xavier shy of winning the regular season title. Richmond is one of just 3 A-10 teams who can claim a top-5 finish in the conference each of the last 3 seasons, joining Xavier and Temple. Mooney was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year by Sporting News and is one of 15 finalists for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.

Richmond received unprecedented preseason national attention for the 2009-10 season, as Blue Ribbon College Basketball Preview wrote the Spiders have "had college basketball pundits Twittering a blue streak all summer about their merits as a rising star." Mooney appeared on ESPN2 with Andy Katz and college basketball analysts from Katz to Jay Bilas to Fox Sports' Jeff Goodman wrote about the Spiders' wealth of talent.

And the program Mooney has built proved to be more than just preseason hype. The Spiders lived up to all the hoopla, winning a school regular-season record 24 games, matching the school record for wins with 26 and notching the best conference finish (3rd) and record (13-3) since joining the A-10.

The Spiders picked up wins over defending Big 12 Champion Missouri and defending SEC Champion Mississippi State on back-to-back days to win the South Padre Island Invitational, defeated No. 13 ranked Florida in the Orange Bowl Classic, routed No. 17 ranked Temple by 17 points in the Robins Center and took down No. 24 ranked Xavier in the A-10 semifinals.

With all Richmond's success throughout the season came unprecedented national notoriety for the Spiders. Mooney appeared on ESPN2's First Take and ESPN's Jim Rome Is Burning along with the Doug Gottlieb Show. He was featured in a New York Times article and the Spiders were profiled in Sports Illustrated and USA Today, twice, including a cover story on the sports section the day before the NCAA Tournament opened.

Known for his ability to communicate, Mooney received the Voice of the University Award, given to a faculty or staff member for being a "voice" that represents the University of Richmond in an outstanding manner. He was also named to Richmond Style Weekly's Top 40 Under 40 for his community involvement.

**KA NAMED TO WOODEN PRESEASON LIST ▶**

Richmond senior point guard Kevin Anderson was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top-50 List. The 2010 Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American averaged 17.8 points per game last season, finishing the season with 622 points. He enters his senior year eighth on Richmond's all-time career list with 1,552 points. Anderson will look to become just the sixth Atlantic 10 player to repeat as Player of the Year and is just the fifth A-10 Player to win both the conference's Rookie of the Year/Freshman of the Year Award and Player of the Year Award, joining Jameer Nelson (Saint Joseph's), Marcus Camby (UMass), Mark Macon (Temple) and Kenny Green (Rhode Island).

**HARP ON IT ▶**

With three players earning Preseason All-Conference Honors the Spiders are very capable of scoring on the offensive end, but do not forget about forward **Justin Harper**. A sportswriter passed on that when doing a preview for one of the summer preseason publications in 2009, A-10 coaches mentioned Harper as the league's best NBA prospect. The 6-foot-10 forward had a 28-point, 9-rebound performance in a win over Rhode Island in 2009-10 with a Los Angeles Lakers scout in the Robins Center, earning him Atlantic 10 Player of the Week honors. Harper also had 20 points and 8 rebounds in Richmond's win over No. 17 ranked Xavier in March of 2009. He has scored in double-figures in 8 of his last 10 games and appears to have become more aggressive in the offseason. Jay Bilas said Harper has pro potential on ESPN before last year's NCAA Tournament and the way Harper has looked this off-season it would be tough to argue.

**BULKING UP AND BOUNCING HIGHER ▶**

The Spiders spent another quality offseason getting bigger, faster and stronger in the weight room with strength & conditioning coach Jay DeMayo and the results speak for themselves. Four players can bench 300 pounds led by senior Justin Harper (330) and freshman Derrick Williams (330). Junior Darrius Garrett may look a bit skinny, but he put up 305 pounds, while sophomore Darien Brothers hit 300. Six players can jump 40 inches in the two-step vertical led by Brothers, senior Kevin Anderson and freshman Cedrick Lindsay at 42 inches. Senior Kevin Smith and shot-blocking sensation Darrius Garrett lifted 41 1/2 inches off the ground and junior Francis-Cedrick Martel, who had Bill Raftery and Verne Lundquist jumping out of their seats with his sky-high rebound in the Atlantic 10 title game, jumped 40 inches.

Francis-Cedric Martel is 6-foot-6 but has a 6-foot-11 wingspan and Greg Robbins is 6-foot-5 but has a 6-foot-10 wingspan.

**TENACIOUS D ►**

In Chris Mooney's first season at Richmond in 2005-06, the Spiders led the nation in fewest points allowed for most of the season, not allowing 60 points or more for the first 10 games of the year with a complex match-up zone that frustrated opponents. The Spiders finished the year allowing 57.8 points per game, which ranked seventh in the country. In 2006-07, with five freshmen seeing the bulk of the minutes, the Spiders did not have as much success defensively, but the past 3 seasons Richmond has been better on the defensive end, allowing 66.0 ppg in 2007-08, 67.5 ppg in 2008-09 and 62.2 ppg this season. The Spiders have held opponents to 50 points or less 21 times in 162 games under Mooney and have held teams to 60 points or less 72 times, including 16 times this season. Richmond has allowed over 70 points in regulation just 38 times in Mooney's 5 seasons and has allowed 80 or more points in regulation just 13 times.

## NOTES

### A NEW SPIDER ►

The Spiders adopted a 14-year-old who has a brain tumor as part of the team through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. Nathan Mwenda, who is originally from Zambia, has been living in Richmond for 6 years. He attends games, practices and exchanges text messages with the players and was on the court for introductions and the National Anthem for the final home game against Dayton.

### SOUTH PADRE ISLAND CHAMPIONS ►

The Spiders won the 2009 South Padre Island Invitational, defeating defending SEC Champion Mississippi State in the semifinals and defending Big 12 Champion Missouri in the title game. **Kevin Anderson** was named tournament MVP, while **Ryan Butler** and **David Gonzalvez** joined him on the All-Tournament Team. The four previous winners of the South Padre Island Invitational were Illinois (twice), Vanderbilt and Oklahoma State.

### SPIDERS' WEB REACHING NBA ►

While the Spiders do not have a former player on any NBA rosters, three Richmond former standouts are working the sidelines in the NBA. Kevin Eastman is an assistant coach for the Boston Celtics, earning a ring with the 2008 World Champions. Standout guard Ken Atkinson, a member of the 1988 Sweet 16 team, is in his third year as an assistant coach for Mike D'Antoni and the New York Knicks. Former guard Curtis Blair, who scored 18 points in the 1991 NCAA Tournament win over Syracuse, is in his third year as a referee in the NBA.

### THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS ►

Richmond coach Chris Mooney got his first Division I head coaching job at the age of 32, which made him the fourth-youngest coach in the nation at the time. Even with his youth, don't look for any grizzled veterans on the 38-year-old Mooney's staff. Associate head coach Kevin McGeehan is 37, assistant coach Jamal Brunt is 30 and assistant coach Rob Jones is 32. Directors of basketball operations Marcus Jenkins and Peter Thomas are 28 and 26, respectively.

### THE WEDDING PLANNER ►

Richmond head coach Chris Mooney started his collegiate coaching career as a part time head coach at Beaver College (now Arcadia College) in 1997. Mooney's full time job was as the school's coordinator of events and as part of that job he had to book weddings at a castle that was on the Glenside, Pa. campus. He showed the castle to newly engaged couples and helped them to decide where the band should play and how tables should be arranged. "I was 25 years old and I'd never even had people over to dinner," Mooney says. "And here I am helping brides prepare for weddings." With no team managers, Mooney washed the uniforms, swept the court and filled water coolers. The team had just six players on the roster during most of Mooney's first season, so when the captains met with the referees before games, the other players had to stop warm-ups and wait. Richmond associate head coach Kevin McGeehan was Mooney's assistant at Beaver College and his full-time job was stuffing envelopes in a cramped office in the basement of the castle.

### THE SPIDERS ON NATIONAL TV ►

The Spiders will play on national television six times in 2010-11, highlighted by two home games on ESPN2 against Xavier and Saint Louis and a road game on ESPNU against Dayton. Richmond will play on CBS College Sports three times, against Rhode Island and Duquesne at home and on the road at Temple. With additional TV games to be announced, the Spiders already have 10 games scheduled to be televised. Richmond had 15 games televised in 2009-10, including nine games on national TV. Richmond played on CBS with Bill Raftery and Verne Lundquist twice last year. The Spiders also played nationally televised games on ESPN2, ESPNU, CBS College Sports and Fox College Sports.

**RICHMOND'S MEMORABLE NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS**

**Richmond 72, Auburn 71 March 15, 1984 - 1st Round - Charlotte, N.C.**

In the first of what would become a tradition of postseason upsets, Richmond, behind the 26 points of John Newman and the 12 rebounds of John Davis, shocked Auburn 72-71 to advance in the NCAA Tournament. The Spiders won despite 23 points and 17 rebounds by future NBA star Charles Barkley. The Tigers entered the contest ranked 19th in the nation. Bill Flye added 19 points and Kelvin Johnson scored 16 for Richmond. Greg Beckwith dished out nine assists, grabbed seven rebounds and swiped four steals of the Spiders.

**Richmond 72, Indiana 69 March 18, 1988 - 1st Round - Hartford, Conn.**

Richmond held Bobby Knight and the Hoosiers scoreless for the last 2:40, knocking the defending NCAA champions out of the tournament with a 72-69 shocker. Rodney Rice nailed a jumper with less than a minute to play to put Richmond ahead to stay. Rice finished with 21 points, which led all Spiders in double figures. Peter Woolfolk finished with 16, Ken Atkinson with 14 and Steve Kratzer posted a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. The Spiders never trailed by more than six points in becoming only the second team to oust a defending champion in the first round. Keith Smart led Indiana with 23 points.

**Richmond 59, Ga. Tech 55 March 20, 1988 - 2nd Round - Hartford, Conn.**

For the third time in two years, Georgia Tech was the victim of a Spider upset bite. But on this occasion, Richmond was rewarded with its first-ever berth in the Sweet 16. Led by Peter Woolfolk's 27 points and nine rebounds, the Spiders knocked off the Yellow Jackets 59-55. Woolfolk, in perhaps his best game ever, went 11 of 21 from the floor. Scott Stapleton was Richmond's next-leading scorer with eight points. Dennis Scott and Brian Oliver - both future NBA players - led Tech with 15 points apiece

**Richmond 73, Syracuse 69 March 14, 1991 - 1st Round - College Park, Md.**

In one of the greatest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament, Richmond became the first No. 15 seed to knock off a No. 2, stunning seventh-ranked Syracuse 73-69. The Spiders never trailed, taking control from the opening tap. Richmond was clicking on all offensive cylinders and confusing the Orangemen with a matchup-up zone. Curtis Blair led a balanced attack with 18 points to go with six assists, while Terry Connolly, the man CBS called "Super Sub", scored 14 points, grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and dished out five assists. With the Spiders up by one with 21 seconds remaining, freshman guard Eugene Burroughs stepped to the free-throw line and calmly drained two shots to seal the victory for Richmond. Billy Owens led all scorers with 22 points.

**Richmond 62, S. Carolina 61 March 12, 1998 - 1st Rd. - Washington D.C.**

Jarod Stevenson scored 24 points, including a pair of free throws down the stretch, as 14th-seeded Richmond handed third seed South Carolina its second-straight first-round loss in the NCAA Tournament 62-61 in the East Region at Washington D.C. The Spiders held the Gamecocks scoreless for the final 76 seconds to secure the victory. After a drive by South Carolina's B.J. McKie and subsequent tap-in attempt were off the mark at the buzzer, the Spiders gathered at midcourt to celebrate yet another upset. Richmond's Marseilles Brown had five three-pointers in the first half to offset 16 points by McKie.

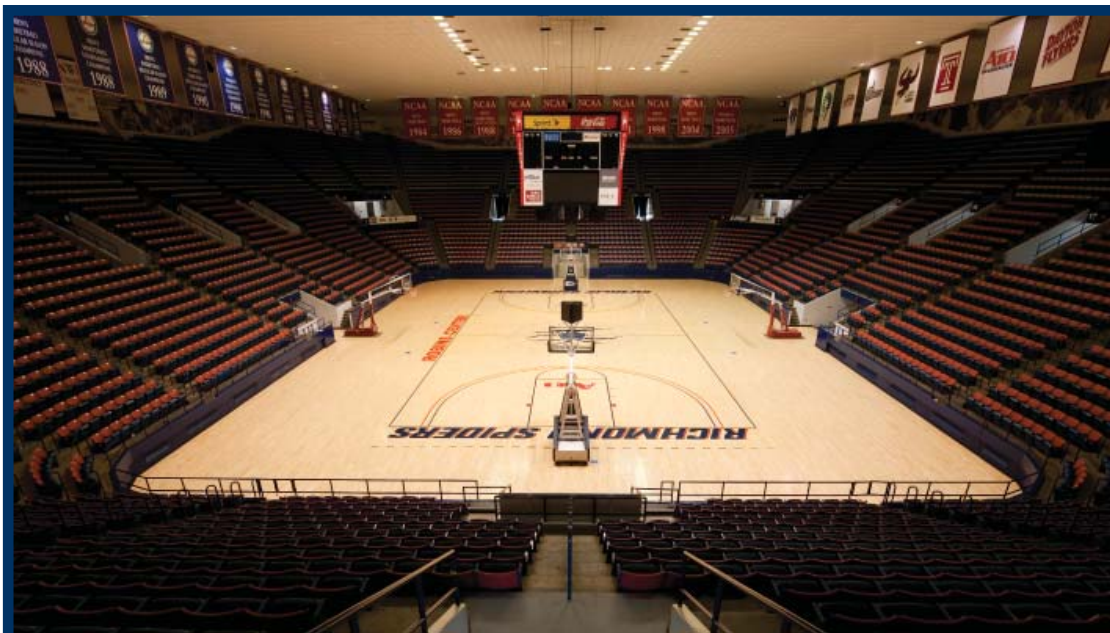

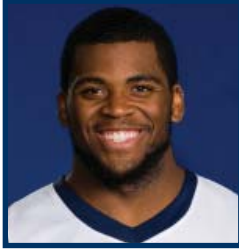
