- Rutgers vs. Maryland will broadcast on ESPNews with Mike Couzens (play-by-play) and Al Groh (analyst) on the call.
- The Rutgers IMG Sports Network pregame show begins at 11 a.m. with hosts Marc Malusis, Eric LeGrand and David Milewski. Game broadcast starts at noon with Chris Carlin and Ray Lucas in the booth, while Anthony Fucilli will provide sideline coverage.

### AGAINST MARYLAND

- Rutgers and Maryland will meet for the 12th time in the teams' all-time history with nine of the previous matchups occurring prior to Rutgers' entrance into the Big Ten Conference.
- Rutgers is 2-2 in College Park, including a 41-38 victory in 2014 and a 34-13 win in 2009.
- Maryland leads the all-time series, 6-5, with the first game taking place in 1920.

### SEASON FINALE

- Rutgers will close its 2016 season with a road matchup at Maryland. The Scarlet Knights will be working for their first victory away from home since defeating Indiana, 55-52, last season.
- It will be the final game for 20 Scarlet Knights who were honored during Senior Day last week. The group includes WR Carlton Agudosi, TE Nick Arcidiacono, RB Devan Carter, DB Anthony Cioffi, OL J.J. Denman, TE Matt Flanagan, RB Justin Goodwin, LB Andre Hunt, LB Isaiah Johnson, LB Greg Jones, DE Quanzell Lambert, LB Kevin Marquez, WR Vance Matthews, DB Marcus Parker, WR Andre Patton, John Tsimis, OL Chris Muller\*, OL Derrick Nelson\*, DE Julian Pinnix-Odrick\* and DT Darius Hamilton\* (\* - team captain).

### SCARLET KNIGHTS VS. TERRAPINS

- Rutgers will wrap up the regular season versus Maryland for the third-straight season, all Big Ten meetings.
- In the previous game in College Park, the Scarlet Knights staged a school-record-tying 25-point comeback to win 41-38 in 2014. Gary Nova threw for 347 yards, as Leonte Carroo, Janarion Grant and Andre Patton all topped 100 yards receiving. Defensively, RU allowed just three points in the second half, using a short-yardage stop on a late fourth down to seal the win.
- However, the Terrapins countered with a 21-point comeback victory last season in Piscataway. Carroo had a career-high 183 re-

The Athletic Communications Office is located on level one of the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium. For information regarding credentials, interviews, statistics, press conferences, etc., please call the Athletic Communications Office at 732-445-7028, visit CollegePressBox.com or e-mail Hasim Phillips at hphillips@scarletknights.com.

To assist in your coverage throughout the year, please read the media information on this page. All interview requests must be directed to and arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day (24 hours) in advance. Coaches, players and support staff are prohibited from participating in any interviews without prior authorization from the Athletic Communications Office.

### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via email to credentials@scarletknights.com. Admittance to the High Point Solutions Stadium press box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made formally to the credential email address.

Requests for game day credentials must be received at least two weeks in advance of the date of the contest to provide sufficient time for processing and mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at the West Gate Media Will Call (Media Entrance) beneath the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium.

Working space in the High Point Solutions Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication covering Rutgers or the current game opponent; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New Jersey, New York and Eastern Pennsylvania; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio representatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials.

### PHOTOGRAPHERS

Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

### PARKING

Media parking is located in the Green Lot, which is located next to the Indoor Practice Bubble. To enter the Green Lot, take River Road to Sutphen Road. Once on Sutphen, make your first left at Fitch Road and attendants will direct you to the media lot. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking pass in advance of the game.

### PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive information with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless internet access. Login information will be provided on the day of game.

### PHONES

A limited number of courtesy phones are available in the press box at High Point Solutions Stadium. The phones are all operator-assisted calls, or third-party billing calls can be made. Should you wish to have a phone installed at High Point Solutions Stadium, contact Verizon at 1-800-564-9911 or 9922.

### PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day (24 hours) in advance. Players are available in person on Monday at the weekly Rutgers football press conference, and following practice on

Tuesday and Wednesday, pending class schedules/availability.

Please consult with Hasim Phillips regarding availability as it will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and media member can be set up by the Athletic Communications Office. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday until following the game.

### COACH ASH INTERVIEWS

All interview requests for Rutgers head coach Chris Ash must be arranged through Hasim Phillips. In addition to post-practice media availability, coach Ash will be available to the media every Monday morning at his weekly press conference in the team meeting room of the Hale Center and on the weekly Big Ten teleconference on Tuesday morning at 12:56 p.m.

### POST-PRACTICE INTERVIEWS

On Tuesday, select offensive coaches and players will be available to the media post practice, while select defensive coaches and players will be available on Wednesday. Head coach Chris Ash will address the media following practice on Thursday.

### POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Head coach Chris Ash, offensive coordinator Drew Mehringer, defensive coordinator Jay Niemann and select players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available for interviews after each game. Following home games, the press conference for coach Ash will take place in the team meeting room on the second floor of the Hale Center, which is located on the east side of the stadium opposite the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Hale Center. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the linebackers meeting room on the second floor of the Hale Center.

### RUTGERS RADIO NETWORK

All Rutgers football games will be broadcast over the Rutgers IMG Sports Network to 50,000 watt WOR 710-AM in New York City and Central Jersey's WCTC 1450-AM.

Play-by-play announcer Chris Carlin is well known to sports radio fans throughout the State of Rutgers. Carlin is in his 16th year with the Rutgers Radio Network, including his 13th as the play-by-play voice of Rutgers football. Carlin is also the play-by-play voice for Rutgers basketball and appears on SNY, including serving as co-host of "Loud Mouths."

Former Rutgers standout quarterback Ray Lucas begins his eighth season as the color analyst on the Rutgers Radio Network. The seven-year NFL veteran has also been an analyst for SNY on its New York Jets programming since 1996 and won a New York Emmy for best analyst in 2010 for his work on SNY.

Anthony "Fooch" Fucilli returns for his 13th season as the Rutgers Radio Network sideline reporter. Fucilli has also worked as a field producer and reporter for MSG Network since 1989.

Marc Malusis is back for his eighth year as the pre-game and post-game host on the Rutgers Radio Network. The pre-game show starts one hour prior to kickoff while the post-game show stays on the air one hour following the game.

Former Rutgers defensive lineman Eric LeGrand begins his sixth season on the Rutgers Radio Network. LeGrand will provide insight and commentary on the pre-game show, halftime report and post-game.

- All-time, Maryland leads the series, 6-5, but the four meetings in College Park have been split.

- Rutgers wide receiver coach Jafar Williams played at Maryland from 2000-03 and totaled 90 receptions for 1,301 receiving yards. Williams received a bachelor of science degree in health and human performance from Maryland in 2003.

**BIG TEN BATTLE IN THE BRONX**

The Rutgers University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced Sept. 13 it will host the “Big Ten Battle in the Bronx,” a football and wrestling doubleheader between the Scarlet Knights and Maryland, at Yankee Stadium on Saturday, Nov. 4, 2017. The wrestling match, which will be the first in the history of the Stadium, will take place first, before head coach Chris Ash leads the football team into action later that day. “Never before has a doubleheader such as this taken place at a venue so iconic,” said Director of Athletics Patrick Hobbs. “We are thrilled to provide our fans this one-of-a-kind experience while enhancing the Big Ten brand in the world’s media capital. This is certain to be a very special day. We are thankful to the New York Yankees, the Big Ten Conference and the University of Maryland for helping to make it possible.”

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Rutgers held Penn State to three field goals in the first half, but the Nittany Lions pulled away with 30 points after the break to win, 39-0, in a night game at High Point Solutions Stadium.
- Defensively, safeties Saquan Hampton (11) and Anthony Cioffi (10) both set career highs in tackles, while Trevor Morris also reached double digits with 10. The unit also broke up five passes.
- The Scarlet Knights did not commit a turnover for the second time this season and K.J. Gray recovered a fumble on the opening kickoff.

**JONES, GRANT AND LAMBERT OUT**

- Fifth-year senior linebacker Greg Jones, senior wide receiver Janarion Grant and fifth-year senior defensive end Quanzell Lambert will all miss the remainder of the 2016 season due to injury. Grant and Lambert each sustained leg injuries during the Scarlet Knights’ game against Iowa, while Jones suffered a neck injury at Ohio State.
- In 42 consecutive game appearances, Grant amassed 270 rushing yards and 895 receiving. He is fourth all-time in the Rutgers record books with 4,251 all-purpose yards and first with 2,606 kickoff return yards. Grant is tied for first in NCAA FBS history with eight career kick return touchdowns (five kickoff, three punt).
- Lambert went down with an injury to his right leg in the fourth quarter against Iowa. He

had five tackles and a half sack before leaving the game. Lambert recorded 15 tackles, including 1.5 for loss in four games this season. He appeared in 40 career games with 15 starts at defensive end. For his career, Lambert has 86 tackles, 5.5 sacks, 15 tackles for loss, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and two pass deflections. Academically, he was named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy.

- Jones started the first five games of the season at strong-side linebacker after winning a position battle over the offseason. He picked up 20 tackles, including eight in the victory over New Mexico with one for a six-yard loss. Jones also had a sack and a pass break-up at Washington in his first start at Rutgers.

**NEWS AND NOTES**

- Rutgers has played 1,324 games, the most in major college football. The program is in its 148th year and 147th season of action.
- The Scarlet Knights have played four teams currently ranked in the top 10 in the AP poll.
- Rutgers has overcome a deficit of at least 21 points and rallied to win a game in three-straight seasons. RU came back from down 21 versus New Mexico in week three this season and won after down 25 points at Indiana in 2015 and at Maryland in 2014. The 25-point rally is the school record.
- Rutgers played eight consecutive games to start a season without a bye for the first time since 2008.
- Rutgers is 38th nationally in fewest penalties committed per game (5.45) and 25th in fewest penalty yards surrendered per game (44.64).
- Rutgers last played an overtime game in 2013 at SMU (triple-overtime win) and is 5-6 all-time in overtime games.

**ASH EARNS FIRST WIN AS HEAD COACH**

- Chris Ash earned his first win as a collegiate head coach by beating Howard, 52-14. The Scarlet Knights scored 52 unanswered points and held the Bison to five yards of total offense in the second half.
- It was the seventh consecutive home opener won by the Scarlet Knights, as the team improved to 102-36-10 all-time in its first home game of the season.

## OFFENSE

- Rutgers has transitioned to the spread offense in 2016 under offensive coordinator Drew Mehringer. He is the youngest play caller in the power five conferences at 28 years old.
- Rutgers' most yards in a Big Ten game this season was 385 versus Illinois.

- The school record for offensive plays run from scrimmage in a game is 95 set three times: 9/14/91 at Duke, 11/11/95 at Tulane, 10/1/11 at Syracuse (3OT). The season-high in 2015 was 83 against Kansas and Indiana. RU snapped the ball 88 times in the season opener at Washington and 80 versus Illinois.

- Rutgers has scored on 16-of-23 trips inside the red zone this season with a touchdown eight times.

- Thirteen of the 17 touchdown scoring drives have lasted under three minutes, with five under one minute. The longest touchdown-scoring

drive of the season was a 15-play, 90-yard trek over 6:31 at Minnesota that ended in scoring pass from Giovanni Rescigno to Jawuan Harris.

- Rutgers has generated 12 plays from scrimmage of at least 30 yards.

## Quarterbacks

- Five different players have thrown a pass this season: Chris Laviano, Janarion Grant, Giovanni Rescigno, Tylin Oden and Zach Allen.

## Giovanni Rescigno

- Started the last four games at quarterback.
- Threw for a career-best 258 yards versus Indiana with one passing and one rushing score. Has accounted for seven touchdowns this season (five passing, two rushing).

- Made first career start at Minnesota and went 22-for-38 with 220 passing yards and three touchdowns. It was the most passing yards by a RU quarterback in their first career start since Chas Dodd had 322 versus Connecticut in 2010. Became just the eighth different quarterback to start a game for the Scarlet Knights since the start of the 2006 season (excluding the wildcat formation).

- Completed passes to seven different receivers and also gained 63 yards rushing (26 net).

- Went 10-for-18 with 120 yards in the second half against Illinois. Also ran for 37 yards on 12 carries.

- Threw first career touchdown pass to Nick Arcidiacono on a jump throw.

- Ran for a 42-yard touchdown on first collegiate carry versus Howard.

## Chris Laviano

- Started the first seven games of the season and has 18 career starts.

- Has 21 career touchdown passes and needs four more to join program top-10 list.

- Played in all 12 games last season with 11 starts last season and went 187-for-307 passing for a 60.9 completion percentage – the best by an RU quarterback since Mike Teel in 2008 – and 16 touchdown passes.

- Totaled 2,247 passing yards to mark the eighth-most in a year in school history and placed seventh in the Big Ten with a 131.8 passing efficiency rating (third among returning Big Ten quarterbacks).

- Threw for a career-best 386 yards at Indiana, tied for the fifth-best mark in school history and sixth-best mark by a Big Ten quarterback last season. Went 7-of-8 for 105 yards in the fourth quarter to help engineer first career last-quarter comeback.

- Owns two career 300-yard passing games.

## Tylin Oden

- Saw action as the backup quarterback against Howard and in five Big Ten games.

- Led the team with 40 rushing yards at Michigan State.

**ASH ANNOUNCES 2016 TEAM CAPTAINS**

Rutgers football head coach Chris Ash announced that fifth-year seniors Darius Hamilton, Chris Muller, Derrick Nelson and Julian Pinnix-Odrick will serve as 2016 team captains for the Scarlet Knights. Hamilton earns the honor for the third-straight year, making him the first three-time captain in the history of Rutgers football dating back to 1869.

**THE HUNT**

Throughout the Rutgers football facilities are signs that read “The Hunt.” “‘The Hunt’ is really the theme of the team,” said Ash. We’re basically chasing the other teams in the Big Ten. We can’t make any secret about that. To chase them, we gotta go hunt every single day. Whether it’s in the weight room, out in the indoor (bubble) with our special workouts or in practice.”

**SCARLET KNIGHTS WORK TO BE 10 STRONG**

One of the mantras seen around the Rutgers football program is “10 Strong” which refers to the 10 position groups on the team: Quarterback, running back, tight end, wide receiver, offensive line, defensive line, linebacker, cornerback, safety and specialist. Head coach Chris Ash stresses the importance of all those units working at a high level in unison to reach peak performance. “That really is one of the ultimate goals of the program,” said Ash. “We’re not going to talk about winning, we’re not going to talk about championships, we’re not going to talk about red-letter games and things like that. We’re going to talk about the process of getting 10 strong. We have 10 position groups of the football team when you count the offense, defense and the specialists together. If we can get 10 units operating at maximum capacity, then we’re going to have a chance for success. That’s really what it’s all about for us.”

**LIFE BEYOND THE GAME**

Rutgers head coach Chris Ash instituted the “Life Beyond the Game” program, designed at preparing football players for their careers after their college playing days have ended. “The percentage of our guys going to the NFL is very small,” said Ash. “Even if you do go to the NFL, your lifespan there could be very short and then what are you going to do for the rest of your life? Universities have programs set up to help the general students population with alumni, but I think it’s our obligation to help student-athletes in their life after football.”

**PLAYER NUTRITION**

Upon taking over the Rutgers football program, head coach Chris Ash hired Allison Kreimeier, the team’s first full-time director of performance nutrition who’s responsible for making sure players understand the do’s and don’ts of eating right and staying hydrated. “There is so much that we’re putting into sports science and nutrition. We’re trying to promote the right type of lifestyle that helps you maximize performance.”

**HEAD COACH CHRIS ASH • FIRST SEASON**



A new era begins for the Birthplace of College Football as Chris Ash takes over as the 30th head coach in the 148-year history of Rutgers football.

A coach with national championship pedigree, Ash arrives “On the Banks,” with nearly two decades of collegiate coaching experience, including five years in the Big Ten Conference (four as a defensive coordinator) with four Big Ten Championships.

The 42-year-old Ash served as co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Ohio State and helped lead the Buckeyes to the 2014 national championship.

In his five seasons as a defensive coordinator, Ash pioneered four groups ranked in the top 25 statistically, including a top-10 defensive unit in 2015. As the defense coordinator at Wisconsin in 2011 and 2012, the Badgers put together back-to-back seasons ranked 15th overall in total defense. The 2011 squad was 13th in scoring defense while the 2012 team turned in a 17th-place ranking.

Ash was hired by Ohio State head coach Urban Meyer in January 2014 to improve a Buckeye defense that placed 112th in pass defense and 47th in total defense in 2013. In his first season, OSU’s defense ranked 19th nationally in total defense and 29th in pass defense. The Buckeyes also ranked fourth in the country with 24 interceptions en route to Big Ten, Sugar Bowl and national championships.

In 2015, the Ohio State defense continued its strides under Ash, ranking second in scoring defense nationally and ninth-best in total defense. The Buckeyes earned a berth in the Fiesta Bowl, finishing the season with a 12-1 record after defeating Notre Dame in the bowl game.

The 2016 NFL Draft saw numerous players from Ash’s defensive unit selected, including the first overall defensive player in Joey Bosa, who was picked third by the San Diego Chargers. In all, the draft featured six defensive players taken from Ohio State with three in the first round.

Prior to taking over the OSU defense, Ash held the defensive coordinator post and coached the secondary at the University of Arkansas in the Southeastern Conference in 2013 under head coach Bret Bielema. He helped improve Arkansas’ pass defense in his one season in Fayetteville, with the Razorbacks’ defense finishing 72nd nationally in passing yards allowed after ranking 113th in 2012.

Ash was first promoted to the defensive coordinator role in the Big Ten while at the University of Wisconsin, where he spent three seasons with the Badgers. His 2011 defense led the Big Ten (conference games only) in total defense and pass defense efficiency, and it ranked fourth nationally in fewest passing yards allowed (163.6), 13th in scoring (19.0) and 15th in total defense (316.4). In 2012, the UW defense ranked 15th nationally in total defense (322.5), 17th in scoring (19.1), 18th in fewest passing yards allowed (193.6), 22nd in pass efficiency and 24th against the run (128.9).

Ash began his coaching career as a defensive graduate assistant at his alma mater, Drake University, in 1997. He was promoted to defensive coordinator for the next two seasons before moving on to Iowa State University in 2000. Ash spent eight seasons over two different stints in Ames, including the 2009 season, during which current Houston head coach Tom Herman was also on the staff. Ash progressed from graduate assistant with the Cyclones in 2000-01 to defensive backs coach for a total of six seasons.

Ash spent the 2007 and 2008 seasons at San Diego State University as the defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator under head coach and College Football Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Long.

Ash has produced numerous instructional videos, including a three-video series -- “Aggressive 4-3 Defense” -- that includes shutting down the passing game and stuffing the run segments. He has coached 34 different players that have gone on to sign NFL contracts.

A native of Ottumwa, Iowa, Ash earned his undergraduate degree from Drake in 1996, and was a two-time letterwinner at defensive back for the Bulldogs. He is one of three from that era of Drake football to become a FBS head coach, joining Dave Doeren (NC State) and Charlie Partridge (Florida Atlantic). Ash completed his master’s degree in education from Iowa State in 2005.

Ash and his wife, Doreen, are the parents of a young son, Brady. Ash also has a son, Tanner, and a daughter, Jacey.
