Broncos Conclude First Season Under O'Brien with Winning WCC Record

Season Ends With Rain Out in Moraga

The 2002 Santa Clara University Broncos had their season come to an end when Sunday's series finale with Saint Mary's was cancelled due to inclement weather. The Broncos and Gaels had split the first two games of the three-game set in Moraga, Calif., with the Gaels taking game one by a score of 5-3 and Santa Clara taking game two by a 11-1 score. In Saturday's win for the Broncos, John Redmond improved to 6-6 on the season by throwing eight full innings of work in which he allowed only one run on eight hits while striking out six. Joey Gomes went 4-for-6 with a double to take his season hits total to 97 and his doubles total to 31.

All-West Coast Conference Honors Handed Out

Santa Clara University rightfielder Joey Gomes was named to the First Team All-West Coast Conference squad, while teammates Matt Travis and Jim Wallace were named to the Honorable Mention team Friday as announced by the league office.

Gomes earns the award after putting together one of the best offensive years in school history. After a year in which he batted only .223, the senior from Petaluma, Calif., busted out on to the national scene in 2002 with his .408 batting average, 97 hits, 31 doubles, 10 home runs and 51 RBI. He ended the season with a 14-game hitting streak and started the year with a 12-game streak. He had at least one hit in 50 of the team's 55 games, and 28 of the teams' 29 conference games. Additionally his 31 total doubles tied him for the WCC Record in doubles while the 19 doubles in WCC only games set a new conference mark that was previously held by Joe Ciccarella of Loyola Marymount in 1991.

Travis earns honorable mention honors after ending the season with a 5-4 overall record and a 4.35 ERA in 15 appearances, 11 of which were starts. In WCC only games, Travis posted a 3.51 ERA, striking out 36 in 56 1/3 innings of work. On four separate occasions, the junior from Glendora, Calif., went eight plus innings, striking out 20 in those 32 2/3 innings while walking only seven.

Wallace collects his first postseason honor after ending the season with a team-leading 12 home runs while finishing third on the team in both batting average (.330) and RBI (44). The senior catcher from Reno, Nev., had a breakthrough month in April, garnering WCC Player of the Week honors during the last week of April, and WCC Player of the Month honors just one week later. During that month Wallace batted .444 with eight home runs, 26 RBI and 18 runs scored.

Santa Clara finished its first year under new head coach Mark O'Brien with a 25-30 overall record and a 15-14 mark in the WCC. The Broncos finished second in the WCC Coast Division and posted a record above .500 in the conference for the second-straight year.

WCC Coast Division Decided on Final Weekend

The WCC Coast Division took all 10 weeks to finally determine its 2002 Champion. Santa Clara had a slim shot heading into the final weekend, needing to sweep Saint Mary's and have Gonzaga take two of three from Pepperdine. The Broncos lost their opportunity on Friday when they lost the series opener to the Gaels by a score of 5-3. As it turns out, it would not have mattered as Pepperdine took the final two games from Gonzaga after losing the series opener on Friday. As Coast Division Champion, Pepperdine will host San Diego in a three-game series to decide the WCC Champion May 24-26.

Gomes Has One of Greatest Offensive Years in School History

After a year in which he batted only .223, Joey Gomes busted out on to the national scene in 2002 with his .408 batting average, 97 hits, 31 doubles, 10 home runs and 51 RBI. The senior from Petaluma, Calif., had one of the best offensive years in schools history in 2002 and here's why. The .408 batting average ranked him No. 41 in the nation in 2002 and No. 3 in the Santa Clara record books for all-time single season batting average. The 97 hits was the third highest total in the nation at weeks end and ranked him second all-time at Santa Clara for hits in a single-season. The 31 doubles ranked second in the nation in 2002 but first all-time in Santa Clara history for a single-season, blowing by the previous record held by Mike Frank who had 25 in 1997. The 10 home runs was the second highest total on the team while the 51 RBI led the Broncos. He ended the season with a 14-game hitting streak and started the year with a 12-game streak. He had at least one hit in 50 of the team's 55 games, and 28 of the teams' 29 conference games. Additionally his 31 total doubles tied him for the WCC Record in doubles while the 19 doubles in WCC only games set a new conference mark that was previously held by Joe Ciccarella of Loyola Marymount in 1991. He was honored by the coaches in the WCC when he was selected as an unanimous choice First Team All-WCC selection.



LaBarbera Emerges in First Year on Mission Campus

Junior transfer A.J. LaBarbera came to Santa Clara from Long Beach State at the beginning of this year when Mark O'Brien was named the head coach of the Broncos. After a rough start at shortstop this season, LaBarbera's game solidified once he moved to his normal position of second base. The Broncos were six games below .500 with LaBarbera at shortstop, but one game above .500 with him at second base. While at shortstop the junior from Whittier, Calif. committed 15 errors in the first 18 games, but while at second base he committed only four errors in the final 37 contests. Offensively LaBarbera finished second on the team with his .342 average and second on the team in hits (81) and stolen bases (14). The 81 hits also placed him fourth in the WCC for the regular season. He was selected as the Newcomer of the Year by his teammates at the season-ending awards banquet held in late May.



Wallace "Catches" On

Santa Clara University catcher Jim Wallace had a breakthrough season in 2002 after posting a career .241 average the previous two seasons. This year the junior from Reno, Nev., led the Broncos with his 12 home runs and was third on the team in both batting average (.330) and runs batted in (44). He was selected to the All-WCC Honorable Mention squad and earned Co-Defensive MVP honors from his teammates at the annual awards banquet. He was selected as the WCC April Player of the Month after leading the Broncos to an 8-8 overall record and a 7-6 WCC mark during the month of April. During that time span he went 28-for-63 (.444) with eight home runs, five doubles and 26 RBI. He led the team in home runs, RBI, runs scored (18), total bases (56), slugging percentage (.949) and on base percentage (.515). His .444 batting average during the month lifted it from .267 up to where it stands now at .342. Behind the plate he notched 80 putouts and seven assists while not committing any errors or allowing any passed balls. All of this after two seasons in which he appeared in only half of the Broncos' games.



Starting Rotation Keeps Broncos in Games

The Santa Clara University baseball starting rotation was given high praise by WCC Coaches for their hard work and tenacity. They were credited with battling game in and game out, and keeping the Broncos in a position to battle for the Division Title so late in to the season. The starting rotation of Joe Diefenderfer, Matt Travis and John Redmond combined to total 15 of the team's 25 wins, seven of which came in league play. The three southpaws threw 278 of the team's 483 innings of work on the mound, striking out 163 while walking only 77. They combined for an ERA of 4.50, one full point below the team ERA of 5.51. Diefenderfer led the team in innings pitched with 103 2/3 in which he struck out 70 batters en route to a team-high three complete games. Travis was named the team's Pitcher of the Year at the awards banquet following a year in which he went 5-4 with a 4.35 ERA. Most notably though, he limited opposing batters to a team-best .266 average. Redmond finished the year with a 6-6 mark after winning his final start of the season against Saint Mary's. He threw 95 2/3 innings of work during 17 appearances, 14 of which were in the starting role.



The Catch of the Year...If Not Decade

On a sunny day at Buck Shaw Stadium in late April, Bronco fans were treated to one of the best catches anyone had ever seen. Junior Jack Headley, who alongside Jim Wallace was named Co-Defensive MVP for the Broncos this year, let instinct take over on what left coaches, fans and opposing players alike breathless. But to get a full grasp of what happened, read how Headley himself described the catch. If you don't believe it, take a look at the photo to the right.

"First of all I went to make my break on the ball and I slipped and fell. I then regained my footing and tried to go at it again but slipped again. I started to take off again but I stepped on my glove this time and it fell off. So to this point there are two slips and a stepping on the glove. So I got up and noticed that the ball had gotten some good ground and I had a long ways to go and it was too late to get my glove so my instincts told me to go after the ball. I have caught balls before with my bare hands as a kid in different sports and I was just basically praying that I caught this one."



Head Coach Mark O'Brien

In his first season on the Mission Campus, the Bay Area native guided Santa Clara to a 25-30 overall record and a 15-14 WCC mark. The conference record gave the Broncos their second straight season in which they just missed out on the WCC Championships series as well as giving them their second straight season in which they finished above .500. O'Brien is the 35th coach in the 111 years of baseball on the Mission Campus. He has built an impressive resume during his time as a coach, having served as the head coach at DeAnza Junior College in 1998 and spending four seasons as an assistant coach at Cal Poly in addition to his last three years at Stanford. Throughout his six-year coaching career O'Brien has helped over 45 players advance on to professional baseball, including seven first-round draft picks. O'Brien's list of first rounders includes Joe Borchard, Justin Wayne, Jason Young, and the four players from the Anchorage Bucs. He also coached the '99 minor league player of the year and current Oakland A's outfielder Adam Piatt. Other notable players that O'Brien has coached at some critical point of their career include current Kansas City Royals player Tony Cogan, three-time all-American and Stanford's all-time leading hitter John Gall, three-time all-American and all-time Pac-10 leader in runs batted in Andrew Beinbrink, Santa Clara All-American Bill Mott, and the NCAA all-time career saves leader Jack Krawczyk. O'Brien played collegiately at San Jose State from 1991-92 and was the Spartans' team captain in his final year. He was also named an Alaska Summer League All-Star in 1991 after coming to SJSU from St. Francis High School and DeAnza College.



40th Anniversary of Santa Clara at the College World Series

40 years ago the Santa Clara University Broncos made it to within one win of winning the baseball national championship. That team went 39-8 and lost to the University of Michigan by a score of 5-4 in 15 innings at the College World Series final. The Broncos lost to Florida State by a score of 5-1 to open up the CWS, but bounced back with wins over Missouri and Holy Cross before having to face the Seminoles for a second time. Santa Clara came away with a 11-6 victory over Florida State in their second meeting and defeated Texas by a score of 4-3 to advance to the Championship game for the only time in school history. As a team the '62 Broncos batted .287 while limiting their opponents to a .200 average. John Boccabella and Ernie Fazio combined for two of the greatest offensive seasons in Santa Clara history, as they combined for a .357 average with 25 home runs, 31 doubles, 12 triples and 125 runs batted in. The Bronco pitching staff also posted a memorable year, recording a 2.38 team ERA, led by Bob Garibaldi who went 10-3 on the year with a 1.86 ERA, 168 strikeouts and limiting opposing batters to a .150 batting average. Truly the 1962 Broncos were a memorable team that started the momentum for a great history of baseball on the Mission Campus.

Broncos Picked Sixth in Preseason WCC Coaches' Poll

The Santa Clara University baseball team was picked to finish sixth by the coaches in the annual West Coast Conference preseason poll that was released Thursday morning by the conference office. After a year in which the Broncos finished tied for first in their division and third overall, the Broncos return many of their key components from last season and a revitalized attitude under new head coach Mark O'Brien. The sixth place prediction was somewhat expected with a new coaching staff but O'Brien remains optimistic about his team's future. "Hopefully we can surprise some people this year," the first-year head coach said. "The key for us will be taking each game one at a time."
