## WCC MEN'S TOURNAMENT BEGINS FRIDAY!!!

The 17th annual WCC Men's Basketball Championship is upon us and eight teams have now refocused on obtaining the league tournament crown and the automatic bid to the big dance!!! This season the league will employ an 8-Team/ Play-In format for both the men and the women. Under the new format, the #5 through #8 seeds will compete in the opening round to determine who will advance to the next round of the tournament. Waiting for the winners in the quarterfinals will be the #3 and #4 seeds, who will have first round byes. The winners of the quarterfinal match-ups will go head-to-head with the #1 and #2 seeds, who will have byes through the first two rounds of the tournament. The 2002-03 regular season ended with Gonzaga earning its fifth conference title in the last six years and earning a bid directly into the tournament semifinals. The Zags' semifinal matchup will be televised on ESPN at 9:00pm on March 9. It is the first time that the men's semifinal has been televised nationally. San Diego earned the #2 seed in their final season playing host to the league's premier event. The Toreros, led by All-WCC first teamers Jason Blair and Jason Keep, overachieved according to the conference coaches after being picked to finish fourth in the league preseason poll.

**GONZAGA BULLDOGS (22-7/ 12-2 WCC) - HEAD COACH: MARK FEW**

The Bulldogs claimed their third straight regular season title with an exciting three-point win over San Diego on Saturday. The Zags are the first team since Pepperdine ('91-'93) to win three straight regular season titles...Blake Stepp became the third straight Bulldog to win WCC Player of the Year. In league play, Stepp led the conference in scoring (20.6ppg) and assists (5.79apg). He is only the second player since 1974-75 to lead the league in both categories. The other player was LMU's Jim Williamson in 1996-97...Ronny Turiaf was named to the All-WCC first team, becoming one of only 11 sophomores named to the first team in the last 10 years...Gonzaga led the WCC in scoring margin (+11.0) for the sixth straight season in league play. The Zags have posted a double-digit scoring margin against conference foes each of those seasons.



**LOYOLA MARYMOUNT LIONS (10-19/ 4-10 WCC) - HEAD COACH: STEVE AGGERS**

Loyola Marymount led the WCC in blocks for the first time since 1998, and for the fifth time since 1986. Leading the swat squad was the league's top shotblocker Sherman Gay. At 2.36 blocks per game, Gay became the first Lions' player to lead the league in blocks since 1979-80...LMU finished the regular season tied for sixth place in the conference standings, which is the team's best finish since 1995-96...The tiebreaker between LMU and Portland for the #6 and #7 seed came down to Sunday's RPI ranking. Portland's win over SCU coupled with LMU's loss to SMC helped the Pilots finish higher in the CBN RPI ratings. The two will face off in the first round on Friday.



**PEPPERDINE WAVES (15-12 /7-7 WCC) - HEAD COACH: PAUL WESTPHAL**

Pepperdine's win over Saint Mary's last Friday earned the Waves the #4 seed and a bye through the first round of the WCC tourney... The Waves have posted 15 or more wins the last six seasons...Alex Acker was the league's top freshman performer this season and earned the league's Freshman of the Year honor for his efforts. Acker's backcourt mate, Terrance Johnson, took home the award 2001-02. The Waves have had back-to-back Freshman of the Year before. Marcos Leite and Ollie Matson were named the top frosh in 1974 and 1975...For the third time in the last four years, Pepperdine led the WCC in steals (7.64spg) during league play, thanks to three players being ranked in the top 10 in swipes.



**PORTLAND PILOTS (11-16/ 4-10 WCC) - HEAD COACH: MICHAEL HOLTON**

Portland's win over Santa Clara gave them the #6 seed in the WCC tourney, the Pilots highest seed since 2000...freshman Donald Wilson and junior Casey Frandsen were named to the honorable mention All-WCC squad. Frandsen's 63 three-pointers this season ranks fourth in the Portland single-season annuals. Wilson was the Pilots' leading scorer in league play at 13.5 points per game...The Pilots are 0-3 as the #6 seed, but hold a 1-1 record against Loyola Marymount in the WCC tourney.



**SAINT MARY'S GAELS (13-14 / 6-8 WCC) - HEAD COACH: RANDY BENNETT**

For the second straight season, Saint Mary's has improved their seeding under second-year Head Coach Randy Bennett in the WCC tournament. The Gaels are the #5 seed in the tournament and will face Santa Clara in the first round...Senior guard Anthony Woodards became the first Saint Mary's player to earn WCC Defensive Player of the Year honors. Woodards was regularly assigned to the opposition's top offensive weapon at the guard position, including holding All-WCC guards Blake Stepp and John Cox to below their averages. Woodards held POY Blake Stepp to a 31 percent shooting night in Moraga and held Cox to nine points after the Don guard went 10 straight games averaging 20.9 ppg.



**SAN DIEGO TOREROS (16-11 / 10-4 WCC) - HEAD COACH: BRAD HOLLAND**

For only the second time since joining the WCC in 1979, San Diego led the league in scoring offense in conference games only. The Toreros averaged 77.8 ppg on their way to a 10-4 league record...Senior Jason Keep is the first Torero to lead the WCC in rebounding in conference games only. Keep led the league grabbing 9.6 caroms per contest. His .617 field goal percentage also led the conference. Jason Blair had the top field goal percentage (.595) in league play a year ago...San Diego is the #2 seed in the tournament for the first time. They have now been every seed except for eighth in the WCC Tourney...USD's 10-4 WCC record ties the school's best conference mark in 16 seasons



**SAN FRANCISCO DONS (14-13/ 9-5 WCC) - HEAD COACH: PHIL MATHEWS**

USF was the WCC's shooting champion, sweeping the field goal (49.2), 3-point (43.9%) and free-throw (74.4%) percentage titles. For USF, it was the first time the team had led the league in FG% in WCC play since 1979, the first time they have ever led in 3pt% (3pt started in 1988) and first time the Dons have led in FT% since 1995...In individual conference stats, John Cox was second in the league in scoring (18.9 ppg) behind Blake Stepp. However, Darrell Tucker, would have led the league in scoring with 22.1 ppg had he played the minimum 75% of USF's WCC contests. Jason Gaines led the WCC in assist/turnover ratio with 2.09..Tucker appears to be on the way to leading USF in scoring for the third straight season, the first USF player to do that since Quintin Dailey, who did it in 80-81-82. Bill Russell, Phil Smith and Ollie Johnson are the only other USF players to achieve that streak.



**SANTA CLARA BRONCOS (13-14/4-10 WCC) - HEAD COACH: DICK DAVEY**

Santa Clara will be the #8 seed in the WCC tournament for the first time ever. They face the Saint Mary's Gaels, whom they defeated on a last second shot on road on Feb. 23...standout freshman Brandon Rohe currently ranks eighth on the Santa Clara freshman scoring list with 289 points. He is three points shy of Kyle Bailey who ranks seventh. Against Portland, Rohe broke Steve Nash's SCU freshman record for three-pointers made in a season with 50 on the year...The Broncos have been in the WCC tournament finals two of the last four seasons...Jim Howell has been a terror on the offensive glass in league play. Howell averages a league-high 3.14 offensive boards per contest.

## AROUND THE WCC

• Gonzaga's Blake Stepp and San Diego's Jason Keep were named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 14 and 15 first teams. Gonzaga's Cory Violette and Ronny Turiaf garnered second-team recognition in District 14.

• This is third straight season that San Diego has hosted the WCC Men's and Women's Basketball Championships. The Toreros will try to become the first-ever men's host team to win the WCC tournament. Santa Clara made it to the finals twice when the tournament was held at Toso Pavilion, but fell both times.

• The Zags are trying to win their fifth straight WCC tournament title. The last four tourney MVP's have come from the Zags with former Bulldog and Atlanta Hawks guard Dan Dickau winning the award in 2001 and 2002.

• Pepperdine has made more semifinal appearances than any WCC team with 13. If they can win in the quarterfinals on Saturday, the Waves will have appeared in the last five semifinals, second only to Gonzaga, which has appeared in the last six.

• If USF wins their quarterfinal matchup on Saturday, they will play the host team in the WCC tournament for the fourth straight season.

• USF's Darrell Tucker currently sits eight points shy of former Cal player Sean Lampley on the Bay Area career scoring list. Tucker has 1,768 point in his career at USF, third on the school's all-time scoring list.

### WCC/RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK DARRELL TUCKER, SAN FRANCISCO



San Francisco's Darrell Tucker was named the WCC/Rawlings Player of the Week after leading the Dons to a 2-0 record against LMU and Pepperdine on the road. As a result of those wins, USF wrapped up the #3 seed in the WCC Tournament starting this week. Tucker was outstanding against LMU, netting 29 points and grabbing eight rebounds in a win in Gersten Pavilion. Tucker followed that up the next night with 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting at Pepperdine. The Oakland native grabbed seven caroms against the Waves. On the weekend, Tucker averaged 24 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists help the Dons to their highest seed since 1997.

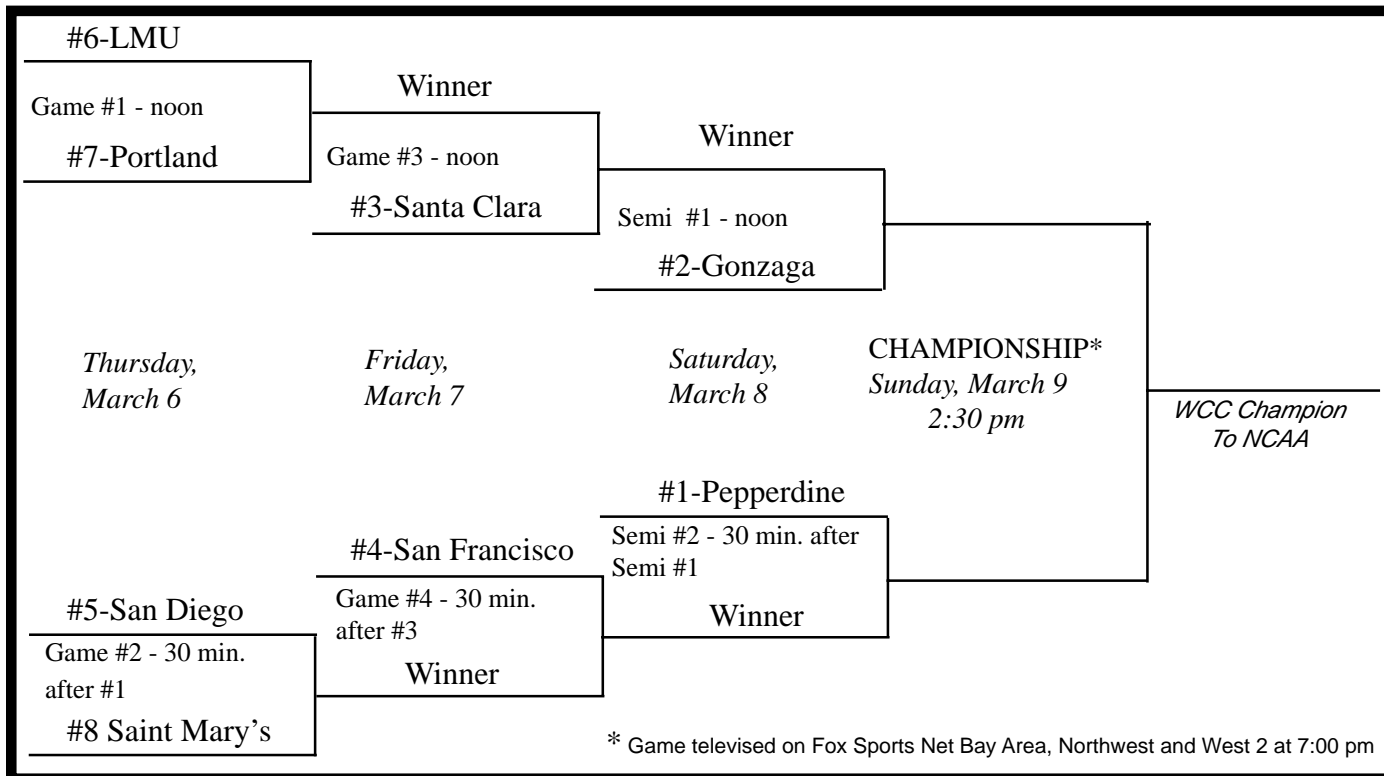
