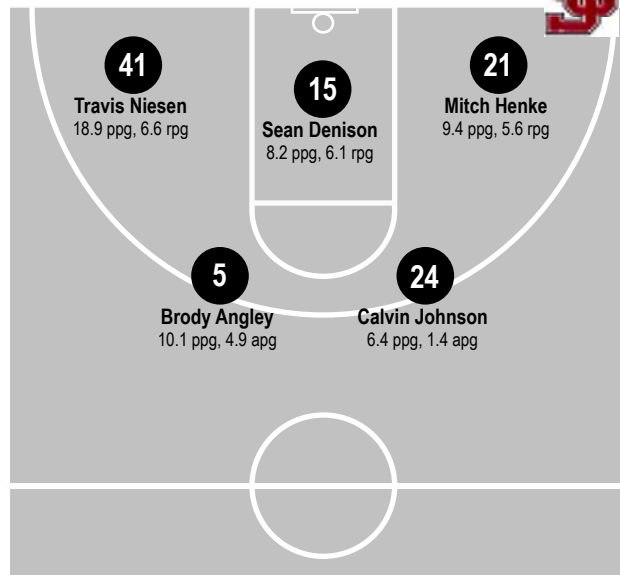

**Head Coach Dick Davey**

In his 14th season as the head coach at Santa Clara, Dick Davey has compiled a career record of 230-180 (112-84 WCC), which includes three 20-win seasons. Davey has a compiled a 129-58 record at home for a .690 winning percentage. He owns the most WCC wins among active coaches and is the first Bronco coach to lead Santa Clara to four 10-plus win seasons in WCC play. A three-time conference Coach of the Year, Davey has coached Santa Clara to three regular season league titles, one WCC Tournament title, three NCAA Tournament appearances and five wins over top-25 teams. Davey served as a Bronco assistant for 15 seasons (1977-92) under former head coach and athletic director Carroll Williams and is a member of the prestigious Board of Directors for the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

**Entering 1,000-Point Club**

Senior forward Travis Niesen became the 25th player in Santa Clara men's basketball history to surpass 1,000 points in his career. The Mission Viejo, Calif. native amassed 1,380 points in his 117 career appearances to rank for 13th on the Bronco scoring charts. He passed Marlon Garnett on Senior Day against Pepperdine then Jens Gordon during the WCC Championships.

**Daniels Breaks Out**

After scoring a career-high 17 points in SCU's

83-78 win at San Francisco, Bronco fans were left wondering "who is that Daniels guy?" Domineek Daniels, a freshman from Barstow, Calif., went 7-for-9 from the field and 2-for-2 from the three-point arc in the game.

**Making Shots Cures All**

In Santa Clara's 80-56 victory at Portland, the Broncos shot an eye-opening .653 from the field and .500 from behind the three-point arc. SCU's success rate was the 11th-highest in school history and the best since a .667 percentage against Boise State in 1989. The Broncos registered 11 steals in the game and 16 layups. Travis Niesen went 10-for-14 from the field, while Mitch Henke and Joey Kaempf both went 4-for-5 and "Big" John Bryant went 4-for-4.

**Making Shots Cures All - Part 2**

In Santa Clara's 83-78 win at San Francisco, the Broncos shot .549 from the field and an amazing .667 (6-for-9) from behind the three-point arc. That percentage is the fifth-best single-game performance (8 min.) in school history.

**Doing It With Defense**

Observers of SCU hoops over the years know that defense has always been the cornerstone of the program. This season's squad, despite games against the likes of North Carolina, Oregon and Mississippi State, among others, quietly posted some of solid defensive

statistics. The team limited opponents to a league-leading .407 shooting and averaging 3.4 blocks (both the best in the Dick Davey era) and 6.6 steals per game.

**One of SCU Top Freshmen Big Men Ever?**

"Big" John Bryant joined some pretty elite company with his rebounding and blocked shots stats through his first season as a college player. His 37 blocks surpassed Michael Norman (32 in 1980-81) as the most-ever for a Bronco freshman and his 180 rebounds is third on the list for SCU freshmen. Kurt Rambis (1976-77) is the all-time freshman rebounding leader with 313 and has the freshman single-game record with 22 against Saint Mary's. The former Los Angeles Laker also holds the freshmen record with 10 blocks against San Francisco. In addition, Bryant's field goal percentage of .590 is fourth-best on the single-season Bronco list for first-year players.

**Re-Writing The Freshman Record Books**

Bryant isn't the only Bronco freshman who has already made an assault on the Broncos record books. Guard Calvin Johnson ranked third in freshman three-point field goals (41) and fourth in attempts (122). The Morton, Texas native tied the school's freshman single-game record, held by Steve Nash and Brandon Rohe, with six treys against Cal Poly. He also ranks sixth on the list for most steals

by a freshman (29) and fifth in three-point percentage (.336).

**One of the Biggest Wins**

Santa Clara's 51-point margin of victory over Division II Notre Dame de Namur on Dec. 20 marked the third-highest at home since Toso Pavilion/Leavey Center opened in 1975. It was the fifth-highest for the Broncos all-time.

**WCC's Best Backfield?**

The Broncos guard duo of Brody Angley and Calvin Johnson just might be one of the best football backfields in college basketball this season. The two combined for more than 11,000 yards of total offense in high school. Angley was the Northern Section's career leader with 4,650 total yards at Enterprise (Redding, Calif.) HS. Johnson was an all-state quarterback and defensive back at Class A Morton (Texas) HS. He passed for 3,661 yards and rushed for 2,766 in two seasons and led the Indians to two playoff appearances.

**Stepping Up**

Travis Niesen surpassed the 20-point mark 13 times during the season and led the team in scoring in 20 of his 28 appearances. He increased his scoring average by around five points in each season at Santa Clara and scored a team-high 18.9 points per game, which ranked second in the West Coast Conference. Niesen, who lists becoming a police officer among his career plans, counts scoring 31

point at USEF, putting in 20 of his game-high 28 points against Pacific in the second half, hitting the game-winning layup at the buzzer at San Jose State and recording a 22-point effort against Gonzaga among the season's highlights.

**Surf's Up**

Niesen was featured in a full-page photo spread in the NCAA's official gameday program for the men's basketball Final Four. A photo taken on the court in the Leavey Center by David Gonzales featured Niesen in his basketball jersey, board shorts and flip-flops. He was holding his surf board surrounded by golf clubs, school books, guitar and, of course, basketballs.

**Good To Be Back**

No pun intended. Junior guard Brandon Rohe returned to the Broncos this season after redshirting last season due to a back injury. Prior the opener against Stanislaus, Rohe had missed the team's previous 37 games, dating back to a three-point loss at Pepperdine on Feb. 14, 2004. He had one of the top seasons ever for an SCU freshman, setting three-point shooting records in 2002-03. He missed the NDDU and Montana games due to back stiffness and was less than 100 percent throughout the entire season.

**Battling The Injury Bug**

It seems that every year at least one key member of the Bronco men's basketball team was on the injured list or missed at least one game during the season for an extended period of

time. This season is no exception.

- Senior forward Travis Niesen missed the San Diego game on Jan. 30 due to back spasms. He suffered a deep bruise while diving for a loose ball at Pepperdine. He also suffered a cut upper lip that required four stitches in the first half of the game at home against Saint Mary's.
- Senior forward Tristan Parham missed the first 10 games due to a knee injury and returned to action at the Cable Car Classic. After playing two games, he was out for the rest of the season due to the injury and will apply for a medical redshirt season of eligibility.
- Junior center Sean Denison missed the last seven games of the non-conference season and the Portland game due to a stress fracture in his right foot. He returned to action against Gonzaga, but suffered an ankle injury in the first minute at LMU and missed three league games.
- Junior guard Scott Dougherty missed the season due to preseason ankle surgery.
- Junior guard Brandon Rohe, who missed last season due to a back injury, missed two games due to stiffness in his back and has been at less than 100 percent during the entire season.
- Freshman guard Calvin Johnson missed the Pepperdine game due to illness and the Hawai'i contest due to a death in his family.
- Sophomore guard Brody Angley suffered a cut upper lip that required four stitches in the second half of the game at home against Saint Mary's.

**Davey Honored With Cable Car Inspirational Award**

SCU head coach Dick Davey was honored with the Dick and Kevin O'Connor Award at this year's 39th Cable Car Classic. The honor is usually reserved for the most inspirational player at the annual tournament. However, due to his strength and courage in the face of a number of personal & family challenges during the last several years, organizers appropriately presented the award to Davey.

**SCU Completes Winning Non-Conference Season**

After winning both games to take its 14th Cable Car Classic in 39 events, Santa Clara completed its non-conference schedule and has a 7-6 record in those games. SCU has won at least seven non-league games in 10 of Dick Davey's 14 seasons and has posted a winning record in pre-league play in nine of those seasons.

**Remembering SCU's Past**

Holder of 48 current individual, team and season records, the 1967-70 SCU men's basketball teams was honored at halftime of Saturday's game against the San Francisco. Highlighting the three-year span was Santa Clara's 73-12 record and Associated Press ranking of number two in the country. SCU won 35-straight games from midway during the 1967-68 season through the end of the regular 1969-70 season and registered 21-straight victories in 1968-69. These teams produced three NBA players in Dennis Awtrey and brothers Bud and Ralph Ogden.

**Inaugural Big Monday**

Santa Clara's Jan. 9 game against Gonzaga was the West Coast Conference's first-ever "Big Monday" contest televised by ESPN. The 9 p.m. tipoff was shown live nationally on ESPN2 and is believed to equal the latest tipoff ever for a Santa Clara men's basketball game. The WCC Tournament championship has been televised at 9 p.m. by ESPN the last several years. However, this season, the tournament final is scheduled for a 6 p.m. start.

**Broncos Feature Youth**

With just seven letterwinners returning for Santa Clara from last year's team (not including redshirt Brandon Rohe), it's obvious that

the Broncos featured a rather youthful club. Just 41 percent of the team's scoring and 42 percent of its rebounding from a year ago returned this season. Most notably, only 16 percent of its long-range shooting returned.

**Biggest Improvement**

With the loss of eight players from last season, the burning question entering the year was exactly who was going to fill the void. Sophomore forward Mitch Henke was a worthy candidate. The Minnetonka, Minn. native increased his per-game scoring average by around eight points per game and his rebounding numbers by around six per game. He was third on the team, behind Travis Niesen and Brody Angley, in scoring with an average of 9.4 points and was fourth with 5.6 rebounds per game. He scored 22 points against NDDU and was the team's leading three-point shooter at .364. He was also an academic all-WCC selection.

**Big John**

Freshman center John Bryant registered five double-figure rebounding games and grabbed 15 in the opener against CS Stanislaus, an eye-opening 17 against UC Riverside and 13 against Portland in the WCC opener. The 6'-11", 325-pound who wears a size 18 shoe, averaged 6.2 boards and 1.6 blocks per game (both 3rd in the WCC). He teamed with Sean Denison to give the Broncos two eligible 6'-11" interior players, while 7'-0" junior Josh Higgins sat out the season due to NCAA transfer rules. All three will be eligible next season.

The Warriors attempted an incredible 47 three-point field goals in the game, completely obliterating the previous SCU opponent record of 37 by UC Santa Cruz in 2002. That helped the Broncos grab a total of 61 rebounds, which is equaled the sixth-highest single game total for a SCU team.

winning percentage. He recorded a 73-27 (.730) record in Toso Pavilion and has a 56-31 (.644) mark in the Leavey Center since the state-of-the-art building "re-opened" on Dec. 13, 2000.

**Davey is "Dean" of Coaches**

Recently completing his 14th season at Santa Clara, Dick Davey owns the distinction of being the longest-tenured coach in the WCC as well as the longest among Division I college coaches in the Bay Area. He is also the second-longest tenured coach among Division I institutions in the state of California behind Bob Thomason of Pacific (18th). Behind Davey in the WCC is San Diego's Brad Holland (12), while California's Ben Braun (10) is the next highest in the Bay Area. Davey's

230 total wins is also a league-high and his 112 league wins is tied for the second-most in WCC history.

**Davey Among Best Ever**

Dick Davey owns the second-most wins for a Bronco head basketball coach in Santa Clara history. Davey, who surpassed Bob Feerick last season, owns a 230-180 overall record in his 14th season at SCU. Carroll Williams is the all-time Santa Clara leader with a 344-274 mark in 22 seasons. Davey is also the second-longest tenured coach in SCU history, behind Williams and just ahead of Feerick.

**SCU Registers "Dream" Fall Season**

With four teams ranked in the national top-20, three in NCAA postseason play, two in NCAA quarterfinals and a first-ever appearance in the NCAA volleyball semifinals, the fall 2005 athletic season has been one of the most successful in SCU history. Sports Illustrated ranked the Broncos as high as 13th in its fall all-sports rankings and Santa Clara is ranked among the top schools in the nation in the NACDA Director's Cup standings. Among the numerous fall highlights:

- **Volleyball** finished the season ranked 4th nationally and advanced to the NCAA semifinals for the first time ever. Cassie Perret became the program's first first-team All-America selection, while Crystal Matich and Anna Cmaylo earned third-team honors. Jon Wallace was named the national coach of the year.
- **Women's soccer** advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals for the 11th-straight year, the only team in the nation to do so.
- **Men's soccer** ranked as high as 4th nationally and advanced to the NCAA second round where it lost in penalty kicks. Mehdi Ballouchy was named first-team All-America and WCC Player of the Year.
- **Men's water polo** ranked 20th in the final national poll and defeated a top-10 team for the first time in school history.
- **Sports Illustrated** placed Santa Clara as high as 13th in its national all-sports ranking.
- **SCU is ranked** eighth in the NACDA Director's Cup standings.
- **Men's golf** won back-to-back tournaments

and finished second in the third event to open the fall season under first-year head coach Rob Miller. The team has started the fall season by winning its first two events of the year.

- **Women's golfer** Megan Stoddard won her first tournament as a Bronco and the team posted a second-place finish at the Cal Poly Invitational.
- **Women's cross country** runner Shannon Bell finished second in the WCC Championships, equaling the best finish ever for an SCU runner in the meet.
- **Women's basketball** tied for the WCC regular-season title and earned the #1 seed in the tournament. Michelle Cozad was the Player of the Year and Michelle Bento-Jackson was the Coach of the Year.

**Special Recognition**

At halftime of the Santa Clara vs. Gonzaga game, there was a special recognition of the Bronco volleyball team that finished the season with a 27-5 record, number four national ranking and the program's first-ever NCAA semifinal appearance. West Coast Conference Player of the Year Cassie Perret was named the program's first-ever first-team All-America, while Anna Cmaylo and Crystal Match earned third-team honors. Jon Wallace was named the West Region, WCC and National Coach of the Year. Santa Clara mayor Patricia M. Mahan presented the team with a special proclamation from the city.

**SCU Athletics Ranks Among Director's Cup Top 10**

Following one of the most successful fall seasons in school history, the Santa Clara University athletic program is ranked eighth in the prestigious U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup standings, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics announced. Santa Clara compiled 206 points due to its NCAA semifinal appearance in volleyball, quarterfinal appearance in women's soccer and second round qualification in men's soccer. The Broncos are just 7.5 points behind seventh-place North Carolina in the standings.

Through league and other broadcast agreements, the Santa Clara men's basketball team is expected to appear on television several times this season. The Broncos receive national and regional exposure on Fox, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN U, ESPN2 HD, Comcast Sportsnet as well as an additional appearance at Gonzaga and San Diego. Digital satellite services such as DIRECTV and Dish Network provide additional international carriage.

**Former SCU Coach Appointed To Prestigious NIT Board**

The National Invitation Tournament appointed former Santa Clara coach and athletic director Carroll Williams to its first six-member at-large selection committee. The committee will forge the strategic direction for the NIT Season Tip-Off and postseason NIT tournaments. The NIT, L.L.C., which is owned by the NCAA, was created earlier this year and is the entity that oversees the day-to-day operations of the NIT tournaments. The members of the committee are Gene Keady, Reggie Minton, C.M. Newton, John Powers, Dean Smith and Williams. Newton will serve as chair.

**Santa Clara Enjoys Stellar Graduation Rates**

Student-athletes at Santa Clara University graduate at the highest rate in the WCC and the second-highest among Division I institutions in the state of California. According to the 2005 NCAA's grad rates report, SCU student-athletes graduated at a four-year average rate of 76 percent while the overall student body at the institution graduated at a slightly higher rate of 82 percent. The report

examined a four-year rolling average ending with freshman entering school in 1998-99. SCU's student-athlete graduation rate is considerably higher than the Division I average of 62 percent for student-athletes.

**Broncos Picked Fifth in WCC**

The Broncos were selected by WCC coaches to finish fifth in the league, according to the annual preseason poll. Gonzaga was picked to repeat as league champions and earned six of the eight possible first-place votes. Saint Mary's was selected second and received one vote for the top spot. Portland was tabbed for third, while LMU was fourth and SCU was fifth. San Francisco, San Diego and Pepperdine were picked sixth through eighth.
