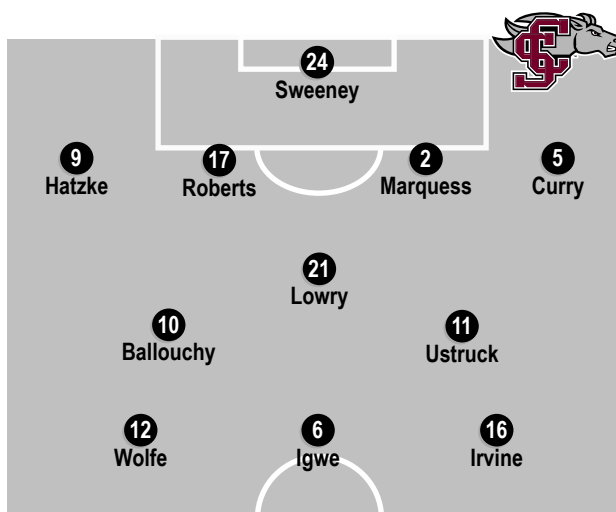

Next Up For Bronco Soccer

Should the Broncos advance in the College Cup with a win at Cal on Tuesday, they would play the winner of Wake Forest (12-7-2) at 10th-seeded Old Dominion (15-3-2) this weekend.

Head Coach Cameron Rast

Cameron Rast (Santa Clara '92) is in his fourth season at the helm of the Santa Clara men's soccer program and has a 54-24-7 (.676) overall record and a 22-12-2 (.639) mark in West Coast Conference matches. He has led the Broncos to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last three seasons and his 2003 team advanced to the NCAA College Cup, where it lost a double-overtime decision to eventual national champion Indiana. After eight years as an assistant coach and four as a player, Rast has reached the College Cup in

three different capacities while at Santa Clara. He is already seventh on the WCC career list for league wins and is currently third (behind former SCU mentor Steve Sampson) all-time in winning percentage in WCC matches. Rast is assisted by Eric Yamamoto, Rusty Johnson and Tim Martin.

Quick Review of the Season

Santa Clara opened the season with a bang, knocking off then second-ranked UCLA 3-2 in a neutral site match at Cal State Fullerton. Keith DeVey netted the game-winner in the 86th minute to knock-off host Fullerton two days later. Following a 3-1 loss at then 6th-ranked Maryland, the Broncos shutout previously undefeated Georgetown in College Park. SCU returned home to win an always-tough 2-1 match against Stanford on a header by freshman Jide Ogunbiyi off a cross from

Peter Lowry in the 97th minute. After a disappointing, last-minute 1-0 loss at then 6th-ranked Cal, Santa Clara won its next four-straight matches: 3-0 over then 25th-ranked Florida International, 2-0 at San Jose State, 3-2 over Saint Mary's in the WCC opener and 2-0 at San Diego. Santa Clara lost just once in its next seven league matches to setup a chance to earn the regular-season WCC title. But, a draw against San Diego and consecutive losses to LMU at home and at Gonzaga and Portland ended SCU's title hopes and gave the Broncos a 12-6-2 record heading into the playoffs.

College Cup 1st Round Recap

Peter Lowry scored the game-winner in the 47th minute on a world-class free kick from 25 yards out to give Santa Clara a 1-0 victory over the Ohio State in the College Cup first round in front of 1,143 fans at Buck Shaw Stadium on Friday, Nov. 18. A total of seven yellow cards, all in the second half, were issued during the physical affair and the Buckeyes committed a game-high 28 fouls, compared to Santa Clara's 17. Bronco keeper Kevin Sweeney earned his eighth shutout of the season after stopping four of Ohio State's 10 shots. The San Jose, Calif. native was the beneficiary of a tough Bronco defense that bent on several occasions but did not break. Just after halftime, Santa Clara earned a free kick when Rohrer fouled Lowry in the middle of the field, approximately seven yards from the top of the penalty area. The Fair Oaks, Calif. native stepped-up and blasted the free kick over the OSU wall, past goalkeeper Ray Burse and into the upper left corner of the goal. The Buckeyes put pressure on SCU in the final 10 minutes of the match, earning four corner kicks and taking five shots during that stretch. In the 90th minute, OSU's Antonio Garcia launched a shot from 12 yards in front of goal that sailed just over the crossbar.

Last Season For The Broncos

Santa Clara finished last season with a 15-6-0 overall record and an 8-4-0 mark in West Coast Conference play. The Broncos advanced to the College Cup, where they dropped a narrow 2-1 overtime decision at sixth-ranked Cal. Santa Clara started the season by winning its first seven matches and 11 of its first 12 before enduring a three-match losing streak, all on the road in league play. SCU went 7-2-0 at home and 3-0-0 in neutral site games. Mehdi Ballouchy was the team's scoring leader with 15 points on three goals and nine assists. Keith DeVey scored a team-high five goals. A total of

13 different Broncos scored at least one goal. Goalkeeper Kent Harkness allowed just 0.76 goals per game and registered six shutouts. Christopher Moreo played in just eight games but allowed just three goals and registered 15 saves and one shutout.

Individually Speaking

In terms of individual honors, the 2005 season has been something of a boon for the Broncos. Seven different players have earned either national or league recognition as a player of the week, player of the month or other significant honor. A list of SCU's individual accolades are listed in the column on the left.

Sweeney Enters Record Books

Senior keeper Kevin Sweeney has entered the school's single season top-20 lists in saves (7th, 65), goals against average (t8th, 0.70) and shutouts (t9th, 8). Current Bronco assistant coaches Eric Yamamoto and Rusty Johnson and MLS all-star Joe Cannon are among the former Broncos ranked ahead of Sweeney.

DeVey Wins Another Academic Honor

Junior forward Keith DeVey was named to the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District team for the second-straight season. He is a communication major at Santa Clara.

Sweeney Earns Accolades

Following a pair of shutouts on consecutive outings against San Francisco, Bronco senior goalkeeper Kevin Sweeney was named the WCC Player of the Week. The San Jose, Calif. native had not played in a collegiate game prior to this season and is among the nation's leaders in goals against average. He became the fifth SCU player to earn Player of the Week honors.

Rast Surpasses 50

Cameron Rast earned his 50th career win as a head coach when the Broncos' shut out Portland 3-0 on Oct. 14 at Buck Shaw Stadium. Rast, a 1991 graduate of SCU, was the second-fastest SCU men's soccer coach ever to earn 50 wins, behind Mitch Murray. Steve Sampson earned his 50th at SCU in the NCAA semifinals in 1989.

Guzman Earns WCC Honor

Just days after his home country of Costa Rica qualified for the World Cup, Hector Guzman scored twice against Portland and was named the West Coast Conference Player of the Week. He has seven goals in two seasons and five of those have been for game-winners, including two of his four this year.

Injury Bug Hits Broncos

Junior midfielder Erik Ustruck, sophomore defender Jamil Roberts and senior forward Eric Irvine each missed significant time this season due to injury. Ustruck suffered a knee injury against LMU and was out for a month, while Roberts injured his elbow on a tackle against Saint Mary's and was out for approx. six weeks. Irvine, a team co-captain, suffered chronic back pain for the entire season and played in just 11 games, mostly during the latter half of the season. Kelechi Igwe, Aaron Clubb, Jeff Scott and Keith DeVey have each missed matches due to injury.

Ustruck Earns National Honor

Erik Ustruck earned national and WCC player of the week honors on Oct. 3 after consecutive solid performances against San Jose State and Saint Mary's. The St. Louis, Mo. native registered a goal and two assists in the overtime win against the Gaels.

Starting Off The Season With A Bang - Hawaiian Style

Junior forward Keith DeVey made sure the Broncos began the season on a successful note with thrilling game-winning goals against then-No. 2 UCLA and Cal State Fullerton. For his efforts, the Kula, Hawai'i native was named the National Player of the Week by Soccer America. He was also named to the national teams of the week for Soccer America, College Soccer News and Top Drawer Soccer and he was named the WCC co-Player of the Week. He followed that performance with an assist at fifth-ranked Maryland and two goals against Georgetown and, for the second straight week, was named the WCC Player of the Week.

Freshman Earns WCC Honor

First-year defender Jide Ogunbiyi was named the West Coast Conference Player of the Week on Sept. 19 after stellar defensive performances against Stanford and Cal. The Gwynedd, Pa. native also headed-in the game-winning goal in overtime against the Cardinal.

Several Broncos Named adidas All-Classic Team

Mehdi Ballouchy, Keith DeVey and Peter Lowry were named to the Maryland adidas Classic all-tournament team for their performances last weekend in College Park, Md.

Ballouchy Named To MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List

Junior midfielder Mehdi Ballouchy was named as one of 25 players on the watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy, awarded to the nation's top college soccer player. A native of Casablanca, Morocco, he was also named a preseason All-America by Soccer America and College Soccer News.

International Flavor

The meals served around the Broncos' dinner table feature a little different menu this year with players from four different countries on the roster and two others who have naturalized parents who emigrated to the U.S. All-American Mehdi Ballouchy hails from Casablanca, Morocco, while forward Hector Guzman is a San Jose, Costa Rica native. Senior defender Ted Kristensson is from Ludvika, Sweden. Jide Ogunbiyi's parents are originally from Nigeria and Mutanda Kwesele was born in Zambia.

WCC Continues Round Robin

For the second-straight season, the West Coast Conference will compete in a double round robin format during conference play. The teams meet each other twice during the WCC slate, with each team hosting a match and expanding the conference schedule from six matches to 12 matches. Prior to this season, conference teams met only once per season with the home site alternating each year.
