The Santa Clara women's soccer team will travel to No. 3 University of Portland to take on the Pilots live on ESPNU. Kick off is set for 1:30 p.m. PT on Sunday, Nov. 2.

## Last Week For Women's Soccer

The Broncos were edged 2-1 by both Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine this past weekend in Southern California on their first conference road trip.

In Los Angeles, Santa Clara fell 2-1 to LMU on Oct. 24. Anessa Patton scored SCU's lone goal in the 77th minute off a Lexi Orand assist. Orand crossed the ball to Patton who volleyed it from six yards out over the Lions' goal keeper. Santa Clara was the more aggressive team and statistically led the game in shots 21-11. Senior keeper Meagan McCray got the start in goal and had one save in the game.

Two days later, the Broncos traveled to Malibu to take on the Waves of Pepperdine. Junior Katherine Reynolds converted a penalty kick in the 48th minute, after Chelsea Bednarz was fouled in the box. McCray and Bianca Henninger split time in goal for Santa Clara. McCray notched four saves in the first half and conceded the Waves' two goals. Freshman Henninger kept Pepperdine scoreless in the second

half, but the SCU offense could not get the ball to the back of the net to come back from behind.

### SCU to Play Live on ESPNU

The Broncos will play live on the national stage for the second time this season. On Sunday, Nov. 2, Santa Clara will travel to No. 3 Portland to take on the Pilots live on ESPNU at 1:30 p.m. PT.

### Reynolds Leads SCU Offense

Tri-captain Katherine Reynolds is Santa Clara's offensive leader after converting her second penalty kick of the season at Pepperdine on Oct. 26. Reynolds has scored three goals in three games for the Broncos. The junior from Medina, Wash. who has started and played in all 18 games this season has tallied four assists and 10 points.

### Sophomore Patton Reaches Back of the Net

Sophomore Anessa Patton scored her second goal of the season and of her career at LMU on Oct. 24. Patton scored the Broncos lone goal against the Lions off a Lexi Orand assist.

### McCray Leads Bronco Defense

Regardless of Santa Clara's overall record, solo starting senior Meagan McCray has been the heart of the Bronco defense. The SCU goal keeper has started and played in 15 games this season, posts 56 saves and has a 1.54 goals against average. McCray has shutout two teams this season, Yale and then No. 2 UCLA.

### Scouting Pepperdine

Pepperdine returns home after earning a win and a loss this past weekend at Gonzaga and Portland, respectively, as they improved their record to 6-8-2 overall, 1-2-0 WCC. They are fifth in the conference, one place above the Broncos.

On Oct. 19 they fell to then No. 3 Portland, 2-1. Amanda Rupp scored the Waves lone goal in the second half off a Sophia Medina assist. Pepperdine had 15 shots compared to the Pilots 29, and keeper Kayla Stole had eight saves in 90 minutes.

Two days prior, the Waves shutout Gonzaga 2-0 in

Washington. Emily Wynne tallied a goal, and an assist on Laura Cole's goal. Keeper Stole had one save in the game.

Santa Clara defeated Pepperdine last season on Oct. 19, 2-1. The Broncos have defeated the Waves 10 times, only falling four times in their 14 meetings in program history.

### On Deck

The Broncos remain on the road, as they travel to WCC leaders No. 3 Portland. Kick off is set for Sunday, Nov. 2 at 1:30 p.m. live on ESPNU.

### SCU Gets in the Win Column

Santa Clara earned both its first home and conference win of the season. The Broncos, who had not seen a win since Sept. 7, when they defeated then No. 21 Cal State Fullerton, 2-1, shutout conference rival University of San Francisco 3-0. SCU broke its four game losing streak two days prior with a 1-1 double overtime.

### Reynolds Named WCC Player of the Week

Katherine Reynolds was named WCC Player of the Week for the first time in her SCU career. The Bronco tri-captain had a standout weekend for Santa Clara as she was an integral part in SCU's 3-0 shutout over conference rival University of San Francisco.

The junior from Medina, Wash. got on the board for the first time this season, scoring two goals and notching an assist in the game. She converted a penalty kick and less than three minutes later she scored a second goal. Twenty minutes later she found Jenny LaPonte in the box to assist on LaPonte's goal. She had four shots in the game, and two days prior versus Saint Mary's she had two shots in the 1-1 double overtime draw.

### LaPonte Leads SCU Offense

Jenny LaPonte scored goals in both Bronco games this past weekend. The versatile freshman, who has played at forward, midfield and defender this season, leads the Broncos' offense with four goals and eight points. LaPonte has started nine of the 15 games she's seen action in. This season she has scored two goals just minutes after subbing in the game. The first was on Aug. 22 at San Jose State, in her SCU debut, and on Oct. 19 versus USF. Both games the Broncos shutout their respective opponents 3-0.

### Reynolds Named to Soccer America Team of the Week

In what was a breakout game for the consistent Katherine Reynolds, she was also honored this week by Soccer America, as a player named to their Team of the Week. The junior tri-captain scored two goals and tallied an assist versus University of San Francisco on Oct. 19. She converted SCU's

first penalty kick of the season and then scored a second goal minutes later in the first half. In the 40th minute, she assisted Jenny LaPonte's goal.

### Broncos' Keepers Shutout Dons

On Oct. 19 the Broncos shutout the Dons of University of San Francisco, with all three SCU goal keepers, Bianca Henninger, Lisa Lahman and Meagan McCray, seeing time in goal. McCray started and played the entire first half, and Henninger and Lahman split time in the second half. They collectively tallied three saves on USF's eight shots.

### Bosio and Orand, Academic All-America Nominees

Junior forwards Kiki Bosio and Lexi Orand were nominated last week for Academic All-America honors sponsored by ESPN The Magazine and CoSida. Nominees are student-athletes who have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. Bosio started 14 games for the Broncos and posts one goal and one assist. She was named to the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Watch List entering the season and earned all-tournament honors at the Santa Clara/adidas Classic.

Orand, who has seen time in 14 contests, starting 10, has scored a goal and an assist this season as well. Both Bosio and Orand were named to the all-tournament team at the Inn at Saint Mary's Classic.

### Bosio Reaches Back of the Net

Junior forward Kiki Bosio broke her thirteen game scoring slump this past weekend versus then No. 20 University of San Diego. Bosio was credited with the Broncos first half goal, when she took a SCU throw in towards the box. The ball was then tipped in by USD's goal keeper Brittany Cameron, to give Santa Clara the 1-0 lead. Bosio, who was an offensive leader last season for the Broncos, posts a goal and an assist on the season. She is third in points with three. She also has been honored this season as a M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Watch List nominee, and was named to the all-tournament teams at the Inn at Saint Mary's Soccer Classic at Notre Dame and the Santa Clara/adidas Classic.

### Solo Senior, McCray Continues to Play Consistently

While the Broncos have faced ranked opponents in almost every week of play this season, solo starting senior goal keeper Meagan McCray continues to lead Santa Clara through solid play in this difficult season. With an undoubtedly very tough schedule in 2008, the Broncos' keeper has worked immensely hard this season to keep SCU in games this season. She has posted 47 saves in 11 games, and has tallied two shutouts, one was versus then No. 2 UCLA on Sept. 25.

## 2008 Santa Clara Women's Soccer • Weekly Press Notes

### Head Coach Jerry Smith

Head coach Jerry Smith enters his 22nd season at the helm of the Santa Clara women's soccer program in 2008. Although he is most known for the development of his players and teams, Smith also produces success and is the winningest women's soccer coach in Santa Clara history, having compiled a record of 338-90-30 (.771)--third best in NCAA Division I history--establishing a standard of excellence few can match.

Since taking over the head coaching duties at Santa Clara in the spring of 1987, Smith has built the Bronco soccer program into a national power. For 19 consecutive seasons, his Broncos have reached the NCAA Tournament and have been ranked among the top 10 teams in the country. Smith's success culminated in 2001, as he was named the National Coach of the Year after bringing home the University's first outright NCAA championship.

In 2007, Smith coached eight athletes to All-West Coast Conference honors, and two players to the NSCAA/adidas All-West Region teams. Five athletes also earned Soccer Buzz All-West Region accolades. The Broncos finished the season with their 19 straight NCAA Tournament appearance, bowing out in the first round to the Golden Bears of Cal, 2-0. Santa Clara compiled a 12-6-3 overall record and went 4-3-0 in WCC action. SCU's season was highlighted by an early 7-1 rout of then-No. 2 Notre Dame in the first round of the 2007 Santa Clara adidas Classic.

He is assisted by associate head coach Gregg Murphy, and assistant coaches Curtis McAlister and former Bronco standout Devvyn Hawkins.

This season the Broncos have faced nine ranked opponents this season, eight of which are still in the national rankings, and five are in the top-10, including No. 1 Notre Dame. On Aug. 29, SCU defeated then No. 10 West Virginia, 2-1, in overtime, on Sept. 7, 2-1, at then No. 21 Cal State Fullerton, and on Sept. 25, they hosted then No. 2 UCLA to a double overtime draw.

## SCU Kicks Off Conference Play

The Broncos kick off WCC conference play this weekend versus No. 20 USD. With the conclusion of non-conference play, the Broncos will be on a regimented schedule along with the other teams in the league. All teams will play the same number of games in a week and have equal time between games. This will give the Broncos an advantage, as throughout non-conference play they were traditionally playing two games a week, while many opponents only had one game a week, which allowed their players to rest and be better prepared for action.

## Anselmo Makes Bronco Debut

Sophomore Lauren Anselmo made her Bronco debut on Friday, Oct. 3 versus Stanford, playing 18 minutes at defender. Anselmo has close Santa Clara ties, as she is the second known mother-daughter pair to have played on the Santa Clara women's soccer team. Her mother, Debbie (Hagan) Anselmo was a member of the team in the late 1980's and graduated in 1986. She also saw minutes in the

Arizona game on Oct. 5.

## Broncos Have Faced Eight Ranked Programs

Undeniably, the Broncos have had a very challenging schedule this season facing eight ranked opponents in 13 games, six of which were in the top-10 at the time of the game. Their schedule does not let up, as conference action begins. This weekend they will take on No. 20 USD and will face the University of Portland in Portland, Ore. live on ESPNU on Sunday, Nov. 2 at 1:30 p.m. The Pilots, have monopolized the upper-half of the rankings this season and round out the top-three in the NSCAA poll.

## Back in the Lineup

For the first time this season, Santa Clara will be able to reach deep into its roster, as all the active players are healthy and ready for action. Redshirt senior Jordan Angeli and redshirt junior Amanda Poach will remain out for the season, but players like Courtney Lewis and Lauren Anselmo, who had missed the beginning half of the season are back and in full swing. Freshman Jenny LaPonte, who suffered a broken nose at then No. 22 California, has been a consistent contributor is ready for substantial minutes going into this weekend's action. The Broncos were also given extra days off this week by head coach Jerry Smith, in hopes that a relaxed and rejuvenated squad would be ready to take on the second half of the demanding schedule.

## Lewis Gets Back on the Field

Redshirt junior Courtney Lewis was able to get back into the lineup at midfield versus then No. 2 UCLA on Sept. 25. Lewis, who missed all of 2007 due to injury and has battled injury in her first two seasons at Santa Clara, made an immediate impact. Versus the Bruins she had three shots, one of which was on goal. She also subbed in at midfield against then No. 22 Cal on Sept. 28.

## McCray Leads Broncos in Keeper Minutes

Senior goal keeper Meagan McCray continues to be a standout player for the Broncos. McCray, who has played 768:40 minutes this season, has helped lead Santa Clara to two shutout ties. The first was on Sept. 21 versus Yale, followed by keeping then No. 2 UCLA out of the goal through the double overtime match on Sept. 25. She has started in eight games this season for Santa Clara and posts 34 saves.

## Aozasa and LaPonte Continue to Contribute Big in First Season

Freshmen Margueritte Aozasa and Jenny LaPonte have continued to have a significant role in the Santa Clara lineup. The rookie duo has each appeared in all 11 games this season. Aozasa has started all but one game at midfield, while LaPonte has taken starting duties in seven games. Head coach Jerry

Smith has utilized LaPonte's versatility playing her at forward, midfield and defender.

## Defense

The Bronco defense has shutout three teams this season. They have taken opponents into four overtime periods this season. Led by tri-captain's Maxine Goynes and Katherine Reynolds, redshirt junior Dani Potts and redshirt sophomore Lindsey Johnson, they have shutout San Jose State, on Aug. 22 in the season opener, Yale on Sept. 21 and then No. 2 UCLA on Sept. 25. Also playing in the backline this season for SCU are Margueritte Aozasa, Jenny LaPonte, Kathleen Matthew and Lindsey Wicher.

## Broncos Continue to Play Overtime Minutes

The Broncos have played in overtime periods in their last four matches. This season they have played overtime minutes versus Cal Poly, and double overtime minutes versus Yale, then No. 2 UCLA and then No. 22 Cal. SCU tied Yale, 0-0, on Sept. 21, and tied UCLA, 0-0, on Sept. 25. Keeper Meagan McCray earned both shutouts.

## Broncos to Play at Home

After playing their first seven games on the road, the Broncos come home to host the Santa Clara/adidas Classic. This weekend will also be the first time the team will play in the newly renovated Buck Shaw Stadium, as the facility underwent an extensive makeover coming into this season.

SCU looks to bounce back into the win column behind their home crowd, after falling in two straight games this past weekend.

"It will be nice to have a home field advantage in terms of not having to travel and playing in front of our own crowd," head coach Jerry Smith said. "We are looking forward to our home opener and playing nine of our last 13 games at home."

## Perry Continues to Shine

Sophomore Kendra Perry, who has started all seven contests this season for the Broncos, remains the offensive leader for Santa Clara.

"She gained a tremendous amount of experience last season," said Smith of the 2007 WCC All-Freshman selection. "She is a very consistent player, which can be attributed to her excellent preparation."

This season she has scored three goals, including a game-winning goal over then No. 10 West Virginia on Aug. 29, and leads Santa Clara in goals scored and points, with six, as well as earning WCC Player of the Week honors earlier in the season.

## Former Bronco Standouts, Leslie Osborne and Aly Wagner to Play in WPS

Former Bronco standouts and National Team

members, Leslie Osborne and Aly Wagner were both selected in the 2008 Women's Professional Soccer league 2008 Allocation. Osborne returns to play in Northern California, as the midfielder was selected by the Bay Area franchise. While at Santa Clara she was an integral member of the 2001 College Cup Champions squad, was named Soccer Buzz's Player of the Year in 2004 and was the 2004 Honda Award winner.

She played alongside Wagner, who is coming off winning back-to-back Olympic gold medals. Wagner will join the Los Angeles based team. The San Jose native holds or shares every offensive record for the Broncos in the NCAA Tournament and led them to their first and only College Cup Championship, as she was the Offensive MVP.

### **Lindsey Wicher Earns First Start**
