PACIFIC COAST SOFTBALL CONFERENCE ANNOUNCES 2005 ALL-CONFERENCE TEAMS

LMU takes three of four individual honors after claiming conference title and automatic bid to NCAA Championship.

Seattle, Wash. -- In its third season of play and first with an NCAA automatic bid, the Pacific Coast Softball Conference (PCSC) announced its 2005 all-conference teams today. Loyola Marymount claimed the conference title after finishing the league season with a record of 16-4.

Margo Pineda of Loyola Marymount was selected as the PCSC's Player of the Year. The sophomore led the Lions to a first place conference finish after leading the PCSC in batting average (.426), runs scored (15), total bases (42), slugging percentage (.689), and hits (26). Pineda claims the third straight Player of the Year selection for LMU, with 2005 first-team third baseman Danielle Kaminaka earning the honor in 2004.

For the first time in conference history, the PCSC Pitcher of the Year was a teammate of the Player of the Year, as this year's selection was LMU freshman Tiffany Pagano. Pagano went 7-1 with a conference ERA of 0.50 over 55.2 innings of work.

Bronwyn Russell of Saint Mary's was voted PCSC Freshman of the Year. The first individual PCSC award winner from Saint Mary's, the outfielder hit .354 in conference play, with five RBI and two extra base hits.

LMU Coach Gary Ferrin has been selected as the PCSC Coach of the Year. Ferrin led the Lions to their second conference title in three seasons and will make the conference's first NCAA appearance this season. Ferrin's selection makes it the first time any conference team earned three of the four individual awards, as Santa Clara had claimed the Pitcher and Coach of the Year nods in 2003 and 2004.

LMU now awaits Sunday's selection show, which will announce the brackets for the 2005 NCAA Softball Championship.
