Setting The Scene: The Sacred Heart men's basketball team looks to reverse an 86-71 loss at the hands of Quinnipiac on Thursday in the second game of what has been dubbed "Rivalry Week" by the Northeast Conference.

Series: This is the 57th career meeting between these schools that goes back to the Division II era for both teams. Sacred Heart holds a 37-19 edge all-time. The series is tied at 10-10 in the Division I era. The first meeting between the teams was in 1965, a 100-83 Quinnipiac win.

Scouting the Opponent: Quinnipiac comes into the game with a 15-7 record and an 9-2 mark in the Northeast Conference.

Junior Justin Rutty leads the Bobcats, averaging a double-double this season with 14.4 points and 10.4 rebounds per game. He had 22 points and ten rebounds against the Pioneers on Thursday. Senior James Feldeine is the leading scorer at 17.9 points per contest, after pouring in 27 against SHU on Thursday.

The Bobcats are the top rebounding team in the NEC, out-boarding their opponents by an average of ten per game.

Upcoming Games: The Pioneers will return to the Pitt Center for a pair of home games against LIU (2/11) and St. Francis- NY (2/13).

This Date in SHU Basketball History: On February 6, 1989 the Pioneers defeated Franklin Pierce College in New Hampshire, 66-52. Todd Williams led the way with 26 points. Sean Williams finished with 14 points six assists and five steals, while Tony Judkins also finished in double figures with 14 points.

The Pioneers would finish the season 22-10 and make their final appearance in the Division II National Tournament, falling to NC Central in the quarter-finals, 58-57 in Springfield, MA.

The Coaches: **Dave Bike** (Sacred Heart '69) is in his 32nd year as the head coach of Sacred Heart. He has a career record of 493-438 and that ranks him 20th among active coaches. Only Jim Boheim of Syracuse as spent more time coaching at one institution. He led the Pioneers to eight NCAA Division II tournaments, and his 1985-86 team won the national championship while finishing 30-4. Bike was named the national Coach of the Year by the NABC following the title game. Drafted as a baseball player out of high school by Detroit, he spent five seasons as a catcher in the Tiger farm system.

Tom Moore (Boston Univ. '87) is in his 3rd season at Quinnipiac, joining the program after serving as an assistant coach at UConn for seven years. He is the sixth coach in the history of the program and took over for Joe DeSantis. He has previous head coaching experience at Division III Worcester State College, where he compiled a 76-59 record. At the time of his hiring, Moore became the youngest coach of a New England collegiate program at just 24. In his last year with the Lancers, he guided them to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in nearly 20 years.

Staying Power: Head coach Dave Bike is second on a list of Division I head coaches who have stayed at the same school for over 20 years. A look at the others:

Last Game- Wagner 74, SHU 73 Jan. 30, 2010:

Junior Justin Ruty recorded 22 points and ten rebounds, while Jonathan Cruz had 11 points and 11 boards to lead visiting Quinnipiac University to an 86-71 win over Sacred Heart on Thursday night.

The Bobcats, 15-7 overall and 9-2 in the Northeast Conference, used a 14-2 run in the first half to open a 23-9 lead midway through the period. SHU, 12-10 and 5-6, made a furious run late in the half to cut an 18-point Bobcat lead to eight at 36-28 with :41 left.

The Pioneers had a chance to trim it to six, but senior Corey Hassan missed a dunk attempt. James Feldeine nailed a trey at the other end to make it an 11-point QU lead instead and the Bobcats led 40-28 at the intermission. Feldeine finished with a game-high 27 points.

"There's a big difference going into the locker room down six after being down by 18," said SHU head coach Dave Bike. "Corey missing an uncontested shot then was a momentum changer."

"It was an important play," he continued. "But Quinnipiac was playing hard and we still would have been in a battle the rest of the way."

Once again QU stretched the lead in the second half, taking a 58-41 edge just six minutes in. A 9-2 Pioneer run, capped by a Chauncey Hardy three, cut the Bobcat lead to ten at 60-50 with 11:38 remaining. Ruty put the Bobcats on his back and scored the next six points, two on layups followed by a pair of foul shots, help QU to an 8-0 run and quelling the Pioneer comeback.

Senior Ryan Litke led the Pioneers with 19 points. Center Liam Potter finished with 15 points. Hassan was held to just eight points, the first time all season he failed to finish in double figures in scoring.

Streaks Snapped: Senior Corey Hassan had a streak of 24 straight games scoring in double figures broken on February 4 when he had just eight against Quinnipiac. He had a string of 20 straight games in which he buried a three-pointer snapped on January 7 against Wagner. Hassan finished the game with 12 points - ten of them from the free throw line - but missed all five of his trey attempts.

Raining Three's: Senior Corey Hassan broke his own school record for three-pointers in a game when he drained ten of them - on 12 attempts - at Wagner on January 30.

He established the record earlier when he canned nine of them at the University of Hartford on December 11. He broke the school's Division I record of 8 set by Luke Granato on 11/14/06 at North Carolina. John Randazzo (1998) and Louis Frye (1996) also hit eight treys in a game during the team's Division II days. The Pioneers tied the school record

for three-point attempts in a game in the same contest, taking 31 of them.

30-point Explosion: Senior Corey Hassan set a new career high with 36 points at Wagner on January 30 and also set a new SHU Division I record. When he poured in a career-high 33 points at Fordham on 11/18. It was the first time in the Division I era a Pioneer had scored 30 in a game twice in one season. He had 30 in the SHU win over Yale on November 13. It was the first time a Pioneer had hit the 30-point mark twice in a season since Louis Frye did it twice in the 1997-98 season, scoring 32 against Southern Connecticut on Dec. 28 and 30 against Albany on Jan. 18.

In the National Rankings: Corey Hassan currently first in the country in three's per game at 3.7, while teammate Ryan Litke is 17th at 3.1. Hassan ranks 16th in the nation in Division I in scoring at 21.4 points per game. The Pioneers are fourth as a team in treys per game at 9.3 and fifth in three-point percentage at 41.9. Marquette is the nation leader at 43 percent.

SHU Against Connecticut Opponents: Sacred Heart has a 186-134 record all-time against schools from the Nutmeg State. The Pioneers have a 65-66 record against schools that are currently Division I in the state, with 35 of those wins coming against Quinnipiac. The Pioneers have a high of 39 wins against the University of Bridgeport during the SHU Division II years.

1,000 points, Two Schools: Senior forward Corey Hassan has 1,393 points between his Sacred Heart career and a year spent at Boston University. He scored 332 points his freshman season at BU. He notched his 1,000th SHU point on January 28 at Mount St. Mary's.

Gunslingers: The Pioneers set a school record for three-pointers made in a season in 2008-09, draining 241 of them. They canned them at a .394 clip, which is also the school record and led the Northeast Conference. Long Island University was on the receiving end of the most

The team is on a pace to break that record, averaging 9 1/2 treys per game through the first 22 contests.

Serving it on a Trey: Senior Ryan Litke reached the top of the Pioneer all-time list in long-range shooting on December 30 when he canned three three's against Brown and passed Darrin Robinson's 219 treys. Senior Chauncey Hardy has worked his way into the top ten, as has Corey Hassan.

Power Outage: The 52 points the Pioneers scored at Mount St. Mary's on January 28 was a season low. The previous low had been 60 on November 30 against Columbia in a 60-55 victory. The last time a Pioneer team had been held under was January 3, 2009 at Monmouth when they scored 56. The last time a SHU team was held under 50 points was November 20, 2007 at St. John's when it scored 49.

Hassan Honored Three Times: Senior Corey Hassan was named the Choice Hotels NEC Player of the Week for the third time this season on January 25 after averaging 21.5 points and 8.5 rebounds a game in a 2-0 week. He is the only player in the league to win the award three times.

Hassan won his second NEC Player of the Week on December 14 after averaging 22 points and 10.5 rebounds per game in a 1-1 week. His week included setting a new school record for three's in a game with nine against Hartford.

He pulled in the first weekly award for the Pioneers this season when he was named NEC Player of the Week on November 16. Hassan averaged 25.5 points, seven rebounds, and three assists a game, while shooting 61 percent from the floor, 55 percent from three (6-11) and 88 percent from the line (7-8).

Home Cooking: The Pioneers have been very good at home over the last four+ seasons, going 46-17 over that span, including an 8-2 mark this season. 2006-07 was the best Division I season at home for

Litke Lights it Up: Senior Ryan Litke scored a career-high 25 points in the win over Wagner on January 7. The SHU sharpshooter came in the game a little earlier than usual, when starting guard Chauncey Hardy picked up two fouls four minutes into the game. Litke responded by draining a career-best seven three-pointers.

Cardiac Kids: The Pioneers gave themselves early Christmas presents when they came back to erase double-digit second half deficits and secure wins over Stony Brook and Holy Cross. The Pioneers trailed by 16 with 12:03 left and came back to win 78-70. The next night, SHU erased an 11-point deficit with 11:50 to play and defeated Holy Cross 82-79.

The Pioneers have come back to win four times when trailing at half. On December 30, SHU trailed Brown by ten in the first half and two at the intermission before coming back to win 83-78. Earlier this year, SHU trailed Lafayette by 12 in the first half but came back for an 81-70 victory.

Digging Out: The 16-point hole the Pioneers dug out of in the second half to beat Stony Brook 78-70 equaled the largest deficit the Pioneers have overcome to win a game, since turning Division I in 1999. The effort matched the Pioneer's climb from 16 down at LIU with 8:45

left in the first half on February 14, 2004 to win 92-87.

Double Plays: Senior Liam Potter has recorded six of the 12 Pioneer double-doubles of the 2009-10 season. Corey Hassan has four and Ryan Litke and Mehmet Sahar one each.

Triple Play: Senior Liam Potter recorded three straight double-doubles from December 21-30. The last time a Pioneer accomplished that feat was last season when Joey Henley did it in four straight games from January 25-February 5.

D1 First: The Pioneer's 76-65 win over Hartford on December 11 was the first time SHU had beaten the Hawks in Division I play in five tries. The previous nine wins against Hartford all came prior to 1999.

Winning Ways: The Pioneers finished last season with its third straight winning record, ending with a 17-14 mark. The last time SHU teams had three consecutive winning campaigns was from the 1987-88 season through 1989-90.

Winning Ways Part II: Over the last three+ years the Pioneer men's basketball team has more wins than any other Division I team in the State of Connecticut, outside of UConn. SHU has 65 wins over that time period, compared to 59 for Fairfield, 57 for Quinnipiac, 56 for Central Connecticut, and 41 for Hartford. UConn is way out in front in that race with 86.

The 1,000-point Club: Senior Chauncey Hardy became the 29th men's player overall and sixth in Division I in school history to reach

Potter Praised: Senior Liam Potter won his first-ever NEC Player of the Week award on January 4. Potter won the award after averaging 14.5 points and 11.5 rebounds a game in a 3-1 stretch for the Pioneers.

Hall of Famer: Former Pioneer Roger Younger, who scored over 2,100 points from 1982-86, was inducted into the Middletown Hall of Fame in Connecticut on January 29. A former Middletown High School standout prior to his college career, Younger helped the Pioneers to the 1986 Division II National Championship at Sacred Heart.

Hot Starts: Senior Corey Hassan is the first Division I player in school history to start the season with five straight 20+ scoring performances. He averaged 26 points per game over that stretch and had the streak snapped on November 30 when he scored 19 against Columbia. The previous best in D1 was when Maurice Bailey scored 20 or more in four of his first five games in 2001-02, averaging 21 points per game.

The school record is held by Darrin Robinson who did it an amazing eight straight games that included seven 30+ performances. He averaged an impressive 33.6 points per game to help the Pioneers to a 6-2 start.

Connecticut Connection: The Nutmeg State will have a lot to say about the success of the Pioneers this season. Six players hail from Connecticut led by seniors Ryan Litke (Windsor) and Chauncey Hardy (Middletown), followed by sophomores Shane Gibson (Killingly), Stan Dulaire (Bloomfield), and Steve Zazuri (Monroe), and redshirt freshman Nick Greenbacker (Manchester).

Helping Hand: Junior Jerrell Thompson set an individual career high when he dished out 11 assists against Monmouth on December 5. It was the most assists for a Pioneer since Drew Shubik dished out ten against Quinnipiac on February 23, 2008. Thompson is currently second in the NEC in assists at 4.7 per game.

New Face: Head coach Dave Bike added walk-on Toso Adebawo to the official roster on November 30. Out of Marianapolis Prep and Lincoln, RI, he has been practicing with the team since October but dressed for the first time against Columbia. He has appeared in two games.

Freshman Class of 2010: The Pioneers signed their first two players for next season in 6'2 guard Steve Glowiak of New Britain High School in Connecticut and 6'2 guard Chris Evans of Stamford, CT, Stamford High School and the Taft School.

Glowiak, 6'2", spent his first two years of high school at Berlin and then transferred to play for his father Stan at New Britain. He averaged 13.4 points per game as a junior last season to help the Golden Hurricanes finish 20-4. Evans, a two-sport athlete who also excelled in football, is considered one the top defenders in the State and helped Stamford High School reach the State tournament semi-finals last year. He averaged 21 points, eight rebounds, and seven assists per game as a senior. He is currently doing a post-graduate year at the Taft School in Watertown.

1,000 career points when he did it against Penn State on November 25. Ryan Litke followed suit on January 14 at Bryant, and Corey Hassan made it a 1,000-point trifecta on January 28 at Mount St. Mary's. They join Maurice Bailey (1,422), Joey Henley (1,397), Kibwe Trim (1,289), Jarrid Frye (1,287), and Drew Shubik (1,029).

Season Openers: After defeating Yale in this season's opener, Sacred Heart is 24-21 in season starters, but just 2-9 since moving to Division I in 1999. The Pioneers had lost seven straight openers before this year, since beating Stony Brook 76-71 to start the 2001-02 season.

Connecticut 6 Classic: The Pioneers played in the first game of the inaugural Connecticut 6 Classic on November 13, defeating Yale 92-86. Fairfield took out CCSU in the second game (67-58) and Quinnipiac finished off the tripleheader by beating Hartford (85-74).

International Flavor: The Sacred Heart roster includes three international players, led by senior Liam Potter (England) and Mehmet Sahan (Turkey), who will both be fixtures in the Pioneer starting lineup this season. Head coach Dave Bike also added transfer Femi Akinpetide (Australia) from Missouri-Kansas City this year. He will sit out the 2009-10 season under the NCAA transfer rules.

New to the Schedule: The Pioneers will take on three schools for the first time this season, starting on November 15 with Lafayette. SHU will face Xavier for the first time on November 21, and then take on a new Ivy League opponent in Brown on December 30.

Pioneers in the Pros: Sacred Heart currently has five former players active in professional basketball. Kibwe Trim '06 is currently playing in Romania and has also played in the NBA D-League. Maurice Bailey '04 is playing in Russia. Jarrid Frye '07 is playing in Macedonia, while Brice Brooks '08 and Joey Henley '09 are in Germany.

NEC Pre-season Poll: Sacred Heart was picked to finish sixth in the Northeast Conference preseason coach's poll. Mount St. Mary's was selected first with nine first-place votes from NEC head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own team. Long Island University was picked sixth and defending champion Robert Morris was picked third, along with Quinnipiac. Central Connecticut State was voted fifth. St. Francis (NY) in the seventh position. Fairleigh Dickinson landed in eighth place, followed by Monmouth in ninth, Wagner in tenth, Bryant in eleventh and Saint Francis (PA) in twelfth.

Since the poll was conducted, Long Island has had 2008-09 Rookie of the Year Julian Boyd sidelined with a heart ailment that will keep him out for the season, and could put his career in jeopardy. In addition, the Blackbirds lost two international players in forward Aurimas Adomaitis and guard Lucas Faggiano. Both players elected not to return to school for family reasons and signed professional contracts in their home countries.

CCSU also announced during the teleconference announcement that their leading scorer and rebounder from last season, Ken Horton, will miss the season after undergoing surgery on his hip.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 20 of the last 22 years.

History: This is the **45th season** of Pioneer men's basketball. SHU's first year of competition was the 1965-66 season under coach Don Feeley, who guided the program for 13 seasons before current coach Dave Bike took over. The Pioneers carry an overall record of **733 wins and 547 losses for a .591 winning percentage**. The Pioneers played in 13 NCAA Division II Tournaments (the last one in 1988-89) and won the national title in 1986. Sacred Heart joined the NCAA Division I ranks for the 1999-00 season, making this their eleventh season of Division I competition.

On the Air and Web: Every men's basketball game will be available on the Internet through Sacred Heart University's website, SacredHeartPioneers.com.

Jeff Holtz and SHU Senior Associate Athletic Director, Gene Gumbs, will provide play-by-play commentating. The Internet broadcasts begin 20 minutes prior to the scheduled tipoff for the Dave Bike Coach's Show, player interviews, and a preview of the upcoming game. The basketball games are part of a 175-game package the athletic communications office has planned for 2009-10. In addition to every football and men's basketball game there will be selected men's soccer, women's soccer, women's volleyball, women's basketball, men's ice hockey, women's ice hockey, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, softball and baseball games available.

*Jeff Sagarin has been providing power ratings and player ratings to USA TODAY since 1985. A mathematics graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and MBA from Indiana University in 1983, Sagarin has applied his unique ranking system to college football, college basketball, Major League Baseball, pro football, pro basketball, pro hockey, volleyball, nascar, soccer and several other sports. Sagarin's college basketball rankings have proven their value to the NCAA tournament selection committee. Since 1984, Sagarin has supplied the committee — at its request — with his latest rankings at the beginning of the tournament selection process and with regular updates until the selections have been finalized. Sagarin's rankings form the basis of Play to Win, a unique game of skill and sports knowledge. He and a close-knit circle of friends and colleagues in his Midwestern town have been playing the game, just for fun, for several years. Now, through the World Wide Web, the game goes global. In addition, beginning in the fall of 1998, Jeff's college football ratings became an official part of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) team selection process.

The RPI (Rating Percentage Index) is a measure of strength of schedule and how a team does against that schedule. It does not consider things like margin of victory or where a game is played, only whether or not a team won. It is used by the NCAA as one of their factors in deciding which teams to invite to the NCAA tournament and where to seed them. It was created and is maintained by the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee. They have always placed a premium on schedule strength when selecting teams for the tournament, so they wanted a relatively simple way to measure that and the RPI was born.
