PROFILE:

Sacred Heart University is an independent, comprehensive, co-educational institution of higher learning and the second-largest Catholic university in New England. Founded by the Most Rev. Walter W. Curtis, Bishop of Bridgeport, the University was the first Catholic university in the United States to be led and staffed by lay people.

CAMPUS:

Just an hour's drive from New York City or Hartford, the main campus is located on 57 acres in suburban Fairfield, Conn.

FACULTY:

153 full-time faculty, 84 percent of whom have the highest degree in their field. No courses are taught by graduate assistants.

ACADEMIC STRUCTURE:

The University is comprised of four colleges: Arts and Sciences, Business, Education and Health Professions, and University College (educating more than 1,200 adults on a part-time basis and via the Internet),

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS:

Rooted in the Catholic intellectual tradition, Sacred Heart offers a well-rounded liberal arts education with more than 31 majors and 15 graduate and professional degrees, including accounting, business, computer science, education, finance, media studies, nursing, physical therapy and religious studies.

COMMUNITY SERVICE:

In preparation for both a lifetime of learning and a lifetime of service, more than 1,200 students and staff volunteered 33,000 hours of service last year in the region, largely in the city of Bridgeport.

TECHNOLOGY:

Each of our new students receive two Dell Latitude notebook computers during their four years and keep the second one upon graduation. The entire campus is wireless allowing our students to access faculty, staff, classmates and the internet from anywhere on campus!

CULTURAL FACILITIES:

The Edgerton Center for the Performing Arts (830 seats) presents musicals, dramas, concerts, lectures and other events, featuring students, faculty, professional performers and public figures. The Gallery of Contemporary Art presents works by nationally known artists four times a year as well as the annual student and faculty exhibits.

Coach Banner returns for her fifth year as assistant coach of the Pioneer women's soccer program. Her responsibilities include game planning, on-field assistance, recruiting and coaching the junior varsity team.

Prior to coming to Sacred Heart, Banner was a standout on the soccer field, earning All-American status at Mitchell College and the

University of Bridgeport. She played one season at Mitchell, where she earned her Associates Degree in business, before moving on the Bridgeport. Banner was a two-time All-American for the Purple Knights while graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in social science. She later returned to UB and earned her Master's in education.

Banner also served as an assistant for the women's lacrosse team at Sacred Heart last season. She and her husband Ian currently reside in Fairfield.

The Head Coach

Joe Barroso is entering his seventh season as head women's soccer coach at Sacred Heart University. Barroso is in his second stint at Sacred Heart after leaving for five years to coach at the University of Bridgeport.

He returned to help the Pioneers make the transition to Division I and has guided his team to two-straight Northeast Conference Tournaments and its first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament appearance.

The 2002 Pioneers finished 10-7-2 overall and tied for third in the NEC standings with a 6-2-2 league mark. The 2001 women's program captured their first-ever Northeast Conference Crown, and for his efforts Barroso was named Coach-of-the-Year. He helped lay the foundation of the women's soccer program at Sacred Heart serving as head coach from 1992-94. He amassed a record of 27-28-2 in those three years on the sideline, receiving the regional Coach-of-the-Year award in 1994-95.

At the University of Bridgeport, Barroso was named the NECC Coach-of-the-Year in 1997. He was 34-41-6 while coaching the women for four years. He also served as the head men's soccer coach for the Purple Knights from 1997-'99.

Originally from Portugal, Barroso played at Southern Connecticut State University. He was a member of that school's Division II National Championship squad in 1990 and is eighth on the Owls all-time scoring list with 99 points (41 goals, 58 assists). His 41 goals are sixth on that all-time list. He was chosen as one of the top-25 players in the country after his senior season at SCSU and picked to play in the Senior Bowl.

Barroso has played professionally both in Europe and the United States. He played for a First Division club in Portugal competing in the prestigious UEFA Cup and for both the Connecticut Wolves and the Boston Storm in the A-League of the USISL. Barroso was also a member of the U.S. National Team in 1990-'91.



2003 Preview

With a blend of experience and youth, the Sacred Heart University women's soccer team has its sights set on a third-straight trip to the Northeast Conference Tournament and beyond in 2003. Eight starters, including three all-conference selections and the team's top-five scoring threats, return to the SHU lineup. Add to that six talented newcomers and the Pioneers looked poised to be one of the conference favorites heading into the season.

Leading the way will be the trio of senior midfielder **Paula Pineda**, junior midfielder **Ingrid Olsson** and senior goalkeeper **Leslie Konsig**, each an All-NEC selection in 2002.

Pineda returns as the team's leading scorer after posting career numbers in 2002. She tallied 13 goals on the season, including four game-winners, to go with four assists for 30 points. The senior from Vigo, Spain earned two NEC Player-of-the-Week honors last season and recorded back-to-back hat tricks in wins over St. Peter's and Northeastern last season.

Olsson, second on the team in scoring in 2002, returns to give the Pioneers one of the strongest midfields in the NEC. Joining Pineda and Olsson in the midfield are juniors **Samantha Leonard** and **Katie Busam**. Highly recruited freshman **Randie Quaglia** will step in and make an immediate impact this season.

Up front this season, Sacred Heart welcomes back three talented players from last year's squad in addition to two highly touted newcomers. Senior **Jill Bizeau** along with juniors **Ashleigh Bepko** and **Nathalie Urbas** give SHU a solid scoring punch. Bizeau finished 2002 with nine points on three goals and three assists while Bepko found the back of the net twice to go with three assists. Urbas tickled the twine twice a year ago while assisting on another for five points. The addition of transfer **Christel Kalweit** from Mitchell College in New London, where she was named an All-New England soccer player, and freshman **Lisa Burbige**, give the Pioneers added fire power on the attack.

Back to anchor the defense is Konsig, a three-time All-NEC goalkeeper. The senior put together stellar numbers in 2002, posting a stingy 0.56 goals-against-average, ranking ninth in the country and tops in the conference. She recorded a school-record ten shutouts while allowing just one goal at home in leading the Pioneers to a perfect 7-0-1 record on Campus Field last season.

Joining Konsig to lead the defense is fellow senior **Colleen Attard**. Attard and Konsig will join Pineda in captaining the 2003 squad. Also returning defensively are juniors **Jasmine Urbas**, **Lisa Harvey** and **Erika Harrysson** and sophomore **Meghan Sullivan**. Freshmen **Karin Olsson** and **Colleen Bardelli** will be counted on to step in and give the Pioneers depth in the back this season.

"This year's team is more experienced, have gotten to know each other better, and are playing better soccer as a team," stated the head coach. "We are adding to that, the deepest recruiting class that we have had since I have been here"
