DONS CLOSE OUT REGULAR SEASON AT PEPPERDINE **LOOK TO HOLD ON TO THIRD PLACE SEEDING** **TUCKER NOW THIRD ON ALL-TIME SCORING LIST**

* Darrell Tucker trails only Quintin Dailey and Bill Cartwright on USF scoring list, leads WCC in scoring.

San Francisco, CA- The USF Dons (13-13, 8-5 WCC) look to continue their strong finish when they close out the regular season at Pepperdine Saturday (7 PM, KYCY 1550 AM). The victor tonight will be the WCC's third seed and play the winner of Friday's six vs. eight seed first round game next Saturday at 6:00 p.m., the loser will play the second game of that doubleheader vs. the 5 vs. 8 winner. With no reseeding this year and with a win, the three seed would play San Diego in the semifinals (Sun at 6:30) , while the four seed would play Gonzaga on ESPN at 9:00 p.m. A win tonight would give USF its first season sweep of both L.A. schools since 1997.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Before the season, everyone thought this would be Darrell Tucker's team. Since returning from his thumb injury, it has been, but never more than last night! Tucker scored a game-high 29 points, including two consecutive three-point plays in the final two minutes to pace USF to a 75-69 win over LMU last night in Westchester.

Tucker scored on a layup and was fouled with less than two minutes left and USF nursing a one-point lead. After LMU hit a three-point shot, Tucker did it again with :42 left to put USF safely ahead to stay. He was 11-21 from the floor, pulled eight rebounds and added 4 assists.

WCC HAS HIGHEST RPI EVER: The West Coast Conference is currently ranked #10 in the College Basketball News RPI rating. It is the conference's highest ever ranking. We finished 15 in last year's NCAA RPI. Here are current the top 15. 1 Southeastern (12), 2 Big 12 (12), 3 Atlantic Coast(9), 4 Big Ten (11), 5 Big East (14), 6 Mountain West(8), 7 Pacific 10 (10), 8 ConferenceUSA(14), 9 Atlantic 10 (12), **10 West Coast (8)**, 11 Western Athl.(10), 12 Missouri Val.(10), 13 Mid-American (13), 14 Horizon (9), 15 Sun Belt (11)

SEEDING SCENARIO: USF will be seeded third with a win, fourth with a loss.. That would leave the Dons in a two-way tie for third at 8-6. In that scenario, Pepperdine would win a tiebreaker over USF because of their win over San Diego.

DONS HOST 2006 WEST REGIONAL

USF was named to host the 2006 West Regionals at the Oakland Coliseum (March 23-25th). It will be the first time for USF to host the event, although they have hosted many games at the Coliseum previously.

TUCKER MOVES INTO THIRD PLACE: Tucker, the Oakland native and grad of McClymonds High School, is trying to earn his third all-WCC honors in four years. Tucker leads the league in overall scoring with 18.5 points per contest and is tied for second in rebounding, 9th in field goal percentage, 2nd in three-point percentage and 13th in free-throw percentage. He is averaging 22.5 points and 8.0 rpg. in WCC play, but has not played enough games to be among league leaders (he would be first in scoring and second in rebounding). Tucker has certainly made his mark on the USF record books, having scored 1,749 points, passing Winford Boynes (1,702) last Saturday night. He trails only Quintin Dailey (1,841) and Bill Cartwright (2,116). Last night he passed three former Santa Clara players; Brian Jones (1722), Harold Keeling (1731) and Kurt Rambis (1735) and David Vann of St. Mary's (1738) to move all the way up to 14th position in WCC career scoring.

Tucker's 832 career rebounds rank seventh on the USF career list. He appears to on the way to leading USF in scoring for the third straight season, the first USF player to do that since Quintin Dailey who did it in 80-81-82. Bill Russell, Phil Smith and Ollie Johnson are the only other USF players to achieve that streak. Tucker has also passed **Paul Silas** (1661 at Creighton – '62-'64) as McClymonds High School's all-time leading alumni scorer. He has six double doubles this season, including a 23-point, 11 rebound performance vs. Fullerton and a 21 point, 11 rebound performance vs. Pepperdine.

HELLO AGAIN: Loyola Marymount and Pepperdine are the only WCC teams that have the honor of seeing Darrell Tucker twice in league play this season. Tucker missed the first five league games after suffering a separated thumb injury at Michigan on January 2nd. He returned for the Pepperdine game, an 87-77 USF win (1/31), and the LMU 91-73 win on Feb.1. He came off the bench for 21 points and 11 rebounds vs. Pepperdine and had 25 points and 11 rebounds vs. LMU earning him WCC Player of the Week honors. Last night he dominated the LMU game with 29 points and 8 rebounds.

WHY NOT TAKE THREE: The Dons are an excellent three-point shooting team, and lead the conference in three-point percentage (44.0%) in WCC games only. Over the last 14 games, the Dons have made 44.2% of their treys (111-251), paced by John Cox (33-68, 48.5%) and Shamell Stallworth (31-65, 47.7%). Darrell Tucker has added 20-39 (51.3%) since returning. The team hit a peak with 14-23 at home vs. LMU (60.9%). Over the past ten games, USF is 86-187 (46.0%) despite going just 4-21 last Saturday.

OR JUST SHOOT....The Dons are second in the WCC (in league games) field goal percentage (48.7%) and are third in free-throw percentage (71.1%).

DYNAMIC DUO: Darrell Tucker and John Cox had a great weekend last time USF played LMU and Pepperdine. John Cox scored 24 points against the Waves and 27 vs. LMU, while Tucker had 21 vs. Pepperdine and 25 vs. LMU. Shamell Stallworth also added 21 points against the Waves.

DONS PLAYING BEST BALL OF SEASON: USF is playing their best ball of the season and has won six of eight and is 12-7 since mid-December.

The addition of transfers James Bayless (10.5 ppg, 5.8 rpg, 56.1% FG) and Alvin Broussard (8.7 ppg, 5.1 rpg) on December 14th has been a big plus, but along with them, everyone else's game has stepped up. Since their first game at Pacific (a game in which USF played poorly in the first half), USF has been a solid team, winning 12 of 19 despite the loss of Tucker for six games. USF has made over 40% of its three's in nine of the last 13 games.

LEAGUE REGULAR SEASON MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER: The WCC regular season is more important than anytime since the postseason tournament was adopted. Finishing in the top four keeps you out of the first round (5 v. 8, 6 v.7), and finishing first or second gets you out of the second round, and allows you to win the tournament with just two wins.

DONS GETTING BETTER ON ROAD: The Dons played well at home this year with a 9-6 mark, with three of the five losses coming in the final minute. Against Nevada, USF led late and had a near midcourt buzzer beater beat them. Against Fresno State, USF had chances to go ahead (missed three-pointer by Gaines) and tie (missed three by Cox) in the final minute. USF trailed St. Mary's by just two with 26 seconds, but could not get any closer. USF is averaging 74.9 points per game at home to 60.0 on the road and allowing 66.2 points at home to 69.8 on the road.

USF is 4-8 on the road this year (4-2 WCC), with five games (at Sacramento State, at Cal, at Michigan, at USD, at Gonzaga) within striking distance and the wins at Santa Clara, St. Mary's and Portland. The good news is that the last eight games on the road (at Cal, at Michigan, at Santa Clara, at USD, at SMC, at Portland, at Gonzaga, at LMU), USF has played very well.

DONS LIKE 80: The one sure thing this year is that when USF scores 80 points, they have a perfect 5-0 record.

40TH MINUTE NOT LUCKY: USF has not had good luck at the end of games this season. Nevada hit a near half-court buzzer beater to top the Dons. USF missed a three-pointer by John Cox to take a lead at Sac State in the final minute, and missed two shots vs. Fresno State in the final minute to lead and then tie the game. USF led at Cal by three points in the final minute twice, but a late three (3.7 sec.) sent the game into overtime. Against St. Mary's USF trailed by just two with :26 left but could not get any closer. Finally USF broke out at Santa Clara, concluding an 11-0 run in the final minute to win 55-52 but then lost a chance for a last minute tie or win when Stallworth's free-throw missed in the last minute at USD. Against St. Mary's Feb. 8, it looked like a late three doomed them again to a tough loss, but Gaines' late basket gave USF the win.

NOT A LOT OF BAKING: USF up to this point has had trouble scoring for numerous reasons, but one of the main reason is that they are creating only 13.3 turnovers per game by their opponents. USF therefore is not getting many fastbreak opportunities, as they are also last in the WCC in steals. The Dons are not "baking" a lot of turnovers either, just 13.7 themselves. Both of those figures are among the lowest in the WCC.

COX: NOT JUST KOBE'S COUSIN: Since Tucker's injury, John Cox has been the man. He has led USF in scoring 10 of the 15 games averaging 18.4 points per game and had a career high 30 last Friday vs. Santa Clara after scoring 27 against LMU Jan. 31. His field goal percentage (51.6 floor, 47.9% 3pt, 78.8% ft) over those 15 games. He is currently fourth in the WCC in scoring during league play at 18.6 ppg., and averaged 20.6 points per contest during Tucker's absence. He is the leading three-point shooter in WCC play with 49.2% made. Ironically, before the loss of Tucker, Cox had lost his starting slot for the previous five games and was averaging 11.3 per game. Overall he is averaging 15.4 points per game. The cousin of NBA all-star Kobe Bryant, Cox is 45-104 (43.3%) from three-point range after shooting at 42% last year (third in the WCC). He started slowly from three point range this year (2-12 after three games), but has now nailed 43-92 (46.7%) since. John scored 21 points including a game-tying three and game winning two at Santa Clara, added 25 at San Diego.. He scored a then-career best 26 points vs. Portland, hitting 8-12 from the floor. John has had three chances to tie games in the final seconds this year, but has not gotten the shot to fall at Sacramento State, vs. Fresno State, or at San Diego.

STALLWORTH – A TALE OF TWO SEASONS: Shamell Stallworth, the senior guard from Fresno had been in a slump to open the year, after completing last season as USF's hottest player. In this year's first six games, he shot just 39% from the floor (3-15 from 3-pt) and averaging 7.2 points per game. Over the past 20 games, he is averaging 14.3 ppg., is shooting 48.2% from the floor and is 44-90 (48.9%) from three-point range. He is 8th in the WCC in three-point percentage in conference games, nailing 26-57 (45.6%) On the season he is averaging 12.7 points per game after averaging 12.2 last season. Stallworth is shooting 46.7% from the floor. **He leads the WCC (overall) in free-throw percentage and three-point percentage.** He did have a season high 16 points in the two games at Pacific and vs. Sonoma before crushing BYU with a career high 37 points, the most ever by a current player on the USF squad and the most since Kenyon Jones scored 27 against Nevada on Nov, 21, 1999.. The last six contests of last year he averaged over 19 points per game. Stallworth **has 1050 career points**, which puts him 23rd on the USF all-time scoring list. Shamell Stallworth, while not making the impact of Tucker, still is having an excellent career. The Fresno native is 24th on the USF career list (1,050 points) and has a chance to break into the top-20 before his career is done. His first basket will put him past John Burks (1,051). He is second on the USF all-time list for three-pointers made behind just Ali Thomas. His 37 points in a win over BYU is a Dons' season high.

BAYLESS GIVING DONS AN INSIDE PRESENSE: The addition of transfer James Bayless (Nevada) on December 14th has given USF an inside game they were lacking. He is averaging 10.4 points per game, pulling 5.5 rebounds and shooting 55.8% from the floor. Last night was the first non-start in his USF career. He has scored in double figures 11 times, with a high of 19 vs. Portland, 18 at Pacific and also 17 at California, where he shot 7-11 from the floor.

BROUSSARD ADDS ATHLETICISM: Former New Mexico Lobo Alvin Broussard has given the Dons athleticism they have lacked. He is averaging 8.7 points and 5.1 rebounds. He had a breakout offensive game at San Diego, nailing 7-11 shots from the floor for 17 points. At Portland, he equaled that total of 17 points on 7-10 shooting. He scored 14 in the win over Pepperdine and added 13 rebounds vs. Brown and five steals vs. Michigan. He has also helped the Dons defensively, and has been very hot from the three-point line in recent contests.

JASON IS GAINING: Sophomore Jason Gaines (who is second in the WCC in assist average during league play 5.54) has been very impressive lately, but never more than Dec. 30th at California. His line for the game was six points, 10 assists, 1 turnover, 5 rebounds and two steals. At Portland he recorded 12 assists, 5 rebounds and 2 steals. January 25th at San Diego, he recorded 11 assists and no turnovers. He is second in the WCC in assists with 5.5 per game in overall play. Over the past 12 games he has 74 assists (6.2 avg) and 33 turnovers. On the year he has 137 assists and just 57 to's, with a 2.40 asst. to turnover

ratio, the best in the WCC. He has established himself as the team's leader. Jason had a season high 10 assists at Cal on Dec. 30. He is 27-35 from the free-throw line this year. His biggest moment was hitting a last minute fall-away shot to give USF the win over St. Mary's on February 8th.

HEAD COACH PAUL WESTPHAL, a 1972 graduate of USC is in his 2nd season at Pepperdine (37-20) and 121-47 career (5th season).

70 POINTS – WIN OR LOSE: During the eight years of the Philip Mathews era at USF, a key to a Dons' victory has been the opponents' score. When USF opponents score 70 or less in regulation, USF is 98-37, and when the opponents score more than 70, USF is 21-66. This year, USF is 8-6 when holding teams to 70 or less, 5-7 when allowing more than 70.

PREVIOUS GAME STORIES:

TOREROS SHUT DOWN DONS: San Diego stopped USF’s home winning streak by outscoring the Dons 50-33 after intermission in a 81-63 victory. It was the first time since the December 14th game at Pacific that USF has not been in contention to win a game at the end. The Toreros won the game by making 17 of 28 shots after halftime, while the Dons made just 14 of 37. San Diego also was able to capitalize on a great deal many more trips to the free-throw line, nailing 19 of 28 to 5 of 7 for USF. Jason Blair scored 26 for USD with Roy Morris adding 20, while USF was paced by Darrell Tucker’s 19 points and 11 by John Cox.

DONS COAST BY BRONCOS: USF broke out to an early 21-10 lead, went into the dressing room ahead 40-20 and coasted to an easy 78-65 win over Santa Clara last night at Memorial Gymnasium. The Dons stretched their lead to 28 points before Mathews starting substituting liberally. Junior guard John Cox led the way for the Dons, nailing 11-15 shots from the floor, as USF made 50.8% of its shots from the floor. Darrell Tucker had 12 points in his first USF start since January 2nd. Alvin Broussard added 4 points and 10 rebounds.

GONZAGA OUTLASTS USF: Guard Blake Stepp scored 27 points and forward Ronny Turiaf scored 24 and pulled 13 rebounds as Gonzaga used a late run to defeat USF 82-71 in Spokane Feb. 15. Gonzaga’s win snapped a four game USF winning streak.

USF was paced by Darrell Tucker’s 26 points, led for much of the second half and trailed just 64-62 with just 4:56 remaining. But Gonzaga went on a 12-0 run that was capped by Stepp’s three-pointer with 1:51 remaining to take control of the game. Seven of the points in the run were free-throws by Gonzaga who had a huge edge at the

free-throw line. USF could not keep up with either Gonzaga's rebounding (a 38-24 advantage) or its free-throw shooting (the Zags knocked down 27 free-throws to just 8 for USF) as Gonzaga won its 21st straight home WCC win.

DONS WIN AT PORTLAND: Darrell Tucker scored 23 points and Alvin Broussard equaled his career high with 17 as USF moved into a tie with second place in the WCC with a 72-55 win at Portland Feb. 13. The win was USF's fourth straight. Tucker was a load in his fourth game since returning from his thumb injury, scoring 23 points on 8-12 shooting including 5-5 from three point range. Broussard equaled his career high with 17 points, Shamell Stallworth added 10 and point guard Jason Gaines added 12 assists. The Dons again were a hot shooting team, hitting 55.1% from the floor and 11-20 from three-point range.

TUCKER AGAIN LEADS THE WAY, BUT GAINES' SHOT TRIPS GAELS: For St. Mary's it was way too much Darrell Tucker as the Dons top the Gaels 68-67 in Moraga on January 8th. Tucker poured in 25 points, went 9-13 from the floor and pulled a game-high eight rebounds off the bench as the Dons won 68-67. The Dons ran off a 12-0 spurt to erase a 56-49 St. Mary's lead with 6:11 left and give the Dons a 61-56 lead. But after SMC's Ross Benson hit two late three's to give St. Mary's a 67-66 lead with 5.9 seconds left, it was USF point guard Jason Gaines to the rescue. Gaines raced up the floor and hit a 10-foot fadeaway to give USF the win. Tucker became USF's sixth all-time career scorer late in the game, passing former USF (and McClymonds HS) great Bill Russell

DONS OUTSCORE LIONS: John Cox scored a career high 27 points, Darrell Tucker added 25 and Shamell Stallworth scored 21 as USF scored a season-high 91 points in topping LMU 91-73. USF led 45-38 at the half, built the lead to double digits for good at the 14:45 mark (61-50) and kept a double-digit lead for the remainder of the contest. Keith Kincade had 16 for the Lions.

TUCKER RETURNS TO LINEUP, DONS TOP WAVES: Darrell Tucker returned to the lineup and combined with John Cox to score 45 points as the Dons topped Pepperdine 87-77. The Dons led by 10 at the half (41-31) after hitting better than 61% of their field goal attempts. USF increased its lead to 17 with 5:21 left, but the Waves made a run to get to within two before USF went on its own run to put the game away. John Cox had 24 points and Tucker 21 points and 11 rebounds. Jimmy Miggins had 18 for Pepperdine.

DONS GET NOTHING "FREE" AT SAN DIEGO: The Dons had to survive a team on a roll, less than ideal housing arrangements and were still missing Tucker when they traveled to the Jenny Craig Pavilion on January 25th. USF, which stayed in Orange County due to the Super Bowl hotel situation, lost a heartbreaker to San Diego 74-69.

The Dons started slowly, losing 16-4 after five minutes, but rallied to trail just 43-41 at the half. The Dons trailed by as many as 7 in the second half, but rallied again to take 68-64 lead with 3:35 left. San Diego got two late threes from Brad Lechtenberg and Matt Delzell to take a two-point lead, but when Shamell Stallworth missed a free-throw with :20 left that would have allowed USF to tie the game, USF was forced to foul and lost by five. Ironically, it was the lack of USF free-throws during the game (USF shot just nine) that ruined an excellent shooting night (47.3% floor) 10-20 from three-point range for USF. John Cox scored 25 to lead USF in scoring.

DONS "COX OUT" FIRST ROAD WIN: USF is coming off a come-from-behind 55-52 victory at Santa Clara Wednesday night. It was an unusual game that was dominated by the defenses, with Santa Clara holding USF to 35% shooting in the first half and USF holding the Broncos to 35% shooting after the break. The Dons held SCU to just three field goals over the final 13 minutes (one with less than a second left) in the victory, scoring 11 straight points to turn a 49-44 deficit to a 55-49 lead, with Shamell Stallworth scoring six of the points and John Cox adding the other five (including the game tying three and the go ahead driving deuce).

USF CANNOT HOLD ONTO LEAD AGAINST GONZAGA: Gonzaga stayed perfect in WCC by rallying past USF 66-56 at Memorial Gym on January 19th. The Bulldogs came out with red-hot shooting and took a 27-14 lead with 11:14 remaining in the first half. But the Dons were able to whittle it to just a 37-32 deficit at the half, behind John Cox's 16 first half points. USF continued its momentum and pulled ahead 50-44 with 10:50 remaining in the game, before five straight USF turnovers swung the momentum back to Gonzaga, along with two long three-pointers by Kyle Bankhead (who made 7 of 11 on the afternoon and scored 23 points). The visitors won 66-56.

DONS TAKE OFF AGAINST THE PILOTS: As they did in their WCC opener against St. Mary's, USF played strong and had control of the game early against Portland. USF went up 20-8, led 36-29 at the half, withstood a Portland run that closed the score to 43-31 and won 73-59 Friday night. The Dons shot the ball well in both halves, 58.3% in the first half and 57.1% in the second, while holding Portland to 43.5% shooting. John Cox (26 pts) and James Bayless (19) each scored career highs for USF, each hitting 8-12 from the floor.

DONS FALL TO ST. MARY'S: USF seemed to be in control of its WCC opener against St. Mary's leading by nine 54-45 with 8:24 remaining. But USF was forced to play the game shorthanded in the frontline. The Dons started the game with Darrell Tucker (the team's high scorer and rebounder) in street clothes and then due to foul trouble lost starter Alvin Broussard and reserve Brandon Queen to fouls. USF was then hurt on the boards, being out rebounded 25-11 after intermission. The Gaels also had a huge 20-11 edge in points at the free-throw line. This negated the successful USF press that forced 22 St. Mary's turnovers. John Cox led USF with 20 points, with James Bayless adding 15 despite taking only nine shots.

DONS ROLL OVER BROWN: In USF's first game without Darrell Tucker in the lineup, USF got off to a slow start, trailing visiting Brown 31-30 at the half January 4th. But the Dons blitzed the Bears 51-21 after intermission and took a 81-52 victory. Shamell Stallworth and John Cox scored 18 each, with James Bayless adding 16.

USF CONTINUES STRONG PLAY AT MICHIGAN: USF lost its second straight game on the road against a tough opponent 74-64 at Michigan on January 2nd. The Dons played well and the lead continued to change hands until USF point guard Jason Gaines was forced to the bench with his second personal foul with 9:22 left in the first half. Michigan eventually took an 8 point halftime lead. With 17:30 left Darrell Tucker was fouled hard by Michigan freshman Graham Brown dislocating his thumb. Still the Dons got to within 6 at the 7:27 mark and to within 5 (65-60) at the 2:25 mark. But after a Michigan basket, USF made their only second half turnover and could not get any closer.

DONS LOSE OT HEARTBREAKER TO CALIFORNIA: USF lost its fourth heartbreaker of the year when they lost a 77-70 overtime decision at Cal on December 30th.

USF took control of the game early, rolling to a 20-8 lead, but the host Bears were able to nab a 32-31 halftime lead. Cal expanded on their cushion and led the game 51-42 with 12:15 left. But USF then went on a 15-2 run to take a 57-53 lead that they held until Cal's Amit Tamir hit a three with 3.7 seconds left to tie it. Alvin Broussard rushed the ball up the floor, but his shot was less than a second to late to give USF the win. The Dons missed free-throws spelled doom in OT as USF missed two front-ends and lost 77-70.

DONS TOP FULLERTON: USF won its third straight game in easy fashion dispatching with Cal State Fullerton 75-61 Saturday night. The Dons trailing 18-13 scored 13 straight points to lead 26-18 on the way to a 34-25 halftime margin. The Dons made 6-10 first half threes (2-3 each by Tucker and Stallworth) and shot 52% from the floor before intermission. Ten USF players scored paced by 23 by Darrell Tucker (10-18 floor) with James Bayless and Shamell Stallworth adding 10. Tucker and Bayless each had double-doubles. USF shot 48.3% for the game.

DONS HAVE BEST PERFORMANCE OF YEAR TO BEAT BYU: The Dons had easily their best performance of the year in their 84-72 win over BYU. USF shot the ball well (50.9% - 60.7% in first half) and held BYU to 36.5% shooting. In a game of runs, USF down 5-2 outscored BYU 19-1 to take a 21-6 lead. The Dons led 46-27 at the half (biggest ½ margin of the year) before BYU went on a 19-3 run to get back to within 49-47. The Dons then went on a 22-13 run to push the

lead to 11 again. BYU never got any closer than four points as Shamell Stallworth scored 27 second half points (of USF's 38) making 9 of 11 field goal attempts after intermission.

DONS TAKE CARE OF SEAWOLVES: It took a while to finally take the lead for good, but USF got its second win of the season on December 18th vs, Sonoma State. USF was paced by senior forward Darrell Tucker (22 points, 10 rebounds) and guard Shamell Stallworth (16 points on 7-8 shooting from the floor. James Bayless was again impressive, narrowly missing a double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds.

USF led the game at halftime (its first halftime lead of the season and their second best first half point total 32-28. The Dons lost their second half lead at the 9:43 mark when the visitors tied the score at 50, but the USF easily closed the game out by scoring the next 7 points in a 17-4 run and won 73-59.

DONS FALL AFTER COMEBACK VS. FRESNO: USF had another heartbreaking loss in the Mayor's Game 74-71 loss to Fresno State.

Fresno State came out and shot the lights out in the first half, hitting 65% of its field goal attempts, including 7 of 11 three-point shots. The Dons trailed 42-27 at halftime and later by 21 points (56-35) with 15:30 remaining in the game. USF went on a 22-6 run to get back into the game and trailed just 62-57 with 7:56 to play.

The Dons continued to press and eventually had the ball trailing by just one (72-71). USF then worked the offense and got a wide-open look at a three with 11 seconds left, but Jason Gaines shot bounced out of the hoop. After a USF foul, John Cox also had a look at a three with :02 remaining, but that fell short.

OFFENSE FAILS TO GET IT DONE AT SAC: USF played good defense, allowing just 62 points, but managed to score just 57 in a 62-57 loss at Sacramento State. USF had a five point first half lead and a six point second half lead, but the was outscored 12-2 as the Hornets stayed perfect at home. USF had a chance to tie with :13 left and down two, but John Cox (who led all scorers with 17 points) missed an open baseline jumper. Darrell Tucker scored 16 points and pulled 15 rebounds but scored just four points after intermission. The Dons dominated the boards 38-27.

USF GETS FIRST WIN: (12/2) Senior Darrell Tucker scored 33 points, John Cox added 15 and Brandon Queen and Shamell Stallworth 11 each to lead USF to an 82-71 victory over Southern. Southern came out smoking in the first half hitting 63.3% of their shots and took a 49-40 lead at the break. But USF coach Phil Mathews challenged his team to hold Southern to 30% shooting in the second half, and the Dons responded, only allowing 9 Southern field goals in 31 attempts. Meanwhile, USF hit 16 of 23 attempts after intermission to outscore Southern 42-22 after intermission.

OFFENSIVE STRUGGLE DOOMS DONS AT UCSB: (11/30) The Dons scored a season low 47 points at UCSB, with only Darrell Tucker (14 pts.) scoring in double figures. Coach Mathews was disappointed in the fact that Tucker did not get enough touches or shots (11 FGA). USF missed their first seven shots of the game, but recovered to take a brief 12-11 lead. The Dons trailed 31-21 at the half, fell behind by 22 early in the second half, and crept to within 11 at 53-42 with 6:53 remaining. But after pulling within 11 at 58-47 with 4:25 remaining were outscored 12-0 to close out the game.

DÉJÀ VU: (11/26) The Dons lost a heartbreaker in their home opener to Nevada 64-61 on a 30-foot buzzer beater by the Wolf Pack's Kirk Snyder. In a game in which both teams shot well below 40% (31.7% for Nevada, 37.0% for USF), the Dons appeared to be in control after Mike Chambers hit a three-pointer with 1:66 remaining giving the Dons a 59-53 lead. But two turnovers and a dropped defensive rebound enabled Nevada to tie it and later go ahead with :23 ticks left. Darrell Tucker, who led all scorers and rebounders with 26 points and 12 rebounds tied the game with 3.9 seconds left on two free-throws setting up the final play. The Déjà vu was the similarity to a tough loss the Dons suffered at home last year to Pacific when the Dons also lost on a buzzer beater by Jono Metzger-Jones on December 15th from almost the identical spot.

A LATE WAKE UP CALL: (11/23) The Dons played a noon game at Continental Airlines Arena Saturday, and might have missed their wakeup call, starting the game slowly. In fact, USF made just one of its first ten shots and just 7 of 28 before halftime. Meanwhile, Seton Hall hit 17 of 33 first half shots, 5 of 9 three's. The Dons fell behind early 22-5 and chased the hosts the rest of the night before losing 77-51.

USF was paced by 16 points by John Cox and 14 by Jovan Harris, while Darrell Tucker (who took just nine shots) scored nine points and pulled seven rebounds.

The other sites for the Regional Finals in 2006 will be the MCI Center (Washington, DC), Georgia Dome (Atlanta, GA) and Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome (Twin Cities, MN).

The West region First and second rounds will be played at the Huntsman Center in Salt Lake City and Cox Arena in San Diego, with the winners advancing to Oakland. The Western Regional winner will advance to the 2006 NCAA Final Four in Indianapolis.
