USF HITS THE ROAD FOR SIX STRAIGHT AFTER THRILLING USF INVITATIONAL WIN

DONS VISIT MARQUETTE SATURDAY, THEN VISIT ASU TOURNEY NEW HOME GAME IS WCC CONTEST VS. ST. MARY'S JAN. 16

San Francisco, CA- USF (4-5) begins a six game stretch, five week series of road contests Saturday at 10 a.m. Pacific (KNEW 910 AM) when they visit Marquette (6-3) of the Big East in Milwaukee. The game comes almost 50 years to the day of USF defeating Marquette in the DePaul Tournament in the midst of USF's 60-game winning streak.

The Dons are coming off a big, come-from-behind overtime victory over Cal State Fullerton in the USF Invitational on Dec. 10th. USF rallied from a 19-point deficit with just 7:15 remaining to win the tournament championship, gaining USF its first two-game winning streak of the season.

It was the heroics of senior guard and tournament MVP Dommanic Ingerson that turned the tide for the Dons. He hit three consecutive three-pointers that took a 17-point deficit down to eight with 4:10 remaining (76-62) and hit another at the 0:58 mark to bring the Dons to within one. He then hit another three-pointer with 3:36 to play in OT to put USF ahead to stay and a final one at 2:25 to extend the lead to six. In the 10:30 of the contest, Ingerson made six three-pointers (in seven attempts) and two free-throws, for 20 points! There were other heroes for sure, Armondo Surratt has 18 points and eight assists and the trey that send the game into the extra session with :07 remaining. Yet another Oakland native, freshman Jesse Byrd also came up with a career game with 12 points and 10 rebounds. He also got an offensive rebound with 10 seconds left that enabled Surratt to shoot the three to send the game into overtime.

USF advanced to the finals by defeating New Mexico State 74-64, as five Dons scored in double figures, paced by Armondo Surratt's 16. The Dons led 36-32 at the half after opening up an earlier eight point lead at 18-10. The Aggies were able to pull into a 36-36 tie but the Dons went on a 11-2 run to lead 47-38 and were able to maintain the lead the rest of the way. Having outstanding games for USF were senior center Jason Wallace Carter (5-6 floor, 11 points, six assists and eight rebounds) and freshman Drew Shiller, who scored a career best 11 points, making three of four behind the arc.

EVANS SAYS: "The team is definitely making progress," said Dons coach Jessie Evans. "Obviously we are disappointed with the won-loss record, but we can definitely see improvement as a team. The players are settling into their roles. I like the balance that we have in the scoring with the five starters all

scoring from 15.8 to 9.3 per game. Our bench players are starting to figure out what they can do, as well. We now will have to work on injecting Vince Polakovic into the rotation as soon as he is eligible (NCAA residency rule).

“We are now ready to go on the road again,” Evans concluded. “We have no problem playing on the road, I just wish it wasn’t for six straight. But that’s the schedule and we are ready to play it.”

USF - WHAT’S UP SO FAR: USF started the season slowly, but is starting to find itself, winning three of the last four games. USF has four players averaging in double figures with junior guard Armondo Surratt leading the way (15.8 ppg.) followed by starting off-guard Dommanic Ingerson (13.4), and forwards Alan Wiggins (13.1) and Jerome Gumbs (12.4).

Things are definitely trending up for USF. They can best be measured in stats over the past two games against excellent competition.

The players that have improved the most over the past four games are Jerome Gumbs (from 10.2 ppg. to 15.3) and from 40.9 FG% to 61.5 and Alan Wiggins, Jr. who has gone from 11.2 ppg to 15.5 and has shot 64.1% compared to 43.2%.

The Dons still need to work on the field goal percentage defense which stands at 48.0% for the year and their points allowed which is at 75.7.

BUSY OPENING MONTH: Prior to this roadtrip, the Dons saw a lot of action in the opening month with nine games in the first 23 days of the season (from Nov. 18 to Dec. 10), with seven of the contests at home. USF has had a week off for finals before playing at Marquette. With the loss of senior forward John Dukes (foot) and transfer forward Vince Polakovic not eligible to play (NCAA transfer residency rule), the team has had to rely on the starters for long stretches. Armondo Surratt (37.4 minutes per game), Jerome Gumbs (33.8) and Alan Wiggins (33.0) have seen the most action.

SEE YOU IN JANUARY: The Dons will be like much of their fellow students, leaving campus for Winter break. USF will not return home to Memorial Gym (for a game) until January 16th. After the Marquette game, USF will play at the Arizona State Hoops Classic (12/21-22), then conclude the calendar year with a game at Fresno State on December 29th. The Dons will then open WCC play on January 7th at Pepperdine and play at LMU on the 9th before again playing at home.

ABOUT THE DONS: It was a new look Dons team (17-14, 1-1 NIT last year) that opened the season November 18th at the Thunderdome.

Gone are WCC leading scorer John Cox (20.0 ppg) and forward Tyrone Riley (15.8 ppg.) as well as both point guards Andre Hazel and Jason Gaines.

The Dons did return starting wing Jerome Gumbs (9.4 ppg./4.9 rpg), post Alan Wiggins, Jr. (5.8 ppg/4.0 rpg) and forward Johnny Dukes (5.6 ppg./3.0 rpg.) to the fold along with center Jason Wallace-Carter (2.3 ppg./2.9 rpg) and guard Dommanic Ingerson (2.3 ppg./1.0 rpg.). Dukes has been lost for a yet undetermined amount of time to a foot injury.

USF’s motto this season is “See How We Run” and the person that will be most in charge of making sure the team has that philosophy is point guard Armondo Surratt. The former Oakland Tech star, who started for Miami-FL in the Big East for two years, will key the attack. “Surratt is as fine a point guard as there is on the West Coast,” said Dons’ head coach Jessie Evans. He will be joined by California State High School Athlete of the Year Drew Shiller, a freshman from Burlingame who can run the offense or shoot, transfer Danny Cavic (from Santa Ana JC), returnee Michael Bell and returning redshirt Sinqua Walls.

The frontline will be bolstered by freshman Jesse Byrd (from Oakland's Bishop O'Dowd HS), who has been a very pleasant surprise in the first few weeks of practice with his rebounding and aggressive play. Another freshman who will be counted on will be Rainier Beach HS center James Morgan, a 6-9 post who has been looking good early, as well. Redshirt forward Vince Polakovic, a 6-8 forward from Slovakia, will join the team after finals (in time for either Marquette or the ASU Classic) and add scoring and rebounding to the group. He played two games last season before transferring from Northern Iowa.

USF has two former Big East point guards redshirting the entire season in former UConn guard Antonio Kellogg and former Rutgers player and Washington D.C. star Manny Quezada.

STARTERS SCORE: USF starters have had to carry the scoring load, especially since the loss of Johnny Dukes. In the Dons first nine contests, the current USF starters have accounted for all but 81 of USF's 658 points (87.7%). Jason Carter is the only starter not in double figures.

NEW RADIO STATION: The Dons have moved to a new radio station KQKE "The Quake" at 960 AM on the dial The Clear Channel station signed a three-year deal to carry USF basketball. Pat Olson is currently in his fifteenth season as the play-by-play man. He will be joined occasionally by former USF head coach Jim Brovelli.

AT LEAST 10 USF GAMES ON TV: There will be at least 10 USF games on TV this year starting with the USF at Stanford game on November 23rd (FSN). KICU-TV will do two games (Northwestern Mutual Classic vs. Texas Tech and Gonzaga at USF), Comcast Sports Net will do at least four (Wichita State at USF, USF at Santa Clara, USF at San Diego, and Loyola Marymount at USF) and FSN will do three (USF at Stanford, St. Mary's at USF and USF at Santa Clara).

SCHEDULE DIFFERENT: The West Coast Conference changed its league schedule from a mostly Thursday-Saturday format to a mostly Saturday-Monday format this season.

In USF's pre-conference schedule, the Dons play nine of their first 11 games at Memorial Gymnasium, but then hit the road for four straight non-league games to close out non-league play. In fact, USF is away for six straight games after playing at home on December 10th and do not return to Memorial Gym until January 16th.

LAST SEASON REVIEW: The Dons went 17-14 in the first season under Jessie Evans and played two games in the postseason NIT. They finished 6-8 in WCC play (tied for fifth) and advanced to the second round of the WCC tournament. USF had a very high RPI which allowed it to advance to the NIT, where it became the first WCC team ever to host the postseason event. The Dons defeated Denver in the opening round before falling to Cal State Fullerton (who will play in USF's Invitational on Dec. 9-10).

USF beat five conference champions last season, a major factor in getting the NIT bid. The Dons topped Saint Joseph's (Atlantic 10), Pacific (only team to beat the Tigers in Stockton), Penn (Ivy), Gonzaga (WCC) and Denver (Sun Belt). USF also defeated Montana who won its conference postseason tournament. The Dons also lost narrowly to Stanford (ot), St. Mary's twice (once in 3ot), and Gonzaga (final second).

EVANS IN POSTSEASON AGAIN: And while it had been a while since USF has made it to the postseason, it was nothing new for USF head coach Jessie Evans, who was in his fourth straight postseason last year. Evans took Louisiana Lafayette to four postseason berths in his seven years there. And he helped lead Arizona to the national championship in his final year as an assistant there in 1997.

DONS WERE 8-1 AT HOME VS. NONCONFERENCE FOES LAST YEAR: Last season, USF was 8-1 in non-conference games at home, losing only to CS Fullerton. This season USF is 4-3.

PREVIOUS CONTESTS:

UCSB 82, USF 59 (Nov. 11): Senior guard Joe See scored eight points in a decisive 14-2 second half run as UC Santa Barbara defeated cold shooting USF 82-59 in the season opener at the Thunderdome in Santa Barbara.

The Dons started the game cold, making just seven of 26 shots in the first half, but were able to claw back into the lead at 41-40 with 14:27 remaining in the contest. That's when the Gauchos made their decisive run, paced by See's two three-pointers and two free-throws.

But it all came down to shooting in the end as the Gauchos, who ended the game on a 42 to 18 run, were hitting threes all night, knocking down 11 of 16 from behind the arc. See did the most damage, making five of six treys for 17 points, which tied him with forward Chris Devine as the Gauchos high scorer. Santa Barbara made 50% of their shots in the game, including 59.1% in the second half.

USF was paced by guards [Armondo Surratt](#) who scored 20 points and [Dommanic Ingerson](#) who tallied 17. "We cannot allow a team to score 82 points and shoot that well against us," said coach [Jessie Evans](#). "They were very patient and they were able to break us down, We need to run at their shooters and not let them hit open threes. We have to play the full 35 seconds of the shot clock. We have a lot of areas to improve, defensively and patience on offense. We need to share the ball more."

USF 70, Monmouth 66 (Nov. 21) Armondo Surratt hit a three to break a 61-61 tie with 3:20 remaining and scored six points down the stretch to lead USF to a 70-66 win over Monmouth and give coach Jessie Evans his 150th career victory.

The Dons (1-1) led throughout much of the second half, but Monmouth (0-1) rallied from a 10-point deficit to a two-point lead with 4:27 remaining in the contest. After Jason Wallace-Carter tied the game, Surratt nailed his big three to put USF ahead to stay.

The Dons were paced by 18 points by senior Dommanic Ingerson, 15 by Jerome Gumbs and 14 by Surratt, while Monmouth was paced by 25 points by Dejan Delic, 18 after intermission.

USF shot 41.0% from the floor to 45.5% for the guests, but the Dons held a 43-30 rebound advantage.

Evans, in his second season at USF, now has a 150-96 career record, in his ninth season.

Ingerson, who was granted an extra year of eligibility by the NCAA last summer, has played well in his senior season. He scored 17 in USF's opening loss to UC Santa Barbara and 18 tonight. Last season, he reached double figures just once.

Stanford 72, USF 57 (Nov. 23): Matt Haryasz scored 18 points and pulled 11 rebounds, Dan Grunfeld added 16 and Taj Finger 15 to pace #25 Stanford to a 71-56 victory over USF Wednesday afternoon at Maples Pavilion. The Stanford win ruined a career night for USF junior [Alan Wiggins](#), Jr. who scored career highs with 21 points and six blocked shots. USF (1-2) also got 13 points from [Armondo Surratt](#). The Dons, playing their second game within 40 hours, shot poorly, hitting just 35.5% of their attempts, while Stanford nailed 44.3% of their shots. "We are inexperienced," said Dons' coach [Jessie Evans](#). "This team is going to be good, we are just not quite there yet." Stanford ran off two streaks that saw the Dons trail 36-21 at the half.

After USF scored the first three points on a Surratt three-pointer, Stanford went on a 17-2 run to lead 17-5 with 13:40 left in the first half. USF fell behind as they hit just two of their first 16 shots. The Dons had a run in them as they closed the score to 23-19 on [Drew Shiller's](#) driving layup, but then Stanford closed the half on a 13-2 run.

Sacramento State 85, USF 78 (Nov. 26): USF dropped a home decision to Sacramento State on November 26th. The Dons and Hornets battled it out for much of the way with the guests breaking up a 67-67 tie with 3:41 to play. The Dons still trailed by two points with just over 2 minutes left, but could get no closer.

USF was paced by senior center Jason Wallace-Carter who scored a career high 23 points, shattering his old mark of just 14 while he was at Colorado. He nailed 11 of 14 shots from the floor and pulled seven rebounds. Unfortunately for the Dons, the team had its poorest defensive game allowing the Hornets to shoot 54.9% from the floor.

Pacific 75, USF 71 (ot) (Nov. 30): The Dons lost their third straight, a 75-71 overtime decision to Pacific on November 30th. USF was in control for much of the game, leading 39-35 at the half and taking a 61-53 lead with 5:42 remaining in regulation after an Armondo Surratt three-point play. However, the Tigers put on an 8-0 run to tie the score at 61. USF again took the lead at 67-66 before a UOP free-throw tied the score. USF missed shots by Surratt, Jerome Gumbs and freshman Jesse Byrd in the final seconds that would have won the game in regulation. The Dons lost both Alan Wiggins and Jason Wallace-Carter to fouls in regulation, with Wallace-Carter fouling out in just 16 minutes. USF missed its first six shots in overtime, while Pacific made one of five. But the guest made six overtime free-throws to take control. USF was outshot 53.1% to 39.3% for the game, despite shooting 50% in the first half.

USF 90, Texas Tech 72 (Dec. 3): The Dons played their best game this season in beating Texas Tech 90-72 in the Northwestern Mutual Shootout at War Memorial Gymnasium Dec. 3. Paced by Sam Skinner Award winner (Shootout MVP) Jerome Gumbs, who scored a career best 31 points on 12-19 shooting, the Dons led virtually from start to finish. The Dons, who shot 54.2% from the floor, were ahead 42-33 at the half and led by as many as 21 in the contest. Alan Wiggins scored 20 points (7-9 floor) and Armondo Surratt added 13 points and a career best 11 assists. Dommanic Ingerson scored 15 points, nailing five three-pointers.

Wichita State 75, USF 67 (Dec. 6): USF played very well against a very talented Wichita State team before losing 75-67. The Dons led by as many as 10 in the first half (in which they shot 55.6%) before taking a 33-30 lead into the locker room. After Wichita State took a five-point lead in the second half (42-37), USF fought back to take its own five point cushion (49-44) with 10:56 remaining. There were eight lead changes in the second half, but it was WSU domination of free-throws that spelled doom eventually for the Dons, as the Shockers made 11 of 15 to just 3-5 for USF. Alan Wiggins made 9 of 11 shots and scored 19 points to pace USF, with Armondo Surratt (16) and Jerome Gumbs (12) also scoring in double figures.. Kyle Wilson paced WSU with 24 points on 8-12 shooting.

HEAD COACH JESSIE EVANS, a 1972 graduate of Eastern Michigan is in his second season at USF (21-19) and 9th year of collegiate coaching (153-100) after recording a 132-81 record in 7 seasons at Louisiana Lafayette. He previously was assistant coach at Arizona for nine seasons where he helped lead the Wildcats to the 1997 NCAA title. He guided USF to the NIT last season and won his 150th career game November 21 vs. Monmouth. He recently signed a contract extension.

HEAD COACH TOM CREAN, a 1979 graduate of Central Michigan is in his seventh season at Marquette (127-68) and career.

GOLDEN EAGLES PREP: Marquette enters the games on Saturday with a 6-3 mark on seventh year head coach Tom Crean. The Golden Eagles have a very young squad, with five of their top six scorers either freshmen or sophomores. Marquette won the Great Alaska Shootout, topping South Carolina 92-89 in OT after earlier wins vs. Eastern Washington (83-73) and Oral Roberts (73-70). They lead the series with USF 2-1. Marquette is playing its first season in the Big East. They are 3-1 at home in the Bradley Center, topping Rice 82-65, South Dakota State 87-52 and Valparaiso 69-54 and losing to Winthrop 71-64. Freshman guard Jerel James is the team's leading scorer.

#11 Armondo Surratt: Former Oakland Tech star who started as a freshman and sophomore at Miami-FL was the high scorer in his USF debut at UCSB with 20 points...scored 14 points in the win over Monmouth, but six were in the stretch when USF took control, hitting a three to break a tie with 3:20 left and then making a traditional three-point play with 1:46 remaining...13 points at Stanford...12 points in loss to Sacramento State and recorded 9 assists and just three turnovers...20 points in OT loss to Pacific adding 7 assists...scored 13 points in win over Texas Tech with a career best 11 assists...scored 16 points, 13 after halftime in loss to Wichita State...team-high 16 points, 5 assists in win over New Mexico State...19 points and game-tying three-pointer in overtime win over Cal State Fullerton...in his last five games he has 45 assists and just 23 turnovers...played with Cal star Leon Powe in High School.

Patrick Clardy, a forward at USF during the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons has passed away due to cancer at 39 years old. Clardy, an Oakland native, averaged 12.5 points per game in his two-year Dons career playing for Head Coach Jim Brovelli.

Clardy came to USF after being named a Junior College All-American at Contra Costa JC. He also played as a freshman at Cal State Fullerton before deciding to return closer to his Oakland home.

Clardy was a Street & Smith's High School All-American at McClymonds High School in Oakland before going on to Fullerton.

His highlights at the Hilltop included a 41-point effort vs. Northern Montana on December 13th, 1987, the fifth highest scoring game for a USF player in history. He will also be remembered for hitting the game-winning shot to beat California at Memorial Gymnasium on December 6th of 1986. He scored 19 points in that 65-63 victory. He was USF's leading scorer in 1986-87 with 13.3 points per game.

"We were very fortunate to have Pat Clardy in our basketball program when we were bringing the program back," recalled Brovelli. "He had a very high level of ability and talent. The last time I talked to Pat we remembered the baseline shot he made to defeat a very good Cal team. He was a great guy to coach and an exceptional player." Patrick leaves behind his 11 year old daughter, Taylor.

COACH EVANS EXTENDED

University of San Francisco men's basketball coach Jessie Evans has been signed to an extension of his long term contract, Director of Athletics Bill Hogan Dec. 2nd.

"We are pleased with the direction that the program is heading," said USF Director of Athletics Bill Hogan. "Jessie has made a great positive impact all over the Bay Area, with alumni, recruits, and basketball fans. Season tickets have increased dramatically. He has chosen to bring in young players this season to build for the future, and with the players that are coming aboard next season, we are expecting great things."

Evans came to USF from Louisiana Lafayette, where he coached for eight seasons after helping lead Arizona (as an assistant to Lute Olson) to the NCAA title. In his first season at USF he led the Dons to a postseason win in the NIT, and a 17-14 record. Along the way he defeated five regular season league champions (Pacific, St. Joseph's, Penn, Gonzaga and Denver) and Montana, who won their conference tournament.

"It's a great compliment to our coaching staff that the University has offered us this extension," said Coach Evans, now in his 29th season as a collegiate coach and ninth as a head coach. "It confirms what we are feeling, that the program is headed in the right direction. We are excited to be here at USF and are looking forward to restoring the tradition of winning here."

Jessie has made a commitment to getting the best Bay Area players available and this year and has already shown that by bringing in Armondo Surratt, Jesse Byrd, Drew Shiller and current redshirt Antonio Kellogg.

He has also signed two prep stars for next season, Jay Watkins (Memphis, TN) and Jared Casey (Vancouver, BC) and junior college transfer Terrell Anderson (CCSF).

USF SIGNS THREE EARLY: San Francisco, CA --(Nov. 16, 2005) University of San Francisco head basketball coach **Jessie Evans** today announced that he has signed two freshman, Jared Casey of Vancouver, BC and Jay Watkins of Memphis and junior college forward Terrell Anderson to letters of intent to play basketball at USF starting in the fall of 2006.

These players, along with Division I transfer guards Antonio Kellogg (UConn) and Manny Quezada (Rutgers), give the Dons five solid additions to the team for the 2006-07 season. The two transfers will have three seasons of eligibility remaining.

Watkins, a highly recruited player out of Hamilton High School in Memphis, Tenn. averaged 20 points and 10 rebounds a game last season. "Jay is an excellent recruit who was sought after by teams from the ACC, SEC and Big 12," said Evans in making the announcement. "He is a versatile player, who can do many things."

Casey will add significant size to the Dons' frontline. The 6-10 center averaged 19 points and 10 rebounds at Maple Ridge Secondary School in Vancouver, B.C. "Casey was also highly sought after," said Evans. "He has played small forward, power forward and center. He is also very athletic having played hockey, baseball and soccer at a high level. He is a power player who can also make a shot from long range.

Terrell Anderson redshirted last season at City College of San Francisco after averaging 10 points and 10 rebounds in 2003-04. He is originally from Oakland, but lived in Louisiana in recent years. "Terrell is another versatile player," said Evans. "He is very athletic, can run the floor and is an outstanding defender."

We are very proud of this recruiting class," concluded Evans. "Our staff has done a great job in enhancing our squad. The players we signed are all very versatile, which is what I like. Next season, with Armondo Surratt, Drew Shiller, Antonio Kellogg and Manny Quezada in the backcourt, our new frontline players will be able to shine, along with returnees Alan Wiggins, Jr., Vince Polakovic and Jesse Byrd."
