NEXT UP FOR USF: USF closes out the 2009 season at Negroesco Stadium on Saturday, November 7. Kick off against Pepperdine is set for 1:00 PM. It will also be senior day, with festivities beginning at 12:30 PM.

KRISTINA HALL LEADS DONS SCORERS: Senior midfielder Kristina Hall has been aggressive in the early going, scoring four of the Dons 12 goals. She scored in the Dons first game of the season, helping USF to a 2-0 win against San Francisco State (8/21). Hall then scored twice in a 4-0 drubbing of Academy of Art (8/30). Her final goal so far came in the 3-0 win over Fairfield in the USF odwalla/ Nike Classic (9/6).

DONS OFFENSE: USF has 21 goals this season, nine more than they had all of 2008. Junior midfielder Lauren Maris (one at Gonzaga on 10/23, one vs. AAU on 9/30 and one vs. Fairfield on 9/6) and freshman forward Megan Connor (AAU 8/30, Pacific 9/20, EWU 9/25) are second on the team with three. Sophomore forward Molly Hall (two vs. SMC 10/11), freshman midfielder Aly Drake (SU 9/27, USD 10/18) and freshman forward Laura Gordon (game winner vs. Marist on 8/28 and one vs. Fairfield on 9/6) each have two scoring strikes for USF. Five Dons have also scored their first ever collegiate goals in 2009 including, junior defender Ashley O'Brien (EWU 9/25), sophomore midfielder Megan Bucci (Marist 8/28), sophomore midfielder Keonna Robinson (CS Fullerton 9/13), freshman midfielder Camile Cholger (SF State 8/21), and freshman defender Ashlyn Mazur (USD 10/18).

WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM THEIR FRIENDS: Eleven Dons have helped out their teammates in 2009. Seniors Samantha Brand and Kristina Hall, junior Ashley O'Brien, sophomores Keonna Robinson and Kelli Woodard, freshmen Laura Gordon and Ashlyn Mazur each have one assist this season. Freshman Megan Connor, sophomores Megan Bucci and Molly Hall, and junior Lauren Maris lead the assist category with two each.

USF HAD EIGHT GAME UNBEATEN STREAK: San Francisco women's soccer remained undefeated in eight straight games (three wins and five ties from 9/6-10/11). The 2009 team now owns the second most consecutive unbeaten matches, behind the 1994 squad that won 11 consecutive games.

MOLLY HALL SCORES TWICE: GIVING DONS 2-1 WIN OVER SMC: Sophomore forward Molly Hall busted out of her scoring drought, scoring twice against Saint Mary's (10/11) to give the Dons a 2-1 win in West Coast Conference action.

DONS IN THE WCC: As a team the Dons are second in conference in goals allowed (11), second in goals against average (0.72), and tied for third in shutouts (7). Individually, three Dons are among the Top-10 in 10 categories.

DONS TAKE SECOND IN ODWALLA/NIKE CLASSIC AT NEGOESCO: USF hosted the odwalla/Nike Classic at Negoesco September 4 and 6, and finished second out of four teams. Long Island took the Championship, going 2-0. USF fell to LIU, but defeated Fairfield to finish 1-1. Fairfield took third, falling to USF but beating San Jose State. The Spartans finished last, going 0-2 in the tournament.

SAM BRAND AND KRISTINA HALL NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Seniors Sam Brand and Kristina Hall earned enough votes from opponents in the odwall/Nike Classic to make the All-Tournament Team. Brand was also chosen by the coaches as the Top Defender of the event.

DONS AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS: USF is set to meet no less than three teams with early season rankings. The Dons host No. 15 Santa Clara at home on Friday, October 16 at 5:00 PM. USF travels to No. 4 Portland on Sunday, October 25 for a noon start. USD, who is receiving votes, will play at Negoesco at 11:00 AM on October 18. as a part of a women's and men's double header at Negoesco

A LITTLE ON COACH CARR: USF Head Coach Mark Carr (Bournemouth University, 2001) is in his third year as the head coach of the Dons following a four year stint as an assistant coach at UCLA. During his tenure in Westwood, the Bruins posted an 81-15-5 overall record and produced nine All-Americans. In addition, UCLA owned an 18-4 record in the NCAA Tournament. No stranger to the West Coast Conference, Carr's Bruins faced the University of Portland in 2005 for the national title in a match won by the Pilots.

Carr earned his first victory on the Hilltop versus Conference and Bay Area foe Saint Mary's (10/14) 2-1. The Dons then won the very next game over Gonzaga (10/19) with their first shutout of the year, 3-0.

Carr continued to improve in his second season, doubling the Dons win total. USF won their first two games, and were off to a 2-0 start for the first time since 2003.

Carr graduated from Bournemouth University in his native England in 2001 with a B.A. in International Marketing. A decorated amateur player, Carr competed on the England School's Representative Team (1996) and played for the Charlton Athletic Youth Team (1995-97). Mark and his wife Caroline were married in the summer of 2009.

DONS ASSISTANT COACHES: Maite Zabala begins her third year as an assistant coach for USF. A former California Golden Bear and WUSA goalkeeper, Zabala spent three seasons as an assistant at Cal before coming to the Hilltop. She also held the volunteer assistant position from 2001-03. In nine years as a player or coach, the Bears posted nine winning seasons and garnered eight NCAA Tournament bids, highlighted by a third round appearance in 2005. Under Zabala's tutelage, the Bears ranked seventh among NCAA Division I leaders in team goals-against average at 0.475 in 2005 and matched a program high with 14 shutouts.

Mike Herman begins his second season on the Hilltop in 2009. As a club coach, Herman led a U-18 Girls team from Bay Oaks Soccer Club to their first ever Tournament victory and an undefeated season. He currently coaches a U-15 girls team at Bay Oaks Soccer Club and also is a trainer at Sutton Soccer Training Facility in Alameda, CA.

A LOOK AT LOYOLA MARYMOUNT: After making NCAA Tournament appearances in 2002 and 2006, LMU has come close the last two seasons. In 2007, the Lions equaled the school record with 12 victories and tied with Santa Clara for third place in the WCC. Last year, the Lions played a more difficult schedule - featuring six games against nationally-ranked opponents - but again reached 10 wins. Third year coach Joe Mallia is determined to take LMU back to the postseason in 2009. His roster this year features a unique blend of talented freshmen and seasoned veterans, with 21 letterwinners and eight starters returning to combine with eight newcomers - LMU's largest incoming class under Mallia. What makes the group unique is that it is heavy on upperclassmen, with 17 juniors and seniors on the roster.

With no seniors, head coach Nicole Van Dyke is looking towards her five returning juniors to provide leadership. MATCH ONE

WOMEN'S SOCCER FALLS TO GONZAGA 3-1: San Francisco women's soccer fell to West Coast Conference foe Gonzaga 3-1 on Friday afternoon. Sophomore Lauren Maris scored for the Dons (6-4-5, 1-3-0 WCC) in the match.

Gonzaga (7-9-0, 1-3-0 WCC) started off the scoring, going ahead 1-0 at 27:05 when Emily Hutchens punched it through to the right side of the goal. Emma Dolcetti and Elle Sweeney earned the assists. That was all the scoring that any team could muster in the first half.

Five minutes into the second half, Catherine Cullen put the Zags up 2-0. Cullen headed the ball into the left corner after a throw in by Morgan Manchester.

USF cut the score in half, making it 2-1 at 54:25. Junior midfielder Lauren Maris kicked the ball passed a diving keeper after a cross from senior defender Samantha Brand.

But the Bulldogs added another goal exactly 20 minutes later to put the game out of reach for the Dons. Jessie Sorenson found a wide open net after passes from Anna Lund and Dolcetti.

Gonzaga held a 14-10 shot advantage, but USF had seven corner kicks to GU's 4. Senior goalkeeper Kelly Pohle had four saves on the day. Maris, sophomore forward Molly Hall, and freshman forward Aly Drake led the Dons with two shots each. Senior midfielder Kristina Hall, freshman defender Ashlyn Mazur, freshman midfielder Joan Piasta, and freshman forward Megan Connor each had one.

QUOTING COACH CARR: "When you show up and think something is going to be handed to you, it's not going to happen. Tonight we were outworked, out battled, and Gonzaga took it to us. Our program is built on the values of work ethic, hustle, attitude, and effort. We were not good enough today."

MATCH TWO

WOMEN'S SOCCER DROPS GAME TO NO. 2 PORTLAND: San Francisco women's soccer fell to No. 2 Portland 8-0 in West Coast Conference soccer action on Sunday afternoon. The Dons fall to 6-4-5, 1-3-0 WCC on the season, and the Pilots, a perennial NCAA Tournament team, improve to 16-1-0, 5-0-0 WCC.

UP scored four goals each in the first and second halves. At 13:40, Sophie Schmidt placed one into the upper right corner from eight yards out after a pass from Jessica Tsao. Five minutes later, Danielle Foxhoven beat senior goalkeeper Kelly Pohle to the left corner of the goal from 15 yards out on a pass from Schmidt. In the 32nd minute, Foxhoven made it 3-0 on a penalty kick. Then, three minutes later, Foxhoven scored once more after a pass from Kendra Chandhoke.

Five minutes into the second quarter, Foxhoven made it 5-0 off a slide kick into the upper left corner from 15 yards. Tsao earned her second assist on the play. At 63:25, Halley Kreminski, with an assist from Foxhoven, scored off a direct kick from six yards out. Kreminski scored again, this time with help from Taylor Brooke, to make it 7-0. Kreminski then scored the final blow at 79:38 after a corner kick from Charney Burk.

Portland held a 30-1 shot advantage, and a 10-0 corner kick lead. Sophomore defender Kelli Woodard had the lone shot for USF. Pohle had six saves in 70 minutes, and freshman Noe Salter had two saves in 19 minutes.

QUOTING COACH CARR: "We played one of the top teams in the nation, and they were impressive. If that team is not at the final four, I would be shocked. We need to get rested, healthy, and be focused for next weekend."
